The Building on Strength Campaign

In 1992 Saint Mary's University remembered the late Frank H. Sobey by naming its Faculty of Commerce in his honour. This year also marked the beginning of the Building on Strength Campaign. This campaign raised money from the private sector to make up the needed \$18 million. The government's contribution of \$6 million got things underway, but it would take over 5 years to raise the rest.

On October 17, 1992 Dr. David F. Sobey kicked off the campaign with a ceremony on the football field. An amount of \$4.5 million was raised that day alone. Over the next five years 34,000 donors would follow the example. SMU students lead off the campaign with a \$600,000 gift. The campaign's goal of \$12 million was nearly reached in June 1995, when the total raised was \$10.1 million. As of December 1997 \$16.4 million had been donated by the private sector, \$4.4 million more than the original goal.

This money not only aided the construction of the Sobey Building, it also supported other areas of the University. Some of these other areas that benefited from the generosity of the community were Athletics, Alumni, Atlantic Center, Scholarships, Field Replacement, Computers, and Academic Programs.

Dr. Sobey contributes the campaign's success to "a total team effort in response to a top quality university." He cites "a dedicated group of volunteers...the President and his talented staff" as major players in the campaign. Their word and the donations of sponsors have led to the construction of a building that will take Saint Mary's well into the future and open a number of opportunities for the University and its students.

The association exists for all students. When necessary, make demands upon it and you will realize how effective our representation can be.



