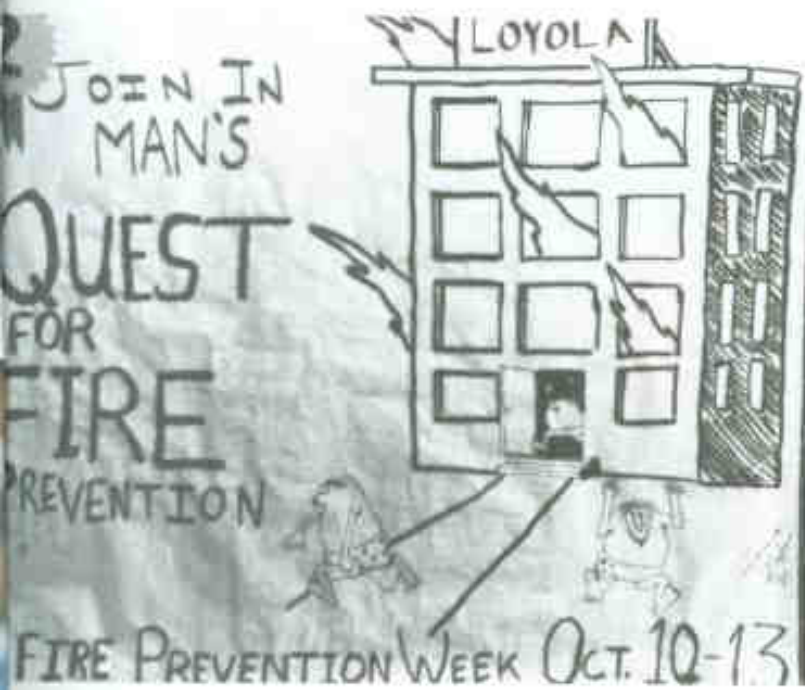
the day, and we all thank those organizers.

Unfortunately, a very low turnout of voters forced a yes/no ballot to be introduced as a determining factor for three positions; Patricia Brown became the new Education Representative, Don Aker became the Graduate Representative, and Tina Hynes became the new Engineering Representative.

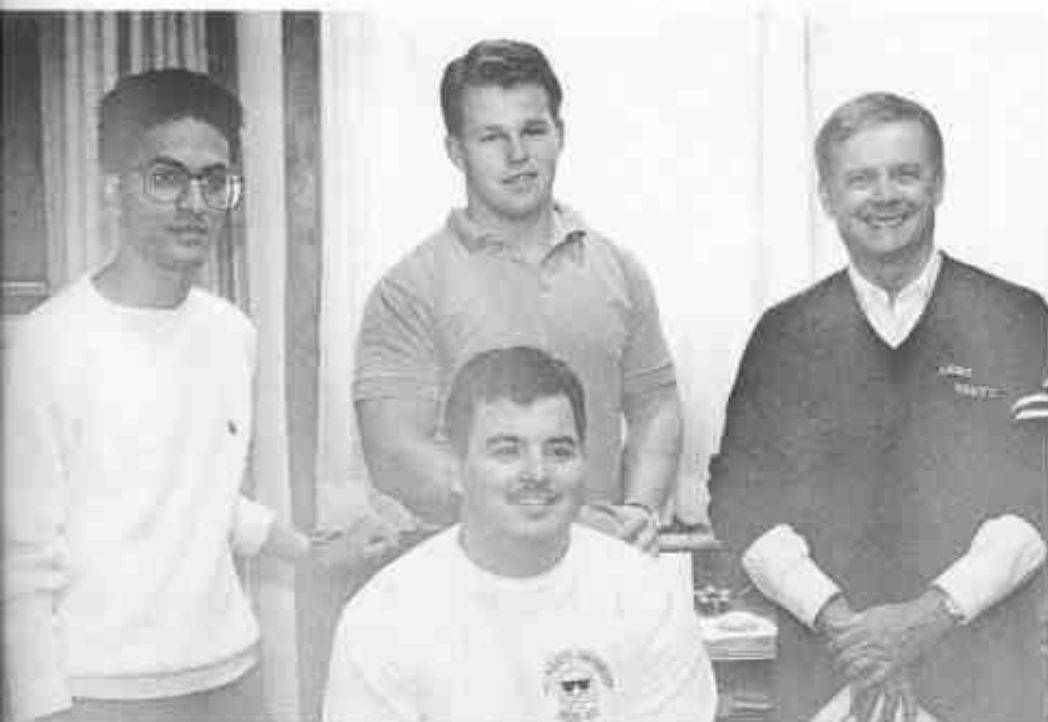




President for a Day

The host team managed to score only one goal, but that was enough to bring it all home. The Huskies must be congratulated on a fantastic record.

