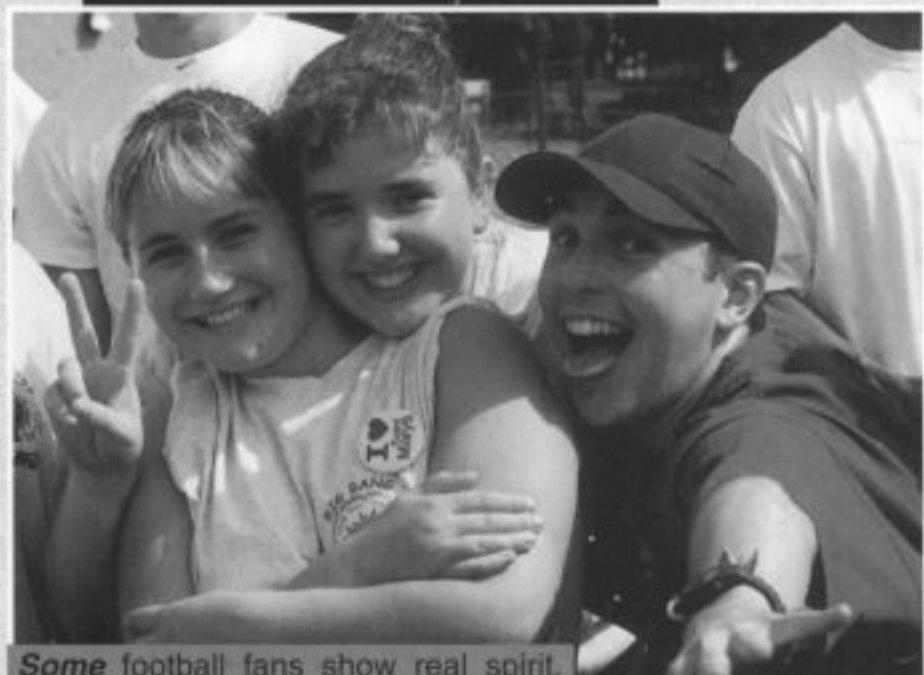

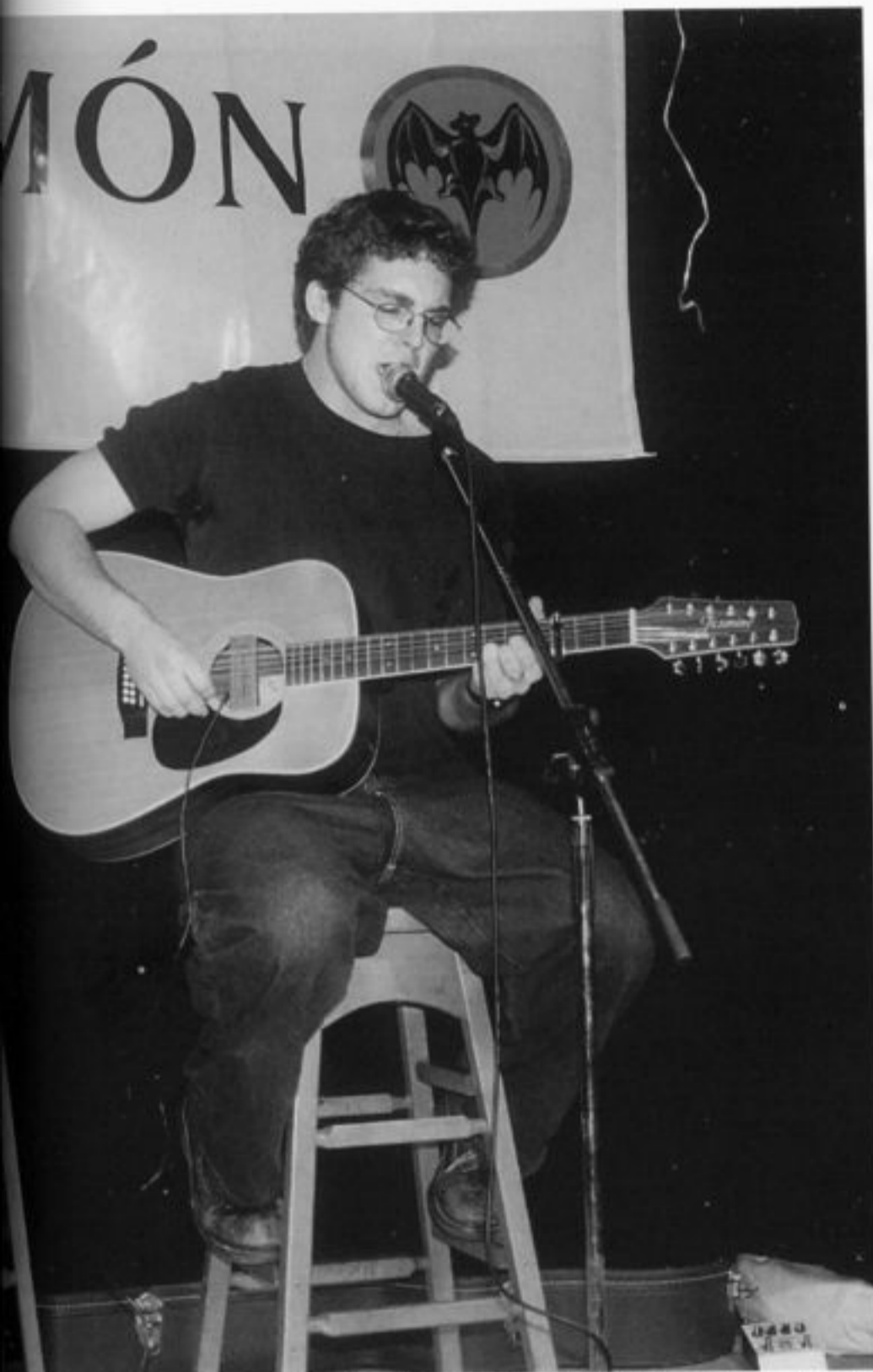

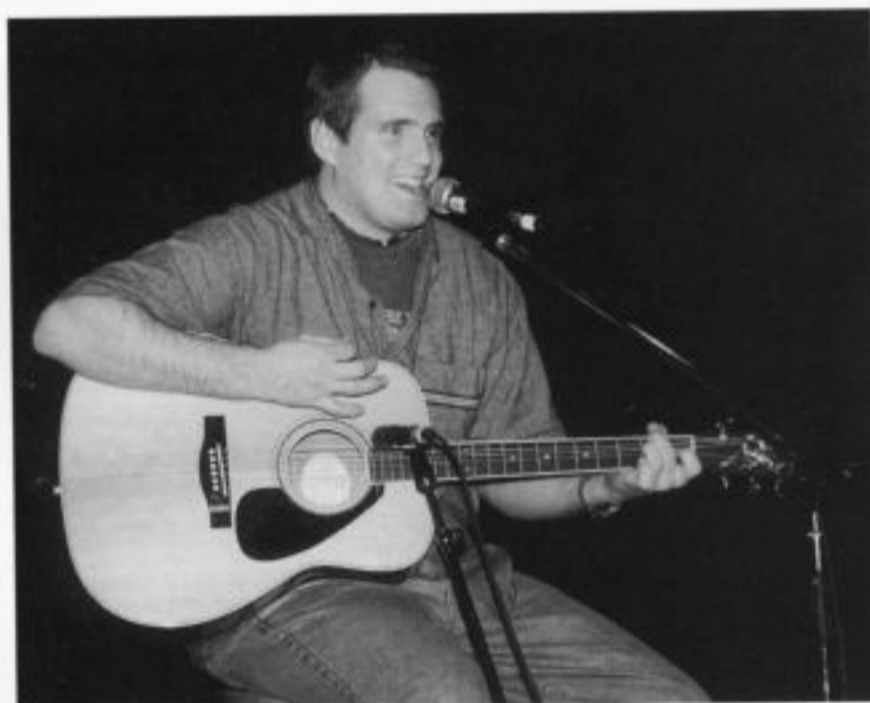

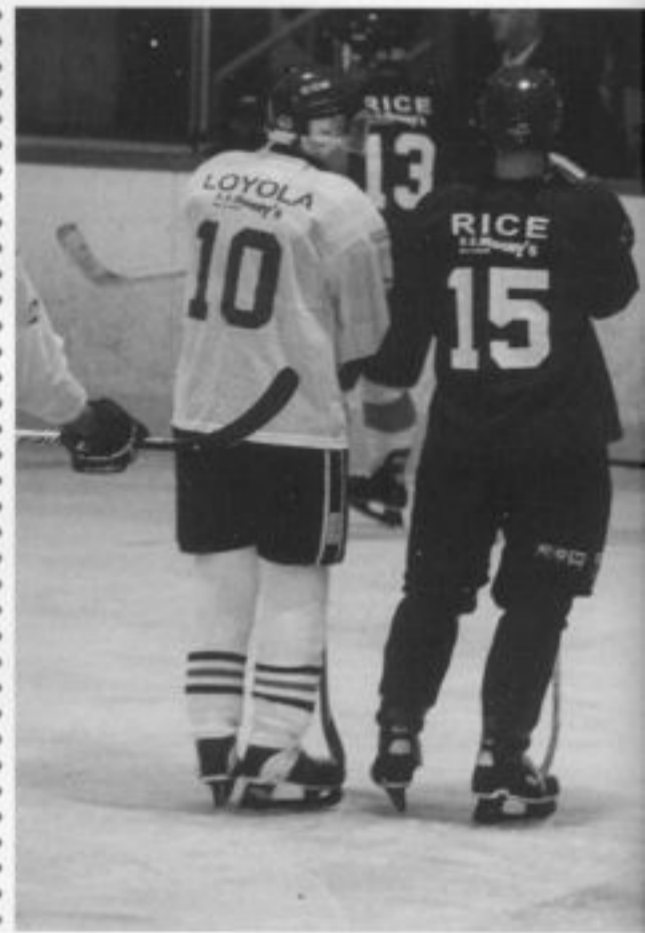


# Loyola - Rice Hockey Game

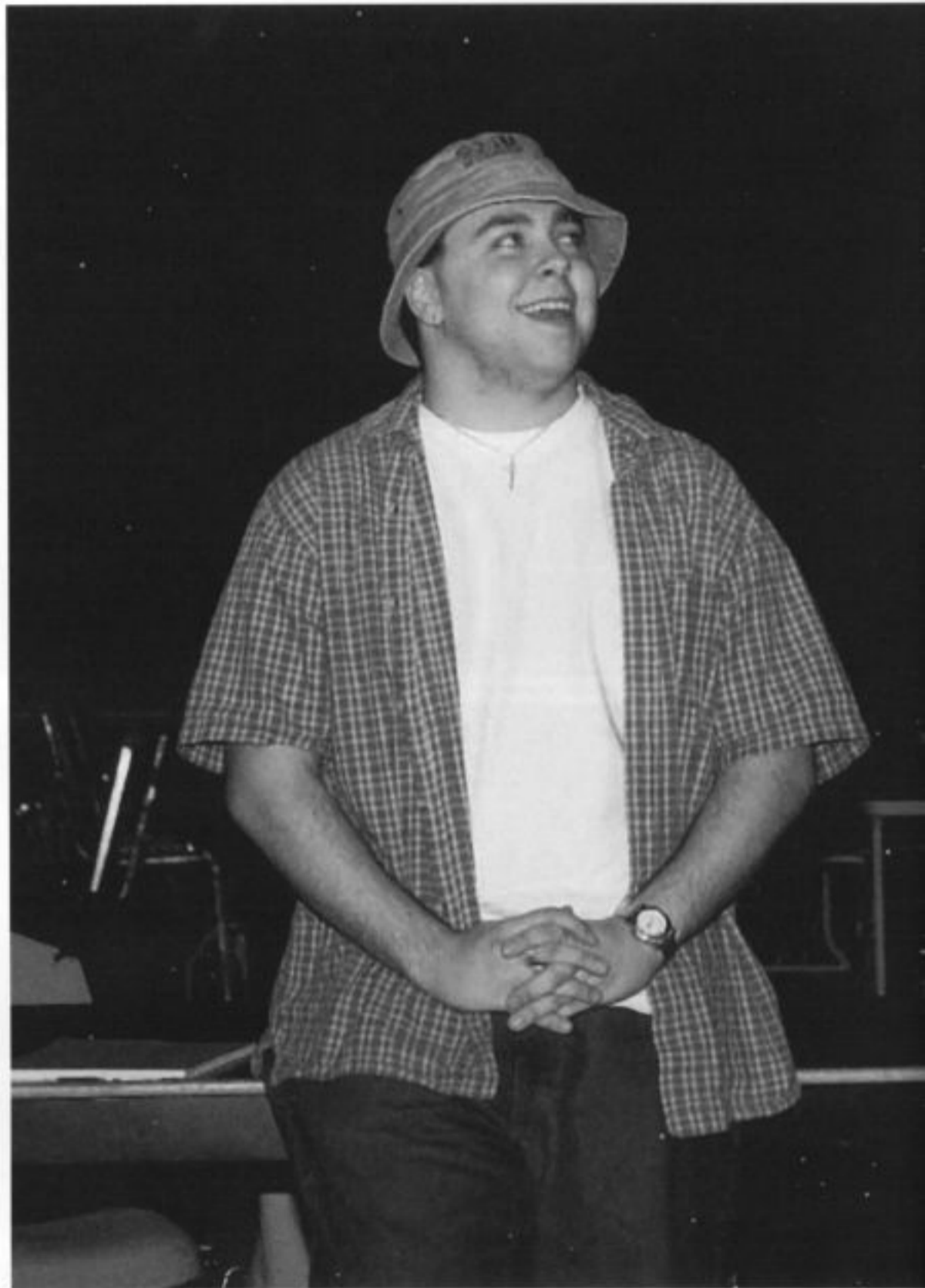
