

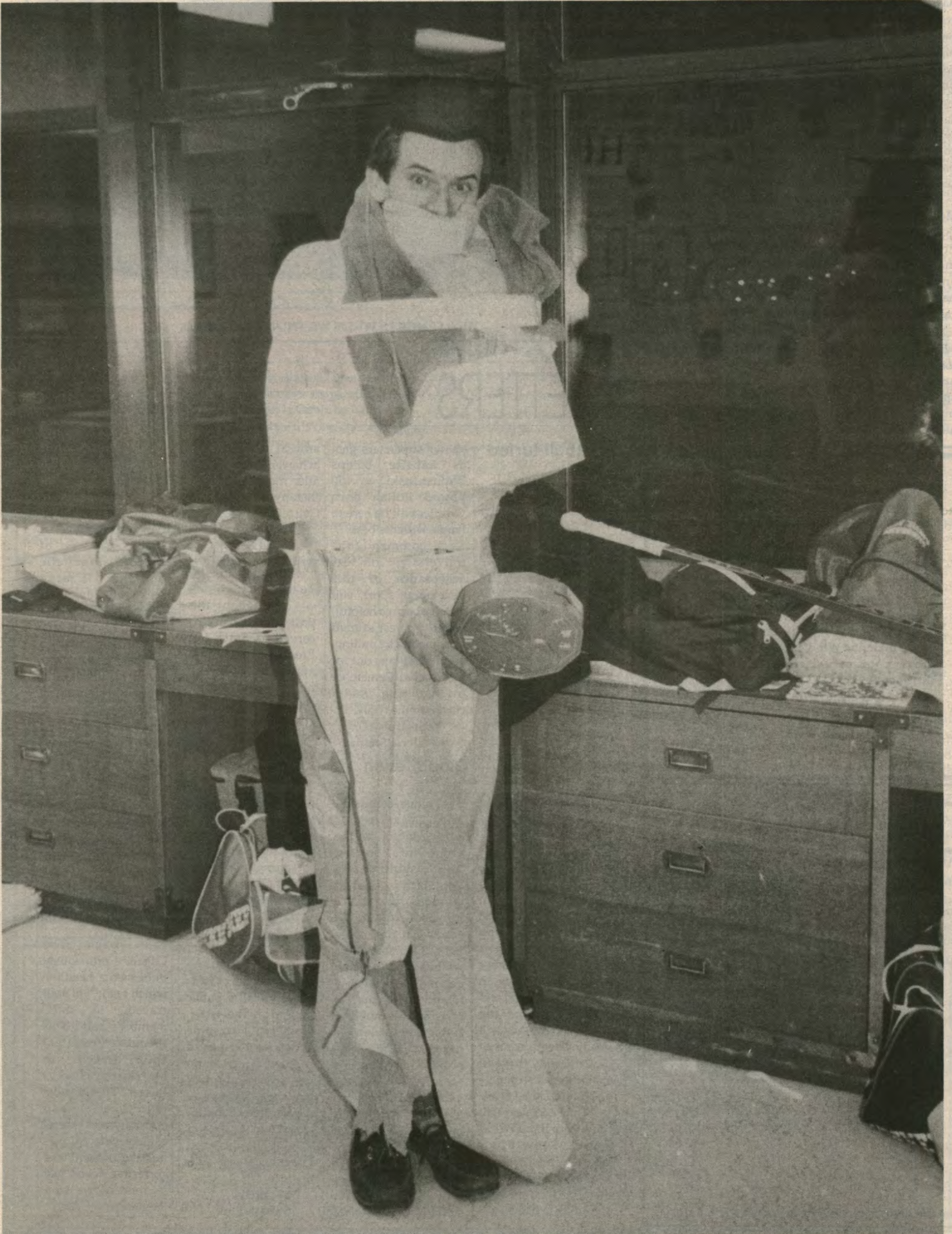

### Wayne's a Payne

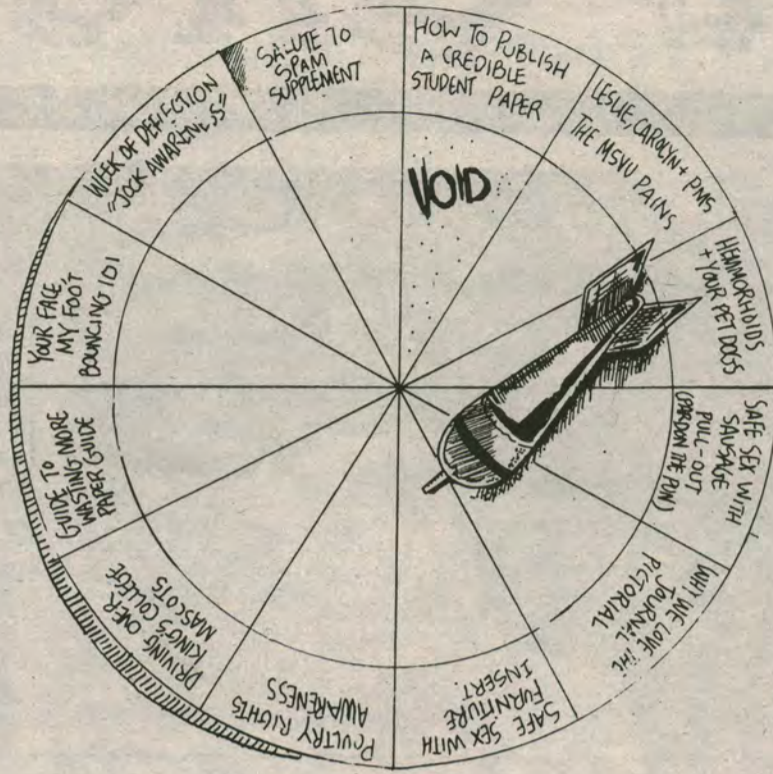

## Council meeting attended

Student fees are to be raised again following lengthy debate at last Sunday's Saint Mary's University Cash Hoarders Association (SMUCHA) meeting. The \$235 per student levy will take effect in September of 1992 in order to afford an increase in Per Diems (per day spending allowances) for SMUCHA executive and Student's Reprehensible Councillors (SRC).

SMUCHA President, Darn Fink, said the increase was necessary as "next year 'banana daiquiris' are going to cost \$5.50 each at St. FX.", and that "the cover charge at strip joints seems to be increasing daily."

President Elect, Homely Fearsome, agreed with Fink adding, "Ask not what your student government can do for you, ask how much booze you can buy for your student government."

Vice President of Administration, W. Hutzisname, had no comment on the issue.

Fink also spoke on the topic of the petition circulating SMU
