The Reverend William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Excellence in Teaching (To be presented at the evening ceremony)

In 1983, the Alumni Association, in cooperation with the Faculty Union and the Students' Representative Council, established the Reverend William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Excellence in Teaching. This award is open to faculty members who have made an extraordinary contribution to the education of Saint Mary's students through teaching in the University's tradition of quality undergraduate education. Nominations are invited from alumni, students, and faculty members. This medal is presented at Spring Convocation together with a cheque for \$1,500. Previous winners of this prestigious award are:

This year's winner is Dr. Janet Hill, Professor of English.

Dr. Hill began teaching at Saint Mary's in 1998 as an Assistant Professor of English. She graduated with her Bachelor of Arts (Honours English Language and Literature) at the University of Sheffield in 1964. She continued her studies at Dalhousie, completing her

Master of Arts in 1989 and her doctorate in 1997. Since she began teaching at Saint Mary's she has been involved with several committees, including the Hiring Committee and the chair of the undergraduate conference committee. Dr. Hill still holds this position and last year she accompanied four students to St. Thomas University in Fredericton.

In the summer of 2001, together with her colleague, Dr. Goran Stanivukovic, Dr. Hill developed a special topics course called "Shakespeare in Stratford-upon-Avon". One of her student's commented that this course "has drawn a lot of excitement and interest among students at Saint Mary's and the Halifax Community". Dr. Hill was the recipient of a Senate Research Grant in 2002 and spent six weeks in Stratford-upon Avon where she continued her research on her next book-length study, which is tentatively entitled Women of Un-Certain Age: Shakespeare's Older Women. Dr. Hill has also participated in numerous conferences, most recently the International Conference on In-Yer-Face Drama in Bristol, UK in September 2002.

Dr. Hill is the author of several works, *Hamlet with Related Readings Teacher's Guide* (with Dr. Barry Fox) and she also was Editor and Introduction Writer to *Proceedings of the Atlantic Universities Teaching Showcase 2000*. She is a member of several associations and organizations, like the Shakespeare Association of America, the Association For Canadian Theatre Research, Association of Canadian College and University Teachers of English.

HONORARY DEGREE RECIPIENTS

At this year's Spring Convocations, Saint Mary's University will confer six honorary degrees: three in the afternoon and three in the evening.

AFTERNOON CONVOCATION

Harold G. Coward

Dr. Harold Coward was born in Calgary, Alberta and began his University education at the University of Alberta where he completed first his Bachelor of Arts (Psychology) in 1958; then a Bachelor of Divinity (Christian Theology); and finally a Master of Arts (Psychology) in 1969. Continuing his education Dr. Coward earned a doctoral degree in Philosophy at McMaster University in Hamilton, Ontario in 1973. He and his wife, Rachel, have three children, David, Kenneth and Susan.

Dr. Coward has had a distinguished career at both the University of Victoria and the University of Calgary in the Departments of History and Religious Studies. He has recently finished his tenure as founding Director of the Centre for Studies in Religion and Society at the University of Victoria. Under his directorship this Centre became respected as a research oriented centre for the study of religion and society. Currently a member of the Genome British Columbia Board of Directors, he serves as a specialist on ethics and biotechnology. He has been a Fellow of the Royal Society of Canada since 1991; is listed in the *Canadian Who's Who*; and in June 2002 was listed as one of the 25 Power Thinkers in British Columbia by the *BC Business Magazine*.

Dr. Coward is known internationally as a specialist in the philosophy and religion of Indian, and has authored many books and journal articles. One of these books was *Population, Consumption, and the Environment: Religious and Secular Responses* (State University of New York Press, 1995) was nominated for the Grawemeyer Award – the Religion equivalent of the Nobel Prize.

Actively involved in his community, Dr. Coward has been a member of the National Advisory Council, a coach for the Canadian Pony Club, the Alberta Tetrathlon Team, and Chaplain for the XVth Commonwealth Games in Victoria (1994). Most recently he was a member of the Task Force on the Relationship of the United Church and Aboriginal Spirituality.