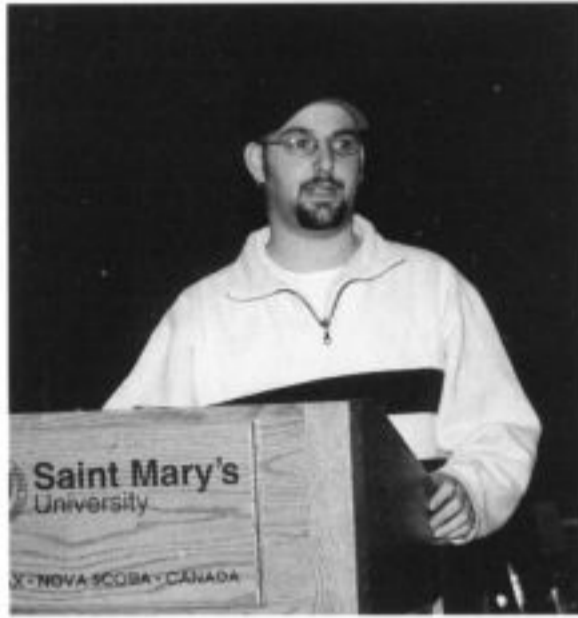

**Chad and Chris** answered some questions from students at the open forum. Chris MacNeil, won the position of VP Admin by a very slim margin.





