The Reverend William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Excellence in Teaching

In 1983, the Alumni Association, with the co-operation of the Faculty Union and the Students' Representative Council, established the Reverend William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Excellence in Teaching. This award is open to faculty members who have made an extraordinary contribution to the education of Saint Mary's students through teaching in the University's tradition of quality undergraduate education. Nominations are invited from alumni, students, and faculty members. This medal is presented at Convocation together with a cheque for \$1,000. Previous winners of this prestigious award are:

This year's winner is Dr. Cyril B. Byrne, O.C., B.A. (St. Dunstan's), M.A. (National University of Ireland), M.A. (Oxford), Ph.D. (Toronto), Professor of English and Co-ordinator of the Irish Studies Program. Since his arrival at Saint Mary's University in September 1970, Dr. Byrne has made a significant impact on campus. One of his colleagues noted that the feedback he has received from students indicated that Dr. Byrne is regarded as a first-rate teacher and educator who passed along to his students his love for literature in general and Irish culture in particular. A frequent point made by his students is that he has always been approachable and responsive to their needs. This same colleague noted also that, notwithstanding his teaching and administrative responsibilities, Dr. Byrne has strived selflessly to develop the Atlantic Canada Studies Program and also the Irish Studies Program at the University. Indeed, he has raised over a million dollars for the Chair of Irish Studies since its inception in 1986.

In supporting Dr. Byrne's nomination, a first-year student indicated that:

He has demonstrated exceptional teaching ability and takes a sincere interest in each and every student. His patient approach to students in addressing their concerns and desires is remarkable. His love of teaching and superior command of literary material has inspired me, a first year student, to major in English.... His strengths in teaching lie not only in his command of the material, but also in his ability to empathize with students. He is, in short, a scholar beyond compare.

One of the honor students in English is likewise extremely supportive of Dr. Byrne, noting that:

His teaching style is exemplary: a move beyond mere pedagogy to cultural and emotional enrichment. It is not uncommon to see him escorting 20 or more students to Neptune Theatre to witness the latest production; Wormwood Theatre to experience the Atlantic Film Festival; or even to St. Paul's Church Hall in Herring Cove to participate in the local Celtic community.... Dr. Byrne's fundamental strength of character is almost palpable. One feels there is something to trust there and he does not disappoint. He shows a genuine concern for his students, one that materializes both inside and outside of the classroom. In Dr. Byrne, one finds a rare combination of empathy and intellect. His impressive command of the literature is enhanced through his lectures, but he remains by choice on a level with his students. I support Dr. Byrne's nomination with enthusiasm. I feel it is almost a civic duty that teachers of this calibre be honored for their contribution to the life of the University and to the lives of its students.

Dr. Byrne's extra-curricular contributions to the life of the University also include his active involvement in promoting Irish Studies throughout Canada and in Ireland. Showing similar energy and drive which have made him popular with and respected by his students, his activities were acknowledged in 1993 when he was appointed to the Order of Canada in recognition of his contribution to this particular area of education.

Honorary Degree Recipients

At this Spring Convocation, Saint Mary's University will award honorary degrees to Evelyn Rae Purdy Pollard, S.C.; Ronald Wan-Hay Wong; and Clarence Eugene "Hank" Snow.

Evelyn Rae Purdy Pollard, S.C.

Doctor of Letters (honoris causa)

Sister Evelyn Pollard, a member of the Sisters of Charity, was volunteering with Covenant House in New York when she decided to turn her attention to the needs of people in Nova Scotia, her home province. Soon after her return in 1981, Sister Pollard and her colleagues brought new meaning to the phrase, "Charity begins at home." In 1981, in an effort to show Haligonians that there was a need for women's shelters, Sister Pollard and her housemates opened their home on Windsor Street to homeless women. Soon agencies were sending women to them "in increasing numbers."