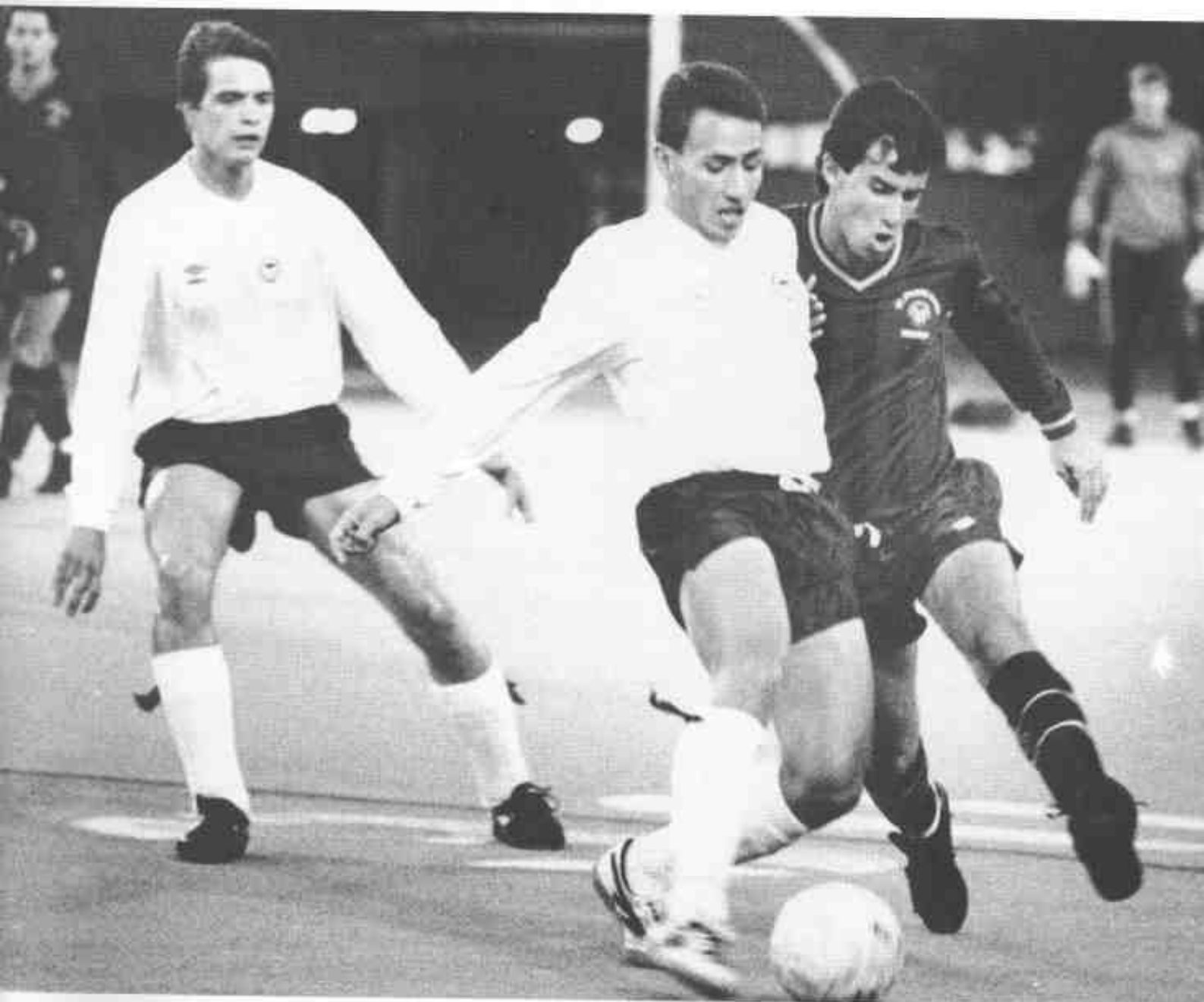

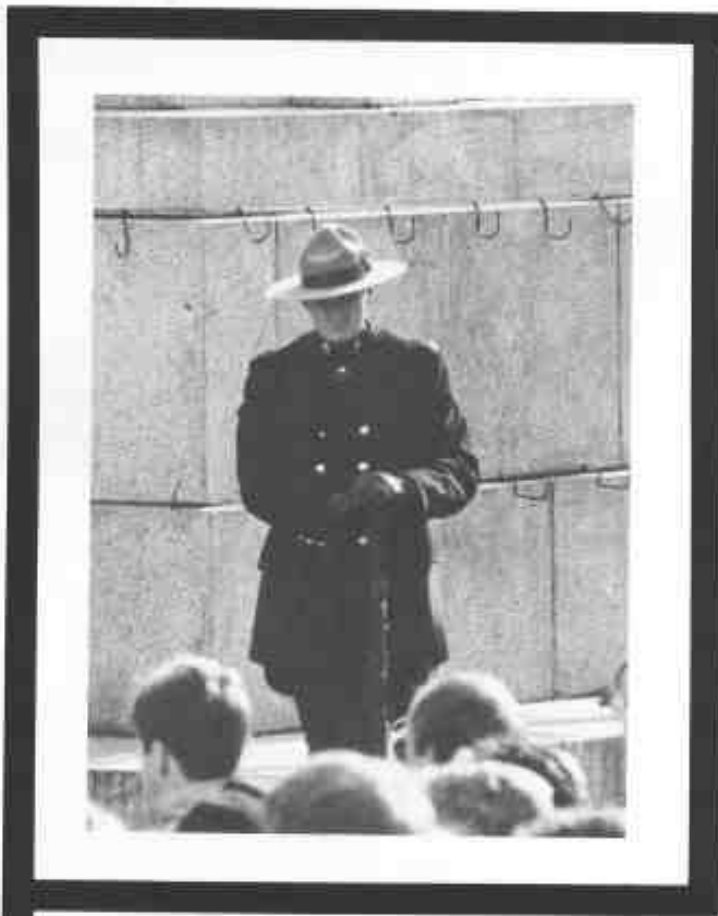
POLITICAL SCIENCE SOCIETY

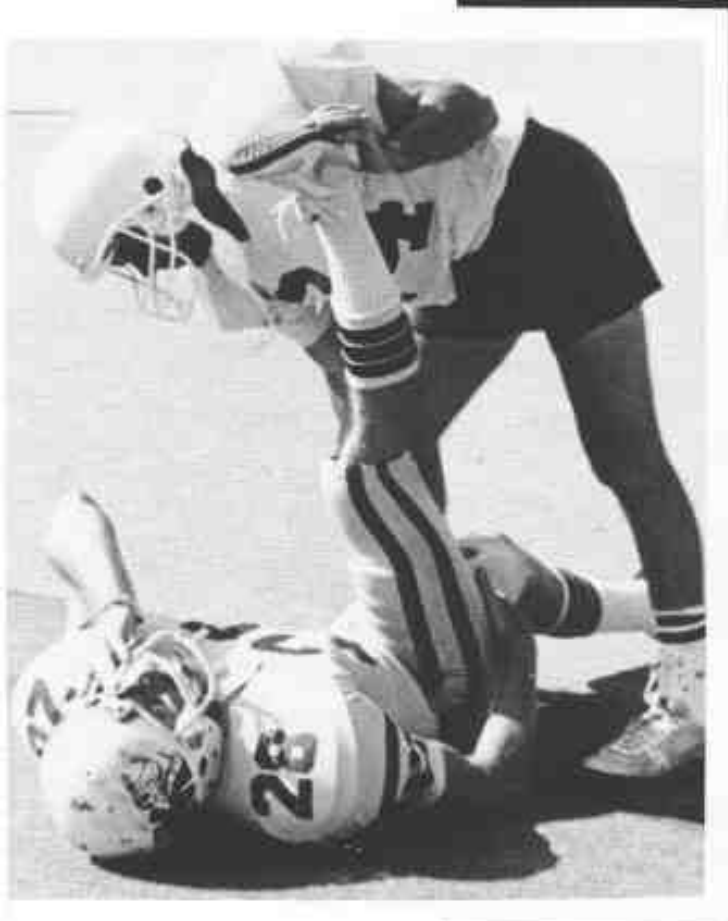

The Saint Mary's Huskies Football Team had seen much support in their confrontations in the past, but 1989 was especially fan-filled. From game one (Acadia at SMU in exhibition play), the crowds gave cheers equalling no past year. One player even remarked on not seeing so many spectators at any regular season game the previous year. The hype began early, with several of the Huskies' top players appearing on local television.

The season began with our team showing no signs of weakness. They literally walked over anyone who stood in their way. Chris Flynn, once again, had an outstanding year, breaking the record for the number of touchdown passes in one season (22). He won the Hec Crighton award for the second straight year, keeping his title as the nation's most outstanding player. Coach Larry Vteck was nominated for the Frank Tindall award as the nation's top coach and Louis Olsacher was up for the J.P. Metzros Trophy as the nation's top lineman.

However, the strength of the team was just fractionally outdone by the Western Ontario Mustangs in the Atlantic Bowl. After this match, the biggest question was, "Will Chris Flynn be back next year?" It was later announced that his fourth year would be played out in a Huskies' uniform, once again as #1.