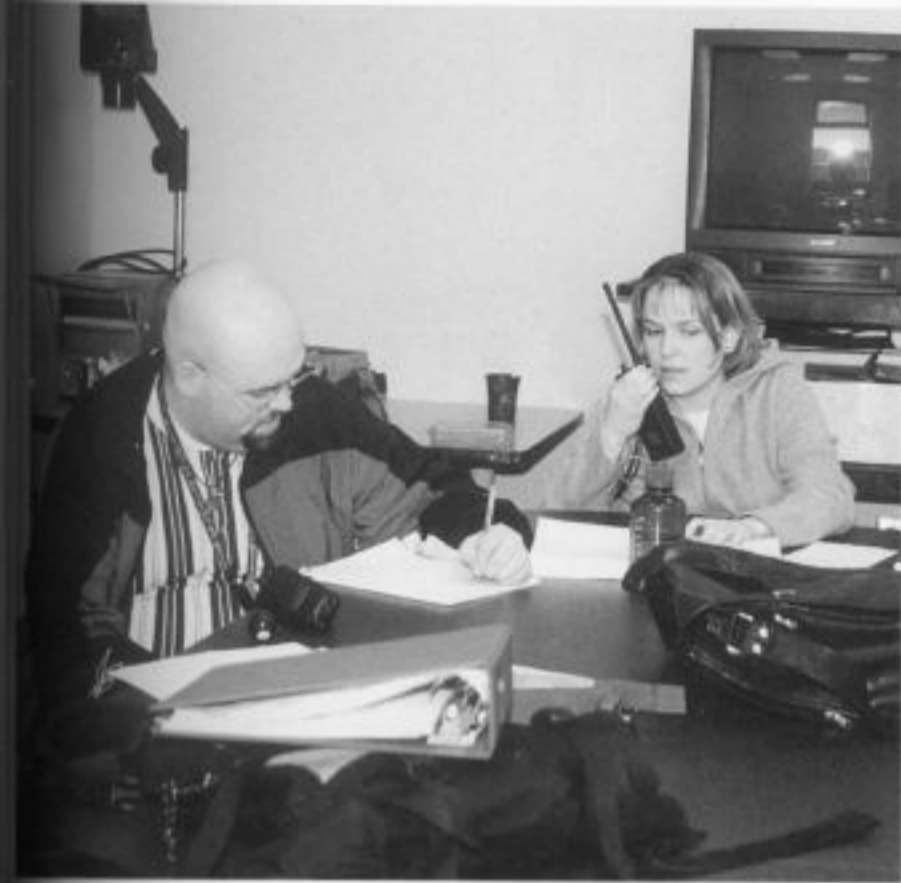
# Elections

**These hungry** guys stuffed themselves with a tasty treat complementary pizza.







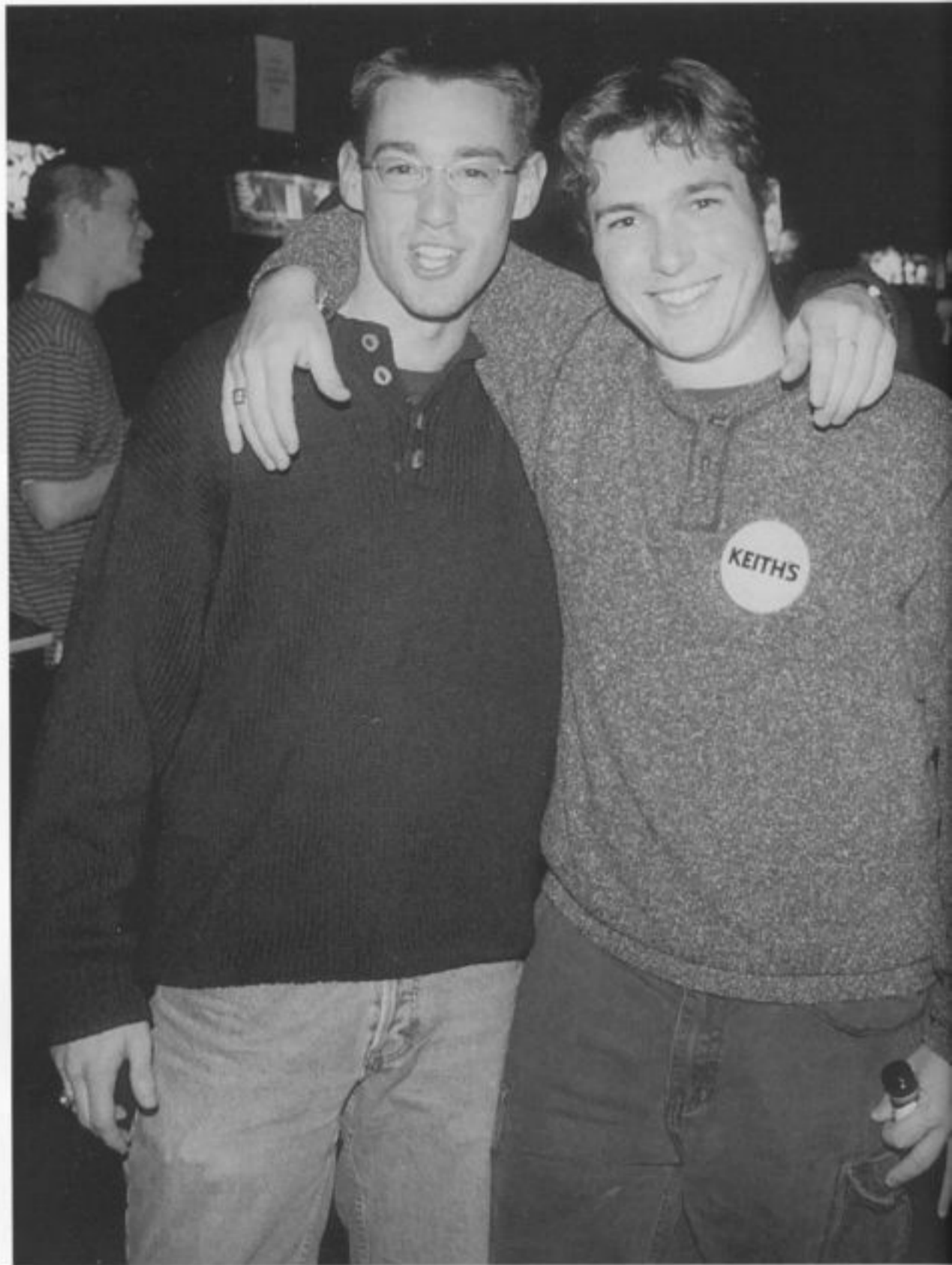

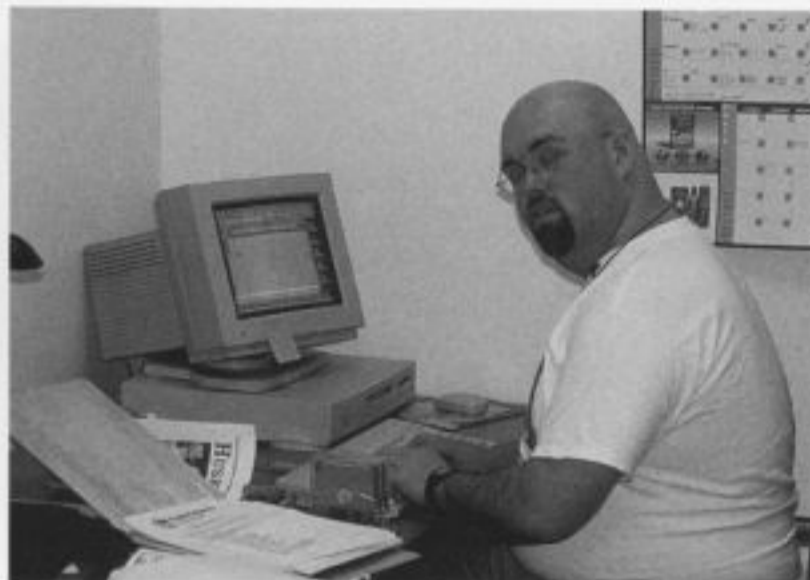

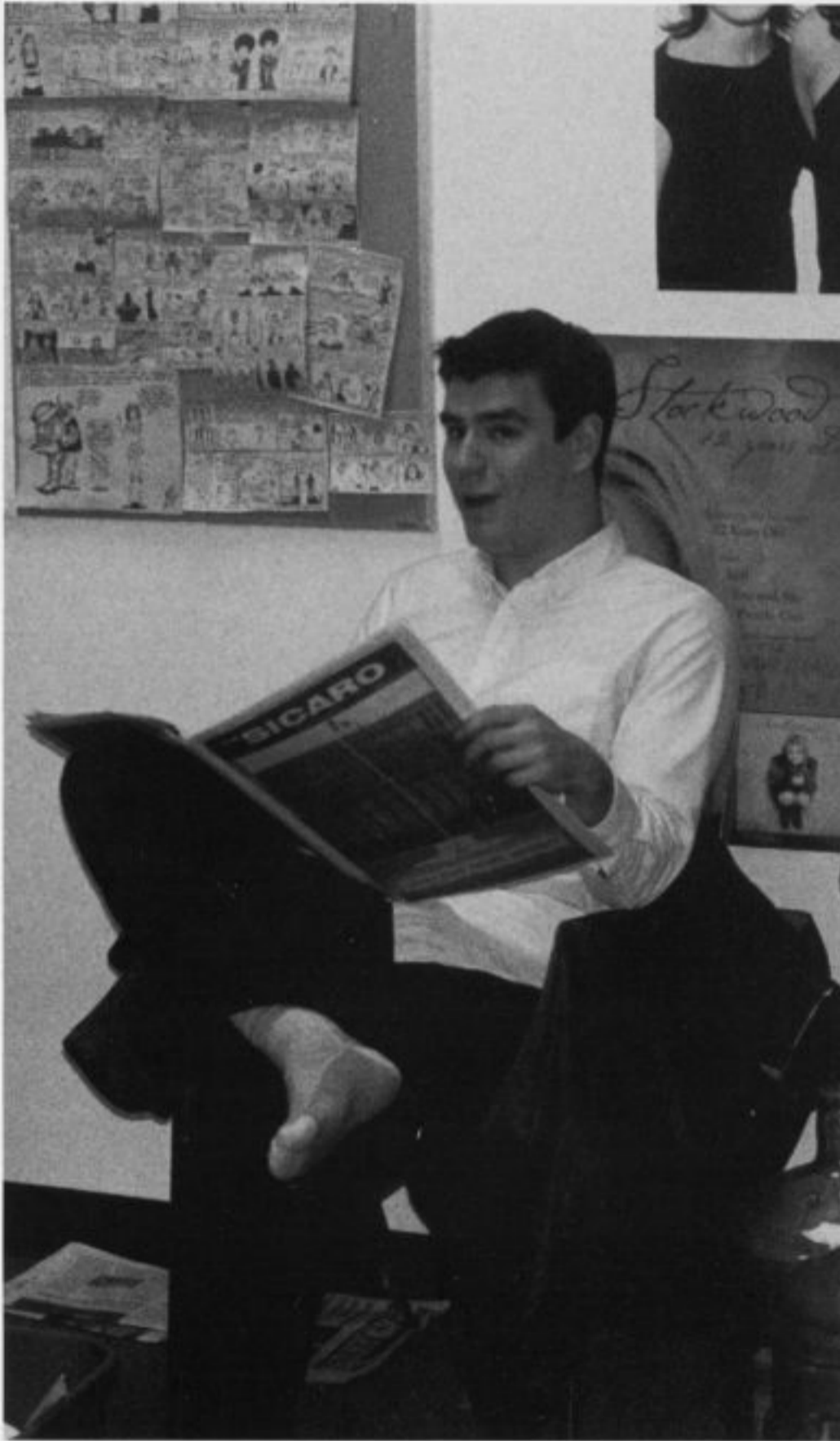

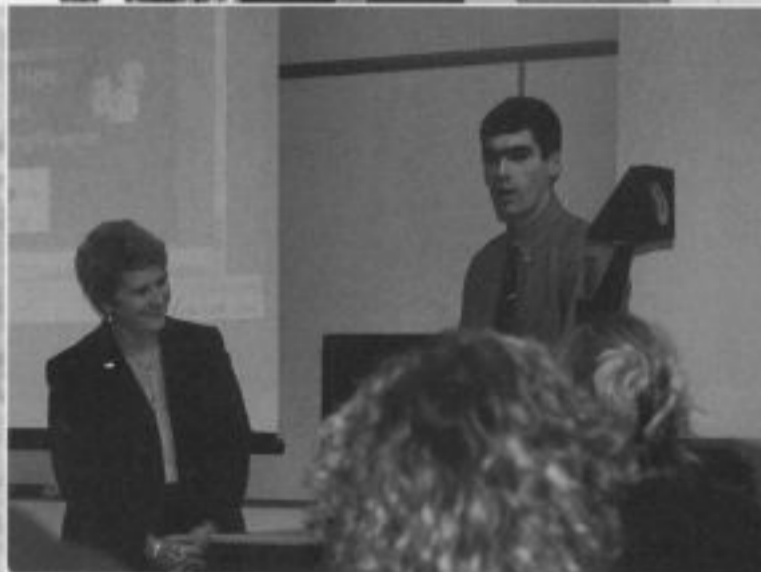

