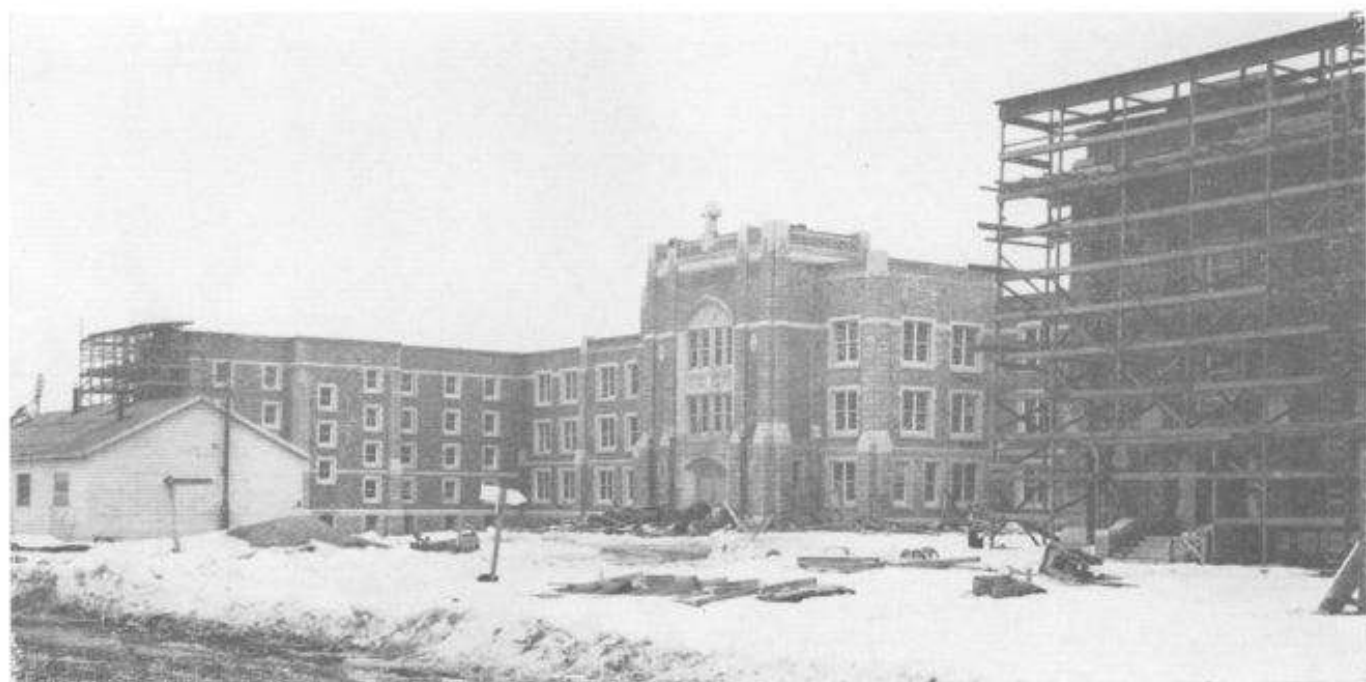

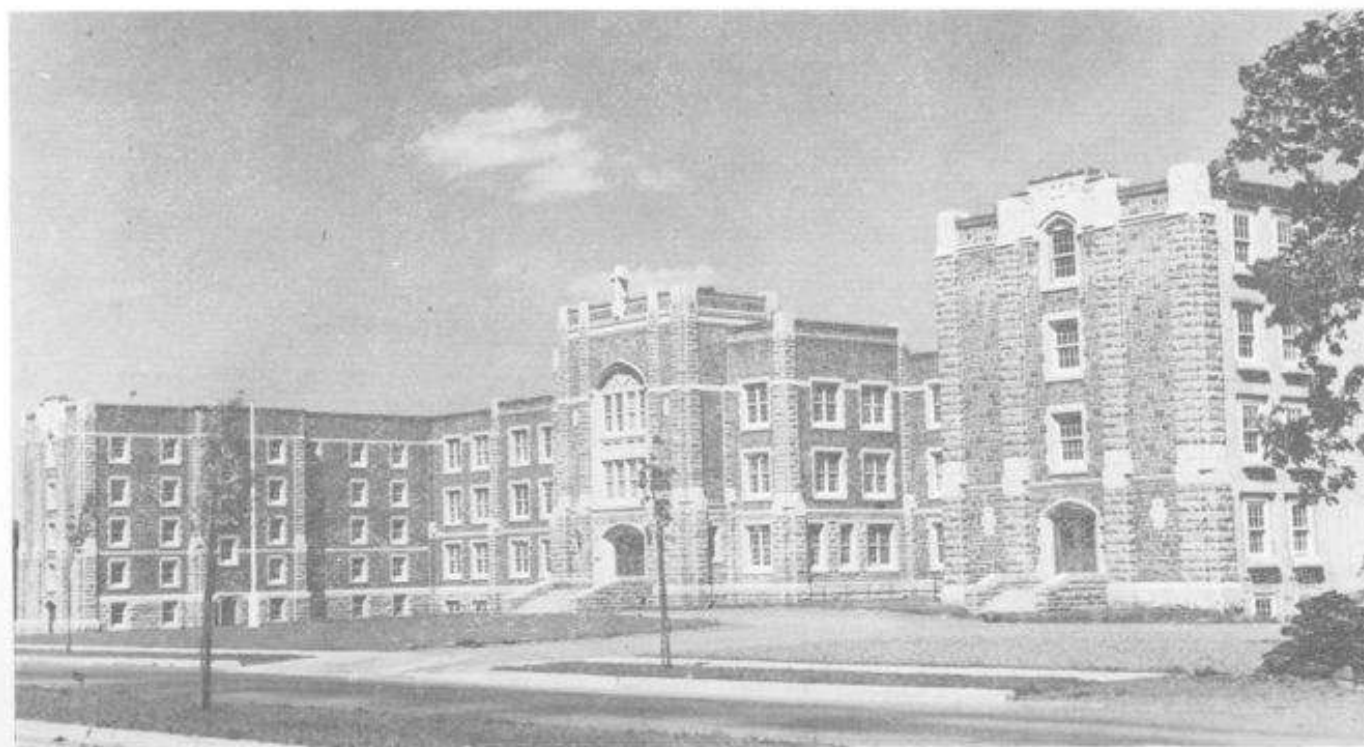

The Address
of
The Most Reverend Giovanni Panico, D.D.,
Apostolic Delegate to Canada

on the occasion of
his recent visit to Saint Mary's University

I am most happy to be with the faculty and students of Saint Mary's College today. As you know, the Holy Father is very concerned about the young of his great flock. He is always urging the clergy and the laity to take a deep interest in the education and training of Catholic young people. As the Holy Father's representative in Canada I am extremely interested in the work being done here at Saint Mary's.

May I say, first of all, that one should expect a great deal from Saint Mary's, since it is under the guidance of the Jesuit Fathers. In every country the Jesuits have become noted for their scholarship and their work in the teaching field. I shall be happy to tell the Supreme Pontiff of their work in this College by the Sea.

To you students I wish to address a special message. These are times when all too many people are forgetting that their greatest asset is their soul, and that their most notable accomplishment in life is the development and salvation of their soul. You who are students at a Catholic College must not be deceived in this fashion. Rather you must, by your own ideals and actions, be a reminder to the world that the soul and the things of the soul come first, even though men rightly concern themselves with temporal welfare and temporal affairs. In other words, it is your task to prove the value of following this exhortation of Christ:

"Make it your first care to find the kingdom of God, and His approval, and all these things shall be yours without the asking." (Matt. 6. 33).

