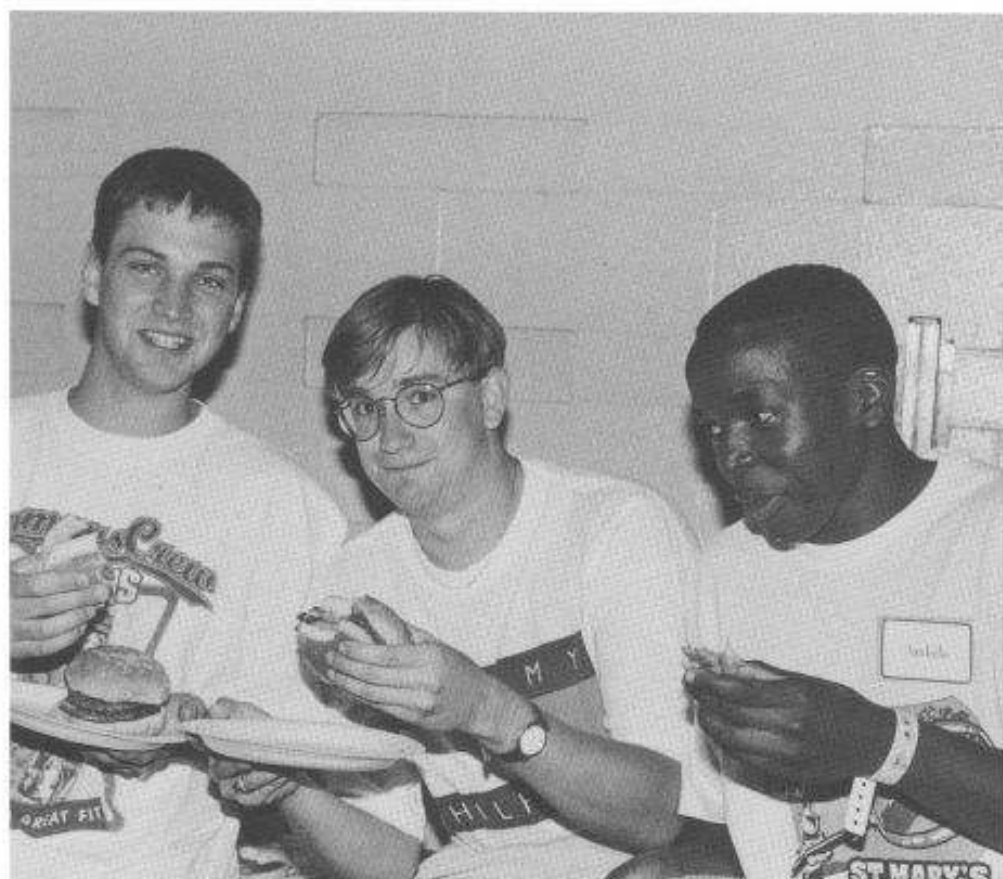
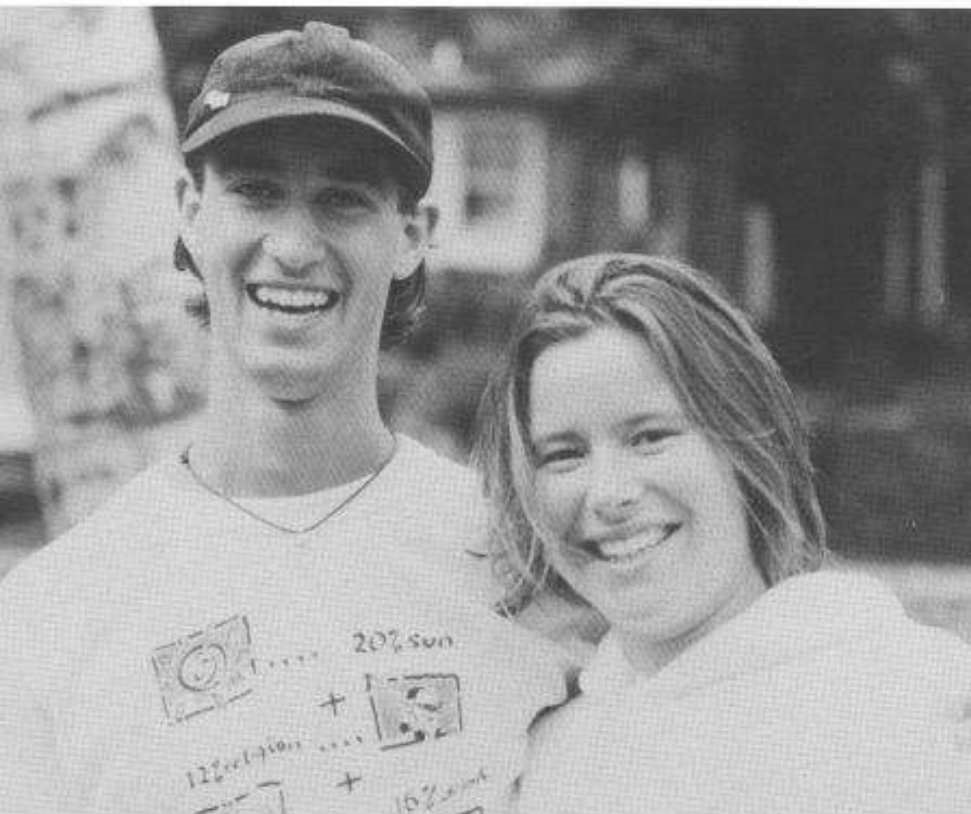