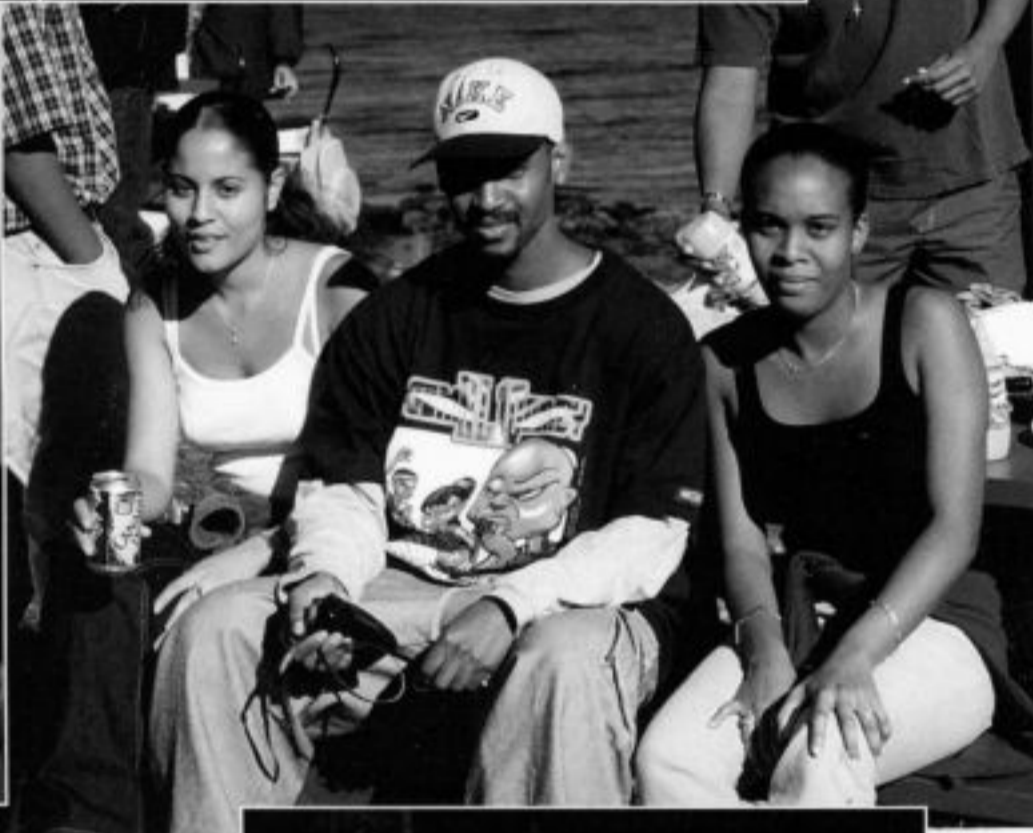

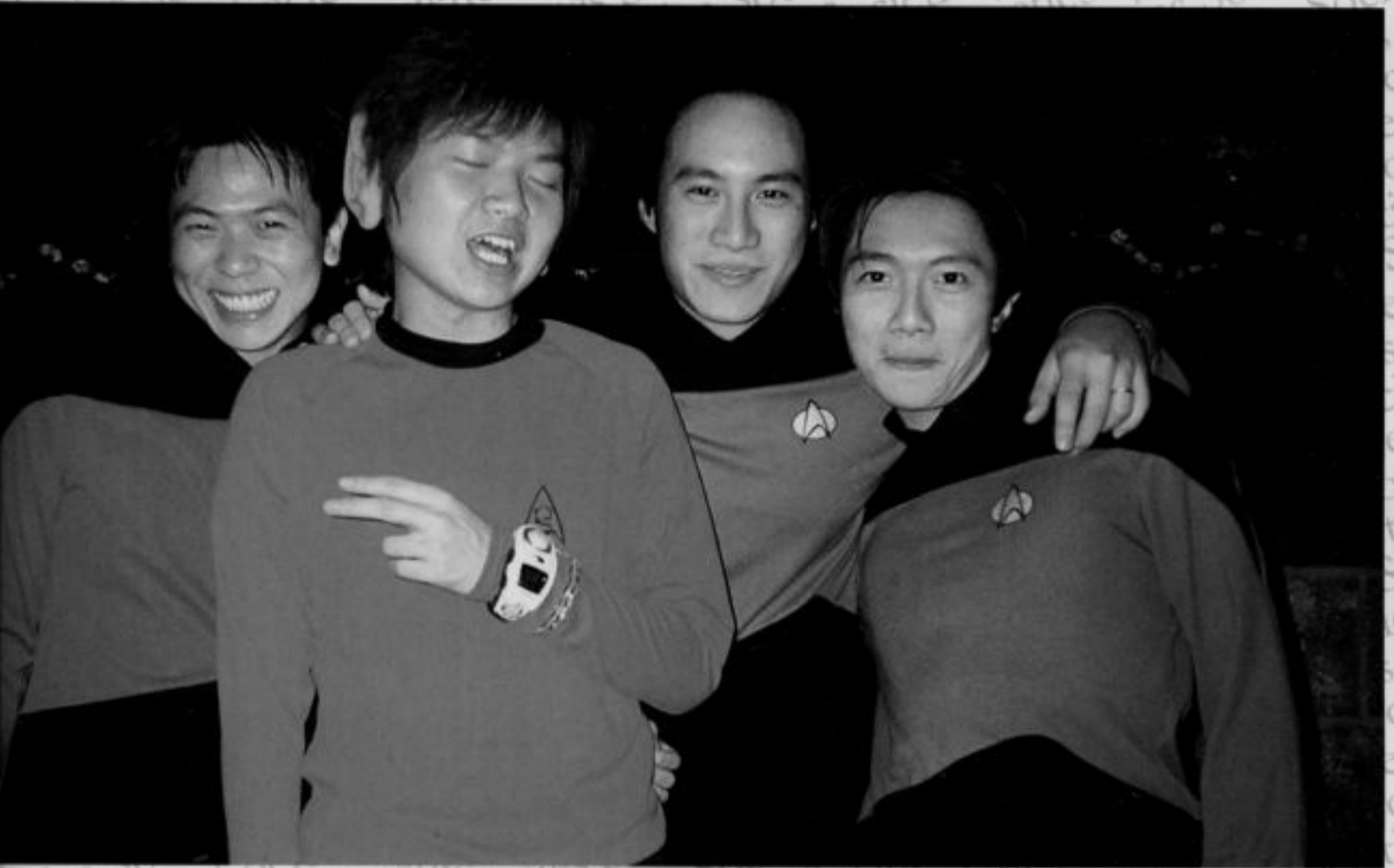
# IDS

# Student Alumni

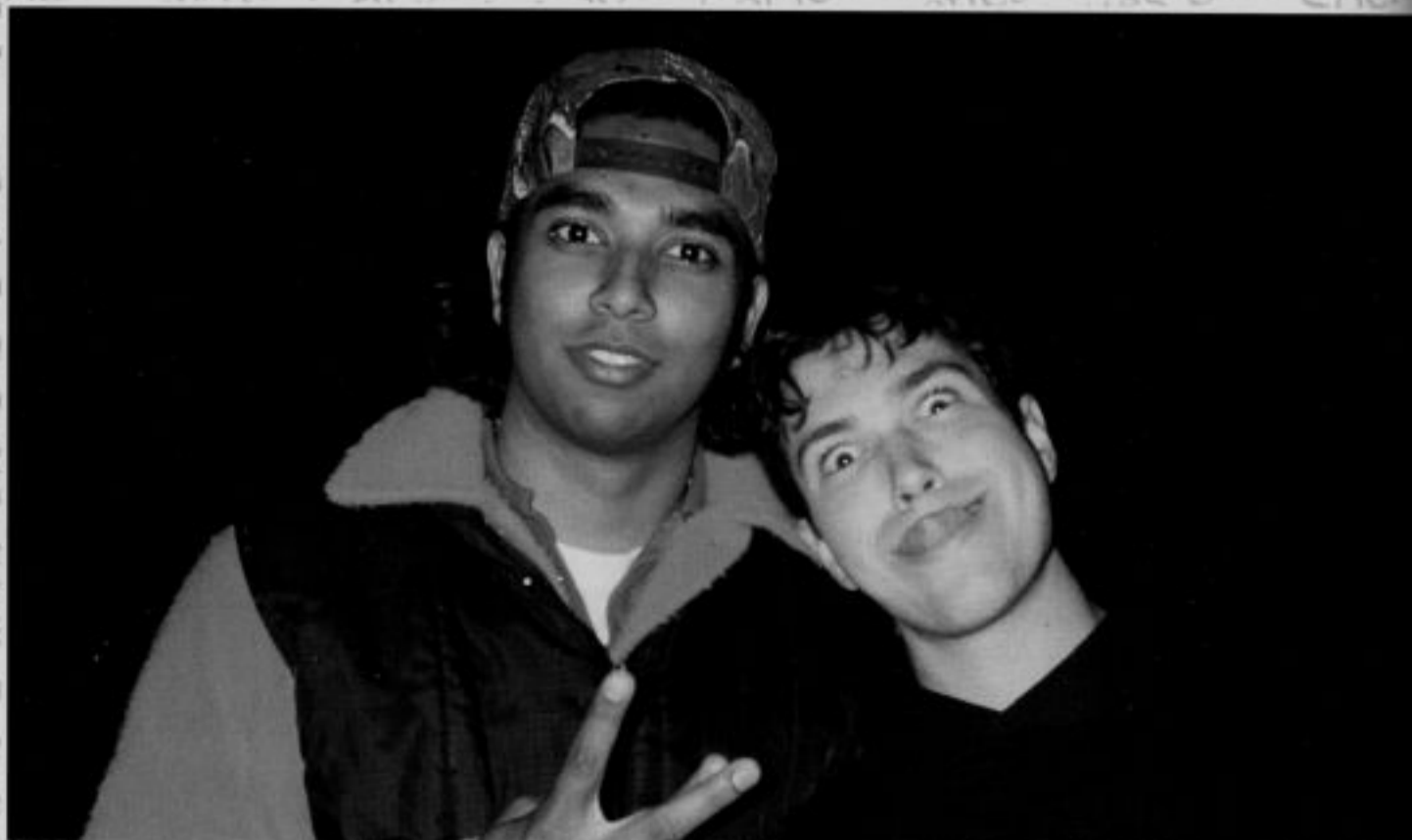

But through help from the RA's and fun floor events, friendships are soon formed that can not compare to any other.

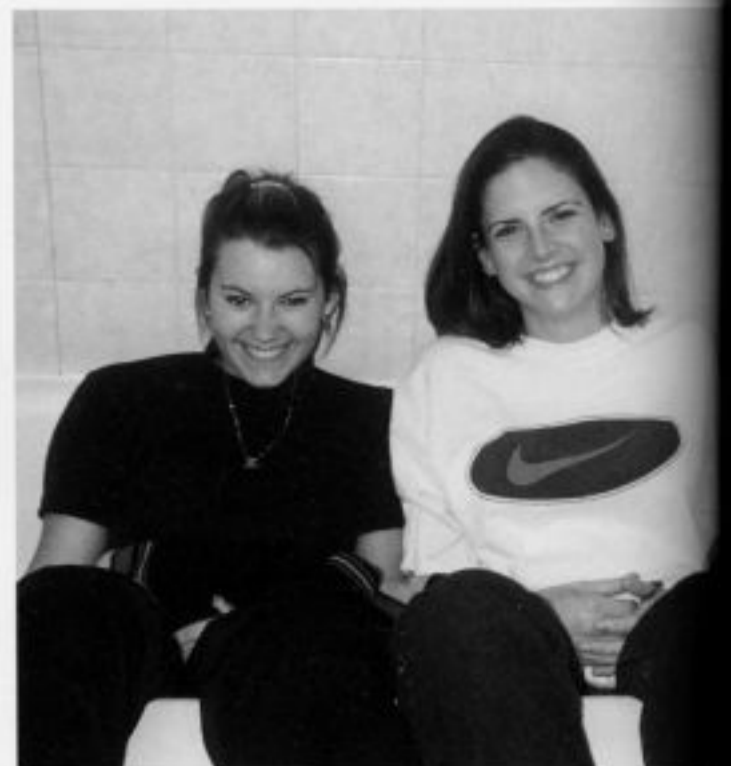