Sister Pollard and her colleagues joined forces with parishioners from St. Peters Church. Together, they negotiated a \$1 per year lease for Hawkins House, which later became known as Adsum House and which serves as a short-term emergency shelter for women 16 years of age and over. Sister Pollard's efforts in establishing and helping to run Adsum House were celebrated in 1985 when she received a Certificate of Recognition from the Halifax YWCA.

During the early 1980's, she helped to establish the Metro Food Bank; was a member of the Homeless Network Committee; and participated as a committee member looking into the establishment of a support service for women prostitutes.

During the fall of 1983, Sister Pollard widened her activities to include the needs of youth. She became a founding member and Vice-Chair of the Board of Directors for Phoenix House, a long-term co-ed facility for homeless youth.

Sister Pollard moved to Boston in 1986 to work on a day program for the homeless, but returned to Halifax in 1990. Since then she has continued to work with community outreach programs.

She is now working as a clinical social worker in Dartmouth, but still finds the time to maintain some volunteer activities. She is currently working with a Phoenix House committee to open a resource centre for young men and women.

Ronald Wan Hay Wong

Doctor of Civil Law (honoris causa)

Ronald W. H. Wong received a Bachelor of Science degree from Saint Mary's in 1959. In 1962, he completed a Bachelor of Laws (Honors) degree at Birmingham University, England. Since that time, Mr. Wong has demonstrated excellence in the legal profession, in the business world and in public service.

During his 18 years of legal practice in Hong Kong, Mr. Wong was appointed by the Governor of Hong Kong to serve on a number of public services. He was a

member of the panel of the Seamen's Board of Reference in the Marine Department of Hong Kong, the Judicial Service Commission, and the Corruption Prevention Advisory Committee in the Independent Commission Against Corruption.

Mr. Wong was a solicitor in the United Kingdom for seven years, after which time he turned his professional attention to the corporate world. In 1991, he was appointed Managing Director (now Chairman and Managing Director) of two United Kingdom-based companies within the Haking International Group of Companies. The Haking Group is one of the largest camera and binocular manufacturers in the world. As Managing Director, Mr. Wong takes charge of the United Kingdom operation under Halina Marketing Ltd. and of the European operations under Haking International Ltd. and the U.S.A. operations under AnSCO Inc.

In addition to his full work-load, Mr. Wong maintained his social activities, serving as Vice-President of the British Dragon Boat Racing Association in England; as a Member of the Visiting Committee of the Harmondsworth Immigration Detention Centre near London's Heathrow Airport; and as a Charter Founder Member of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award.

Mr. Wong's involvement in extra-curricular activities was evident during his days at Saint Mary's where he served as Treasurer of the Students Council. Since then, he has continued to maintain his ties with the University. In 1992, for example, he returned to campus to meet with former class colleagues, government representatives and business leaders to discuss past days and future directions of the University and the Province of Nova Scotia.

Clarence Eugene "Hank" Snow

Doctor of Letters (honoris causa)

This native of Queens County has had a country music career spanning seven decades and several countries. He began his singing career on Halifax radio station CHNS in 1933. After much struggling and risk-taking, he signed a record deal with RCA Victor in Montreal. That contract lasted for 46 years and is, in fact, the longest continuous recording contract in the history of the music business. In 1950, his song, "I'm Moving' On," topped the charts for 29 consecutive weeks and remained on the charts for 14 months. The song still holds the record for length of time at the number one chart position.

Mr. Snow joined Nashville's Grand Ole Opry in 1950. His recordings and performances have enjoyed international success in countries such as England, Germany, Japan, Korea, and Norway.

Mr. Snow has received many honors from his fans. He has been elected to seven different Halls of Fame, including the Country Music Hall of Fame, the Canadian Country Music Hall of Fame, and the Songwriters Hall of Fame. Perhaps the biggest honor came in 1991 when The Friends of Hank Snow Society began work on the Hank Snow Home Town Museum and Country Music Centre in Liverpool, Nova Scotia.

Each summer, the Society holds a Hank Snow Tribute at the Queens County Fair Grounds. The festival attracts fans from all over Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Ontario, New York, and Massachusetts. Local musicians entertain the crowds with renditions of Hank Snow's songs.

