Archbishop's Message

Since its last annual the new Saint Mary's University has launched out into the deep, and is building high its hopes for an ever increasing draught.

Its view of the mighty ocean portrays to it the triple quality they hold in common, its immensity, as it strives for the greater glory of God; its purifying power as it points out the path that leads from error—

"Better plod ignorant life's road along
Than run instructed how to best run wrong"
and finally the buoyancy that gives a confident resiliency to all who trust themselves to its guidance.

It has as its glorious patron our Heavenly Mother Mary:—

"Blessed name to God most dear
Sweetest name to sinners here,
Holy name that all revere,
Virgin Mother Mary".

And its building was begun during the year in which, after the universal belief of the Faithful from the beginning of Christendom, the age-long tradition of our holy Church, and its continued teaching through the liturgy, the final word was given to the world by the infallible teacher in his formal definition of the dogma of the Assumption body and soul into Heaven of the blessed Mother of our Saviour God.

So unseen God still lets His promised light,
Through holy Mary, shine upon our sorrow."

In view, therefore, of the truly outstanding possession we hold as our trusted obligation in the glorious building and grounds that distinguish our new and unavoidably necessary Saint Mary's University; in the immense promise it holds for a long future of unbounded usefulness, and in support of the unstinted and devoted labours of its staff from the world renowned teachers of the Society of Jesus, let us raise our heartfelt cry for help to our heavenly Queen, our beloved Mother, and our powerful Patron, who has never yet failed in the hour of need.

For thy Son's dear servants to thee we cry
Sent out as fishers of men."