SAINT MARY'S WHAT'S HOT

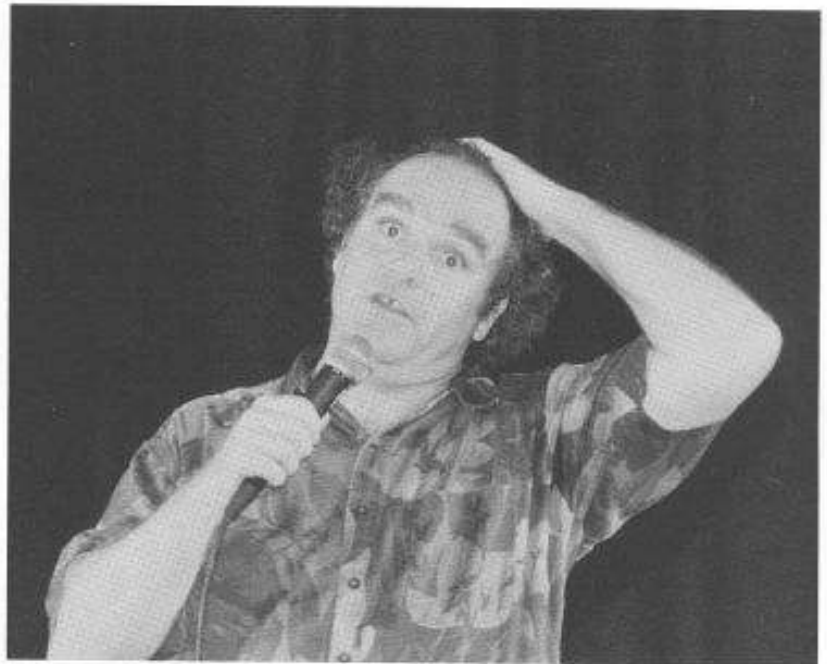
- Red armchairs in the library—for people-watching

A NEW ERA IN BASKETBALL

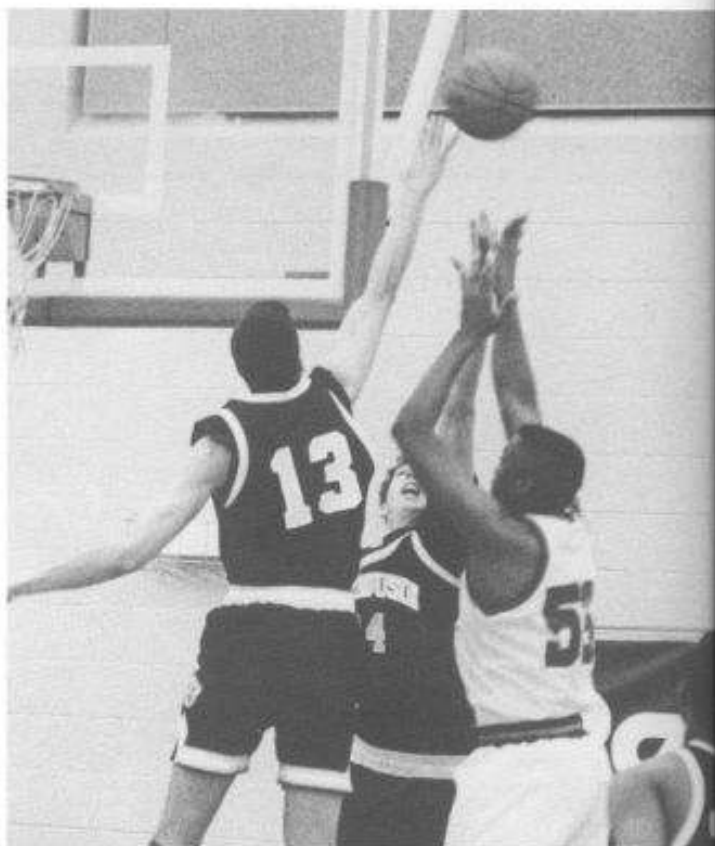
THE RIGOURS OF PROFESSIONAL SPORTS CAN PREPARE YOU FOR A LOT OF UNFORSEEN INCIDENTS. A PLAYER CAN SUDDENLY GET INJURED OR A TEAM CAN HAVE A HORRIBLE DAY SHOOTING THE BALL AND LOSE BY AN ENORMOUS AMOUNT. WHATEVER THE CASE MAY BE, AN IN PLAYER EVENTUALLY REHABILITATES AND A TEAM CAN RE-THINK STRATEGY AND REGROUP FROM THEIR LOSS.

ONE PROBLEM PROFESSIONAL COACHES DON'T HAVE TO WORRY ABOUT IS A FIVE YEAR ELIGIBILITY RULE. IN THE CANADIAN INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETIC UNION (CIAU), AN ATHLETE MAY ONLY PARTICIPATE IN UNIVERSITY ATHLETICS FOR FIVE YEARS. THIS IS A HEAD ACHE EVERY COACH HAS LEARNED TO DEAL WITH, BUT NO ONE RECEIVED THE LESSON "ELIGIBILITY 101" LIKE SMU BASKETBALL COACH ROSS QUACKENBUSH DID THIS YEAR.

SAINT MARY'S LOST SEVEN VALUABLE PLAYERS FROM ITS LINE-UP TO ELIGIBILITY AND GRADUATION LAST YEAR. WITH THE OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION OF WILLIAM NJOKU AND RICHARD SULLIVAN, AND THE DEFENSIVE PLAY OF VETERAN MIKE DIXON GONE, THIS WAS DEFINITELY A REBUILDING YEAR.

ALTHOUGH SMU FINISHED IN LAST PLACE IN THE ATLANTIC CONFERENCE WITH A RECORD OF 4-16, THE FUTURE DOES LOOK PROMISING. THIRD YEAR CENTER JASON MEDFORD PROVIDED THE OFFENCE FOR THE HUSKIES. ALSO SHOWING LEADERSHIP ON THE COURT WERE FORWARDS DEREK HURDLE, BRIAN LUINSTRA, JON WAYE AND CHRIS LAWRENCE.

