
Time well spent






Halloween at the Pub

On Wednesday, February 6, students at Saint Mary's University gat at 1:00 p.m. at Saint Mary's University Student Centre in support of the Student Day of Action campaign. The Saint Mary's students joined forowith all other students in the province at Victoria Park at 2:15p.m. and the ventured to the steps of the Legislature for 3:00p.m.

Students organized for massive demonstrations on Wednesday, Fet 6, to manifest strong opposition to crippling government under-funding skyrocketing tuition fees and debt loads. The demonstrators are timed part of the Canadian Federation of Students National Day of Action; however, all Student Unions, regardless of their Federal and Provincial Lobby Organizations, are participating through the Nova Scotia Student Advocacy Coalition.

The unprecedented co-operation between all of the Student Unions directly related to the deplorable state of post-secondary education in N Scotia. Students here face the highest tuition fees and debt loads in Ca Furthermore, Nova Scotia is the only province to have a complete abse of Provincial Grants and debt relief.



Student Day of Action began at 12:30 with the music of Trip Complete, after the band a fireshow kept students warm while showing their support. Samantha Anderson, President of SMUSA had the opening remarks followed by Ian Appleton the VP of External Affairs then Ian Affleck from NSAC on the importance of student support.

Barbara Moore the President for CUPE3912 of the part time faculty Union for SMU, Dal, and MSVU. Dr. Terry Murphy spoke as well as the Saint Mary's Student Max Haiven was the master of ceremonies.



Student Day of Action continued on a march down to Victoria Park to meet with Dalhousie, Mount Saint Vincent, Acadia and , Saint Francis Xavier Universities to voice thier concern for change.

In the year 2000, they had 3,000 people take part in the marathon program. The Joints in Motion Program fundraises six million dollars annually.


























Engineering Society














Environmental Society








Rugby Society









Anthropology Society




Campus Crusade for Christ

Outreach




Saint Mary's Varsity Hockey 2001 – 2002






Saint Mary's Huskies travelled to Montreal to compete