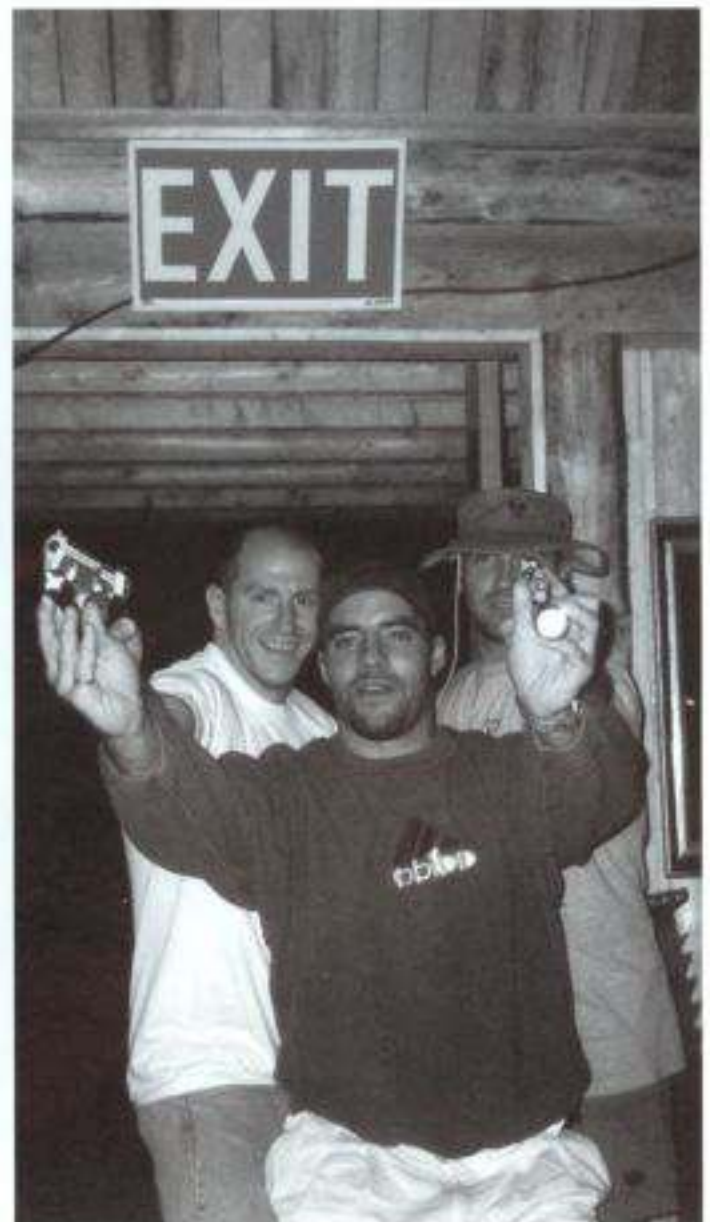

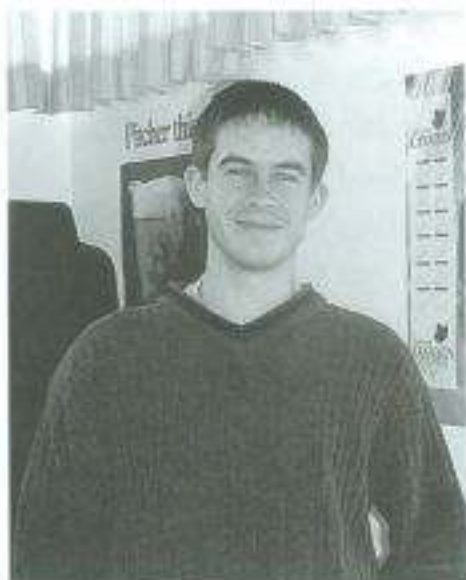


Public Relations

Saint Mary's President Dr. Kenneth Ozmon was decorated with the Order of Canada. Saint Mary's graduated 61 students in The Gambia with Bachelor of Arts degrees through their University Extension Program. Biason resigned at the end of November, citing irreconcilable differences with the direction of SMUSA and the RC as the major factor in his decision. This marks the third year in a row that a member of the SMUSA executive body has not completed their term of office.

On the social scene, our amateur team affiliate, The Pylons, continued to overachieve in intramural ball hockey by reaching the semi-finals before succumbing to the eventual champions, and underachieve in co-ed broomball, losing for the second straight year to The Plungers.

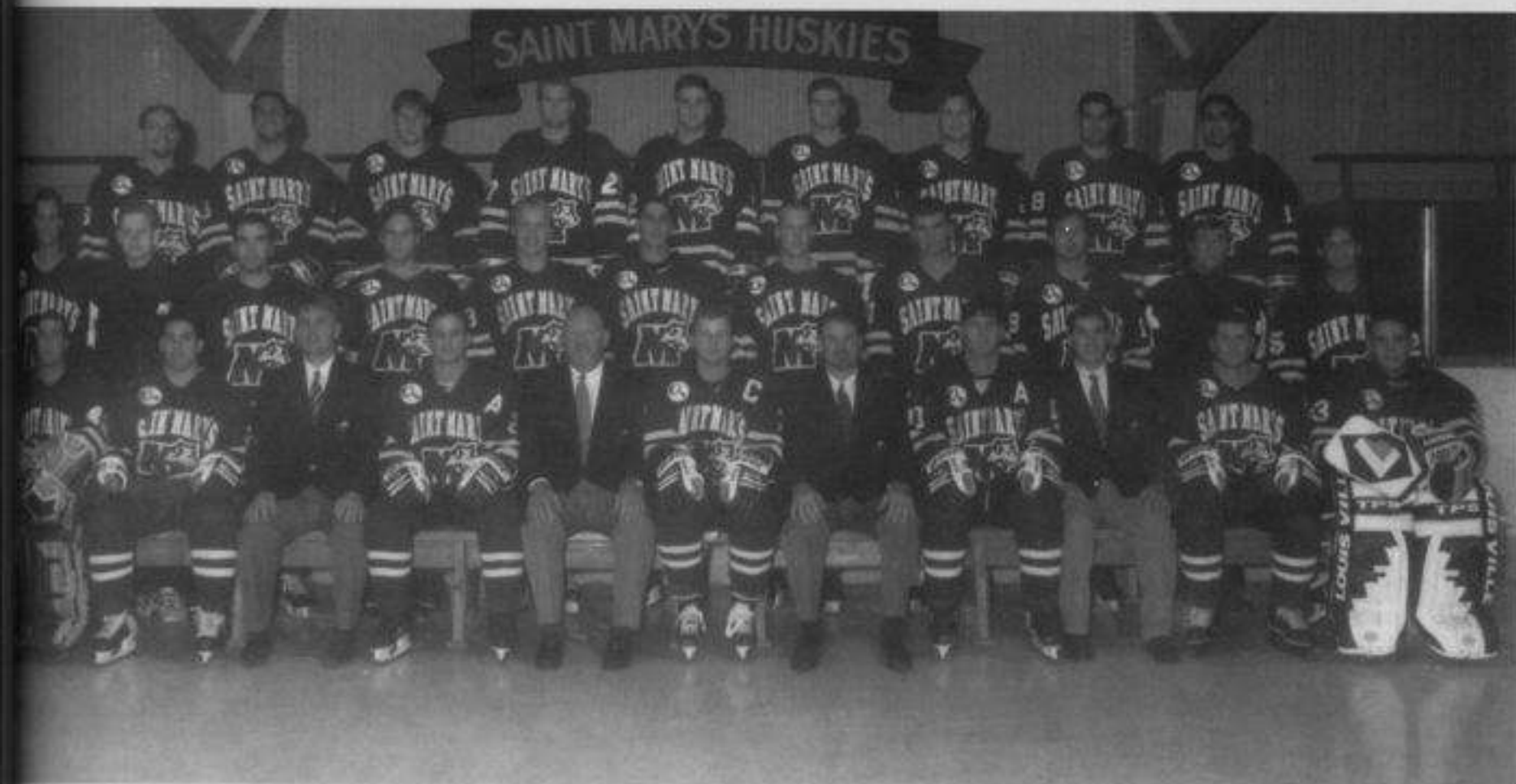


Men's Hockey
