ST. MARY'S COLLEGE

In September, 1913, the Most Rev. E. J. McCarthy, Archbishop of Halifax, entrusted the management of St. Mary's College to the Christian Brothers of Ireland. A new building has since been erected and is now fully equipped. With the additional accommodation provided by this extension, St. Mary's has facilities for good educational work.

The College stands indebted to the zeal in the cause of Catholic education of the Archbishop, the clergy and the citizens of Halifax, by means of whose generous donations the building was erected.

St. Mary's College admits both resident students and day students. Boys under eleven years of age are not admitted as boarders, but they may enter the Preparatory Department as day-scholars if their school work reaches the required standard. Students may be received at any time during the year, but it is advisable that they should enter, if possible, at the opening of the school year in September.

Applicants for admission who are not known to the College authorities must furnish satisfactory references. The diplomas of any recognized school will be accepted as evidence of standard.

CURRICULUM

By virtue of its charter from the Legislature of Nova Scotia, St. Mary's College is empowered to grant degrees in Arts.

The College has been affiliated to the Nova Scotia Technical College in Halifax. Students of St. Mary's who follow successfully its two years' Engineering Course are admitted to the Nova Scotia Technical College for the final two years' course prescribed for its degree.

The religious training of the students and the formation of character are objects of first importance in St. Mary's.

ST. MARY'S COLLEGE PROVIDES:

A Preparatory Course.

A Collegiate Course of Four Years.

An Arts Course of Three Years.

An Engineering Course of Two Years.

A Commercial Course of Three Years.

The Preparatory Course is intended for pupils who are not sufficiently advanced in their studies to take up the Collegiate Course. Boys who have completed Grade V of the Public Schools, or an equivalent course, are eligible for the Preparatory Department.

In the Collegiate Department a general course for each year will be selected by the College from the subjects of the Programme.

In selecting the subjects of study for the Arts Course, the College authorities will take into account the probable future career of the students and the number of applicants for any particular branch.

Ample provision is made for all the practical work that is required for the Course in Engineering.

The Commercial Course is open to all who have followed the general Collegiate Course, or an equivalent, for at least one year.

Written examinations are held towards the close of each term and the results are made known to the parents. These examinations determine the student's class standing for the year. Every student who is successful in a subject is credited with First Class Distinction, Second Class Distinction or Pass. The names are arranged in order of merit in both Distinction and Pass Lists.

At the end of the school year Diplomas are awarded to all who have satisfactorily completed the year's course. Students who attain a high standard of excellence are awarded Distinction Diplomas.

Debates on literary and other subjects, vocal music and physical training are all part of the College Curriculum. Football, hockey, baseball and other games are played by the students.

TERMS AND FEES.

The school year is divided into three Terms:

First—September to Christmas.

Second—Christmas to Easter.

Third—Easter to Midsummer.

A reduction is made in the case of brothers.

An extra charge of \$2.00 per Term is required from students who take Typewriting or Science.

Students who desire lessons in Instrumental Music may take them at approved hours, at the teacher's rates.

Medical attendance, if required, will be an extra charge.

All charges are payable in advance, at the beginning of each Term.

Deductions are not allowed for absence unless it is due to long illness.

Books and stationery may be purchased at the College at current prices. Accounts for books cannot be opened for day students.

Parents of boarding students may arrange with the Brothers to have their sons supplied with necessary books, stationery, etc.

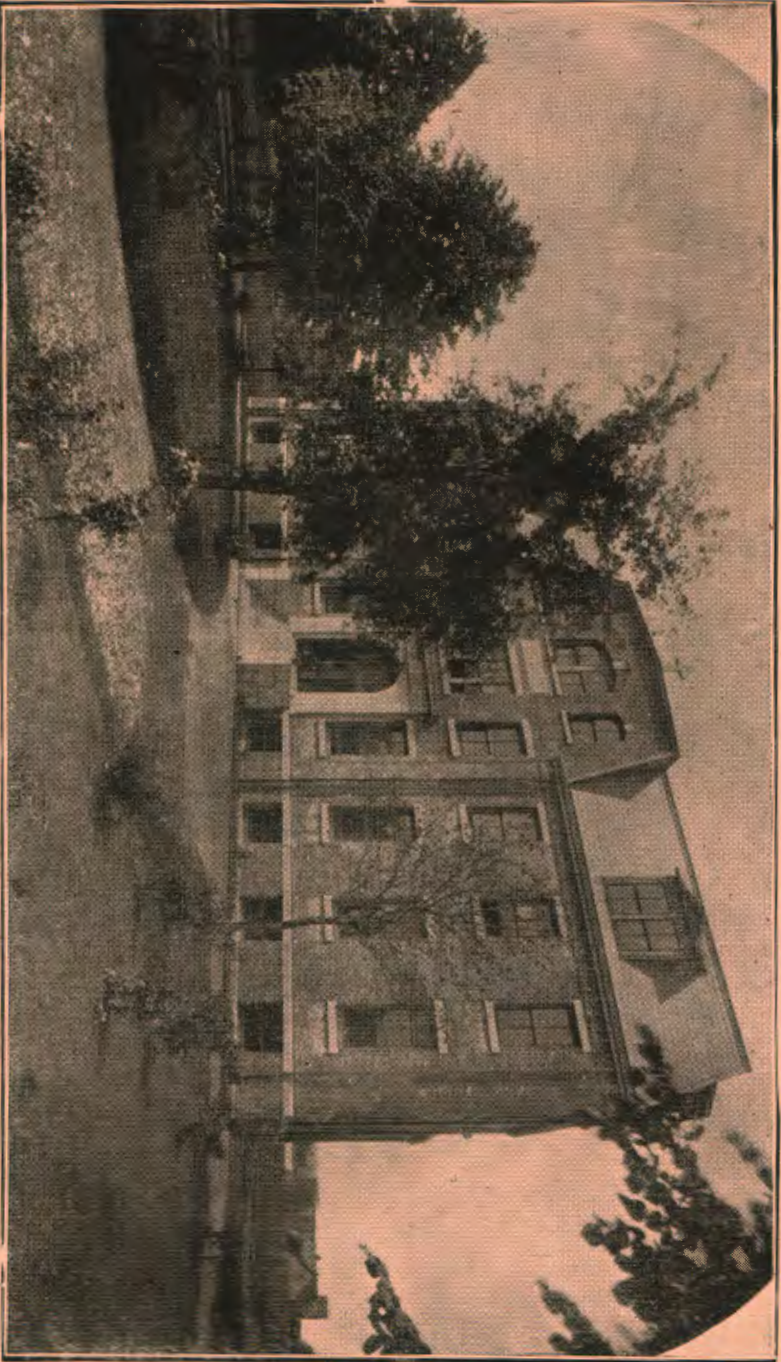
Each boarding student should bring a supply of clothing, towels, napkins, a napkin ring, a laundry bag, toilet articles, etc. The owner's full name should be on each article.

Boarders whose parents reside in the city may be permitted to join the home circle for some hours on Sunday.

The Scholastic Year begins in September and ends in June.
Vacation is given for about three weeks at Christmas.

Students may remain at the College during Christmas vacation at a charge of \$15.00. Students may not remain during the summer vacation.

MATRICULATION EXAMINATION

The following is the uniform Matriculation Syllabus for students seeking admission to the Engineering Course of the Universities and Colleges affiliated with the Nova Scotia Technical College.

1. ARITHMETIC AND ALGEBRA.

Arithmetic. Algebra, as in Grade XII of the N. S. High School Course, or its equivalent.

2. GEOMETRY AND TRIGONOMETRY.

Geometry, as in Grade XII, or equivalent. Trigonometry: Plane Geometry, as in Grade XII, or equivalent.

4. FRENCH OR GERMAN.

Regulation for Students conditioned in Matriculation:

“No student shall be admitted to the full work of the first year of the engineering course who is deficient in Mathematics, or in more than one other matriculation subject. Any student who has more conditions than mentioned above may enter a College, and take a combined Arts and Engineering Course, provided he can satisfy the matriculation requirements of that College. *Such a person cannot be considered a regular first year student in engineering, and will require three years' work to complete the first two years of the engineering course. All matriculation requirements must be met before the student can enter the second year of the engineering course.*”