Flora Isabel MacDonald

Born and educated in North Sydney, the Honourable Flora Isabel MacDonald graduated from Empire Business College and the National Defence College in Canadian and International Studies. For 16 years (1972-1988) she served as Member of Parliament for Kingston and the Islands during which time she held three Cabinet positions: Secretary of State for External Affairs (1979-1980), Minister of Employment and Immigration (1984-1986); and Minister of Communications (1986-1988).

Ms. MacDonald served as Executive Director of the Progressive Conservative National Headquarters from 1957 to 1966 and for the next three years (1966 to 1969) was National Secretary of the Progressive Conservative Association of Canada. She was a Visiting

Fellow at the Centre for Canadian Studies of the University of Edinburgh from September to December 1989, and Special Adviser to the Vancouver based Commonwealth of Learning from August 1990 to October 1991. Ms. MacDonald hosted a popular TV series, North South (a weekly human affairs series featuring countries in the developing world) from 1990 to 1994.

From 1992 to 2001 Ms. MacDonald served with several organizations – as the Chairperson of the International Development Research Centre; the Carnegie Commission on the Prevention of Deadly Conflict; was the Co-chair of the Canada Coordinating Committeee, UN Year of Older persons; and was the Chairperson of HelpAge International. She is currently the Chair of the following organizations: Future Generations, World Ferderalists of Canada and Shastri Indo-Canada Advisory Council. Ms. MacDonald also serves on several Boards including Canadian Council for Refugees, CARE Canada, National Museum of Scotland and Friends of the National Library. In 1989, the Secretary-General of the United Nations appointed her Member: Eminent Person's group to study Trans-National Corporations in South Africa.

Ms. MacDonald has received honorary degrees from universities across Canada and the United States including two this Spring in Atlantic Canada. First named as an Officer of the Order of Canada (1993), in 1999 she was named Companion of the Order of Canada. She has also received the Order of Ontario (1995) and, in 1999, she was awarded the Pearson Peace Medal.

Carolyn S. Shoemaker

Carolyn Shoemaker was born in Gallup, New Mexico and educated in California at the Chico State College where she received her Bachelor of Arts (cum laude) in 1949 and her Master of Arts in 1950. She was a teacher and homemaker until the age of 52 when she began her work in Astronomy at the Palomar Observatory. She received her Doctor of Science from Northern Arizona University in Flagstaff, Arizona in 1990.

Ms. Shoemaker has developed efficient stereoscopic techniques for scanning films taken with Palomar Observatory's 46cm Schmidt camera. These techniques have made possible more than a two-fold increase in the rate of sky coverage with the 46-cm Schmidt. She has discovered more than 800 asteroids, 350 which are now numbered, and is credited with discovering 32 comets, including the Shoemaker-Levy 9 which collided with Jupiter in 1994. At that time she was an equal partner on CNN television with David Levy (Canada) and Eugene Shoemaker.

From 1980 to the present, she has been a visiting scientist, Branch of Astrogeology, US Geological Survey and is a Research Professor of Astronomy at Northern Arizona University as well as a staff member at Lowell Observatory. She has served on several boards, including Planetary Science Institute, Minor Planet Research, and the International Spaceguard Association. She is currently on the Council of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and on the Executive Board of the Western Region, American Academy of Arts and Sciences.

For her efforts, Ms. Shoemaker was recognized with the Women of Distinction Award,

Soroptimist International in 1994. She has been the co-recipient of several honours with her husband, Eugene Shoemaker, including the Rittenhouse Medal from the Rittenhouse Astronomical Society (1988), National Academy of Science, James C. Watson Medal (1998). She is also a Fellow of the American Association of Science.

EVENING CONVOCATION

Luca Codignola

Born in Genoa, Italy, Professor Codginola married his wife Gabriella in 1947, they have one daughter, Federica. Professor Codignola and his family currently live in Italy where he is a Professor of the "History of Canada" at the Universita de Genova. His University education began at the Universita di Roma, where he received his Laurea in Modern History (Magna Cum Laude) in 1970, and four years later his Master of Arts in History from the University of Toronto.