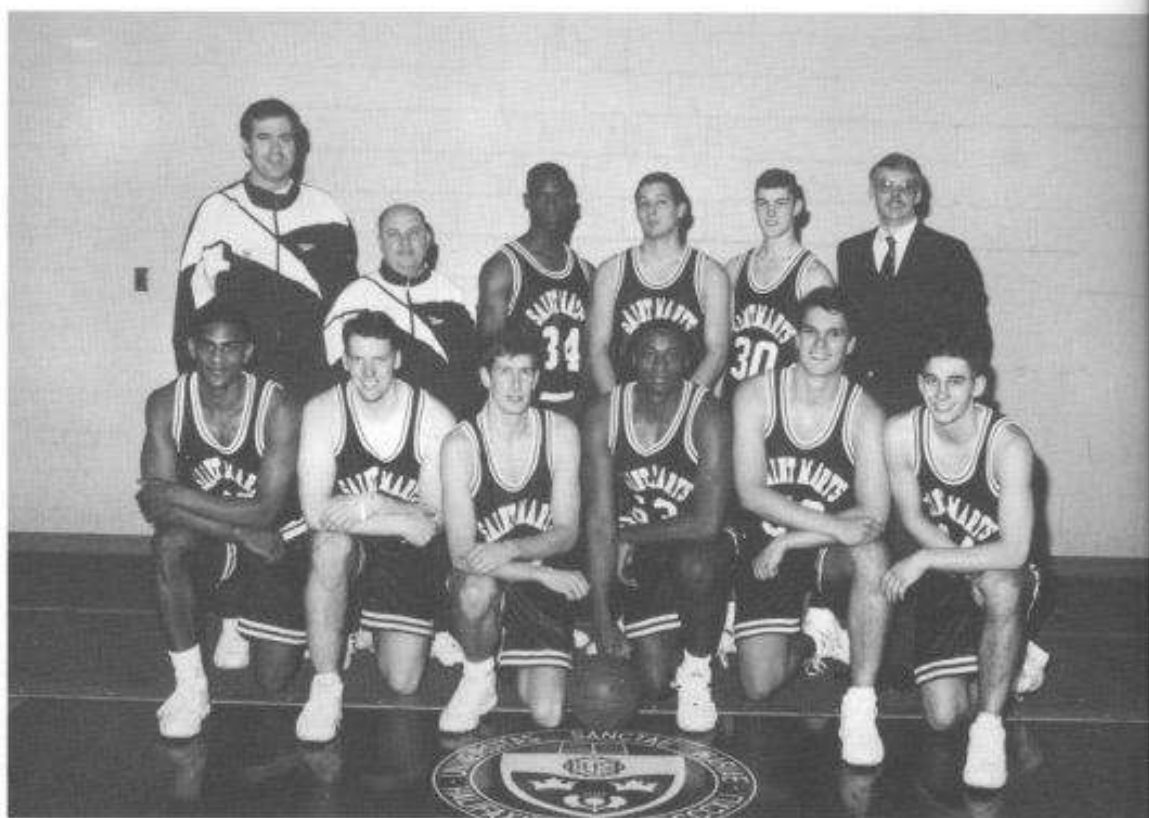
THE SURPRISE OF THE YEAR, THOUGH, WAS THE ADDITION OF SHARP-SHOOTER KEVIN KEELER AT THE GUARD POSITION AND OF MICAH BOURDEAU WHO OFTEN CAUGHT OPPONENTS SLEEPING WHILE HIDING UNDER THE MASK OF 'ROOKIE STATUS'. 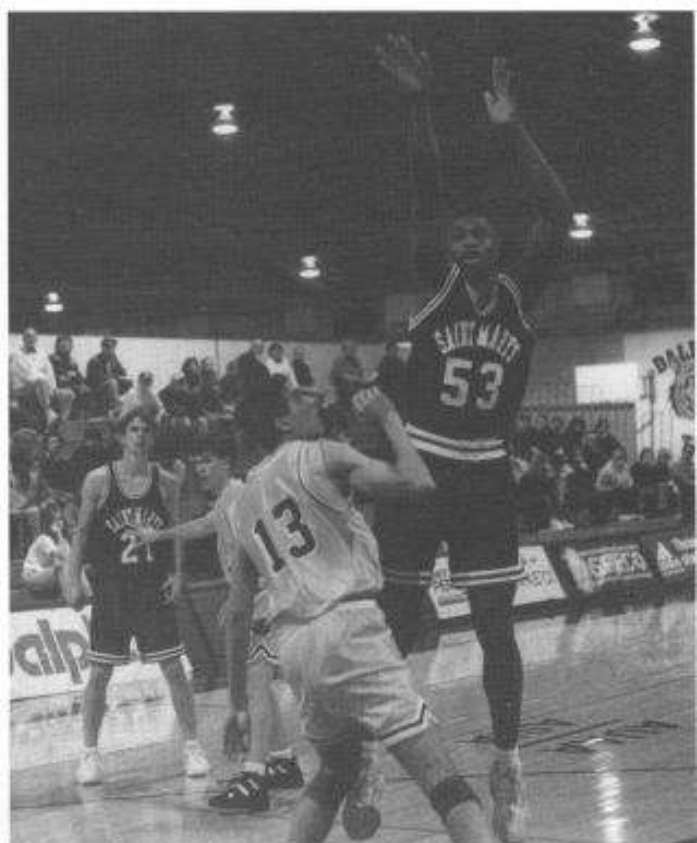