**These girls** spent one evening at home playing boardgame "Headbands" with some friends on floor.

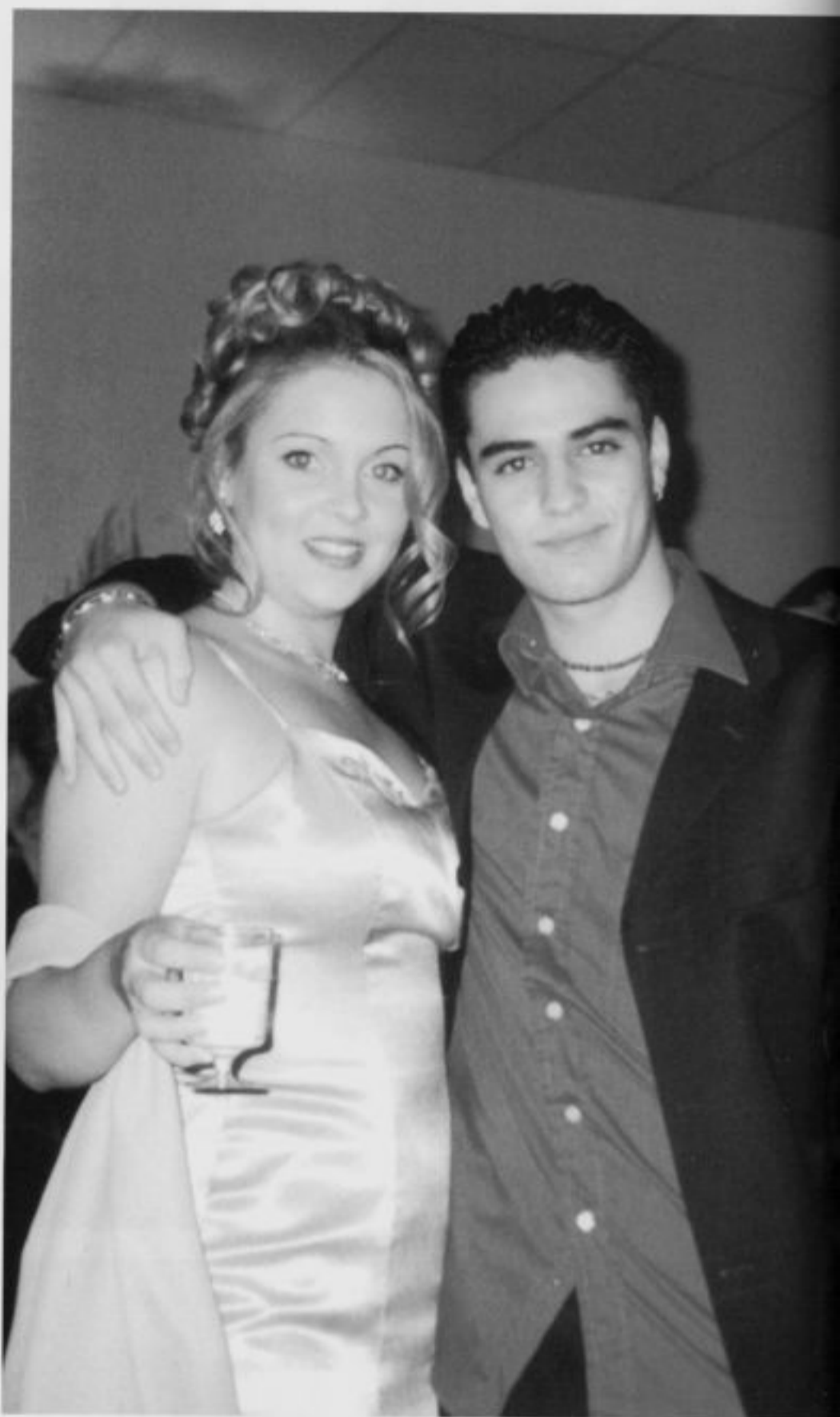
**The friendships** you form while living in residence can never be matched. All these photos capture relationships between tight roommates and floormates.

