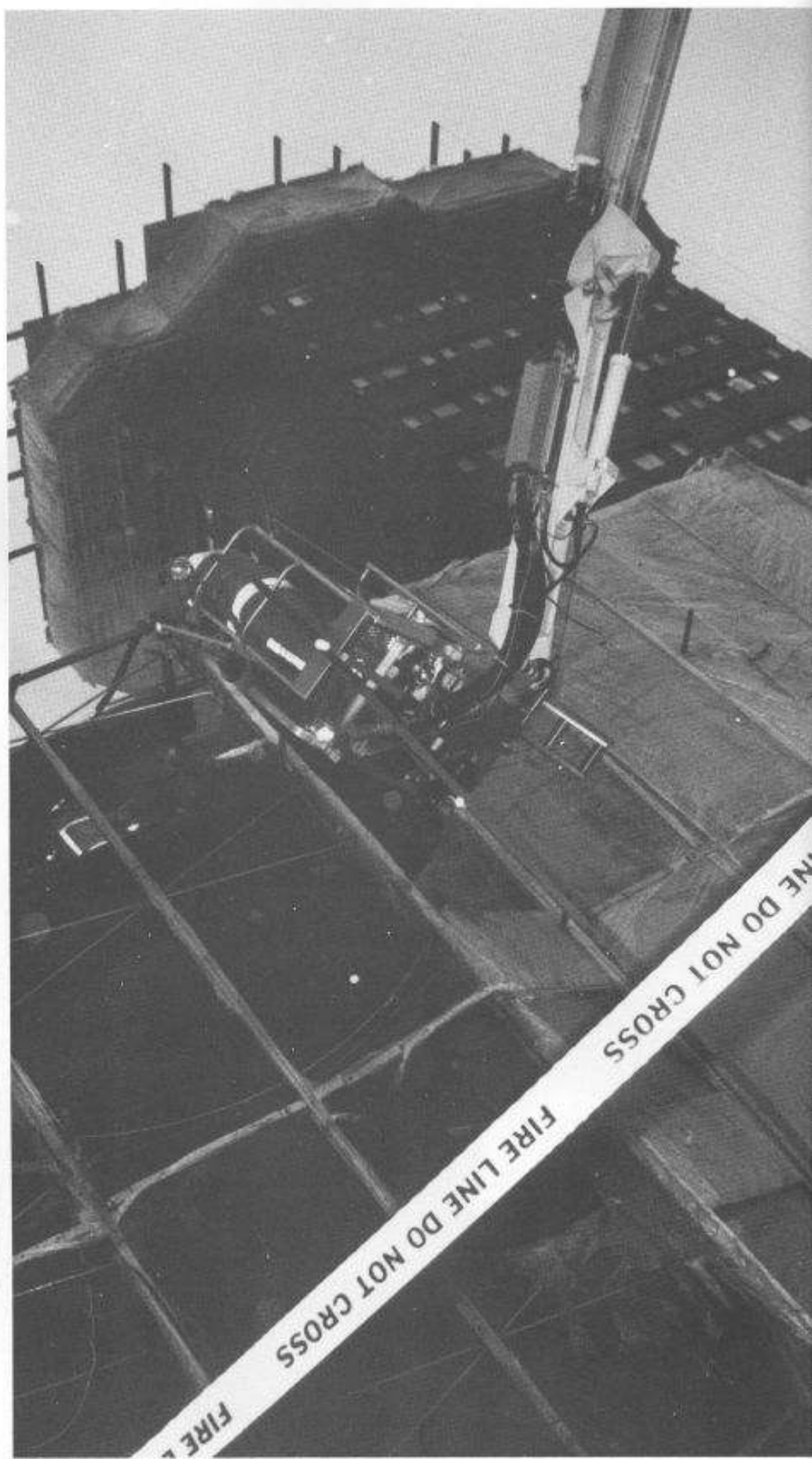


SAINT MARY'S UNIVERSITY PUT TO THE ULTIMATE TEST!

And it was passed with flying colors.

On Monday January 17, at approximately 4:30 in the afternoon, a fire broke out at D House in the Vanier Residence. Damage from fire and smoke caused residents from D and C House to stay overnight at the Lord Nelson Hotel. Clean-up began the next day, but the damage to D House meant that its residents had to stay at the Lord Nelson until renovations were completed.

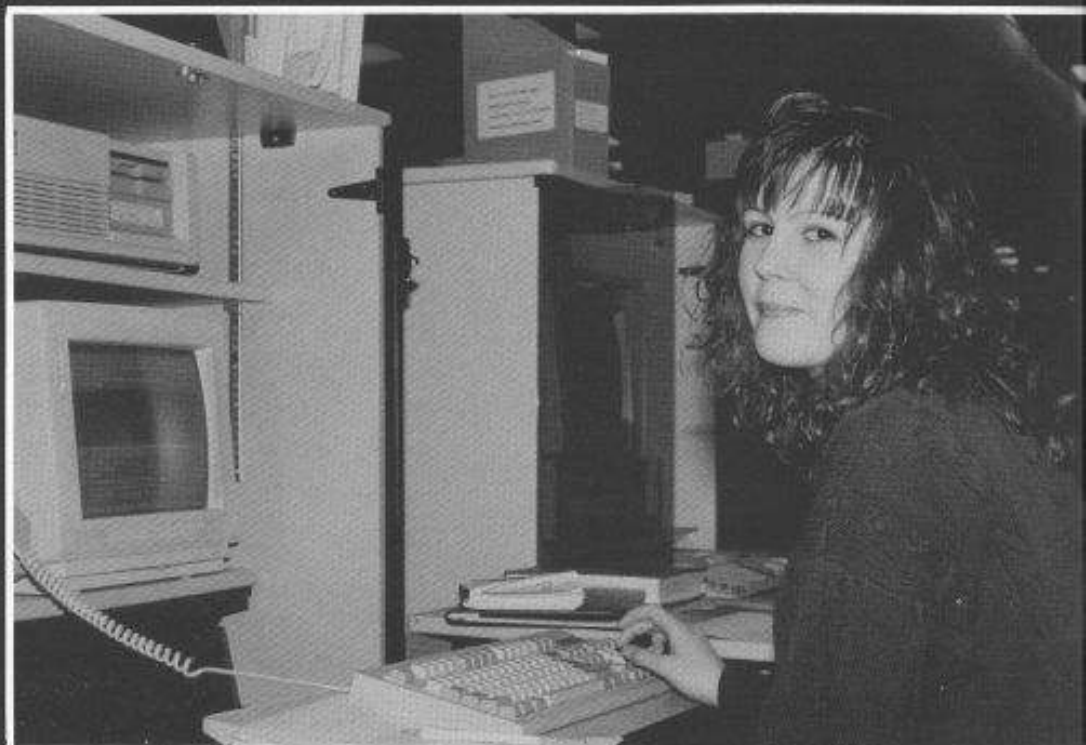
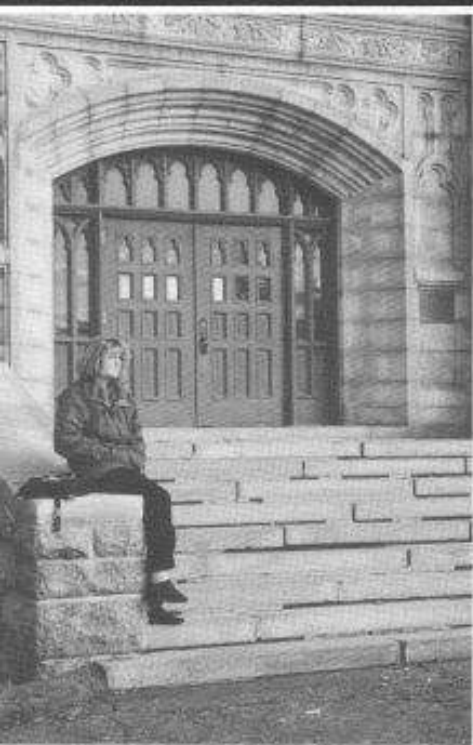
Dr. Kenneth Ozomon, outlined the refund schedule to students and many people graciously pitched in to help the students through this difficult time. Members of the Saint Mary's University Students' Association, as well as the Residence Society were constantly at work to help with moving and cleaning up. Residents of D House received assistance from fellow students and staff, Dalhousie and Mount Saint Vincent Universities, and several Halifax companies. Companies that lent their assistance included The Bay, Eaton's and Sears stores, Sobeys, Pepsi, and the shops at Park Lane and Mark's Work Warehouse. Later that same month Rice Residence students were told that they were being moved. After safety concerns arose during renovation of the residence, the administration decided to move students. On Wednesday January 26, students began moving to the Halifax Hilton, where they remained until the end of the school year. Emptying the high rise and relocating almost 300 students was indeed a challenging project. The four day move went smoothly, thanks to many people: residents, university staff and volunteer movers, comprised of students, staff and faculty, who donated their time to help with the move.

