It is a dynamic group of students who undertake various activities, including cultural events, with the goal of promoting awareness of the rich African culture.

During the 2007-08 academic year the presence of the African Society was felt as the society was involved in various activities such as partnering with the Caribbean Society for the Caribbean fashion show which raised funds for a charitable organization, and working hand-in-hand with the WUSC Society and supporting its student refugee program. SMASS held the first African Christmas dinner at Saint Mary's University which welcomed guest speaker Joseph Nyemah who addressed issues of forced migration, displacement and the presence of African students in the diaspora. One highlight of the year was the creation of the African Citizenship Award. This award will be presented every year to an African student who encompass model citizenship behavior and displays leadership skills, community involvement and awareness of African affairs. This year, it was awarded to Kamagaju Karekezi on "African Night" for her work with the World University Services of Canada local committee and the Student Refugee Program at Saint Mary's University.



CONFLICT RESOLUTION SOCIETY

The Conflict Resolution Society worked hard this year to maintain and create connections with Peaceful Schools International and the Conflict Resolution Project: where SMU students are sent into schools in Northern Ireland to promote peaceful resolution. The society worked with a group of children from Oxford Elementary School in Halifax, and then worked overseas.

Belfast and Northern Ireland left impressions on the 12 SMU students who spent their Reading Week in the country. We met the Deputy First Minister Martin McGuinness and the British Irish Secretariat, and worked with hundreds of students in primary and secondary schools around Belfast and Ballymurphy.

We visited St. Bernadette's Girls Primary School to meet with the teachers we would partner with throughout the week, as well as the Peaceful Schools International workers we worked with in preparation. The teachers were more than welcoming to all of us. After Hetty van Gurp's inspirational speech, we were all ready to get into schools and spread the word on sustainable peace.

After an early morning visit to Stormont and a closed meeting with Martin McGuinness MP, we headed to the Boys Model Secondary School in North Belfast. The boys, who showed interest in becoming student ambassadors, were phenomenal. They listened and partook in our workshop, with the odd laugh at our quirky accents. After the session which focused on conflict resolution and anger, we had a chance to talk freely with the young men. From Guitar Hero and Lucky Charms, to "what the hell is poutine?" and stories of sectarianism at work, nothing was off limits in our conversations. It was interesting to see how easily the conversation shifted from conversations about cell phones to ones of paramilitaries or running through the Catholic area in a Rangers track suit on St. Patrick's Day. It was an interesting first look into the lives of students living in some areas of Belfast.

The next day we headed to St. Bernadette's Primary School, an all girls school in West Belfast. The adorable young ladies certainly knew our topic well; bullying. We were shocked to hear such inclusive answers to our questions about bullying. It was even solemn to realize such young faces were hiding such grave experiences. At the end of our stay at St. Bernadette's, the girls practiced their school play for the group. After a moving performance of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, we had memories to last a lifetime.

Those little instances are what made us all realize what we were doing can have a positive impact. In a conversation with several of the students we were told, "It means a lot more coming from you big kids than it does the same teacher who we listen to every day". As if that wasn't enough, when the gang was eating lunch, we looked out into the playground to find well over one hundred children waving emphatically at us, a group of 'big kids' from Canada. Talk about your celebrity moment.

The last school we visited was the all boys school of St. Aidan's Primary School in Ballymurphy, an area plagued with a skyrocketing suicide rate. Walking into the school courtyard, past the razor-wire fences, after the gates were opened from an indoor security system, there stood a large mural depicting a suicide helpline and counseling service. The boys told some of the most haunting stories we had ever heard, from fathers being kidnapped to having to taxi into school everyday to avoid having death treats followed out, but they were still willing, even eager to learn. Some of the brightest faces came from St. Aidan's, and an impromptu game of basketball against the 'big kids from Canada' showed all of us that despite having been through terrible times, these kids are still kids, children who like to play and have fun.


The little ladies and gents we encountered gave us many precious memories, along with many solemn ones. Stories of jailed or killed family members rolled off their tongues so matter of factly during our peace tree exercise; we realized the realities of these children are of our worst night mares.