Through the years, Mr. Snow's music has brought enjoyment to many people; and his work, such as the album entitled, "My Nova Scotia Home," has brought pride to residents of his home province.

Mr. Snow's work extends beyond music. In 1978, he set up the Hank Snow International Foundation for the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect. His work with the Foundation was recognized by the National Council of Juvenile Judges.

In 1991, The Honorable Terence Donohoe, then Minister of Tourism and Culture, wrote, "I don't think there is any question that in Hank Snow this province has produced a native son who has made a greater impact in the international country music genre than any other Canadian in history."

Recognitions

Professors Emeritus/Emerita

The following two faculty members have been awarded the distinction "Professor Emeritus/Emerita", as appropriate.

Professor Emeritus - Dr. John Chadwick-Jones (Psychology)

Dr. Chadwick-Jones came to Saint Mary's in 1974. He has a B.A. and M.A. from Oxford University and a Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Wales. In 1981, the University of Wales recognized his research contributions by the award of a higher doctorate, a D.Sc. He began his research career in applied psychology at Cardiff University in the late 1960's, then moved into the theoretical side of psychology, writing a widely-acclaimed book on social exchange theory. In the 1970's, Dr. Chadwick-Jones turned his attention to worker absenteeism, making a significant research advance by the publication of a book in 1982. Most recently he has studied the social psychology of baboons, collaborating with Dr. Barbara Smuts of the University of Michigan in the analysis of African field studies. In 1990, he received the President's Award for Research Excellence for his research in three distinct areas of social psychology. These are organizational behaviour, social behaviour and non-human primate behaviour. At the time, then Dean of Science, Dr. William Jones, said, "With an international reputation established through a continuous record of publication ... he is recognized as one of the leading psychologists in Canada." He has written a total of five books and more than 60 journal articles and contributions to books and holds the Fellowships of the Canadian, American and British psychological societies. His research has been generously supported over the years by Canada Labour, Health and Welfare Canada, Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, and the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council. He officially retired from the University last year.

Professor Emerita - Dr. Helen Ralston, R.S.C.J. (Sociology)

Dr. Ralston began her academic career at the age of 16 in the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Sydney, changing in 1953 to a diploma in Medical Social Work. She worked as a medical social worker in Australia and Canada before joining the religious community, the International Society of the Sacred Heart, in 1957.

She earned a teaching certificate from Kenwood Normal Training School, New York; a B.A. in Sociology from Newton College in 1965; and an M.A. in Sociology from Boston College in 1969.

She taught in Sacred Heart Schools in Montreal and Halifax for eight years before she became a lecturer in sociology at Saint Mary's University in 1968. She was awarded a Canada Council Doctoral Fellowship, and in 1973 earned the first doctoral degree in sociology at Carleton University. She was promoted to the rank of Professor in 1989.

Her teaching, research, and publications have focused on race, ethnicity, class, caste, and gender in comparative perspective and on religion in Canada and in developing societies. She has been awarded two Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada grants and two Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute Fellowships to support her ongoing research in Canada, Australia, New Zealand, and India.

She has been the University's representative on the Board of Directors of the Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute and was a member of its executive for one year. She has served as Canada's elected representative on the Council of the International Sociological Association and on the Council of the International Society for Sociology of Religions. She was President of the Atlantic Association of Sociologists and Anthropologists. In addition, she has served on various committees and writes for the Society of the Sacred Heart.

Although "officially" retired, Dr. Ralston will continue to teach and to pursue her research with vigor.

Nova Scotia's Rhodes Scholar for 1994 - David C. Sykes

In September 1989, David Sykes entered Saint Mary's University having completed his secondary schooling at Queen Elizabeth High School, Halifax. He will graduate at this Spring's Convocation with a Bachelor of Commerce degree with a major in Economics and a Bachelor of Arts degree with a major in Political Science. Both degrees will be conferred with a summa cum laude distinction, the highest available at the University.