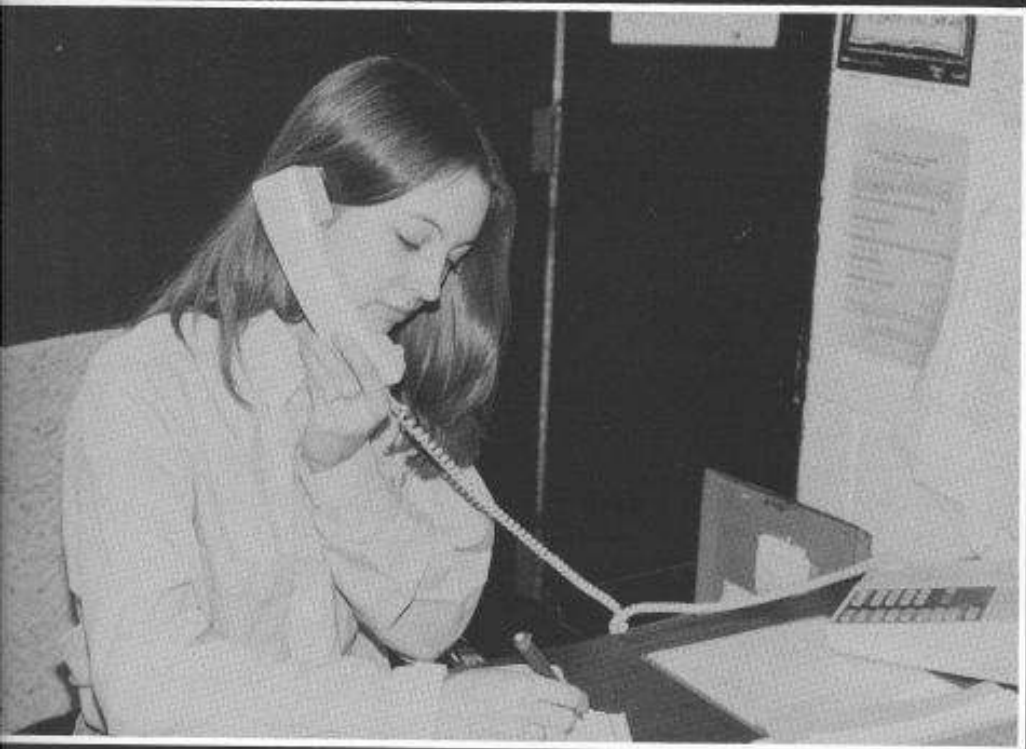

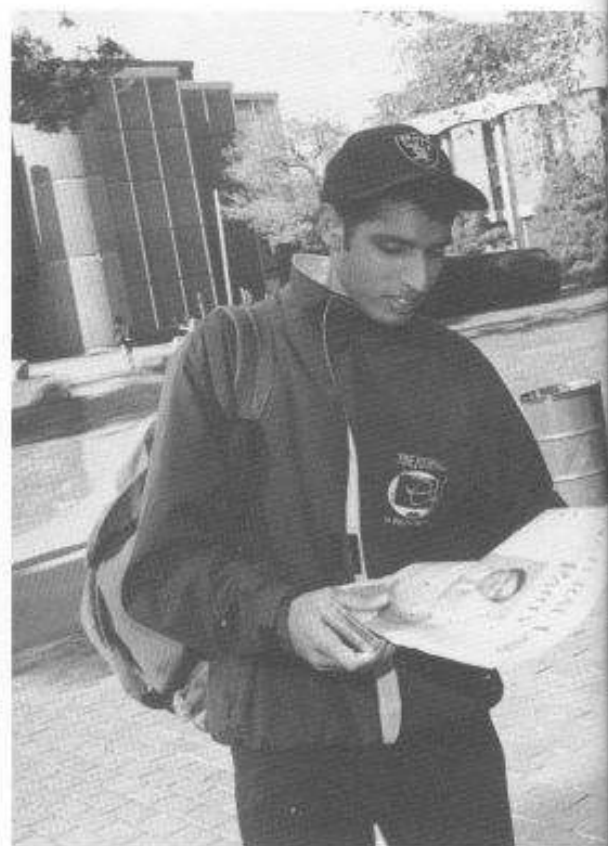

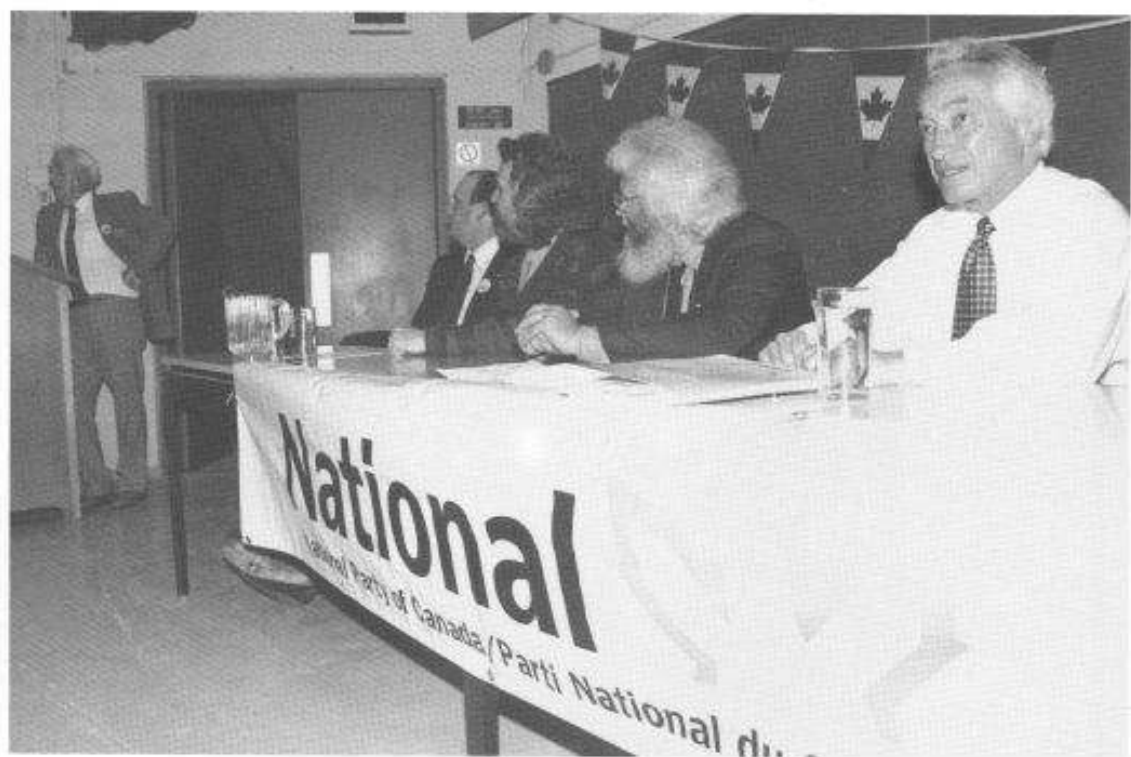




NEWS FLASH

TOUCHED BY INDIVIDUALITY

In dedication to a wonderful instructor and an accomplished singer - Professor William Greer. Thankyou for touching the lives of students and faculty alike at Saint Mary's University. You will be fondly remembered.