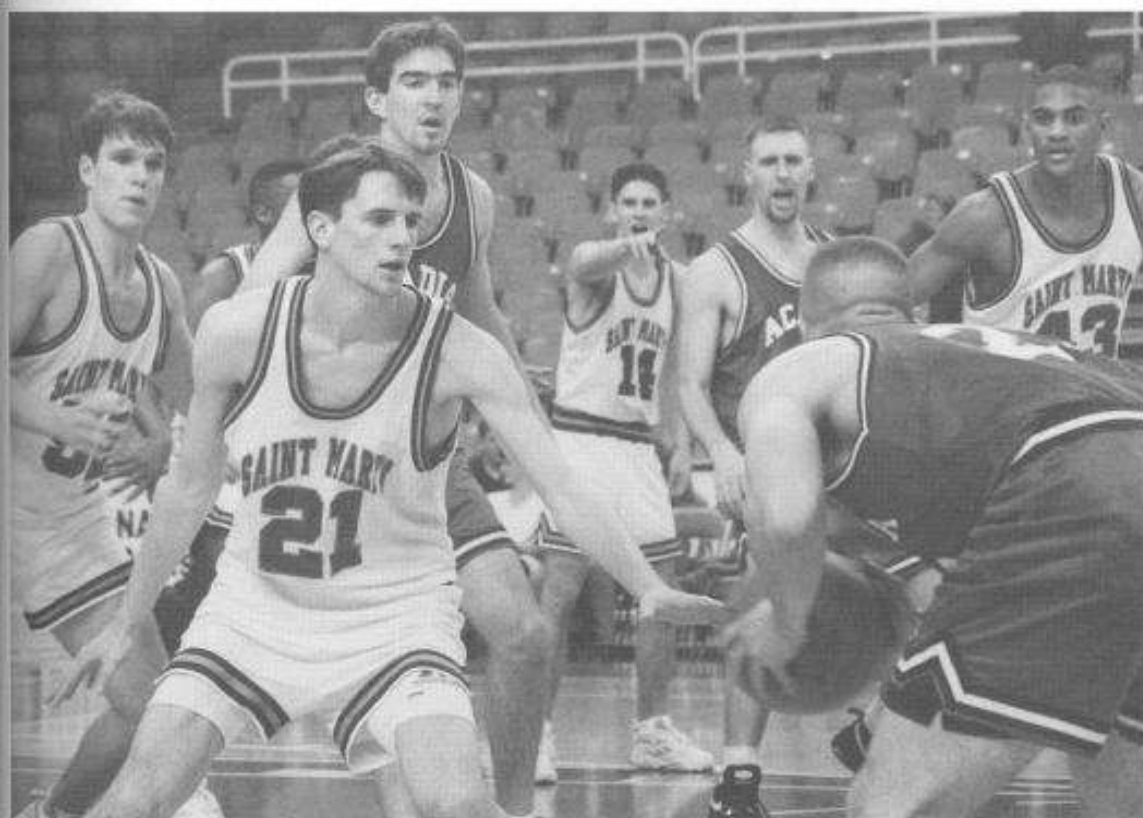

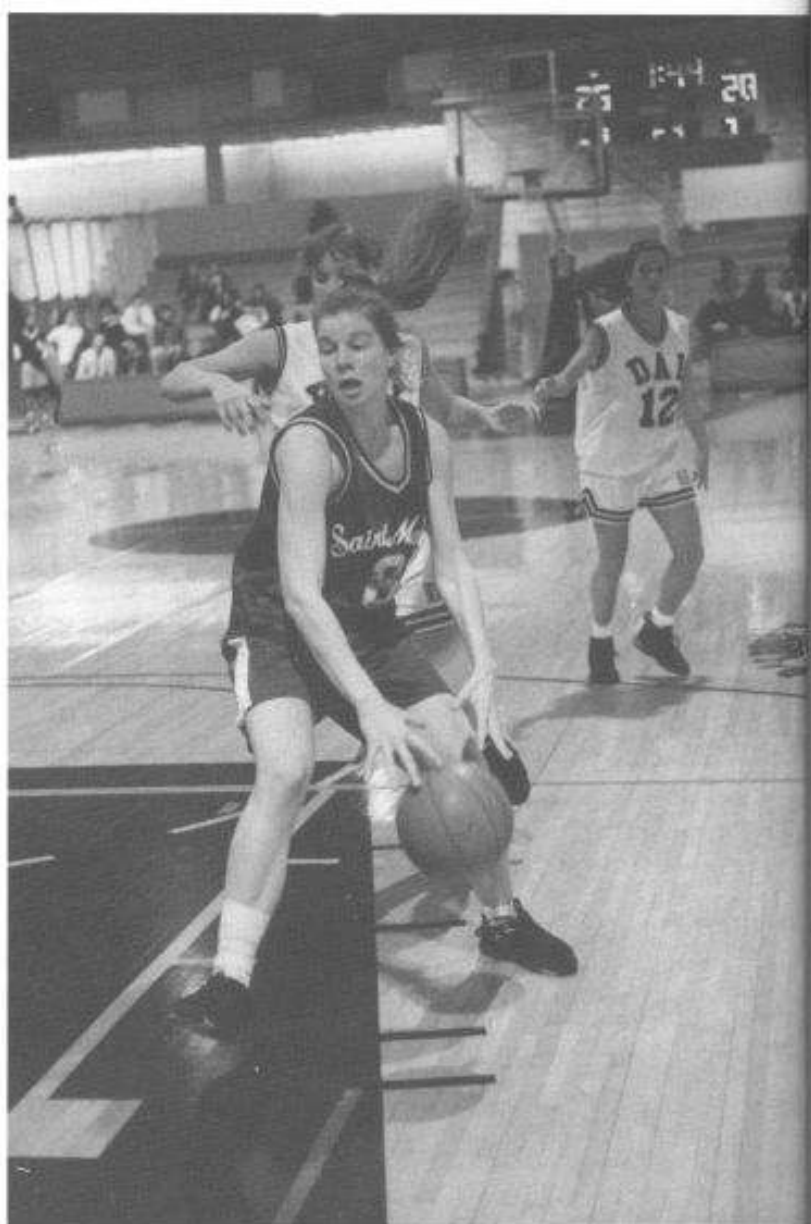

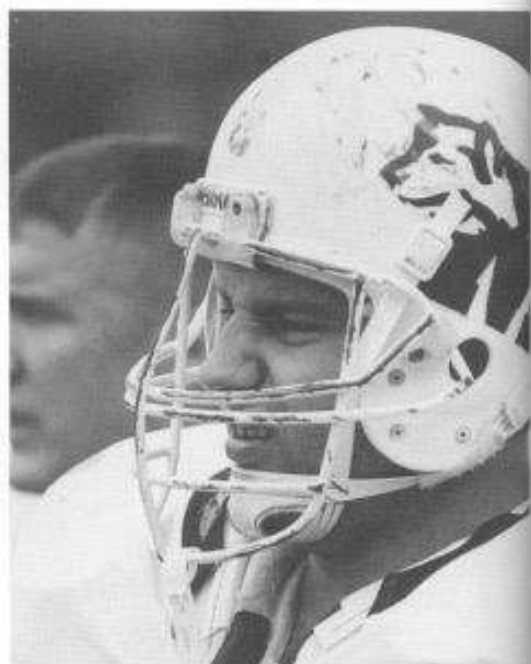

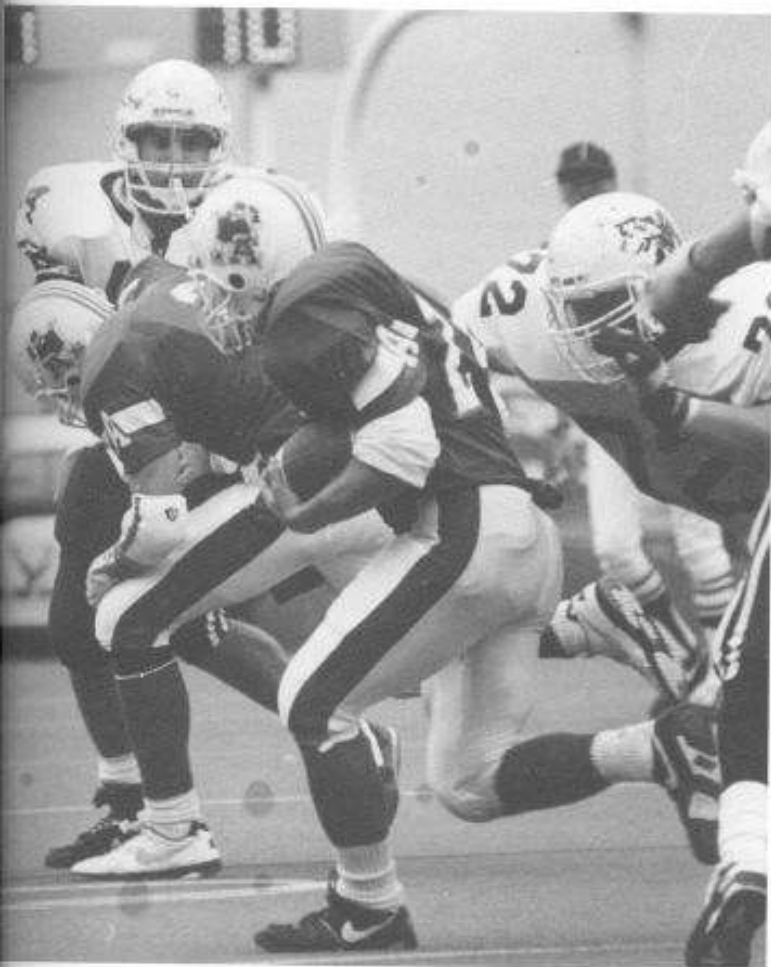

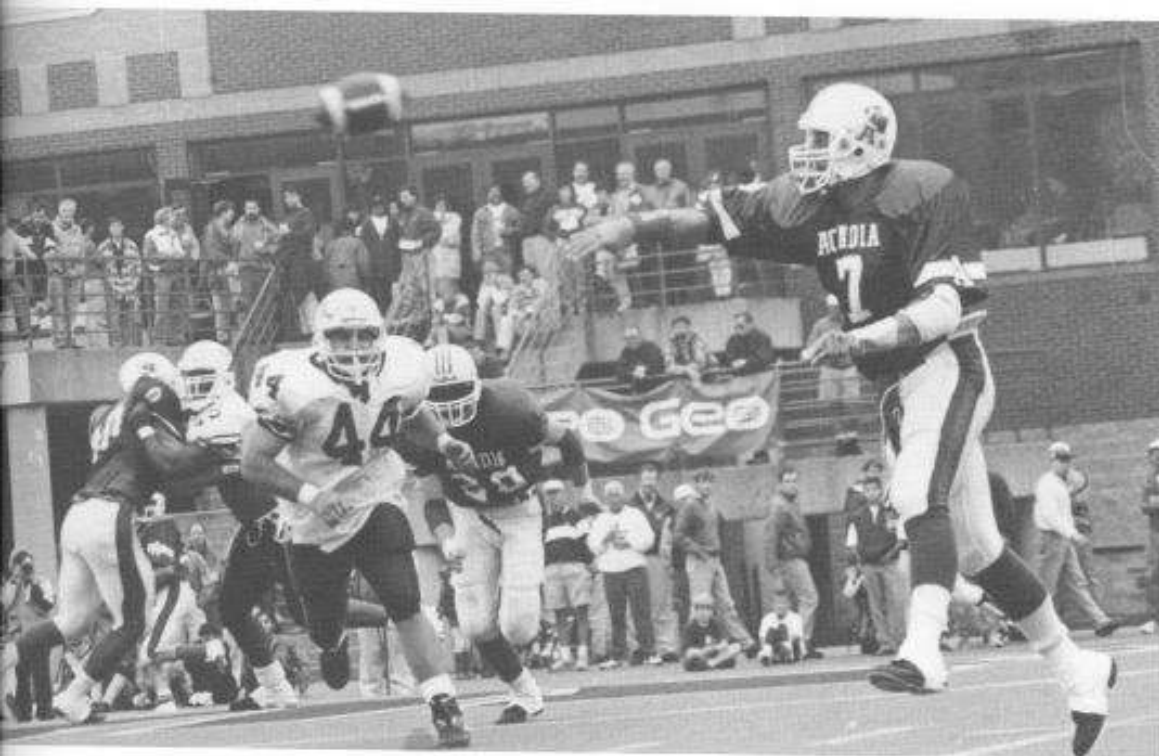

A Tradition of Excellence at SMU

The football program at Saint Mary's University is not just a tradition, it is a tradition of excellence. The football Huskies have dominated the Atlantic Universities conference recently winning seven of the last eight AUAA titles.

With the continuous fluctuation of players, leaving after graduation or having used up eligibility, maintaining a winning program can be difficult.

A lot (if not all) of the credit for the success of this program can be attributed to head coach Larry Uteck. A recruiting mastermind who molds and remolds his roster into a winning combination year in and year out.