The Conflict Resolution Project left incredible impressions on all of us; memories we shall never forget. As a group, it is our hope that we were able to leave a few valuable impressions of our own. It is safe to say that we learned as much, if not more, from those children as they learned from us.

SMU PRAMA SOCIETY

1907 is the first recorded date of the Santamarian Dramatic Class, producing annual plays, which became the College Playshop in 1940. In 1954, it became the SMU Drama Society. Since then, we have produced an unbroken string of plays which continues today, with a cast and crew from the university community of students and alumni, staff and faculty.

2007-2008 productions were Little Women, based on Louisa May Alcott's novel of the same name and directed by freshman Kate Basile, and Shakespeare's A Midsummer Night's Dream, directed by local actor Marty Burt. Recent productions have included Oscar Wilde's Importance of Being Ernest (directed by Natasha McLellan) and Shakespeare's Twelfth Night (directed by SMU professor Glenn Walton).











LINGUISTICS

The first ever Linguistics Society was founded in September 2007 to act as a voice on behalf of the students enrolled in the tri-university linguistics program; we are happy to have representatives from Dalhousie University and Mount St. Vincent University on our Board of Executives.

The society's main goal has been to act as a liaison between students and faculty in order to promote the program and address any concerns that members may have while increasing the level of information being relayed to students. This year we have been able to act as a resource for our students in several different ways; we are offering volunteering opportunities, which are being officially logged, and are recognizable on academic and professional CVs; we offer tutoring, research help, study tips, and organize study groups for students taking linguistics related courses. We have worked with the Employment Center to organize a successful panel discussion regarding potential careers related to this field. Additionally, we are putting together information regarding graduate programs at schools across the continent and are working in collaboration with the program faculty on several other projects.

WUSC

"EPUCATION CHANGES THE WORLP"



The World University Service of Canada (WUSC) is a Canadian International Development NGO based in Ottawa, and is comprised of a network of individuals and post secondary institutions. It's mission is to foster human development and global understanding through educational training, and works with partner organizations on development programs in 10 countries around the world to achieve this.

One of WUSC's main programs is the Student Refugee Program. This program is currently operating on 60 campuses across Canada including SMU, where we have successfully sponsored 23 students in the past 24 years. The goal of this program is to provide refugee students an opportunity to study at a post-secondary institute and resettle in Canada as permanent residents.

The sponsored students come from refugee camps and urban centres in Kenya, Malawi and Thailand. Students are sponsored for one year with the help and contributions from the university, Residence Life Office, Book Store, Saint Mary's University Faculty Union, International Centre, SMU-SA and Aramark. The WUSC Local Committee, and its staff and faculty representatives, plays a vital role in supporting each sponsored student as they ad just to a new life in Canada.

In addition to supporting the Student Refugee Program and welcoming our 23rd sponsored student to SMU, the WUSC Local Committee has been very active on campus during the 2007-2008 academic year, educating the university and wider Halifax community about international development issues through events such as Stand Up and Speak Out and the presentation 'Afghanistan: A Nation at the Crossroads' by Mirwais Nahzat during International Development Week. The Local Committee also promoted international learning opportunities provided through Uniterra in which one SMU student was selected to travel to Ghana for the 6 week Uniterra International Seminar scheduled to take place during Summer 2008. Other events focused on fundraising such as the International Market and Live Music Fundraising Event, bake sales, a Leap Year Basket raffle, and coat checks at International Night and Africa Night. A group of Local Committee members also attended the WUSC Annual General Assembly in Ottawa in November, 2007.

The members of the SMU WUSC local committee are dedicated to the society and have worked hard to make WUSC a success this academic year. A big thank you all the members who made WUSC possible this year!








STUDENTS WORKI

The staff and management would like to thank all of its loyal customers and look forward to serving you in the future as alumni. Cheers!


Husky Patrol

Marketing also handles most of the SMUSA related media including print, SMUSA.ca, and the HDMD screens located around campus. Marketing has been around in some form for over 20 years! This year, the department was open from 9am to 5pm, Monday to Friday.