If later you are to have such a sense of values and such dedication, if you are to edify the world, then these years of preparation are of tremendous importance. The studies and the discipline of today, the prayers and good works of today, are the foundations and basis for Christian manhood in the future. If there is one thing that I would urge, it is that you avoid falling into mediocrity. By that I mean that you should have a healthy respect for hard work, that you should avoid just "getting by". I am not applying this merely to your studies. You must work at being honest, truthful, generous and pure. You must work at being attentive and devout in prayer, in assistance at Mass and reception of the Sacraments. You must work at nourishing a reverence for authority and in being obedient to superiors. Remember that no one ever knew how to command who could not learn how to obey.

If there is one thing I wish the students of this College to face, it is the need for more vocations to religion. When you are casting about for direction from God as to your future in the world, pay close attention to His divine prompting. Present Him with an open mind, a ready will and a generous heart. Then if He wants you in religious life you will be a courageous and willing follower. Like Peter and Paul and their thousands of successors, you will drop all other ambitions and all other hopes, to enter that noblest and highest of human careers, the religious life. You are young and you dream of future adventure. There is no adventure to compare with that of a soul lined up shoulder to shoulder with the Divine Leader who beckons you and calls to you with challenging words: "Come, follow me."

Remember then, my dear students, that you will have only the ideals, the attitudes, the skills and the piety you are now developing with which to meet the world, and with which to influence the world. God bless you and keep you all.