The '94 season got off to a rocky start with a one point loss to the St. Francis Xavier X-men. This was, however, only one of two losses the Huskies would suffer all year. They finished with a 6-2 record (tops in the AUAA) quarterbacked by third year Hamilton, Ontario native Matt Finlay.

Finlay's performance was key after the departure of David Sykes and the ever present glory days of Chris Flynn. A lot of credit has to be given to SMU's wide receivers as well with names like Charles Ashe, Mike Messam, and Steve Sarty. The Offensive line of Chris Goddard, Colin O'Donnell, Alex Westwater, and Lee Rosky along with others worked hard in the absence of Ted MacLean who sat the year out with a broken leg.

With the departure of Trevor Burke, Andre Williams, Tony Bailey and David Houston defensively, the new backfield handled itself well this year. SMU gave up on average less than two touchdowns a game. Sean Marriott had a monstrous year at the linebacker position. Also filling in defensively were Brian Walker, Mark Preyma, Chris Merritt, and Dwayne Provo. Provo, who also placed fifth in the 60m in the CIAU Nationals was drafted fourth overall in the CFL. Weeks later he signed to a one year contract in the NFL by the New England Patriots.

Kicker Mark Dalla Riva topped the AUAA in points with 54 to lay claim to the scoring title. Dalla Riva, going into his fourth year next season will assume more responsibility with the departure of punter/kicker Dana Segin.

The Defensive line must finally get a mention as Tom Fleet, Noah Cantor, Sandor Kardos, and Tom Walton. This line combined with the talents of linebacker Alex Eliopolos makes the Huskies hard to beat and virtually unbeatable at home. Scott Rye has also bloomed at the running back position.

A major change in the program saw coach Paul Boutilier take over the head coaching job two years ago and with it some heavy recruiting. 16 player were recruited this past two years who give Boutilier the base to build his version of the hockey Huskies. This version includes a balance of skill, character, speed, size academic success of his players.