Professor Codignola began his teaching career at the Universita di Bologna and has also taught at the Universita di Pisa. He has had visiting professorships and research fellowships at several institutions including London, McGill, York, Laval, Toronto, Montreal and Brown. In 1988 he received the Northern Telecom Five Continents Award in Canadian Studies and was awarded by the Government of Canada, the Prize of the 25th Anniversary of the Programme of International Canadian Studies at the Department of Foreign Relations and International Trade in 2001.

Currently he participates in the Canada Research Chairs Program, as a member of the College of Reviewers, which administers \$900m (Canadian) invested by the Government of Canada to support the establishment of 2,000 Canada Research Chairs in universities across Canada by 2005. He is also a Member of the Editorial Board of the collection "Canadian Studies / Etudes canadiennes" of Presses Interuniversitaires Europeennes / Peter Lang, directed by Serge Jaumain. The author of several works, his latest is *Vatican. Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide", Finding Aid no. 1186, Calendar of Documents Relating to Canada in the Archives of the Sacred Congregation "de Propaganda Fide" in Rome, 1831-46*, Ottawa: National Archives of Canada, 2001, microform edition. He also has written several articles in Italian and English. Professor Codignola is currently researching the history of Reverend Edmund Burke, the founder of Saint Mary's University.

J. Chalmers Doane

J. Chalmers Doane is a native of Truro, Nova Scotia. After obtaining his teaching certification from the Nova Scotia Teachers College, he started the first public school band program in Nova Scotia at Hants East Rural High School. He earned a Bachelor of Music Education from Boston University majoring in trombone and minoring in string education. In 1967, he undertook a major expansion of music in the Halifax City School System. While directing the introduction of one of the largest string programmes in the country, general music classes twice a week at the elementary school level, a large choral program, homogenous instrumental classes taught by specialists, award-winning stage bands, and the first orchestral school program in eastern Canada, he developed the ukulele as a major vehicle for music instruction. This program eventually included workshops for teachers in all regions of Canada and also Hawaii on an annual basis. Fond nicknames for him

abound - "Mr. Ukulele" and "The Pied Piper of Nova Scotia".

His continuing interest in piano methodology, ukulele and classroom pedagogy has resulted in a number of publications and recordings, used widely in classrooms across Canada. During his tenure, several television specials were produced by CBC and The National Film Board, featuring performing groups from the Halifax Music Department. After seventeen years as director of the Halifax City Schools Music Department, he accepted a faculty position as Director of Music Education at the Nova Scotia Teachers College and for six years served the provincial Department of Education as an instrumental development consultant.

Retired since 1994, he continues to do some teaching, ukulele and piano workshops, and plays in a Halifax restaurant with his jazz combo twice a week. His own 9 hole golf course is very dear to his heart – no line ups and no fees!

Nancy L. Knowlton

After graduating from Bishop's University in Lennoxville, Quebec, with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree with honours in 1975, three years later she graduated from Saint Mary's University with a Master of Business Administration degree concentrating in Marketing and Finance. She also earned her Chartered Accountant designation in Alberta in 1982.

There are three separate stages to her career beginning with her appointment as a sessional faculty member at Saint Mary's University in 1978-79 and also working part-time at other universities thereafter. For eight years, between 1979 and 1987, she was employed by Deloitte and Touche in Calgary and at the time of leaving that part of her career she was a Senior Audit Manager. In 1987, she began the third part of her career in partnership with her husband, David Martin, when they founded SMART Technologies. Initially, the business started in her home with just two employees.

Now recognized as one of Canada's top business women, Ms. Knowlton was named the 1999 Canadian Woman Entrepreneur of the Year in the export category – awarded by the Joseph L. Rotman School of Management at the University of Toronto and the Bank of Montreal. She and her husband were awarded the 1999 Prairies Regional Technology Entrepreneurs of the Year award sponsored by Ernst Young. The following year, SMART was named Canada's exporter of the year by the Department of Foreign Affairs and International Trade. It has also been recognized as one of Canada's 50 best managed private companies. Ms. Knowlton has also been recognized by *Chatalaine* magazine as the 7th top woman entrepreneur in Canada.