In his five years on campus, Mr. Sykes has excelled in academics, in athletics, and in leadership. His exploits on the football field are well known to followers of the intercollegiate game. Coach Larry Uteck remarked that, "David is not an

exceptional athlete. Originally assigned to the role of place kicker on the Saint Mary's University Varsity Football Team, he managed to achieve his present level as one of the best university quarterbacks in Canada by a combination of hard work, perseverance, and the ability to command the respect of his team mates. This determination and work ethic has been an inspiration to all... . This is the perspective with which David approaches life.”

His exploits have gained him numerous recognitions including the University President's Award presented to the student athlete displaying quality athletic ability, leadership, and academic scholarship; on the Atlantic level, the James Bayer Award for Excellence in Athletics, Citizenship, and Academics; and on the national level, the most significant award presented in the Canadian Interuniversity Athletic Union, namely the Russ Jackson Award. He was also named one of the four finalists for the most outstanding football player in the Interuniversity Union for 1993. He has been termed, “a coach's dream and a true student of the game”.

In addition to academics and athletics, David has been involved in significant ways in the Canadian Heart Foundation, the Canadian Red Cross, Nova Scotia Special Olympics, as well as being a qualified Big Brother. These numerous community involvements become all the more remarkable when one knows the emotional, physical, and intellectual commitment that he makes to each and every one of these undertakings.

One particular area of his volunteer efforts has been the honing of the skills of provincial minor tackle and high school footballers. David's volunteer work as a clinician has also been well documented. In the summer of 1993, Football Nova Scotia hosted the first ever novice football camp known as the David Sykes Camp. Ten to thirteen year olds in attendance were enthralled with the teaching/coaching demeanour of this local hero.

In his numerous endeavours both on and off campus, David has earned the reputation of being an excellent speaker, notably on the subject of combining academic and athletic excellence; a well-rounded individual; and perhaps most important of all, “a real nice guy”.

In short, therefore, he is an individual whom Saint Mary's University, the City of Halifax, and the Province of Nova Scotia are proud to call their own. We wish him well in his future undertakings.

Retirements

The following faculty members are retiring from Saint Mary's University at the end of this academic year.

Dr. Samuel H. Jopling (Department of Accounting)

Dr. Jopling came to Saint Mary's on July 1, 1976, to be the Dean of Commerce, a position he held until 1982. After completing his term as Dean, Dr. Jopling remained as a Professor of Accounting.

Dr. Jopling's educational background is broad, with degrees in business administration, accounting, and engineering. He holds the degrees of Bachelor of Mechanical Engineering, earned in 1950 at Georgia Institute of Technology; Master of Science in Business Administration, awarded in 1965; and Doctor of Philosophy in Business Administration, awarded in 1975. Both of these degrees were earned at Pennsylvania State University. He also holds a Certificate in Management Accounting.

As a Lieutenant Colonel in the United States Army from 1950 to 1970, he carried out various command assignments in the United States and overseas, including that of Chief of Budget Systems and Analysis at the United States Army Headquarters in Europe.

Dr. Jopling was an instructor in accounting at North Carolina State; taught military science at Pennsylvania State University; and was Associate Dean of the School of Business and Economics at California State University, Los Angeles, prior to joining the Faculty of Commerce at Saint Mary's.

During his career, Dr. Jopling served with a number of academic and professional organizations, including being President of the Canadian Academic Accounting Association (CAAA) in 1989. During that time, he devoted much of his attention to carrying out the duties of his role and pursuing his research interests. Much of Dr. Jopling's research was devoted to examining issues pertaining to the conceptual basis of accounting for both the public and private sectors.

An Explanation for our Guests

Monday, 9 May 1994, marks a special event in the history of the University, namely the Convocation of the largest graduating class in its 192-year history.

In the early years of Saint Mary's, major events such as Convocation were always held off campus. Once the University moved to its present campus in 1951, it was possible to hold Convocation on campus until 1986, when the number of potential graduates required a larger facility than was available; hence the choice of the Metro Centre, which provided a very suitable and comfortable setting for this major event. The Convocation Committee continues to strive to bring as much Santamarian flavour as possible to this event, thus ensuring that Graduation is truly in the Saint Mary's tradition.

History of Saint Mary's University

Saint Mary's University was founded in 1802 to provide opportunities for higher learning to young Catholic men. Its founder, the Reverend Edmund Burke, had meagre resources to work with, but, on later being named Bishop with responsibility for Nova Scotia, he continued to support the college as essential to

the development of the Catholic community. In 1841, the Nova Scotia House of Assembly gave formal recognition of its academic role. Its legal status was confirmed in perpetuity by enactment in 1852.

In 1913, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, a teaching order, were invited by the Archdiocese of Halifax to direct the college and its academic program. During the ensuing years, Saint Mary's University became more widely known for the quality of its undergraduate teaching and continued to develop new instructional programs most notably within its Faculty of Commerce. In 1940, the Upper Canada Province of The Society of Jesus was invited to succeed the Christian Brothers as administrators and teachers in the University, and for thirty years until the enactment in 1970 of the new act of incorporation, the college remained under Jesuit supervision. The long-standing emphasis on liberal arts and commerce was extended to include new programs in science, engineering, and teacher education. Extension courses became an important part of the University's commitment to an active educational role in the community.

Currently there are in excess of 8,700 students enrolled at Saint Mary's, approximately 5,200 of whom are full-time. The remainder are studying on a part-time basis both on campus and at such extension centres as Truro, Bridgewater, Sydney, Dartmouth, Lower Sackville, and Charlottetown.

Convocation Ceremony

The Procession

The ceremony starts with the procession — the entering of the members of Convocation, beginning with the Marshall of Convocation and the students who will be presented with degrees, diplomas, and certificates during the service. As the students fill up the chairs on the main body of the Metro Centre floor, they will give the impression that today's ceremony really is, as convocations traditionally were, a meeting of the whole University. (The word "convocation" means "calling-together".) Indeed, this Centre could not hold all the individuals who are part of Saint Mary's — the students, the professors, the administration, the staff, and a large number of alumni around the world — not to mention their families and friends.

Next in the procession are special guests, the Members of Faculty, the Board of Governors, and the Deans of the Faculties.

Next are honorary degree recipients. In addition to "earned" degrees awarded to students who have studied and met the usual requirements, annually the University confers several "honorary" degrees on individuals who have been designated by the University's Board of Governors and Senate as deserving special honor. To symbolize the degrees, they will receive hoods trimmed with specially designated colours. The people receiving this honor are introduced during the Convocation ceremony and a brief text is read to explain why they merit the award. Details are found in the latter portion of this program.

The final members of the academic procession are the Vice-President (Academic and Research), the President, and the Chancellor of the University.

Many will have colourful gowns and hoods of institutions from across Canada, the United States, and many nations of the world.

The Ceremonial Mace

The ceremonial mace, which is carried by the Marshal of Convocation at the head of the academic procession, was presented to Saint Mary's in April 1980 and used for the first time at the 1980 Convocation. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees. It was made and presented to the University by Maritime Command in recognition of Saint Mary's alumni killed in both world wars and also serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at the University.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings. The plates represent the contribution to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Archdiocese of Halifax, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers, and the Armed Forces.

Degrees and Diplomas Awarded with Distinctions

At Saint Mary's University in the general undergraduate degree and diploma programs, academic distinctions are awarded to successful candidates on the basis of the following quality point averages calculated on the highest grades attained in twelve courses taken at Saint Mary's, including the last ten in the student's program in the case of the pass degree and, in the case of honors, seventeen courses (or equivalent) including the last fifteen courses in a student's degree program. In the case of the Diploma in Engineering, the best ten courses are selected. There are no distinctions awarded in the Bachelor of Education program, nor in graduate and certificate programs.

Traditions form a very important component of a University. A number of these are associated with Convocation, including the four described in the following paragraphs.

