## Registrar's Notice

### Final Examinations

The final edition of the Final Formal Examination schedule for 1985-86 is now being prepared and when completed will be posted on the Registrar's Information Boards located at several different locations on campus. Please check carefully and report any actual conflicts to M.J. Wilson, in the Registrar's Office.

### Courses in Summer Session, 1986

The timetable for the two summer sessions, 1986, at Saint Mary's will soon be published. Once it is available, registration for the courses will commence. The dates for Summer Session I are 14 May to 27 June; for Summer Session II, 2 July to 14 August 1986.

### Graduation

(i) The graduation fee of \$20.00 can be paid from now to 8 May 1986 at the Business Office. Please obtain a receipt and take that receipt to the Registrar's Office in order that its number can be retained on file. The receipt itself is to be

presented at the time when the academic gowns are distributed to eligible graduating students.

(ii) Students who do not plan to participate in Convocation are asked to so advise the Registrar no later than Monday, 28 April 1986.

**Mailing of final grades and/or information**  
Grade Report Forms for 1985-86 will be mailed to student's home addresses in May. Should you wish your grades mailed to an alternate address, please fill out the appropriate card available in the Registrar's Office. 21 April 1986 is the deadline for filing such information. Also, if you wish the timetable and information on the 1986-87 academic year sent to an alternate address, please file the appropriate card in the Registrar's Office by 1 June 1986.

### Distinctions for Diploma in Engineering Students

Recently Senate modified the criteria on which distinctions were determined for the Diploma in Engineering programme. Commencing with this year's Convocation, academic regulation 27(b) has been modified for this Diploma programme only so as to require ten only (instead of twelve) full courses (or half course equivalents) taken at Saint Mary's University.

## Meal Plan Survey in

The Students' Association Student Affairs Committee has submitted its report on the current food plan in place at Saint Mary's.

The report is based upon a survey conducted among residence students late in the first semester.

The survey polled 14% of residence students in High Rise II and Lowrise.

Results of the survey showed that students on the meal plan enjoy the flexibility and feel it is as good or better than other plans they are aware of.

The survey also showed that 51% of the respondents felt they were not eating properly on the current plan.

45.9% of those surveyed felt the plan forced them to eat in their rooms.

The Student Affairs Committee has determined that Meal Plan II (1480 points) does not have enough points to allow students who are big eaters to eat sufficiently. The committee has recommended that the point value of Meal Plan II be increased with no great increase in cost to students.

The committee also recommends the establishment of a counselling service on how to eat properly on the plan.

## The Father William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Teaching

You are invited to nominate a candidate. Each nomination must be supported by the name of at least ten persons from among alumni, faculty, and students. The nomination must also be accompanied by a brief statement in support of the nomination.

Established in 1983 by the Saint Mary's University Alumni Association, the Father William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Teaching is awarded annually to a faculty member who has made an extraordinary contribution to the education. The Award is open to faculty members who have completed at least five years of teaching service at the University.

In making its recommendation to the Alumni Executive, the selection committee will have regard for the following factors in making its decision, as well as to any other factors considered pertinent:

- 1) Teaching ability and classroom performance.
- 2) Interaction with students.
- 3) Extra curricular contributions to the life of the university community.

The award will be presented at Spring Convocation, Monday, May 12, 1986.

The award will consist of an appropriate medal and a monetary award.

## Response to Royal Commission

On January 11, 1986, student delegates representing a wide range of interests and views at Saint Mary's University gathered to generate a response to the Royal Commission on P.S.E. in Nova Scotia (1985).

The day long workshop was sponsored by the Students' Association and resulted in a student response to the Royal Commission.

Workshops and discussions were held on each of the six chapters of the report. A consensus was reached by way of debate and vote on many of the issues raised by the Commissions' Report.

## Alumni Leadership Awards

### Specific Criteria

Consideration will be given to (a) academic standing; (b) leadership qualities; (c) need.

### Procedures

Applications are available at the Alumni Office. Deadline for applications in June 2nd. Awards made in July. Awards will be made by Alumni Association Executive on recommendation of the Athletic Committee. Applications may be turned into the Financial Aid Office or the Alumni Office no later than June 2, 1986.

Submission deadline at the Financial Aid Office for Bursary Applications received in the Student Loan package is February 10, 1986. Applications must be processed by a Financial Aid Counsellor. Applications received after this date will not make the provincial deadline.

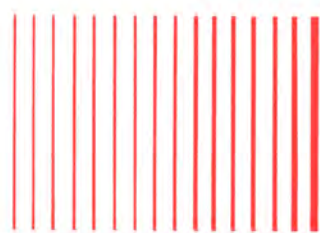

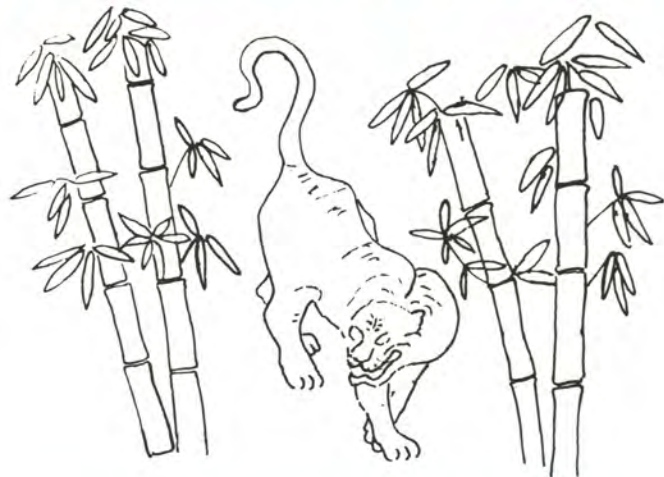