As a nationally-recognized and successful business person, education has always been a part of her life – as a student, university lecturer, through athletics, and now the Smarter Kids Foundation – a non-profit organization dedicated to helping fund technology in North American classrooms. Not only is she a proud alumnus of Saint Mary's University but is an excellent role model for our students.

Retirements

Three faculty members are to retire this year with a combined years of service of 92 years.

Dr. Michael Overington

When Dr. Overington steps down from his Professorship in the Department of Sociology, he will have served the University for 30 years in that he began his career in 1973 as an Assistant Professor. He was granted a tenure in 1978, a year after he had been promoted to the rank of Associate Professor. In 1986 he became a Full Professor.

Dr. George F. G. Young

Dr. Young joined the Department of History at Saint Mary's University in 1969 and when he officially retires at the end of the summer, he will have served the University 34 years. Dr. Young has asked that no special recognition be made of his retirement – a wish which the University community respects.

Dr. Wayne Grennan

Dr. Wayne Grennan joined the Department of Philosophy at Saint Mary's as a Lecturer in 1975. At that time he held a Bachelor of Engineering degree from the former Nova Scotia Technical College, and an Honours B.A. and M.A. from Dalhousie University. He received his Doctorate in Philosophy from Oxford University in 1977 and was granted tenure at Saint Mary's two years later. As a result of his teaching and research achievements, Dr. Grennan was appointed Professor of Philosophy in 2000. He has published ten articles and two books, *Argument Evaluation* (1984), and *Informal Logic: Issues And Techniques* (1997).

Dr. Grennan has served as Chairperson of the Department of Philosophy; as a member of the University Senate; and of the Board of Governors, as well as on a variety of University Committees.

All members of Dr. Grennan's immediate family are graduates of Saint Mary's. His wife, Eleanor Grennan, graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology; son, Gavin, received a Bachelor of Arts in French, a Bachelor of Commerce. in Economics, and an Master of Business Administration; while son, Damon, received a Bachelor of Arts and the Honours Certificate in History.

In retirement Dr. Grennan plans to continue his research projects; spend more time traveling; and, in a futile attempt, master the game of golf.

Paul Deveau

Entering Saint Mary's University from Bedford/Waverley's Charles P. Allen High School, Paul enrolled in a Bachelor of Arts degree and will graduate later in this Convocation with an advanced major in Psychology and also a Certificate in Human Resource Management (Psychology Option).

HOODING CANDIDATE

James Key-Wallace

A native of Greenfield, New Hampshire, Mr. Key-Wallace entered Saint Mary's University in September 1999 after completing his high school at Contoocook Valley Regional High School in Peterborough, New Hampshire. He will graduate later today with a Bachelor of Science degree with a major in Computing Science and Business Administration. His strong academic performance throughout his years at Saint Mary's University has resulted in numerous achievement awards and scholarships as well as being placed on the Dean's List. He also has achieved a remarkable 4.23 cumulative quality point average out of a possible 4.30 and will be honoured with a distinction of *summa cum laude* as well as the Governor General's Silver Medal awarded to the undergraduate student who stands first in the graduating class.

HISTORY OF SAINT MARY'S UNIVERSITY

Saint Mary's University was founded in 1802 to provide opportunities for higher learning to young Catholic men. Its founder, the Reverend Edmund Burke, had meagre resources to work with, but on later being named Bishop with responsibility for Nova Scotia, he continued to support the college as essential to the development of the Catholic community. In 1841, the Nova Scotia House of Assembly gave formal recognition of its academic role. Its legal status was confirmed in perpetuity by enactment in 1852.

In 1913, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, a teaching order, were invited by the Archdiocese of Halifax to direct the college and its academic program. During the ensuing years, Saint Mary's University became more widely known for the quality of its undergraduate teaching and continued to develop new instructional programs, most notably within its Faculty of Commerce. In 1940 the Upper Canada Province of The Society of Jesus was invited to succeed the Christian Brothers as administrators and teachers in the University, and for thirty years until the enactment in 1970 of the new act of incorporation, the college remained under Jesuit supervision. The long-standing emphasis on liberal arts and commerce was extended to include new programs in science, engineering, and teacher education. Extension courses became an important part of the University's commitment to an active educational role in the community. The newest building on campus, The Sobey Building, opened in the fall of 1998 and houses the Frank H. Sobey Faculty of Commerce and provides meeting rooms as well as state-of-the-art classrooms for all three faculties of the University.

