EDITORIAL GUIDELINES

Submissions to the Journal of Co-operative Accounting and Reporting (JCAR) are made via email to the editor (jcar@smu.ca).

REVIEW PROCESS

Each paper is reviewed by the editor and, if it is judged suitable for this publication, it is then sent to at least two independent referees for double blind peer review. The decision for publication is made by the editor in consultation with these reviews.

COPYRIGHT

Articles submitted to the journal should not have been published before in their current or substantially similar form, or be under consideration for publication with another journal. Authors submitting articles for publication warrant that the work is not an infringement of any existing copyright and will indemnify the publisher against any breach of such warranty. It is the author's responsibility to ensure that all necessary permissions have been acquired.

MANUSCRIPT REQUIREMENTS

Format – All submissions should be a Word document

Article Length – Articles should be between 5000 and 12000 words in length.

Article Title – A title of not more than ten words should be provided.

Article Title Page – An Article Title Page should be submitted alongside each individual article, which should include:

- Article Title
- Author Details (see below) and Biographies
- Acknowledgements
- An Abstract
- Keywords (see below)

Author Details - Details should be supplied on the Article Title Page including:

- Full name of each author
- Affiliation of each author, at time research was completed
- Where more than one author has contributed to the article, details of who should be contacted for correspondence
- E-mail address of the corresponding author
- Brief professional biography of each author

Abstract - Maximum is 250 words, the Abstract should concisely summarize the article. **Keywords** - Please provide up to 6 keywords on the Article Title Page.

Headings - Headings must be concise, with a clear indication of the distinction between the hierarchy of headings. The preferred format is for first level headings to be presented in bold format and subsequent sub-headings to be presented in medium italics.

Notes/Endnotes - Notes or Endnotes should be used only if absolutely necessary and must be identified in the text by consecutive numbers, enclosed in square brackets and listed at the end of the article.

Figures - All Figures (charts, diagrams, line drawings, web pages/screenshots, and photographic images) should be embedded in the document and numbered sequentially.

Tables - Tables should be embedded in the document and numbered sequentially. **References -** References to other publications must be in *Harvard* style and carefully checked for completeness, accuracy and consistency.
