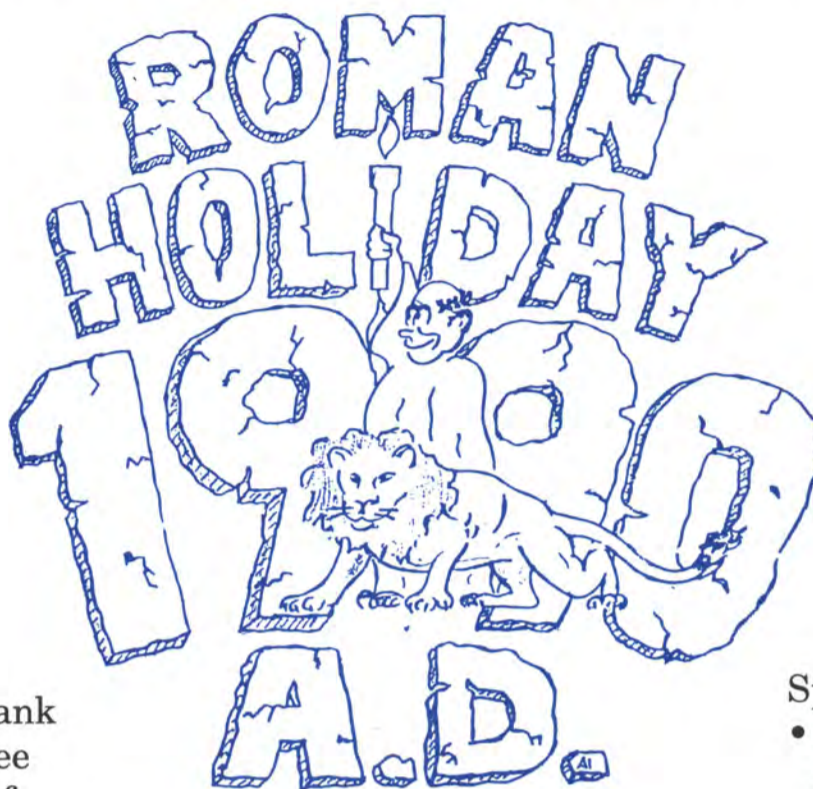

Second semester - Monday, January 7, 1991

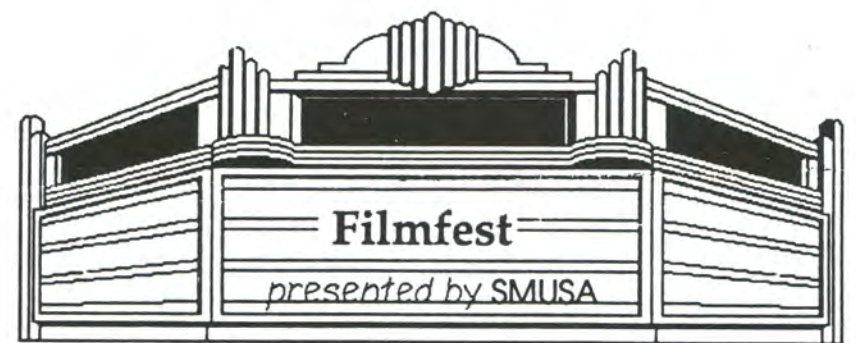
**USED BOOK BUYBACK**  
Our two major textbook buybacks are normally scheduled to coincide with the first and second semester exam periods. We pay half the price for titles CONFIRMED for future semesters and wholesale price for other titles. Superceded editions have no resale value for the used book market.

**GRADUATION RINGS**  
"Ring Days" are held three times during the regular academic year, in October, January and April. Special discounts apply during these sales. Deposits of \$25 (silver) or \$50 (gold) are required when placing the order and delivery is usually 6-10 weeks. This October ring days will be on the 3rd and 4th.