University Crest

Hanging above the centre of the stage is a copy of the University crest, designed in the 1940s by the Reverend Daniel Fogarty, S.J., then Dean of Education. Each

symbol in the crest has a significance relevant to the various phases and history of the University

On the outer portion of the crest, the name and location of the University are inscribed in Latin and, in Roman numerals (1841), the date the University received its charter authorizing it to grant degrees.

The book shown above the shield represents learning and knowledge. The inscription on the page of the book is in Latin — “Age Quod Agis”. This is the motto of the University which exhorts all those connected with the University to strive to do their best in everything that they do. This quotation is from the Irish Christian Brothers and symbolizes their contribution to the development of the institution.

The upper part of the shield has the official seal of the Jesuits with I.H.S. being the Latin initials for Christ’s name. Below these initials are the three nails which represent the Crucifixion, and surrounding these is the Crown of Thorns.

The two crowns represent a dual loyalty — to the then Dominion of Canada and to the British Commonwealth. Below these crowns is the thistle, which stands for Nova Scotia’s Scottish heritage.

The Hooding Ceremony

As you will observe, all the graduates and members of the academic procession are attired in the basic elements of formal academic dress, which at Saint Mary’s follows the general guidelines established at Oxford and Cambridge Universities in England. Formal attire consists of academic robe, hood and mortar board, although at Saint Mary’s the latter is limited to Master’s graduates only. The academic dress worn by each participant depends upon the academic level attained. There is a special attire for the Bachelor level candidates, for the Master’s, and the Doctorate. While tradition has dictated the style or cut of the academic attire, each university, for the most part, will amend certain details of the attire to suit its own particular tastes and traditions.

The academic hood which each graduate is wearing symbolizes the degree into which the student will be or has been admitted. The hood itself traces its tradition back to the Middle Ages, when its prototype, with a cowl-like appendage and tail, was used to cover the shoulders in the cold and draughty medieval buildings or in inclement weather. Gradually this garment was modified, and the hood assumed an academic rather than functional significance. The hood has two basic elements: the trim on the outer edge and an inner satin lining. Each hood has its outer edge trimmed with a colour to indicate a particular faculty and degree: white symbolizes Arts; gold, Science; grey, Commerce; and white with pale blue, Education. The hood for the Master’s candidates is essentially the same as the Bachelor’s hood except that the trim is usually an inch or two wider. All the Bachelor level hoods are lined with satin in the colours of the university granting the degree. Hence at Saint Mary’s the hood is lined with maroon satin with a white chevron. The Master’s hood at Saint Mary’s is lined with maroon satin only to give it added distinction from the Bachelor’s.

A symbolic hooding ceremony has become a traditional feature of all Convocations at Saint Mary's.

Flags on the Stage

Each year Saint Mary's has a number of non-Canadians in its student body. The flags which you see displayed on the stage for Convocation are from some of the countries from which these students come, not necessarily graduating students, but those in any year of study. This international aspect of the Saint Mary's University community is a feature of justifiable pride which contributes markedly to the growth and understanding of both Canadian and non-Canadian students. Also included in the University's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the University's permanent commitment to people with disabilities.

Graduation Alumni Pins

The Alumni Association of Saint Mary's University has generously provided an Alumni Pin to each member of the Spring Class of 1994. This is a new tradition which started with the 1992 Spring Convocation. Graduates are encouraged to wear theirs with pride and to consider becoming an active member of the Association.

Special Gifts

The University Bookstore has set up a display and is selling some crested items. If you are still looking for a gift for your favourite graduate, you might find something available. It is located in front of the concession stands on the Brunswick Street side of the building.

The University's symbols and traditions reflect its roots as well as looking to its future, and the ritual of Convocation looks to the roots of the University as well as being a beginning for the students who now enter a new stage in their lives. Indeed, both the symbols and the Convocation look back far beyond the beginning of this University to the centuries of academic life in western civilization. Today the University dresses in clothes which are symbolic, not functional, and goes through the 600-year-old ritual of a convocation for the conferment of degrees, diplomas, and certificates.