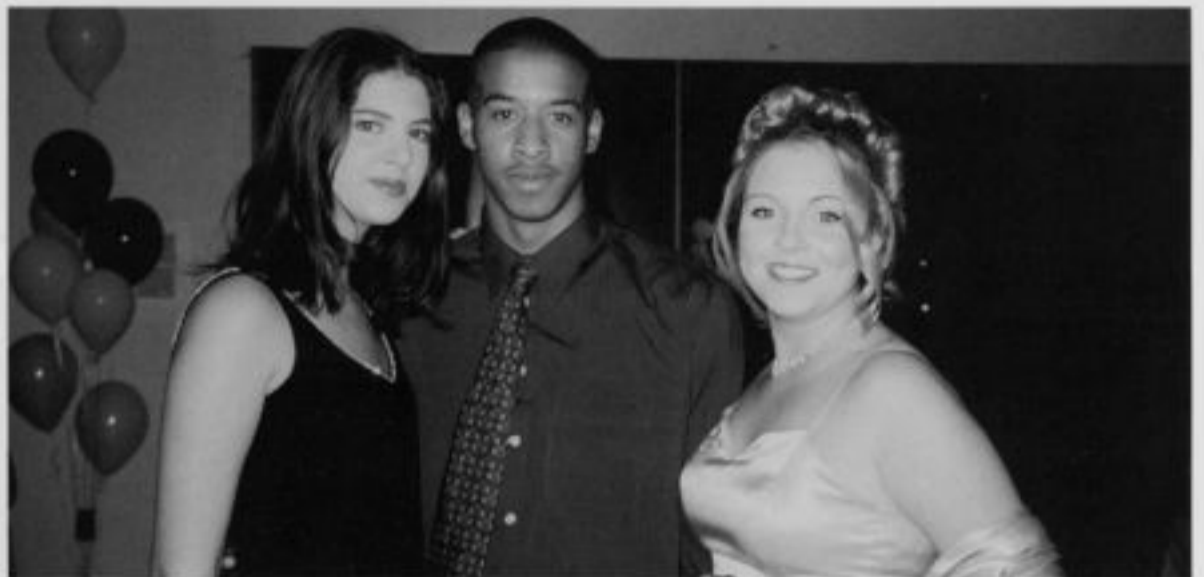




# Residence Banquet

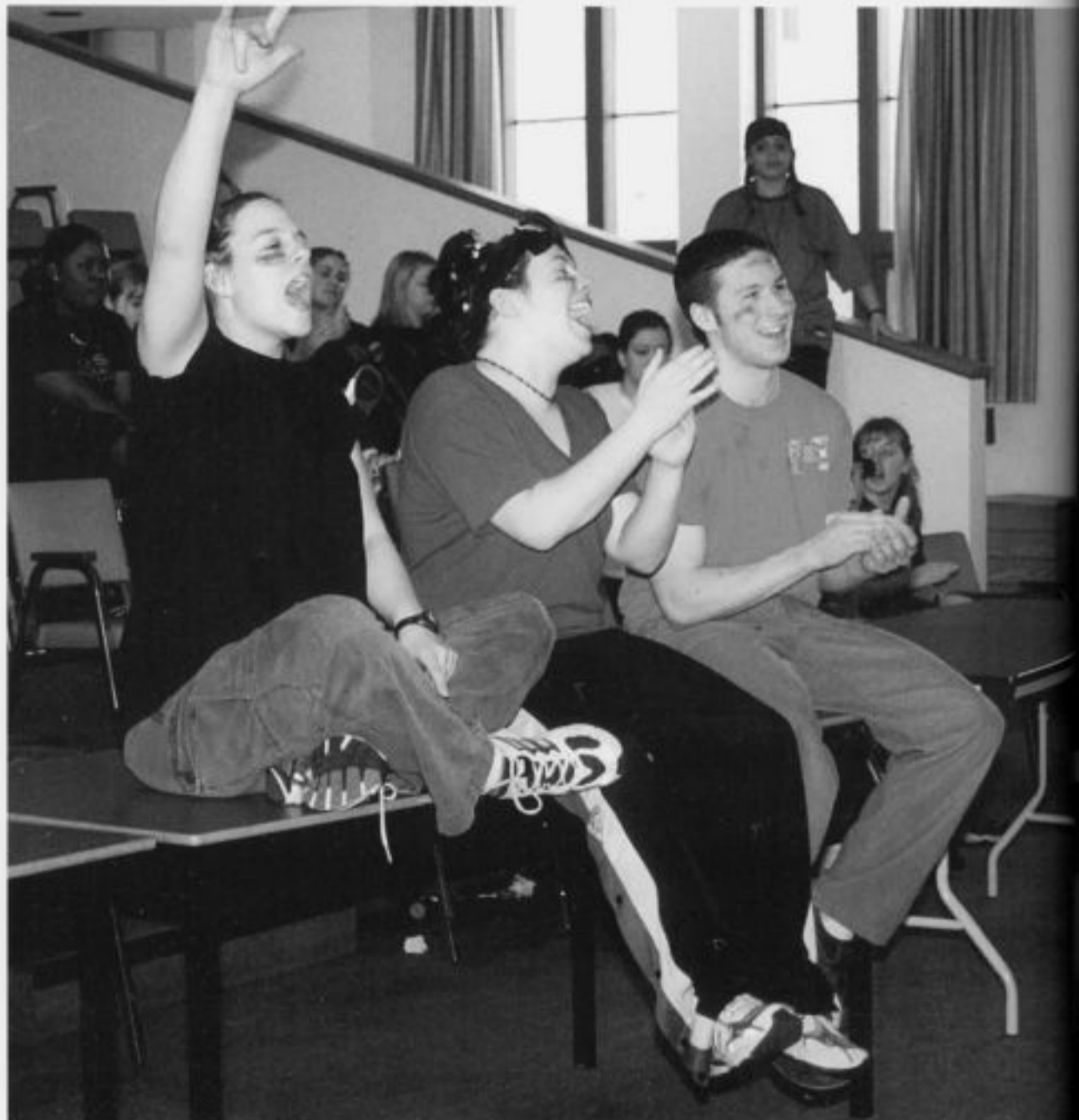

# football

In 1999 the Huskies returned to their rightful place amongst the elite of the CIAU Football Programs. By continuing to build on a successful 1998 season, the Huskies were set to win their first AUAA championship since 1994. It was all over the Huskies not only clinched the conference title, but dominated University of Waterloo to earn the Atlantic Bowl and a trip to Toronto to represent the school at the Vanier Cup.

The season started slowly for the squad as they lost a last minute game to Acadia in Wolfville. However, they regrouped and reeled off eight straight wins including a thrilling come from behind, 25-24 victory over Acadia in the AUAA Championship game.

The strength of this year's squad was seen in the depth of the team. From earlier in training camp it was clear the Huskies had the potential to be strong in all facets of the game. Offensively, the coaching staff put together a balanced attack of running and passing. The running game was especially strong with backs Dean Jones and Luis Perez, who finished one and two for the rushing title. The emergence of the passing game was evident as QB Ryan Jones continued his development. Ryan showed tremendous leadership during the Cup run and was able to connect effectively with his receivers for most of the year. Perhaps the biggest reason for the Huskies dominance can be found on their offensive line. In most cases, this group of athletes who average 6'3", 310 pounds, simply were too big for opposition defenses to deal with.

On the defensive side of the football, the Huskies continued to progress, finishing the year allowing the fewest points in the AUAA. Perhaps their greatest effort came during the Atlantic Bowl in which the Huskies "D" contained a very powerful Waterloo offense limiting their running attack and forcing 6 turnovers, paving the way for a victory. This unit remains in tact, so look for continued improvement by the Huskies defenders.

Individually, several players were honored for their outstanding efforts during 1999. The Huskies collected several conference awards as well as 2 All-Canadian honors. Making the all-conference list were:

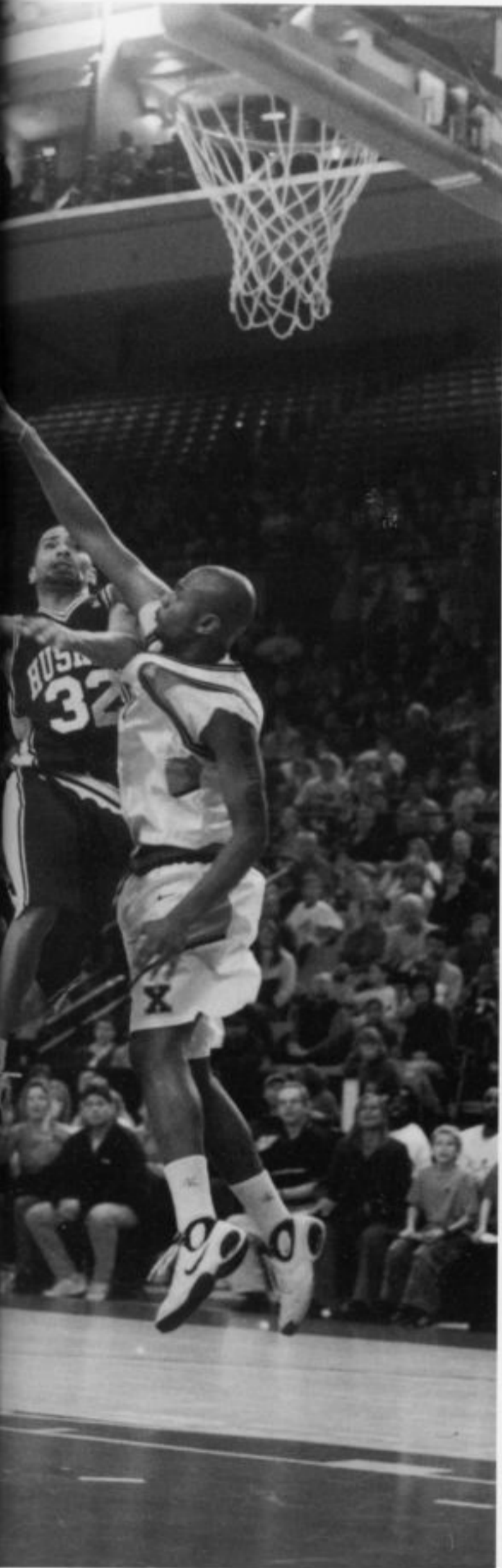
# men's basketball

Having won the CIAU National Championship in March, 1999 and with the majority of players returning for the 1999-2000 season, the Huskies were expected to contend for a second consecutive title. The team had an outstanding season with twenty-five wins against only nine losses, but they were unable to get back to the Final Eight Tournament.