The University is concluding a year-long series of events in celebration of its Bicentennial Anniversary. The celebration provided a marvellous retrospective of our past and set the stage for the University's significant role in the 21st Century.

AN EXPLANATION FOR OUR GUESTS: THE CONVOCATION CEREMONY

(a) The Procession

The ceremony starts with the procession — the entering of the members of Convocation, beginning with the Marshall of Convocation and the students who will be presented with degrees, diplomas, and certificates during the service. As the students fill up the chairs in the Gymnasium, they will give the impression that today's ceremony really is, as convocations traditionally were, a meeting of the whole University. (The word "convocation" means "calling-together".) Indeed, the Gymnasium could not hold all the individuals who are part of Saint Mary's — the students, the professors, the administration, the staff, and a large number of alumni around the world — not to mention their families and friends.

Next in the procession are special guests, the Members of Faculty, the Board of Governors, and the Deans of the Faculties.

Next are honorary degree recipients. In addition to "earned" degrees awarded to students who have studied and met the usual requirements, annually the University confers several "honorary" degrees on individuals who have been designated by the University's Board of Governors and Senate as deserving special honour. To symbolize the degrees, they will

receive hoods trimmed with specially designated colours. The person receiving this honour will be introduced during the Convocation ceremony and a brief text is read to explain why she merits the award. Details are found in the earlier portion in this program.

The final members of the academic procession are the Vice-President, Academic and Research (who presides over Convocation), the President, and the Chancellor of the University. Frequently, the Lieutenant Governor of Nova Scotia and her husband join the procession.

Many will have colourful gowns and hoods of institutions from across Canada, the United States, and many nations of the world.

(b) The Ceremonial Mace

The ceremonial mace, which is carried by the Marshall of Convocation at the head of the academic procession, was presented to Saint Mary's in April 1980 and used for the first time at the Spring Convocation of that same year. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees. It was made and presented to the University by Maritime Command in recognition of Saint Mary's alumni killed in both world wars and also serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at the University.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings. The plates represent the contribution to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Archdiocese of Halifax, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers, and the Armed Forces.

(c) Degrees and Diplomas Awarded with Distinctions

At Saint Mary's University in the general undergraduate degree and diploma programs, academic distinctions are awarded to successful candidates on the basis of the following cumulative quality point averages of all courses taken at Saint Mary's University. Students must have taken a minimum of 75% of their courses at Saint Mary's University to qualify for a distinction. There are no distinctions awarded in the Bachelor of Education program, nor in graduate and certificate programs.

To honour those outstanding students, the President's Hall of Academic Excellence was inaugurated on 22 May 2002. Located in the main hallway of the McNally Building, directly outside the President's Office, this Hall will display the names of all students who earned their parchments with one of the distinctions previously cited. It will also include the names of students who won academic medals at graduation. This Bicentennial project will serve as a permanent and very public recognition of the academic excellence of Saint

Mary's University's students.

TRADITIONS

Traditions form a very important component of a University. A number of these are associated with Convocation, including the five described in the following paragraphs.

(a) University Crest

Designed in the 1940's by the Reverend Daniel Fogarty, S.J., then Dean of Education, each symbol in the crest has a significance relevant to the various phases and history of the University.

On the outer portion of the crest, the name and location of the University are inscribed in Latin and, in Roman numerals (1841), the date the University received its charter authorizing it to grant degrees.

The book shown above the shield represents learning and knowledge. The inscription on the page of the book is in Latin — "Age Quod Agis". This is the motto of the University which exhorts all those connected with the University to strive to do their best in everything that they do. This quotation is from the Irish Christian Brothers and symbolizes their contribution to the development of the institution.

The upper part of the shield has the official seal of the Jesuits with I.H.S. being the Greek initials for Christ's name. Below these initials are the three nails which represent the Crucifixion, and surrounding these is the Crown of Thorns.