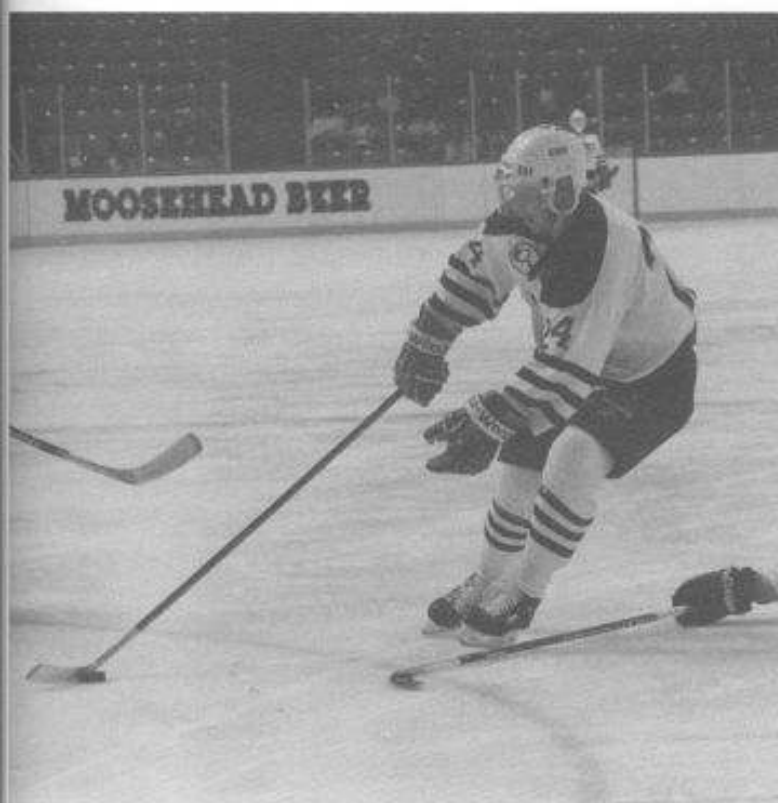

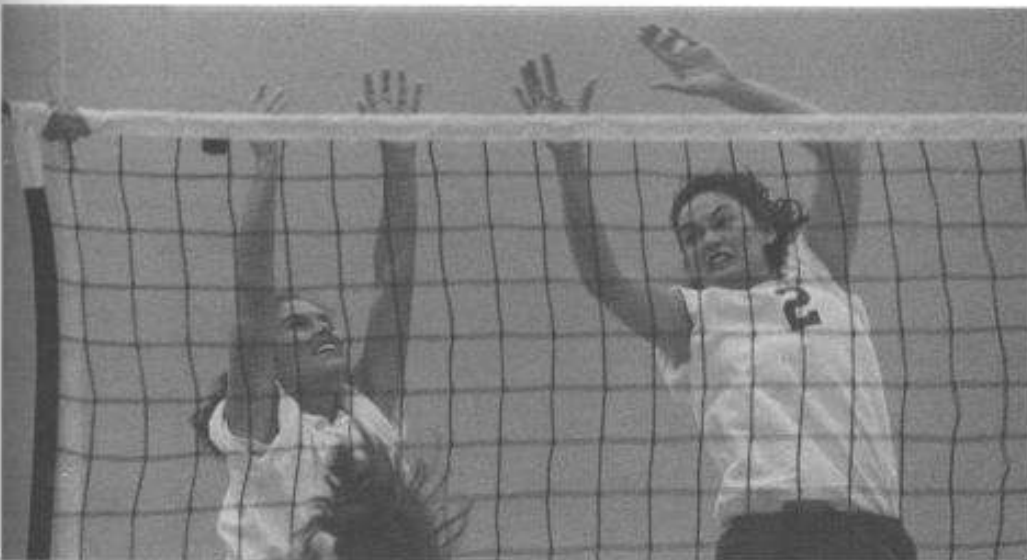

A club which, in its three year existence has made more headway than most Varsity sports can claim. The Saint Mary's Women's Hockey Huskies finished up another great season, contending for the championship until the dying seconds of the season.

A 7-4 loss to the Halifax club marked the end of a great season. The loss was a tie-breaker match of a best-of-three series played at SMU's Alumni Arena on Campus.

Major changes in this year's team saw Lori Hannay and John Turnbull take over the Head Coaching positions of the team. With a regular season record of 8-4 and an overall record of 9-6 in 1995, the Huskies have proved themselves to be contenders for years to come.

Leaving the team this year will be veterans Lori French, Corrina Cummings, and Carla Ward. The team will still have a strong core and excellent coaching to bring into next year.

Being a club sport or non-varsity, the club depends on fundraisers and its own resources to go to away games and provide for uniforms, equipment, etc.

Other club teams are from other universities such as Dalhousie and Acadia, while teams from the surrounding Metro Area also enter as independent clubs, for example: the Halifax team, the Flyers (Dartmouth), and also a team from Truro.

The club utilized the Alumni Arena on Campus for all its home games. On occasion a small crowd would gather to cheer the home team on but fan support was minimal.

The Huskies would end up finishing in 3rd spot behind Acadia and Halifax in the six team league.

Women's hockey has become a very high profile and highly competitive sport in Quebec and Ontario, however, the Maritimes is lagging in support and participation in the sport.

For women's hockey to become a varsity sport, a male varsity sport must also be created at the same time as stipulated by AUSA rules.

It seems that although women's sports, particularly hockey are getting more popular, that rugby may receive varsity status before any other sport. Rugby is being played in club format in virtually every university across Canada. It has not received varsity status at any university institution as of yet.

You may have heard of the Rosebowl, the Superbowl, the Orangebowl, and the Shrinerbowl, but what the heck is the

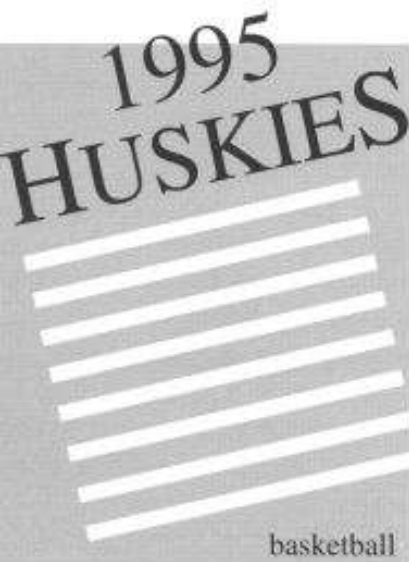
Robe Bowl???