This year went by so quickly. The department focused on increasing usage of sustainable media such as the Media Screen's and website. The media screens are unique for their ability to display large, bright material with comparatively low impact on the environment. This was the first year for the Volunteer Coordinator position, which fell under the Programmer/Coordinator position in past years. With more time available for volunteer activities, we were able to execute many charity and Random Acts of Kindness (RAK) events. The RAK Squad is a group of students from SMU who perform good deeds all over Halifax. These student volunteers can be seen out and about in their bright orange t-shirts and maroon hats, making people's day with contagious smiles. The RAK Squad, initiated in 2005, is a joint project of the Pride In Our Shared Neighbourhood Committee and Saint Mary's University Students' Association (SMUSA).

This year, over 450 volunteers were recruited and the RAK Squad reached over 65 members, growing after every event. Some international events RAK participated in are: UNICEF's Spread the NetCampaign, raising funds for mosquito nets for children in Africa; Canfar's Have a Heart Campaign, promoting AIDS awareness, and St. Valentine's Day Hair Massacure, with proceeds going to the Make-A-Wish Foundation. During International RAK week, the RAK squad served at local soup kitchens, helped make African bracelets for African Heritage Month at Inglis Street School, and raised funds for CIBC's Boys in Red Trust Fund. This year we also initiated a Charity Events Committee that consisted of several dedicated volunteers. This committee met to discuss potential charity ideas to better meet the interests of SMU students.

▲ IT TAKES A WORLD. UNICEF, the international children's agency, announced that global childhood deaths hit a record low in 2006. Though 9.7 million children died before their fifth birthday, that statistic is down from nearly 13 million in 1990. While the worst rates came from nations plagued by war and violence, some Third World nations have used simple affordable measures to great success.





▲ BRAVERY IN BURMA. Dressed in vivid orange and red robes, thousands of Buddhist monks marched barefoot through the streets of Rangoon last September. They were joined by thousands of civilians, shouting "Democracy!" Burma has been ruled by a harsh military regime since 1962, which the massive street protests could not defeat. Within days, soldiers and police responded with a brutal crackdown. The government shut off all access to the outside world, including Internet service, and thus the fate of the protestors may never be known. (AP)


■ THE DYNAMIC DUO. The passionate crowds of U.S. Democratic party members flocking to presidential candidates' rallies and debates know they are witnessing history in the making. At the party's convention in August, they will nominate either the first black, Barack Obama, or the first woman, Hillary Rodham Clinton to be their presidential hope on the November election ballot.



▲ MUSEUM LOOT. When Italy asked the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City to return a number of objects it claims were illegally lifted from ancient sites, it opened a huge debate in museums around the world: who really owns pieces looted in the past? The debate centred on one object in particular: the Euphronios krater, a Greek vase from the 6th century B.C., that was sold to the Met for \$1 million in 1972. Italy wanted it returned, and after 30 years of wrangling, a deal was reached. In a splashy homecoming celebration, the vase went on display in Rome in January. (Bebeto Matthews/AP)



▲ CAMPUS HERO AMID THE HORROR. On the morning of the Virginia Tech massacre, engineering professor and Holocaust survivor Liviu Librescu, 76, was presenting a slideshow to his class. When shots were heard in the corridor, Librescu pressed himself against the classroom door, blocking the gunman long enough for many of his students to jump to safety through second-floor windows. Librescu was killed that day by Cho Sueng-Hui, who shot 31 other students and professors and then himself in the worst school



■ AN OFFICER AND A PRINCE. It was Prince Harry's grandma, Queen Elizabeth II, who told the 23-year-old army officer that he was off for a tour of duty in the dangerous southern Afghanistan. While Harry, his recognizable red hair safely obscured by a helmet, called in air strikes and went on foot patrols, dozens of media outlets kept his location a secret for 10 weeks. This protected the selfdescribed "bullet magnet" and his fellow soldiers from Taliban attacks. But after a U.S. website broke the news, Harry was forced to return home. He was met by his dad, Prince Charles and his elder brother William, who, because he's a future king of England, will never get to see action. (REX FEATURES)