Saint Mary's was highly ranked in the CIAU Top Ten throughout the season and finished in second place in the Baldwin division behind the also highly regarded St. F.X. X-men. At the AUAA play-offs a 79-71 come from behind win over UCCB moved the Huskies on to the semi-finals and an 87-68 win over UNB. In the final game Saint Mary's lost 68,62 to St. F.X. who went on to defend the honour of the AUAA by winning the league's second national championship in many years. 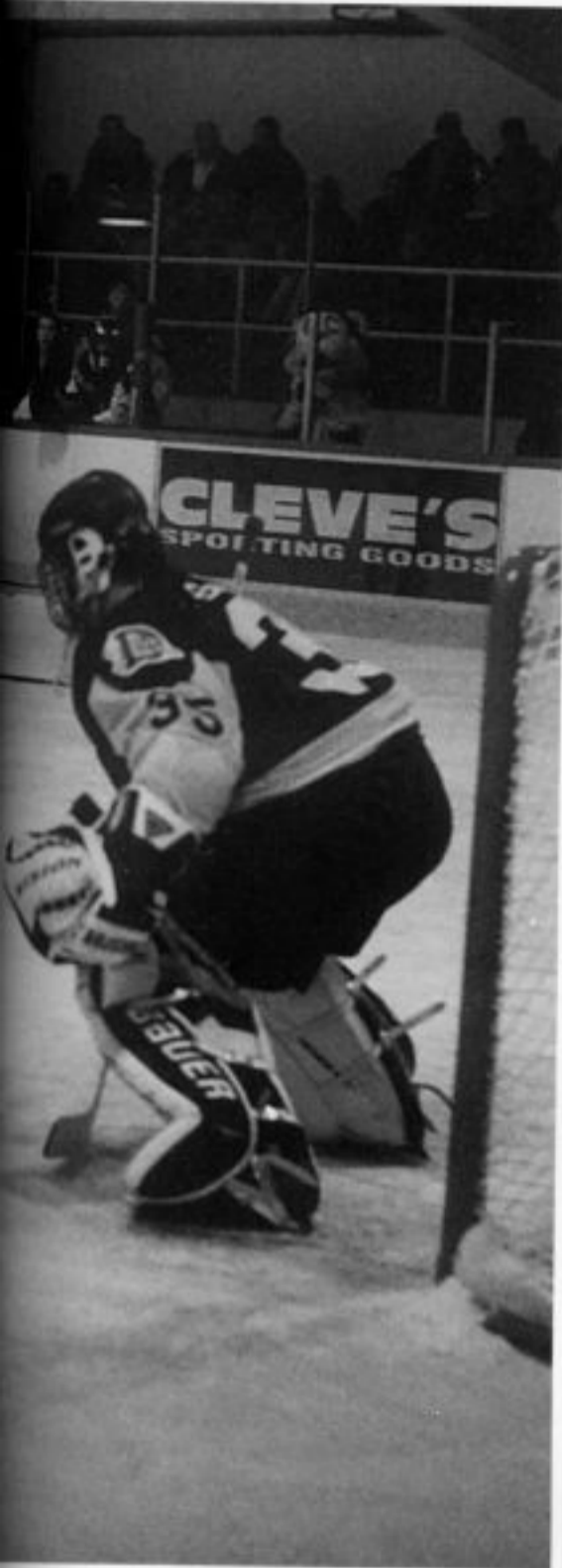