The two crowns represent a dual loyalty — to the then Dominion of Canada and to the British Commonwealth. Below these crowns is the thistle, which stands for Nova Scotia's Scottish heritage.

(b) The Presidential Medallion of Office

On 22 October 2000, a Medallion of Office was officially presented to the University and used for the first time that same day at the installation of Dr. J. Colin Dodds as President. Designed and crafted by James Bradshaw and Bruce Babcock of James Bradshaw Jewelery Design Studios, Inc., Halifax, its centre is a University Gold Medal, traditionally awarded to the top graduating students. It symbolizes the University's deep commitment to academic excellence. It is surrounded by contrasting sterling silver, representing the diversity of the institution's students and of its academic programs. It was generously presented by Mary Eileen Donahoe and her family as a memorial to the late Senator Richard A. Donahoe, Q.C., K.S.G., LL.D.(Hon.), a member of one of the earliest Boards of Governors, in recognition of his career of public service and his love of Saint Mary's.

(c) The Hooding Ceremony

As you will observe, all the graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of formal academic dress, which at Saint Mary's follows the general guidelines established at Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England. Formal attire consists of academic robe, hood and mortar board, although at Saint Mary's the latter is limited to Master's graduates only. The academic dress worn by each participant depends

upon the academic level attained. There is a special attire for the Bachelor level candidates, for the Master's, and the Doctorate. While tradition has dictated the style or cut of the academic attire, each post-secondary institution, for the most part, will amend certain details of the attire to suit its own particular tastes and traditions. The academic hood which each graduate is wearing symbolizes the degree into which the student will be or has been admitted. The hood itself traces its tradition back to the Middle Ages, when its prototype, with a cowl-like appendage and tail, was used to cover the shoulders in the cold and draughty medieval buildings or in inclement weather. Gradually this garment was modified and the hood assumed an academic rather than functional significance. The hood has two basic elements: the trim on the outer edge and an inner satin lining. Each hood has its outer edge trimmed with a colour to indicate a particular faculty and degree: white symbolizes Arts; gold, Science; grey, Commerce; and white with pale blue, Education. The hood for the Master's candidates is essentially the same as the Bachelor's hood except that the trim is usually an inch or two wider. All the Bachelor level hoods are lined with satin in the colours of the institution granting the degree. Hence at Saint Mary's the hood is lined with maroon satin with a white chevron. The Master's hood at Saint Mary's is lined with maroon satin only to give it added distinction from the Bachelor's.

A symbolic hooding ceremony has become a traditional feature of all Convocations at Saint Mary's.

(d) Flags on the Stage

Each year Saint Mary's has a number of non-Canadians in its student body. The flags which you see displayed on the stage for Convocation are from some of the countries from which these students come, not necessarily graduating students, but those in any year of study. The globalization of the Saint Mary's University community is a feature of justifiable pride which contributes markedly to the growth and understanding of both Canadian and non-Canadian students.

Also included in the University's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the University's permanent commitment to people with disabilities. Also part of this collection is that of the Mi'kmaqs' in recognition of their First Nation's Status. For the first time at our Spring 2002 Convocations the University's Bicentennial flag has taken its rightful place in our permanent collection.

(e) Graduation Alumni Pins

The Alumni Association of Saint Mary's University has generously provided an Alumni Pin again this year. To commerate our 200th Anniversairy a special designation has been added to this year's pin. This is a tradition which started with the 1992 Spring Convocation. Graduates are encouraged to wear theirs with pride and to consider becoming an active member of the Association.

A symbolic presentation of an Alumni pin to the Hooding Candidate by the President of the Alumni Association has become a traditional feature of all Convocations at Saint Mary's University.

The University's symbols and traditions reflect its roots as well as looking to its future, and the ritual of Convocation looks to the roots of the University as well as being a beginning for the students who now enter a new stage in their lives. Indeed, both the symbols and the Convocation look back far beyond the beginning of this University to the centuries of academic life in western civilization. Today the University dresses in clothes which are symbolic, not functional, and goes through the 600-year-old ritual of a convocation for the conferment of degrees, diplomas, and certificates.