Monaday, November 15, Professor William Greer passed away after a brief illness in the Victoria General Hospital.

With Bill's passing we lose not only a gifted instructor and accomplished singer, but also a man whose generosity and caring spirit touched many lives.

A member of the Department of Management since 1990, Bill Greer didn't just teach his classes and leave the campus. He worked to insure his students that their input and feedback were important, and that he was always available to discuss future careers, aspirations and concerns. He was honored when, in 1992, the Commerce society named him

Professor of the Year.

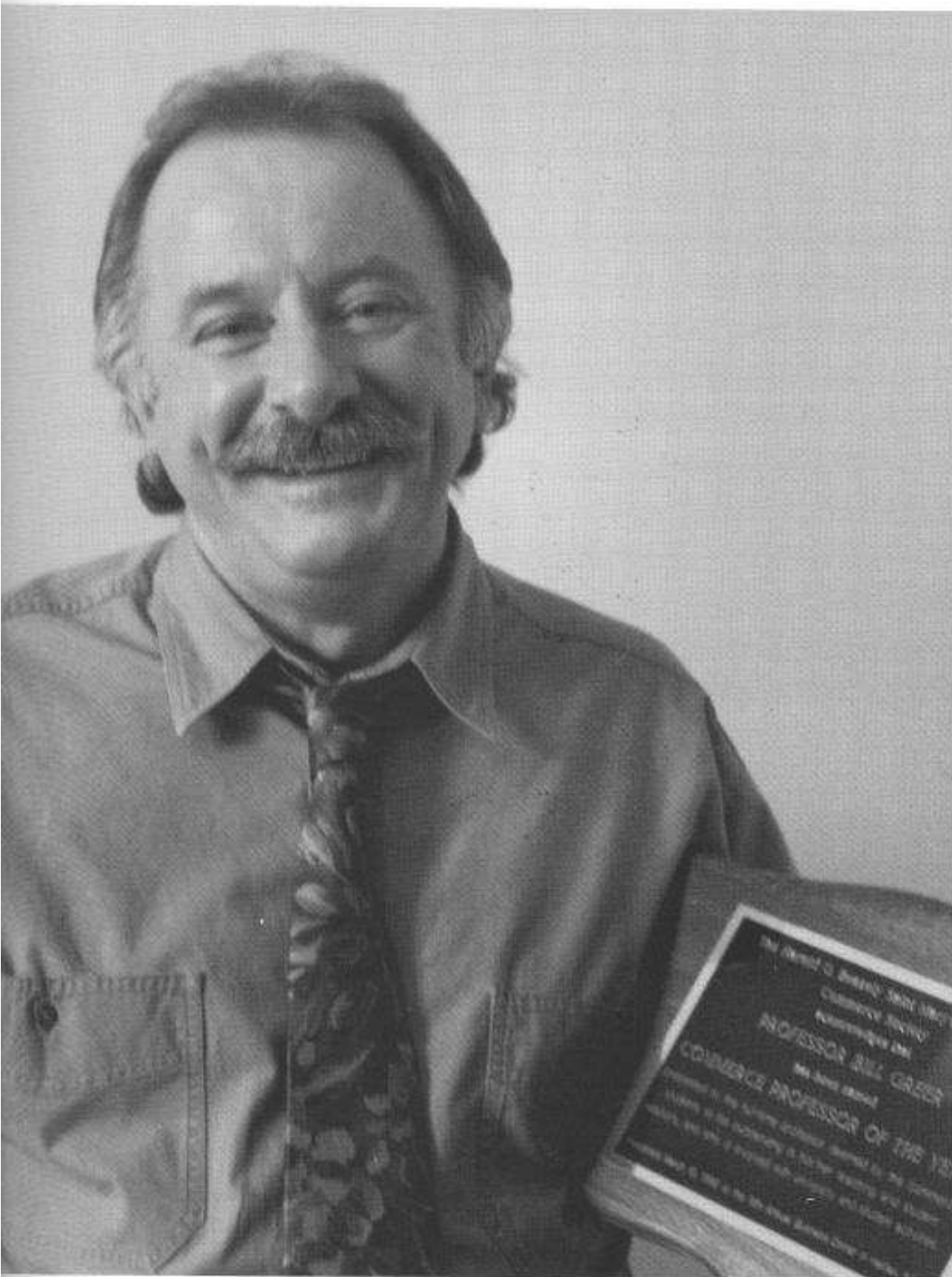
Bill served on numerous academic committees, on the advisory board for AIESEC - a student's association, and on the Quality of Teaching Committee. He was pursuing a PhD in the area of large classroom dynamics and was examining what we at Saint Mary's could do to better prepare our professors and students to cope with the increasing number of students on university campuses.

Before he turned his attention to the world of academics, Bill was a professional singer, who trained in Toronto and Milan, Italy. Happy to put his talents to use, he sang at the 1992 Spring Convocation and

was always willing to perform when the proceeds went directly to a worthy cause.

Although his professional and volunteer activities and outgoing nature made him a well-known figure on campus, Bill was always quick to direct the spotlight elsewhere, bringing attention to activities and accomplishments of his friends, peers and colleagues.

TEACHING FOR POSITIVE SOCIAL CHANGE

Dr. Kelly of the Faculty of Education

Concern for groups who have been generally ignored in all aspects of education, Dr. Kelly feels that knowledge is not worth anything if it is not about you. She feels that it is important to have a balance between the professor and the students and what each brings to the classroom.



Dr. Kelly was born and raised in Newfoundland. She completed her Bachelor of Arts in English and History at Memorial University in Newfoundland. She also received her Masters in Education from Memorial. She then went to Toronto and completed a Doctorate degree at the University of Toronto.

Dr. Kelly taught high school in Labrador for four years. She also taught at Memorial University in the English department for about one and a half years. It was then on to Saint Mary's and she has been here for six years. With the closing of the Faculty of Education in the next school year, Saint Mary's will be losing several excellent professors including Dr. Kelly. Hopefully she will find employment at one of the other Nova Scotia Universities.

She has had several publishings throughout her career. Journals such as the "Journal of Education", "Canadian Journal of Education", "Journal of Educational Thought" have published her work. She has also had chapters in various books. Dr. Kelly has also had her own book published in 1993, entitled "Marketing Place: Cultural Politics, Regionalism, and Reading"

Dr. Kelly feels that the students at SMU are great and also that there is a very supportive working environment. For instance she has a golden retriever, Julie, who she brings with her to work every day unless it is raining. No one has ever made a negative comment about her dog or has told her not to bring Julie with her. Besides looking after Julie, Dr. Kelly enjoys woodworking and her job at Saint Mary's.