# men's hockey

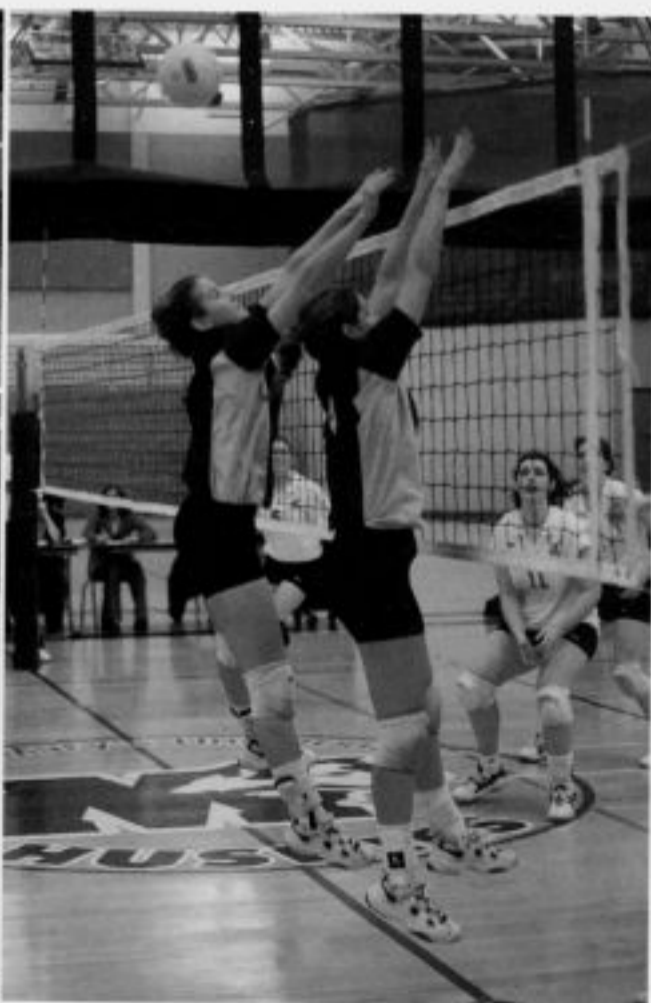
# women's volleyball

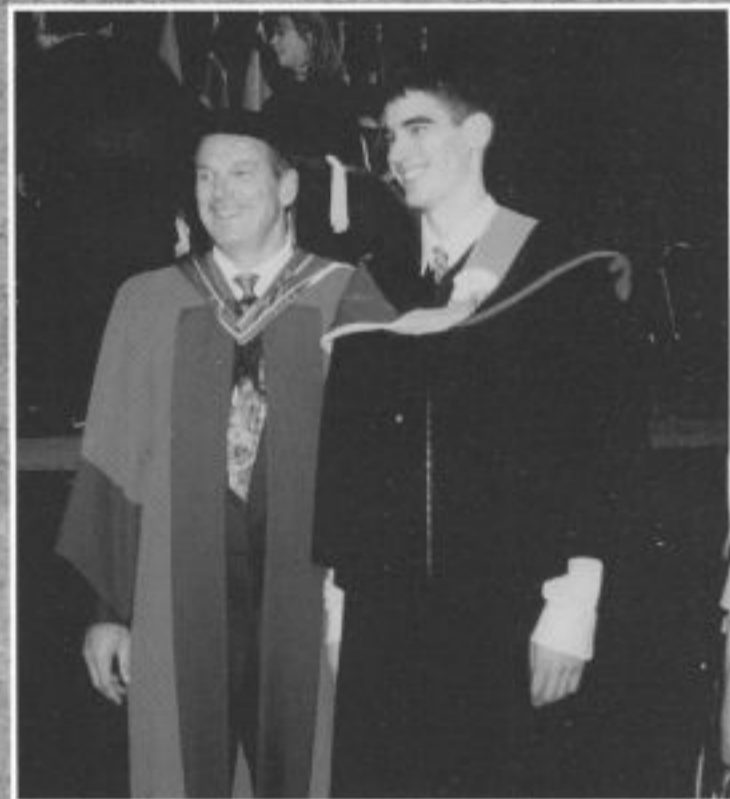
## Convocation

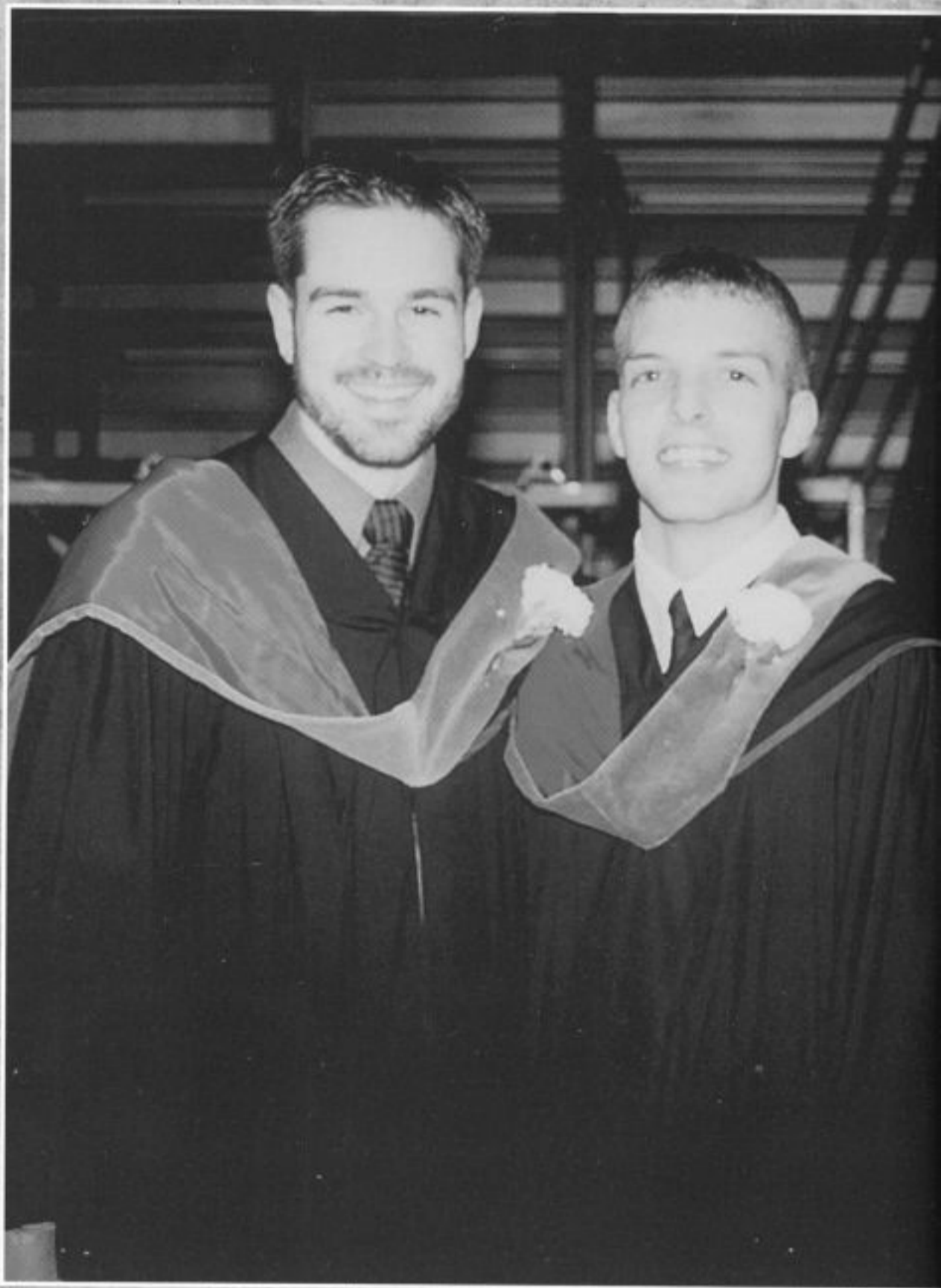
Each convocation had it's own valedictory address. Tuere Armony spoke at the afternoon convocation and Terence Connelly spoke at the evening ceremony.

**Tuere Armony** gives her valedictory address at the afternoon convocation.



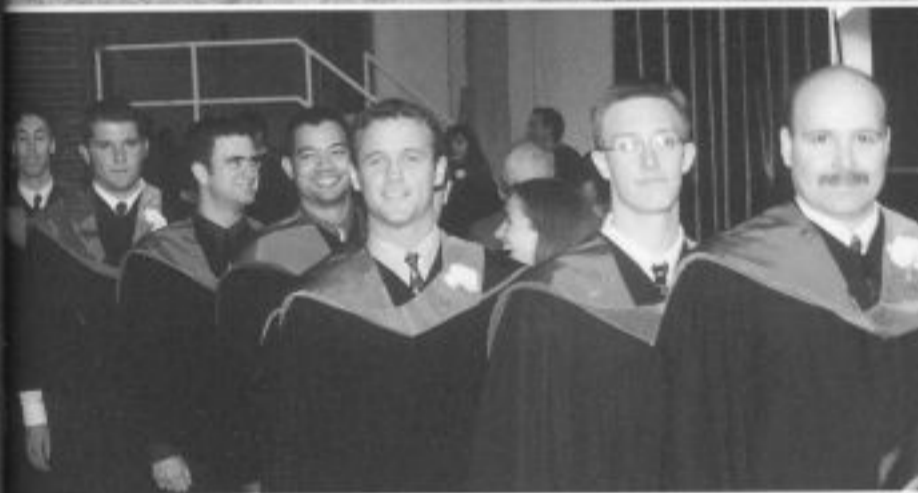

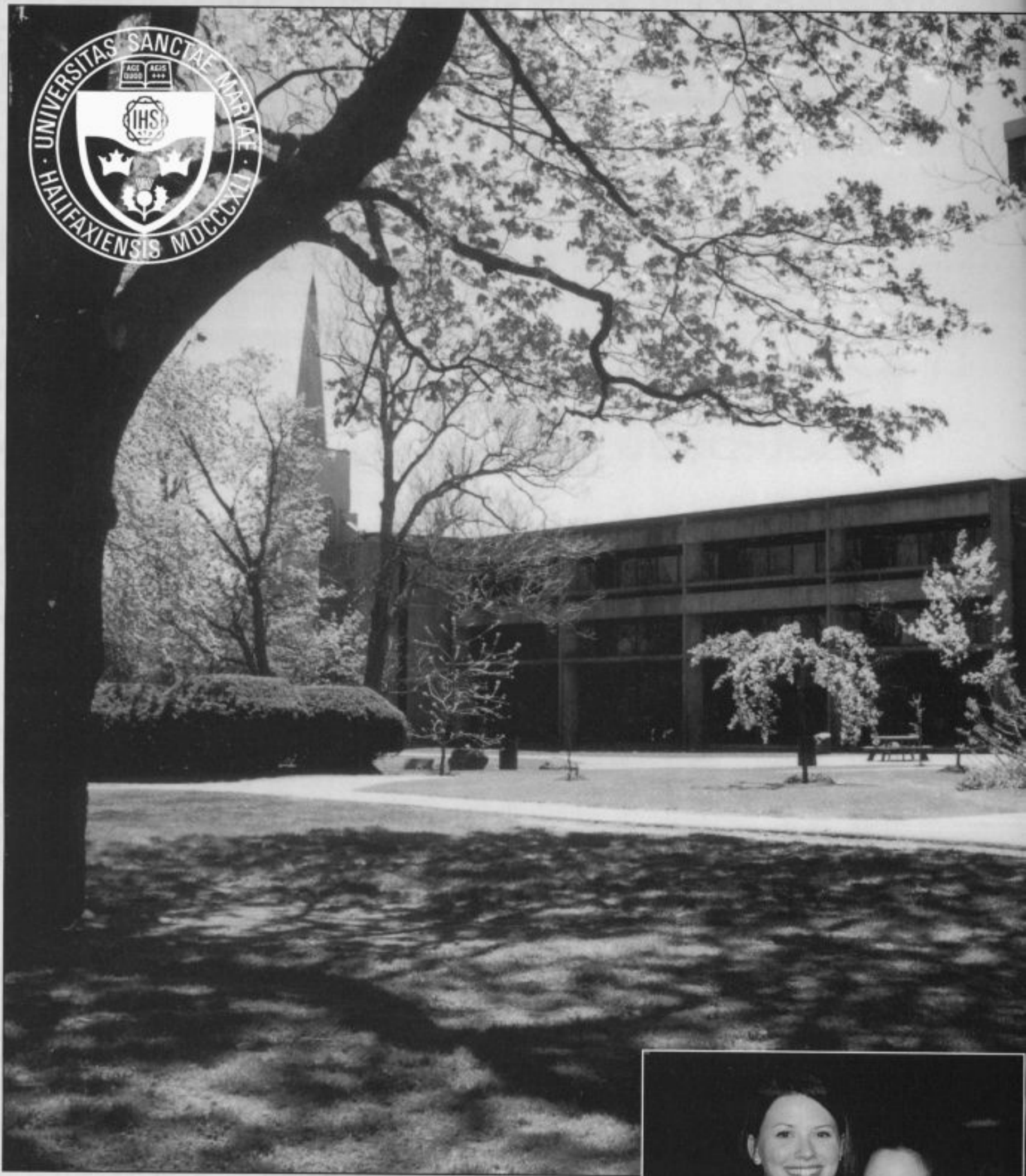
