This will be the last issue of the Maroon & White prior to the expiration of my term of Presidency and I thought I would take this opportunity to say a few words to my fellow Alumni.

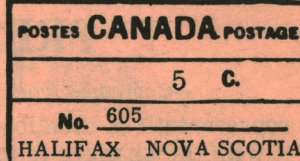
We enjoyed a reasonably successful year as an Association and a vote of thanks and appreciation to all of those who helped make it so. The Annual Committee Reports will be published soon and they will describe in some detail the activities of our Association, so I won't steal their thunder by commenting on the activities in this column.

There were three happenings, however, that I will mention. Firstly, we had a very successful dinner for Father Labelle last Spring on the occasion of his retirement from the Presidency of the University. It was a small, but intimate dinner attended by the Executive of the Alumni Association and some of Father Labelle's close friends. The other two occurrences referred to took place at our Annual Dinner in December. A gift of money was presented to the University in the amount of \$2,500.00 by the Alumni Association. We also presented the University with an excellent permanent sound system for the New Reading Room as our Annual Dinner was the first official function to take place in this new

facility. A brass plaque has been installed in the Reading Room by the University commemorating the occasion and the gift.

An earlier issue of the Maroon & White outlined in some detail the Saint Mary's University Act, 1970. The passing of this Act by the Legislature of Nova Scotia made Saint Mary's an autonomous body. KAMP

For the second consecutive year the students of Saint Mary's University are undertaking to operate a summer camp, based on the campus, for some of the less fortunate children in the metro area. This project is known as the Kamp.

The purposes of this program are as follows: that the socially and culturally deprived children of the area (by direct association with university students) may realize that a higher level of living, at least education wise, is possible and attainable for them and that a few of the innumerable less fortunate children be given an opportunity to have a good and happy summer camping experience.

During the months of July and August four camps, two of fifteen — day duration and two of eight — day duration each catering to 20 boys and 20 girls will be held at Saint Mary's. The program of activities is unique and highly diversified taking full advantage of all facilities on campus and in and around the metro area. There are also excursion trips to various historic and recreational sites within the boundaries of Nova Scotia. One characteristic of which we are very proud is that we maintain a staff of one counsellor for every four children. The counsellors eat, sleep, play and learn with the Kampers. Our program is both educational and entertaining for the children and the students.

Two complete floors in the High Rise residence have already been secured for our operation. Due to the 30% increase in program length and 60% increase in the total number of children (160) our budget this year is expected to run in excess of \$11,500 as opposed to 1970's costs of \$9,329.

It will be hard for us to surpass last years tremendous success, but with the experience behind us we are working hard to out perform ourselves.

Kamp offers a unique opportunity for students to join and work together with all facets of the community. Help us build a better place in which to live. We need your support.