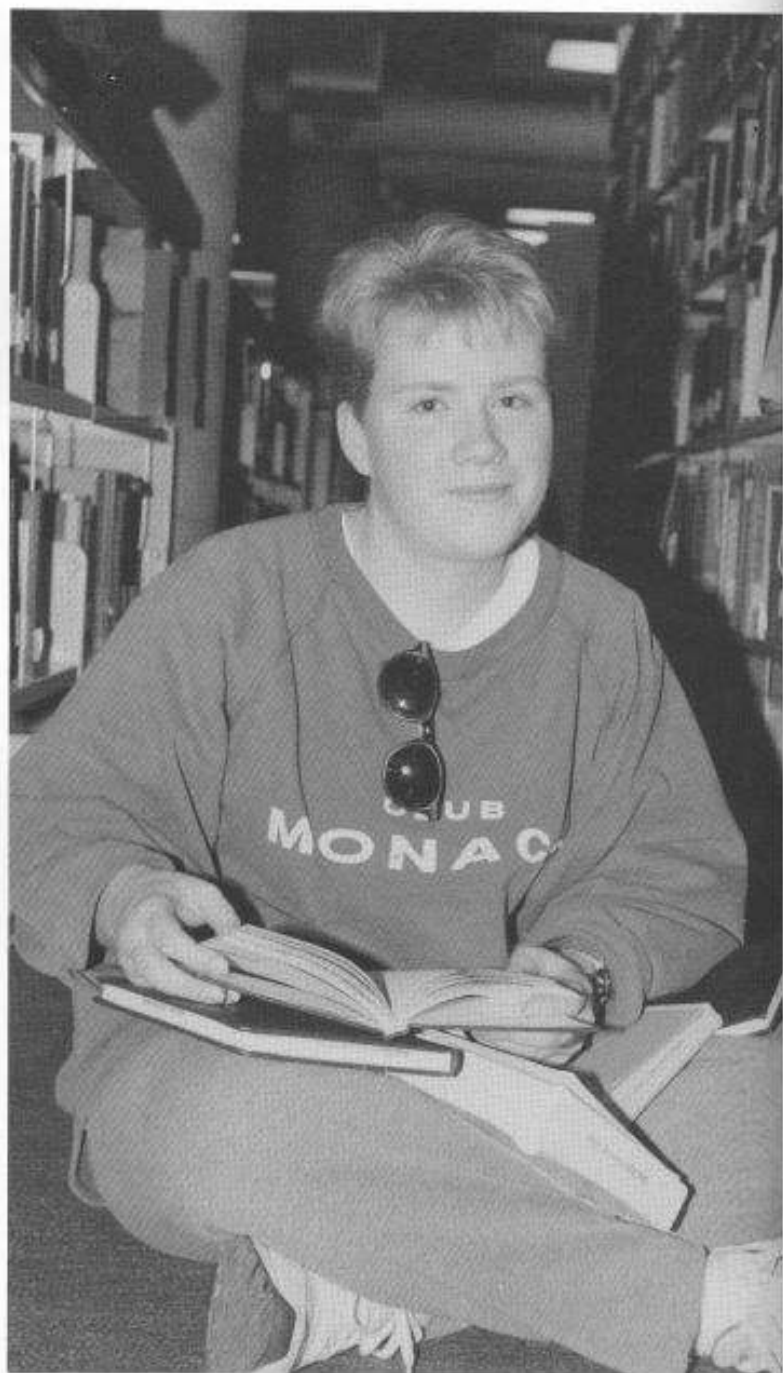
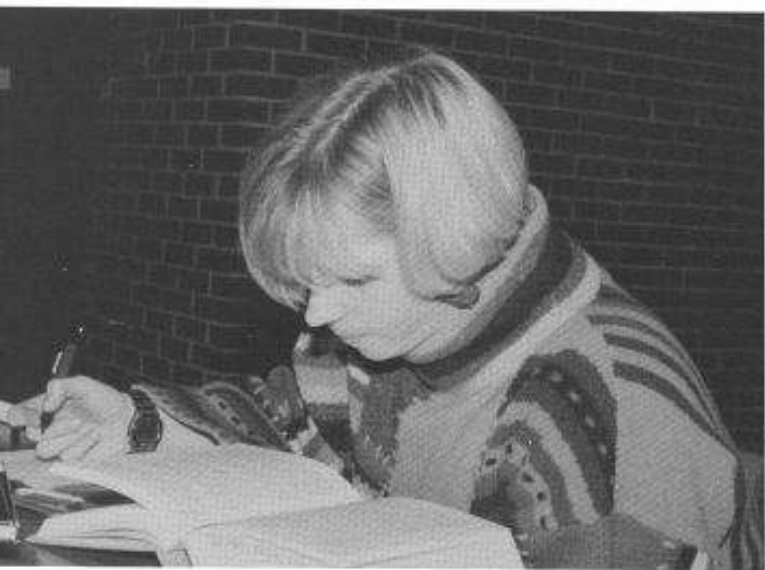
Dr. Zaworotko born in South Wales also spent the first part of his life there. He received a Bachelor of Science from the Imperial College in London. He left South Wales for the University of Alabama in the United States where he obtained his Doctorate degree in Chemistry. In 1982 he moved to Victoria, Canada where he did a Post Doctoral Research Fellow in synthetic chemistry. Three years later he came to Saint Mary's University where he is a professor of organic chemistry and is now the Chairperson of the Chemistry Department.

Dr. Zaworotko has over eighty publications including articles in the "Journal of American Chemistry Society", "Chemical Communications" and a German publication - "Angewandte Chemie". Two of his past undergraduate students, have won NSERC 1967 scholarships for twenty two thousand dollars to go anywhere to do graduate work. Dr. Zaworotko just received the President's Research Award from Saint Mary's University in May 1994. He has also been the recipient of other research grants from NSERC and the Institute for Chemical Science and Technology.

In his free time Dr. Zaworotko coaches the Chemistry Society soccer team which does very well. He is very involved with his students as shown by the pride he has in the Chemistry Society which this year won the honor of Society of the year. Dr. Zaworotko also enjoys jogging, squash and spending time with his children and wife.





