

Saint Marys University High School Closing 1961 June 13
Awarding 7 Prizes in Maths. by M.W. B-G.

On May 5th, the Canadian Mathematical Congress held a Mathematical Competition open to all students of grade XI in schools in Nova Scotia.

279 students wrote the same examination. Of these students, 6 were from Saint Mary's^{University} High School.

20 prizes were awarded for excellence. Of these twenty prizes, Saint Mary's students took 4. That is: of the 279 students writing, less than 3% were from Saint Mary's, and of the 20 prizes given, Saint Mary's captured 20%.

It gives me great pleasure, on behalf of the Canadian Mathematical Congress, to present these prizes, - each \$25:

The first goes to the student who took 4th place in the Province and 1st place in Halifax County: MICHAEL FRIEDLANDER

Taking 7th place in the Province was Kevin Glancy

10th place in the Province was gained by Patrick Curran.

In 12th place, out of 279 was Leonard Hampton.

The two Saint Mary's students who did not gain prizes in the competition both placed high in the first division, - ~~near the top of the list~~ that is in the top 25 %.

Father Power has very rightly deemed that these two are worthy of recognition, and it gives me great pleasure to present these prizes, ~~on behalf of Saint~~ as a tribute from Mary's High School, to:
