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DEFINITIONS

1. Full-Time Students (FTS)

A full-time student is one whose primary occupation is personal attendance at the University and who is enrolled in three or more courses during the regular academic year. (September to May).

2. Part-Time Student (PTS)

A student registered in a degree program at Saint Mary's University but enrolled in less than three courses during the regular academic year.

3. Special Student

A student registered in a degree program at a university other than Saint Mary's University or a student with a first degree not registered in a degree program at any university but enrolled in a credit course at the University during the regular academic year.

4. Course Registration

One student enrolled in one-full course.

5. Average Section Size

Number of course registrations in a department or faculty divided by the number of course sections in the department or faculty.

6. Full-Time Equivalent Faculty

The number of full-time faculty plus the full-time equivalent of part-time faculty. As a general rule a part-time faculty member is considered as one-third (1/3) full-time equivalent for each full-year course he teaches.

7. Assignable Square Feet

The sum of all areas on all floors of a building assigned to or available for assignment to an occupant, including every type of space functionally useable by an occupant. Does not include custodial, circulation or mechanical areas.