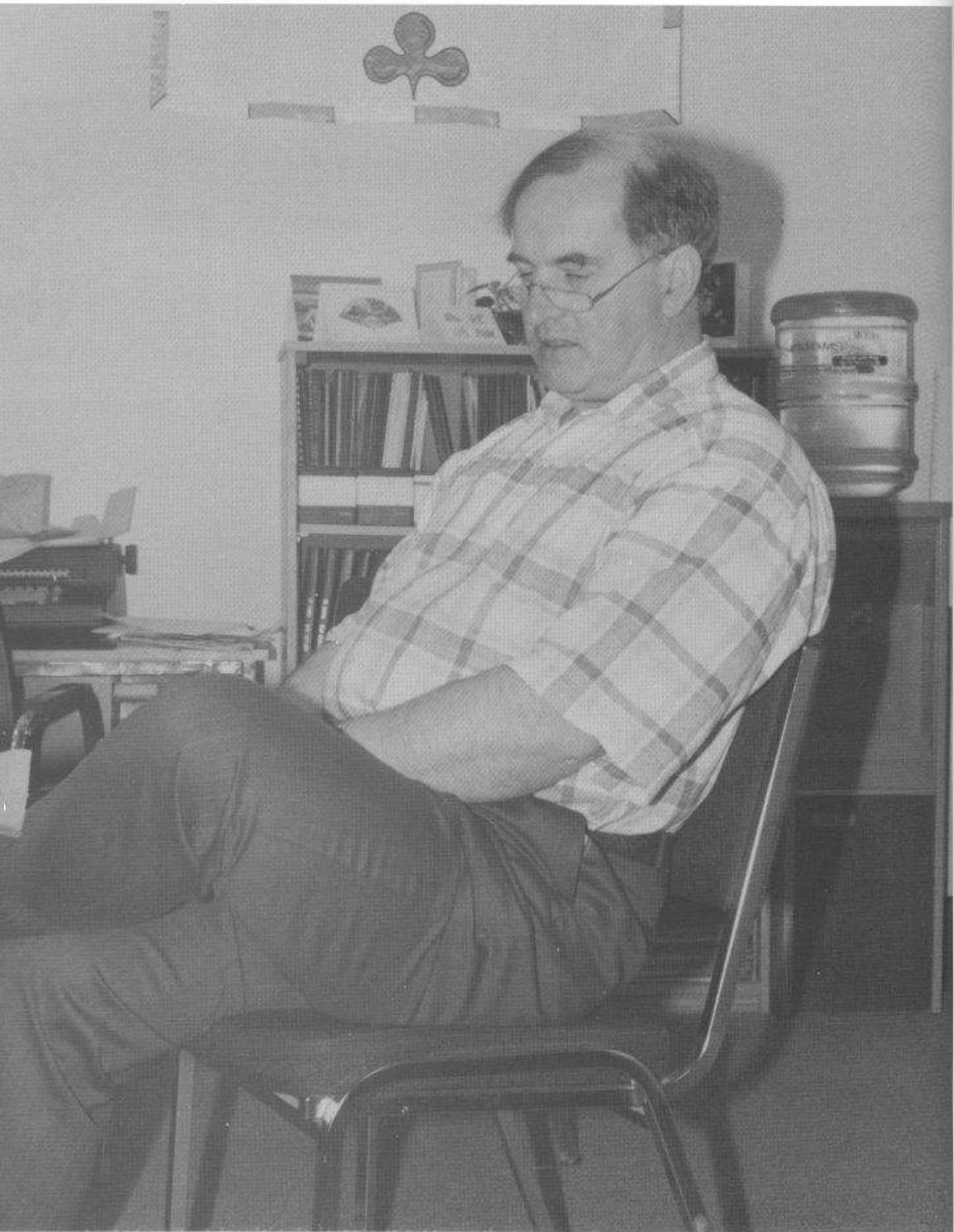

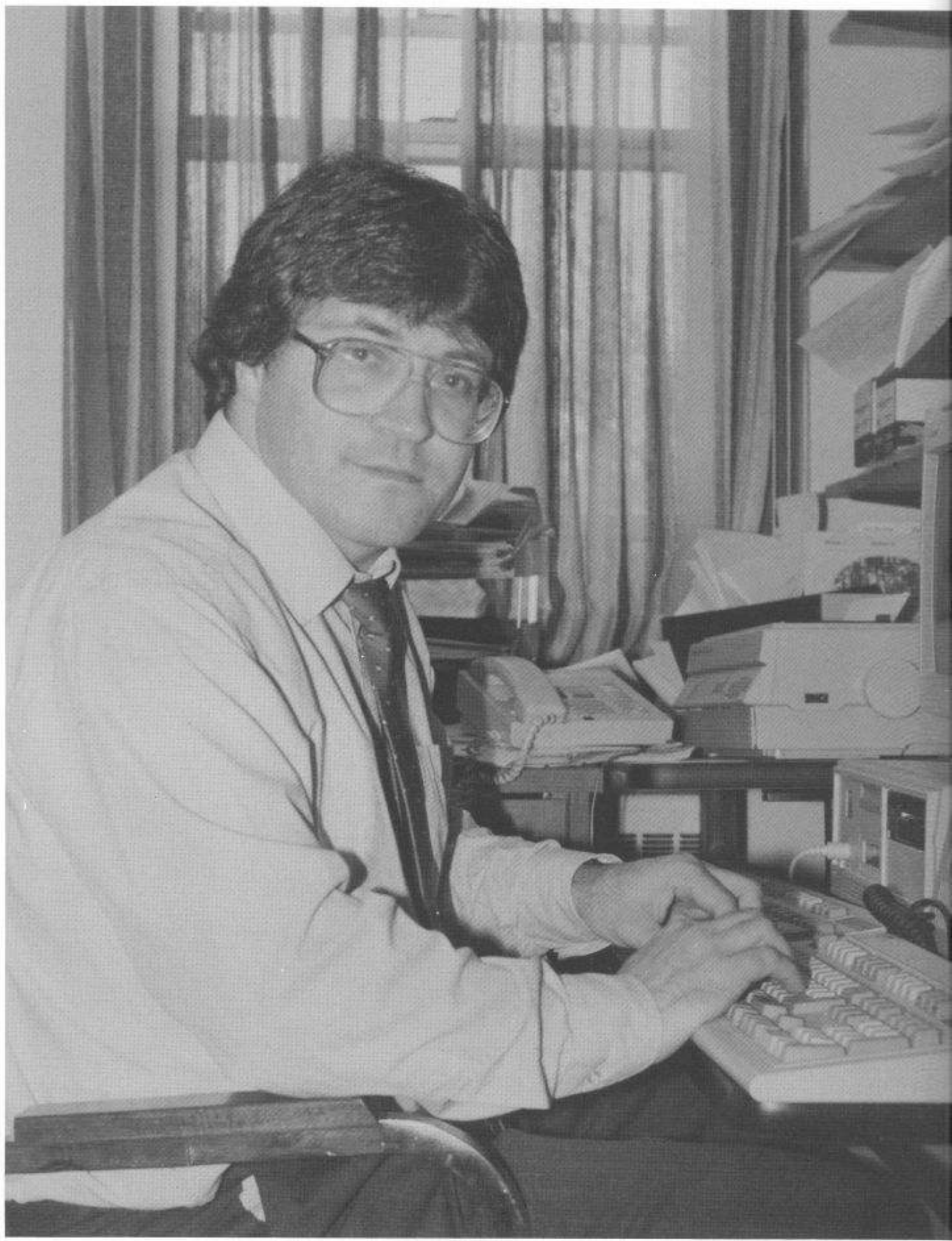
Dr. Byrne was born and raised in Cornerbrook Newfoundland. He spent his summers on the East coast of Newfoundland in a small village on Conception Bay. This is where he developed his love for literature, especially Irish literature. The village resembled Ireland and the Irish language was spoken there until about one hundred years ago.

Dr. Byrne travelled to St. Dunstan's in Prince Edward Island which is now a part of the University of Prince Edward Island. He received a Bachelor of Arts in English and wrote his graduation essay on James Joyce. He then moved to Ireland where he attended the National University of Ireland in Dublin. Dr. Byrne completed a Masters degree in Ireland with a concentration in Anglo and Irish literature. He returned to Newfoundland and taught school there for one year. He then came to Nova Scotia and taught at Mount Saint Vincent University for another year. Moving around quite frequently he returned to St. Dunstan's in P.E.I. and taught there for one year.

He won an IOD fellowship to Oxford and received another Masters degree, this time in Medieval English. He lived in England for two years and then returned to Canada. He went to the University of Toronto where he completed a Doctorate on Shawn O'Casey. After this he came to Saint Mary's and has been here for twenty four years.

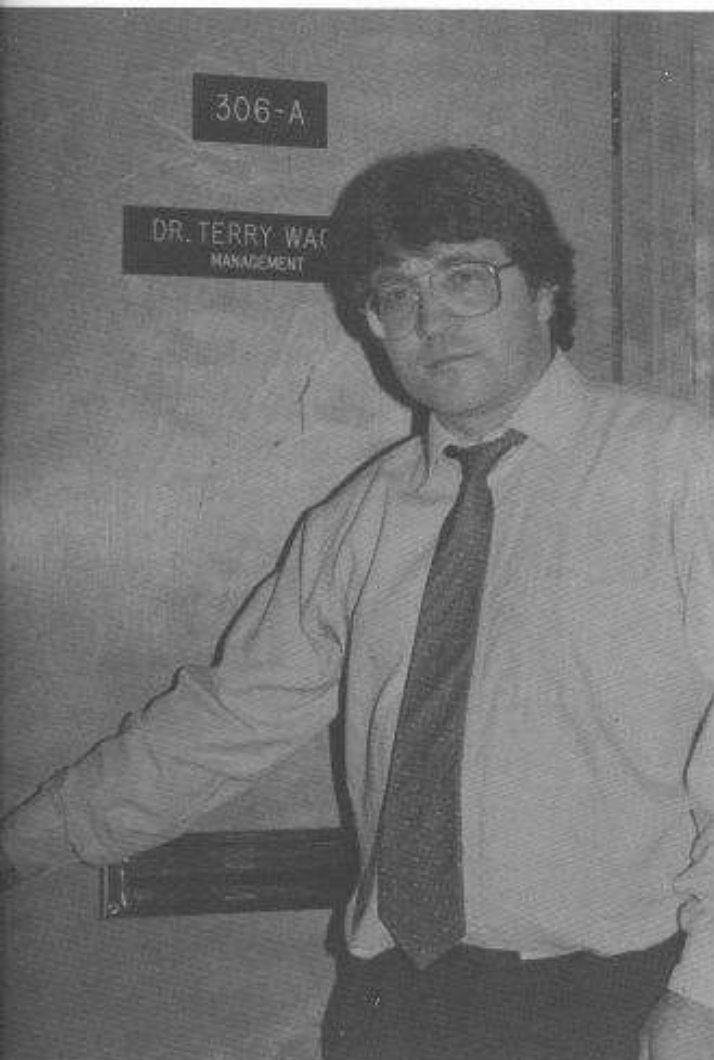
Dr. Byrne has had several publishings including three books. He feels that his major publication was "Gentlemen - Bishops and Faction Fighters." He was made a member of the "Order of Canada" in May 1993. This recognized his achievement of establishing the chair of Irish Studies at Saint Mary's University. He raised over one million dollars to accomplish this goal.