Never has the Saint Mary's Huskies seen hype and popularity as they did during the 1989 AUFC regular season. Everyone in the two cities was gunning for an Atlantic Bowl victory. The championship game, however, didn't end as most local fans hoped it would, for the Western Ontario squad was a solid force both offensively and defensively. The 38-35 upset over the number one ranked Huskies was surprising to most, despite an incredible drive by Chris Flynn's offensive line in the last minutes of the game. Consequently, the Western Ontario Mustangs went on to the Toronto Skydome for the Vanier Cup and a national victory.

The 1989–90 year began with a blast—“Blast Off '89” was the theme of Orientation Week.

The week featured record attendance at many events. 1250 packed the Fieldhouse for “the Spoons” concert and 4000 attended the first football game of the year as the #1 rated SMU Huskies trounced Acadia Axemen in an exhibition contest.

“Blast Off '89” raised \$1250 for the Abilities Foundation, the object of a charity benefit. As a result of charitable efforts, four disabled youngsters obtained funding for summer camp.

Football star Bill Scollard was appointed Honorary Chair of Orientation Week and C100 radio served as an official sponsor of the activities.

Other highlights of September included the opening of a branch of Continuing Education at the World Trade and Convention Centre, the second birthday of the Tower Athletic Centre and the President's Dinner for new students.

In October, election time arrived. On October 4 and 5, voters elected Patricia Brown (Education Rep), Tina Hynes (Engineering Rep), Tim Nicholls (Mature/Part Time

Rep), Don Aker (Grad Rep) and Tonya Firth (Freshman Rep) to the Students' Representative Council.

The SMUSA executive served Thanksgiving Dinner to residence students and the SMUSA scholarship was officially co-awarded to Nicole Philips and Keltie Worrall at the Scholarship Reception on October 22.

During National Universities Week (October 16-21), two SMU students were selected as President of SMU and President of SMUSA. Joe Carolla succeeded Dr. Ozmon while Greg Foran replaced Sanjeev Chowdehury. The selection took place by lotto, proceeds of which went to the United Way.

SMUSA laid a wreath at the Grand Parade Cenotaph during Remembrance Day ceremonies. The wreath commemorated the sacrifices of SMU students during the First and Second World Wars, as well as the Korean War.

The Caribbean Society Fashion Show, the Tower Christmas Auction (proceeds to the Atlantic Centre for Disabled Students) and Residence Society Bingo (proceeds to Christmas Daddies) were held in November.



On November 22, Radio Saint Mary's Association presented their application for FM licencing to the CRTC. The society would later be denied their application.

The SMUSA Christmas Party was held in December. Exams and Christmas cheer rounded out the the decade of the 1980's.

In January 1990, students returned to campus to face another semester full of SMUSA sponsored activities. On January 11, the campus pub hosted **Campus Comedy Night 1990** in conjunction with Olands Brewery. Leonard Kane won first place, Greg Purvis came in second, and Steve Dougherty placed third. Greg went on to represent SMU at the Campus Comedy finals, and managed to place respectfully amongst all contestants.

On January 17, SMUSA sponsored a contest to see which person(s) or group of persons could cheer the loudest at the home hockey games. As usual, **Don Bill Dailey** and his floor walked off with most of the prizes.



January 24-26 was **Winter Carnival 90**. This years' theme was "Pink Flamingos". Students participated in a casino afternoon filled with wheels of many descriptions, fortune tellers, buskers, and cotton candy.

The **Commerce Society Business Dinner** featured the Chairman of Air Canada, Claude Taylor, as its guest speaker at the Chateau Halifax.





Winter Carnival Week featured the ever popular “Lambert and James”, performed in the pub, and the week ended with a formal ball hosted by the Residence Society.

On February 5, SMUSA sponsored a “Human Rights Awareness Day”, the purpose of which was to raise awareness of human rights and the abuses of these rights around the world. Information booths were set up around campus and flyers were handed out to students.

On February 14 and 15, students took to the polls to elect a new President and two new Vice Presidents. Ian Morrison, of Newcastle, New Brunswick, was elected SMUSA President for 1990–91, Dave Bond was elected Vice President (Administration), and Oktay Kesebi was re-elected Vice President (Student Affairs).

During this same month, SMUSA extended invitations to all candidates seeking the position of Leader of the Liberal Party of Canada to speak on campus. The Honorable Iona Campagnolo, Co-Chair of “Canadians for Paul Martin”, accepted this invitation and addressed approximately 60 students on February 26, in the Alumni Lounge.

Aker, Kesebi, and Flynn, along with John Webber and Sandra Mudge captured the five seats on the Senate.