◄ CHINA SYNDROME. From clothing and electronics to foodstuffs and toys, China is now the world's source for cheap imports. But in recent months, reports of contaminated products point to the downside of our growing dependence on Chinese suppliers. First there was the dog and cat food that killed family pets, next came

▲ HOPING AND PRAYING. Pictures of Madeleine McCann's chubby face, big round eyes and blond hair are plastered throughout Europe. The British toddler went missing from a Portuguese holiday resort just before her fourth birthday last May. When a huge hunt by police and volunteers combined with massive media coverage failed to turn up any clues, her parents launched a website looking for information. Weeks after Madeleine vanished, Quebec was stunned when 10-year-old Cédrika Provencher disappeared in Trois-Rivières while on a bike ride. Missing posters plastered store windows and a massive volunteer effort was organized. Though police continue to investigate, the girls are still missing. (Alastair Grant/AP)

■ PAKISTAN UNDER PRESSURE. Reeling from crisis to crisis, Pakistan teetered on the brink of chaos. While al-Qaeda and other terrorists encroached from Afghanistan next door, homegrown militant Islamists at mosques in the capital, Islamabad, fought gun battles with security forces. Meanwhile former political leaders lined up to challenge President Pervez Musharraf, a general who had seized power in a 1999 coup. The main challenger was former prime minister Benazir Bhutto, whose triumphant homecoming after eight years in exile was cut short when she was assassinated in late December during the national election campaign. In February, after voters rejected Musharraf, the big question remained whether anyone could lead Pakistan into calmer waters.

▲ ANGEL WISH. When Maddie Babineau, dying of bone cancer, was offered anything she wanted by the Children's Wish Foundation, the 15-year-old Hamilton, Ont., teen passed on a Disney cruise or a shopping spree and instead asked for a new school in the poor Kenyan village of Enelerai. After the foundation granted her request, Babineau started raising the \$10,000 needed to build a well near the school, so kids could attend classes rather than spending hours hauling water for their families. For those concerned that the public, deeply divided over Canada's combat role in Afghanistan, wouldn't support its soldiers, the tributes on a stretch of highway in Ontario proved otherwise. Each time one of our war dead returned to CFB Trenton, thousands of Canadians lined Highway 401 to pay respects to the fallen as the cortiège passed by. The spontaneous nature of the vigils led the province to rename that section of Highway 401 the Highway of Heroes. (Frank Gunn/CP)

▼ TUSSLE FOR THE TUNDRA. As ancient Arctic ice melts faster and faster—the Northwest Passage was fully open last summer—the international fight over who will control the potentially lucrative shipping lanes and natural resources of the Far North is intensifying. As well as bulking up its military forces in the area, Russia planted a flag on the seabed below the North Pole while the United States aggressively pushed its idea that the passage is an international waterway and not, as Canada believes, a domestic route. In response, Ottawa beefed up Canuck claims, announcing plans to build up to eight new icebreakers along with a new Far North military base and a deep-water port on Baffin Island. No word yet on how the true kings of the Arctic, the polar bears, will deal with the newcomers. (**Placemon Canada Archiva)**



▲ A LOBBYIST AND A PM. As the economy slowed and the debate over the military's role in Afghanistan heated up during the winter, the biggest draw on Parliament Hill wasn't debates in the House of Commons but rather a committee hearing into the relationship between former PM Brian Mulroney and lobbyist Karlheinz Schreiber. The so-called Airbus Affair, which started two decades ago over allegations of kickbacks paid when Air Canada bought new Airbus planes, exploded back to life when PM Stephen Harper announced a public inquiry into the affair, hoping to shed light on the reported \$300,000 paid by Schreiber to Mulroney. Fascinated citizens watched as politicians, lobbyists and officials gave enough contradictory testimony to the committee to make a Law & Order plot look

▲ CRIME ISN'T PAYING. The last time the crime rate was this low, Pierre Trudeau was prime minister. Statistics Canada reported that the 2006 crime rate dropped three per cent, on top of a five per cent decline in 2005. Indeed, virtually all crimes had been trending downward in the past decade: breaking and entering rate was 43 per cent lower than it was in 1996, while murder was down 14 per cent. 