Outside of the University he enjoys spending time with his five children, one who will be attending Saint Mary's in the fall. He also likes to study Newfoundland cultural history, sail, and do things with his hands such as cooking and carpentry work. Dr. Byrne has a love of Saint Mary's University and all of his students.

Born in Kingston, Ontario, Dr. Terry Wagar grew up in Ontario and after highschool attended Queens University. He received a Bachelor of Arts with Honors in Urban and Economic Geography. He then went to the University of Windsor where he obtained a Bachelor of Commerce in Management and Finance. Then it was off to the University of Ottawa Law School for a LLB in Labour and Corporate law. His next degree was from the University of Toronto where he received a Masters of Business Administration with a concentration in Management and Accounting. He then obtained another Masters degree in Industrial Relations concentrating on Collective Bargaining. His last degree was a Doctorate in Labour Relations and Statistics at Virginia Tech.

Between his different degrees he taught at St. Laurence Community College for one year and at Saint Mary's in 1985-86 before he got his Doctorate.

He came back to SMU in 1988 and teaches Industrial Relations and Collective Bargaining. In 1994-95, Dr. Wagar is taking a sabbatical in Australia where he will study at the National Institute for Labour Studies at Flinders University of South Australia.

Dr. Wagar has over one hundred publications in such journals as "Labour Law Journal," "Australian Bulletin of Labour," "Industrial Relations Canada," and his latest publication in "Annals of the Academy of Political and Social Science." He has received several awards including four major Social Science and Humanities Research Council of Canada Grants, MBA professor of the year in 1991 and EMBA professor of the year in 1992.

Outside of the university Dr. Wagar enjoys travelling, which he has done extensively through Europe, the United States, and Western Canada. He also enjoys tennis, golf, hockey and reading. Dr. Wagar has a one and half year old daughter, Emily. His wife is a Legal Assistant at McInnis, Cooper and Robertson, a downtown law firm.

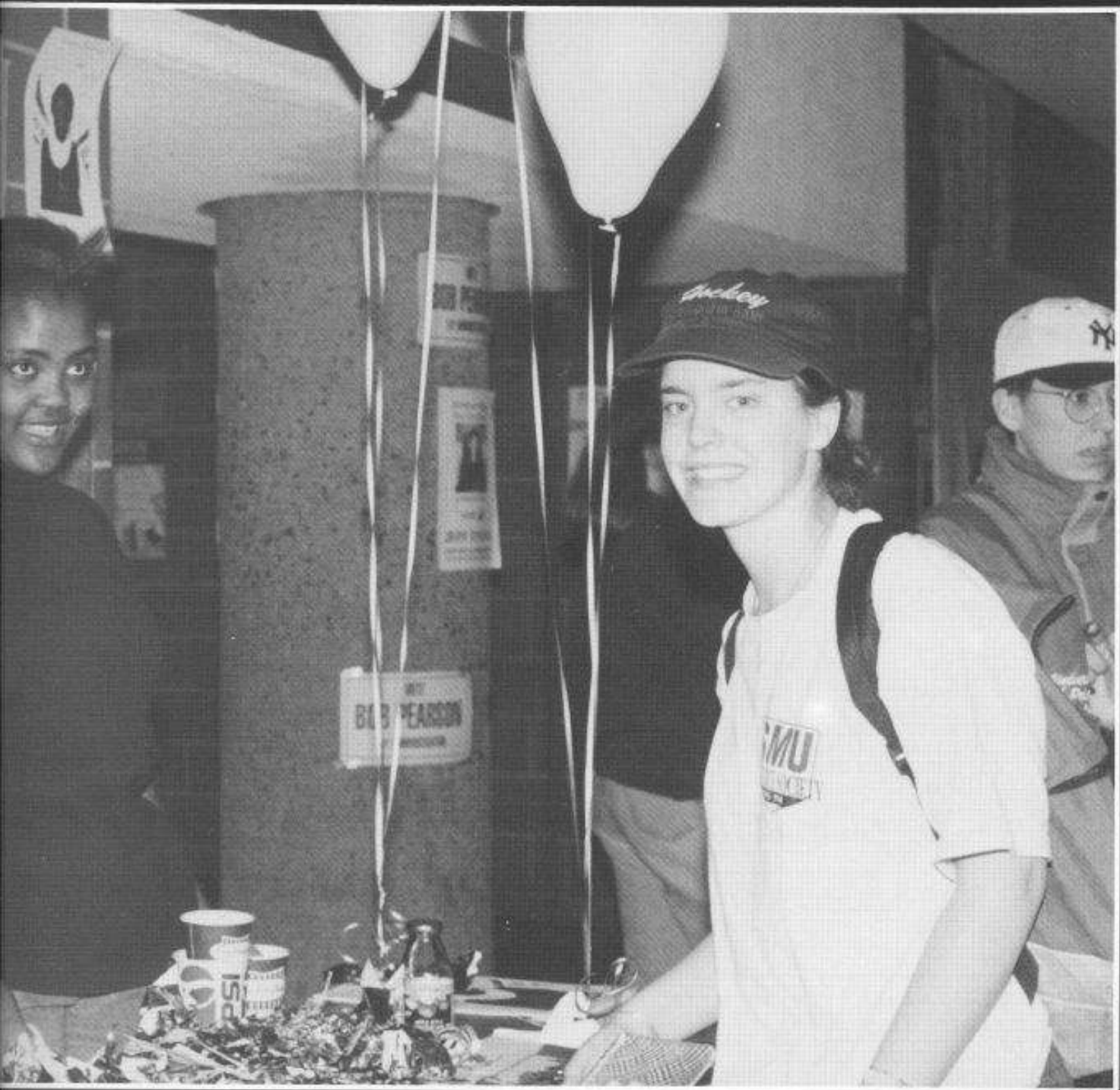

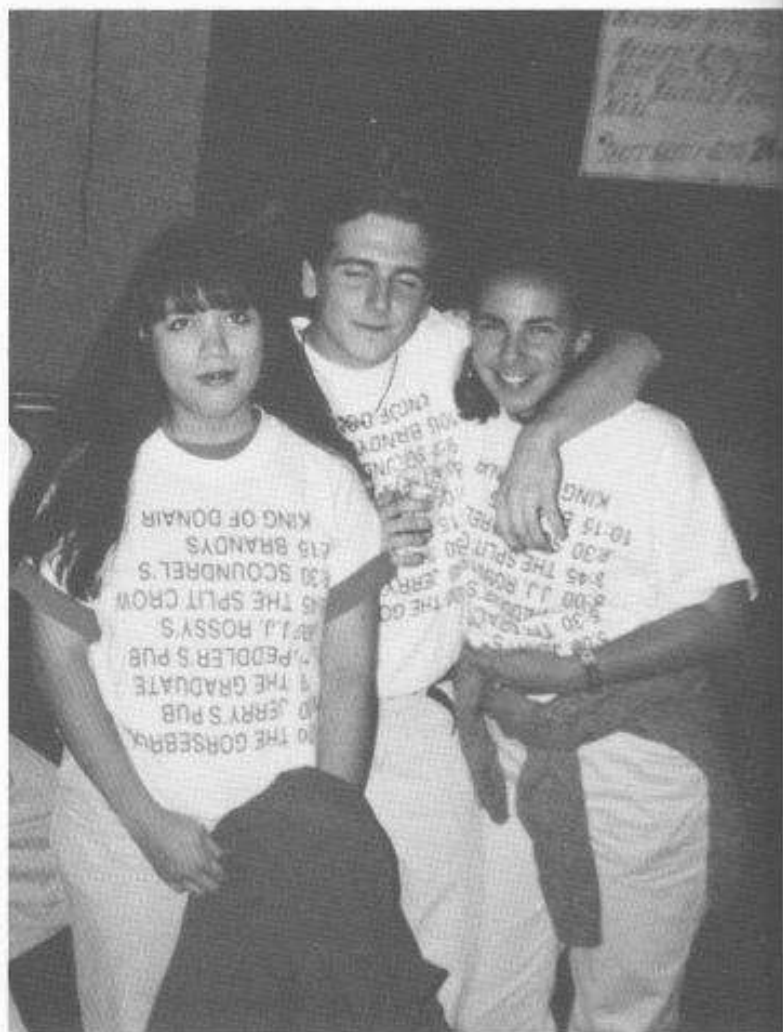


CHEMISTRY SOCIETY Enthusiasm Shown By All!

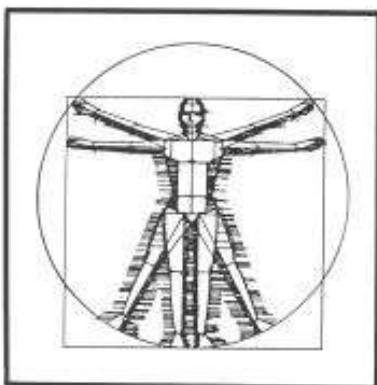

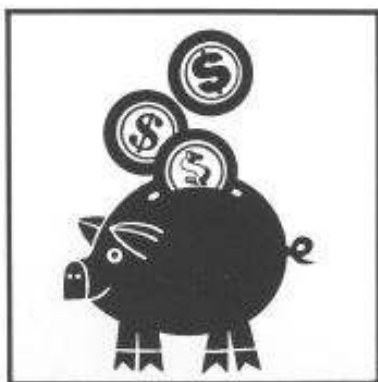

Peer Support Workers provide the following programs/services to students:

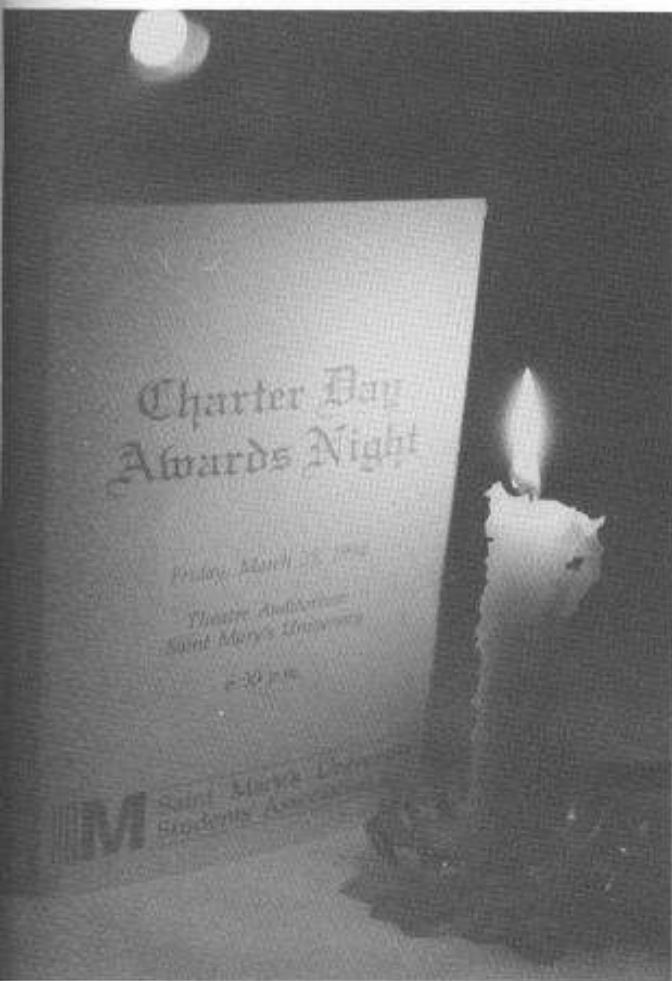
- assistance with the Choices CT career computer program and career resources

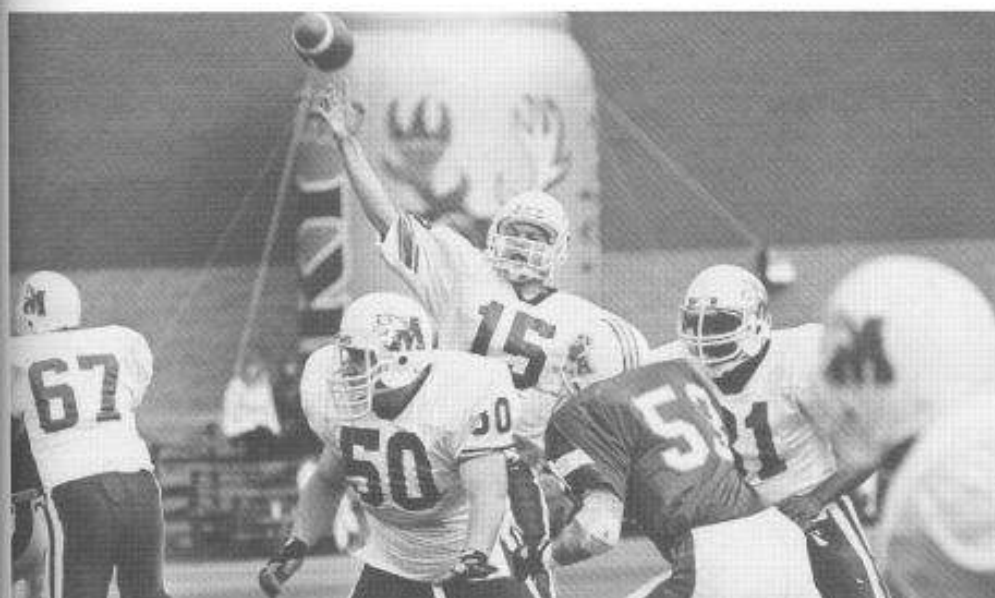

This photo was taken on the day Sykes, a fifth-year senior from Halifax, shattered the record for completion percentage in a single game. The 6', 175-lb., Queen Elizabeth High graduate completed 28 of 30 attempts for a whopping 93.3% efficiency, breaking the old record held by former Calgary quarterback Bob Torrance by 16%. Sykes threw for 303 yards and four touchdowns in a 53-7 win and was named Atlantic conference most outstanding player in addition to his first-team all-Canadian selection and his second consecutive Russ Jackson Award for combining athletic and academic excellence.

