

May you always be true and loyal Santamarians, as proud of your University and as worthy of its pride as you are on Graduation Day.



Membership in this society is restricted to those student registered in the Faculty of Commerce.








Science Society


Engineering Society

Membership is open only to those registered in the Engineering Faculty.





- Graduate Studies. . .The Faculty of Graduate Studies offers teaching fellowships up to \$3,000 for students seeking a Master's Degree in the Arts or Sciences and \$4,000 for Ph.D. candidates in Bacteriology, Biochemistry, Biology, English, Geology, History, Physiology, Pharmacology, Psychology, Mathematics, Chemistry, Physics, and Oceanography. The new Sir James Dunn Science Building and the greatly extended facilities of the Chemistry Building offer excellent apportunities for advanced research.
- Oceanography. . .A most promising field of Graduate study, with great possibilities. The construction of the Bedford Institute of Oceanography, affiliated with Dalhousie, makes Halifax one of the world's major oceanographic centres. Fisheries research, Hydrographic and Meteorological services in Halifax work together with the Bedford Institute and Dalhousie. This offers unique opportunity for Post-Graduate work at Dalhousie.
- Medicine. . .90% of the Medical Students from the Atlantic Provinces are registered in the Faculty of Medicine. 