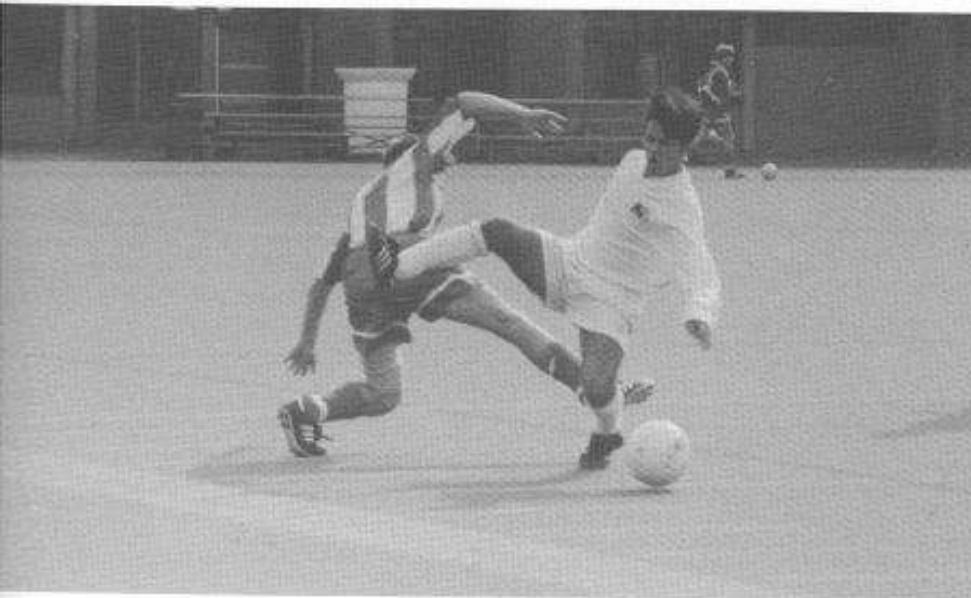

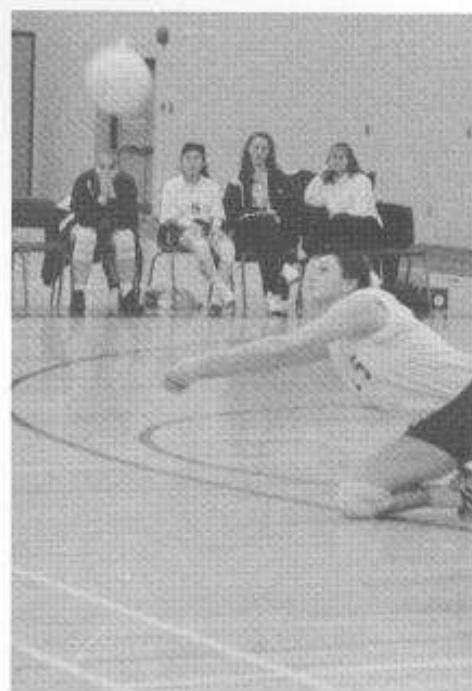

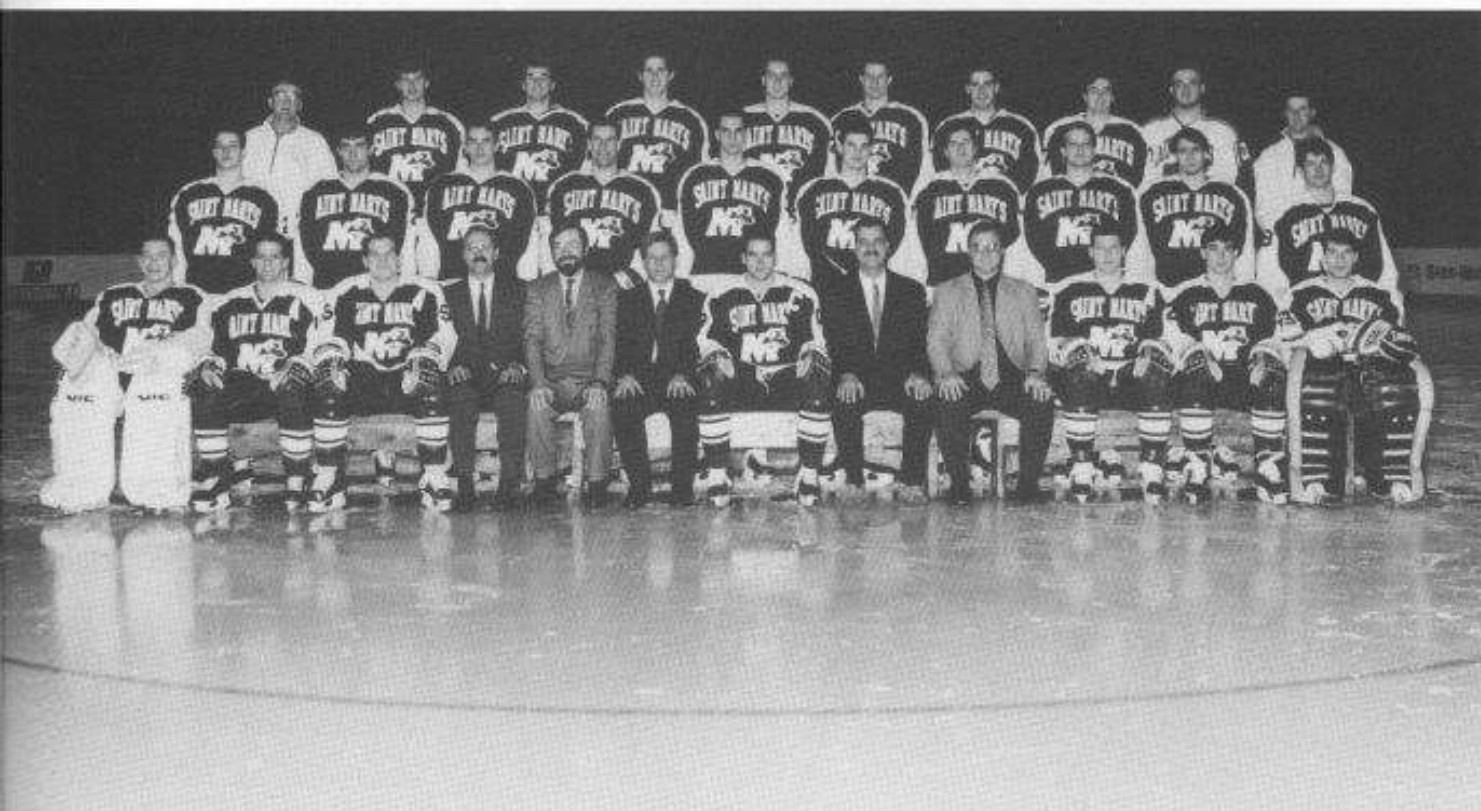

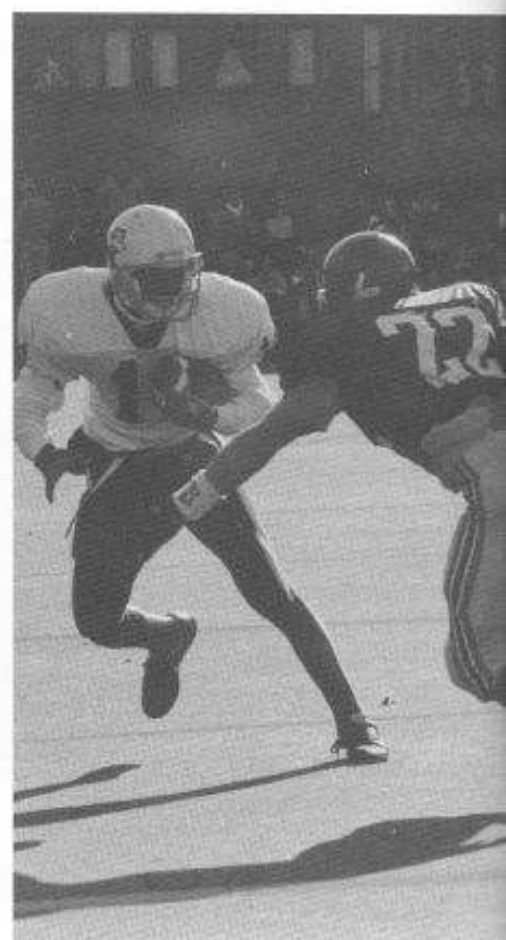