SUPERNOVA DISCOVERED

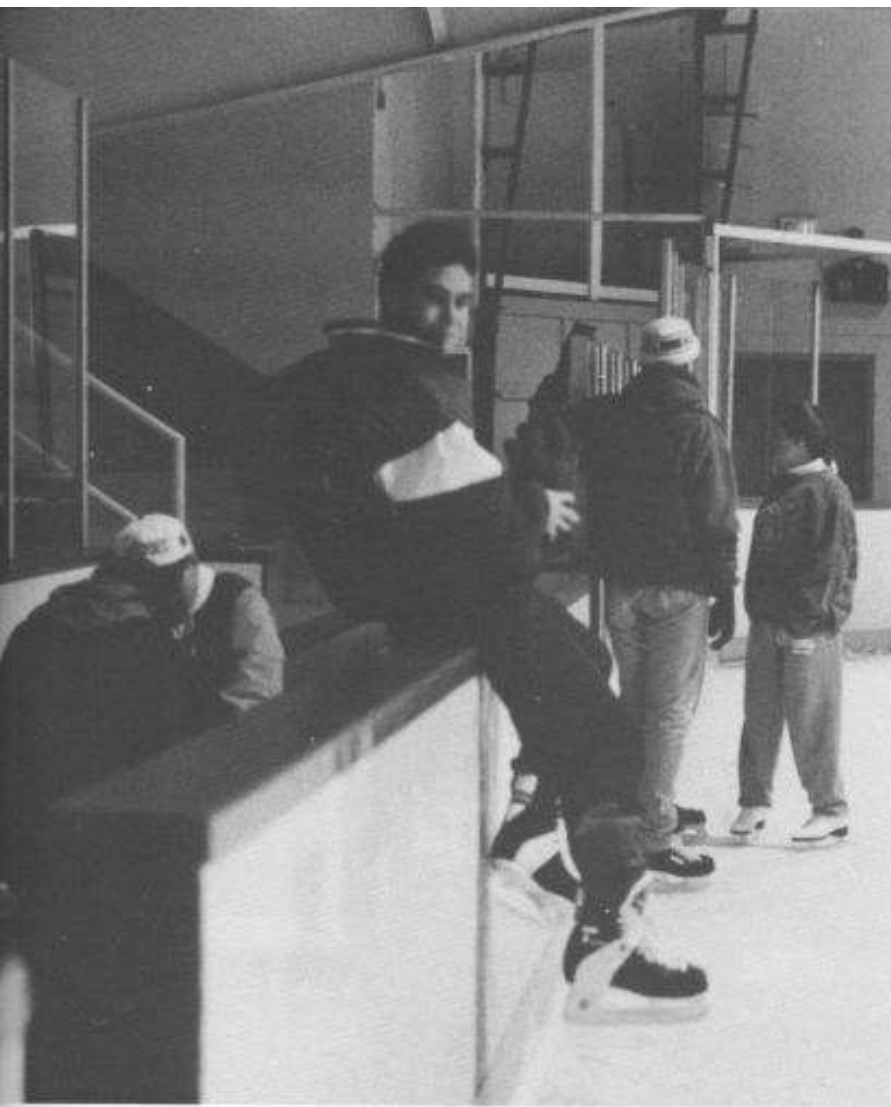

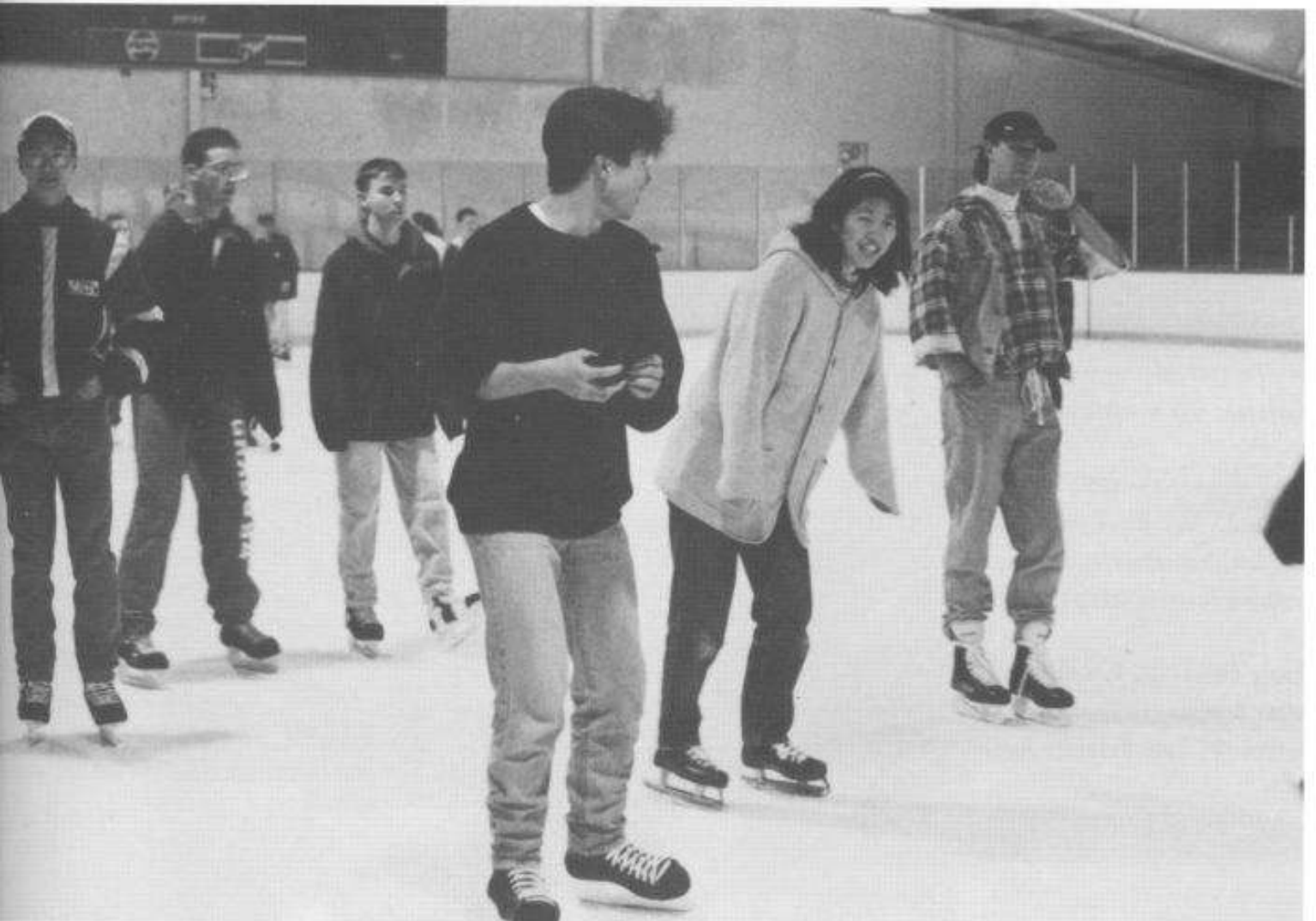

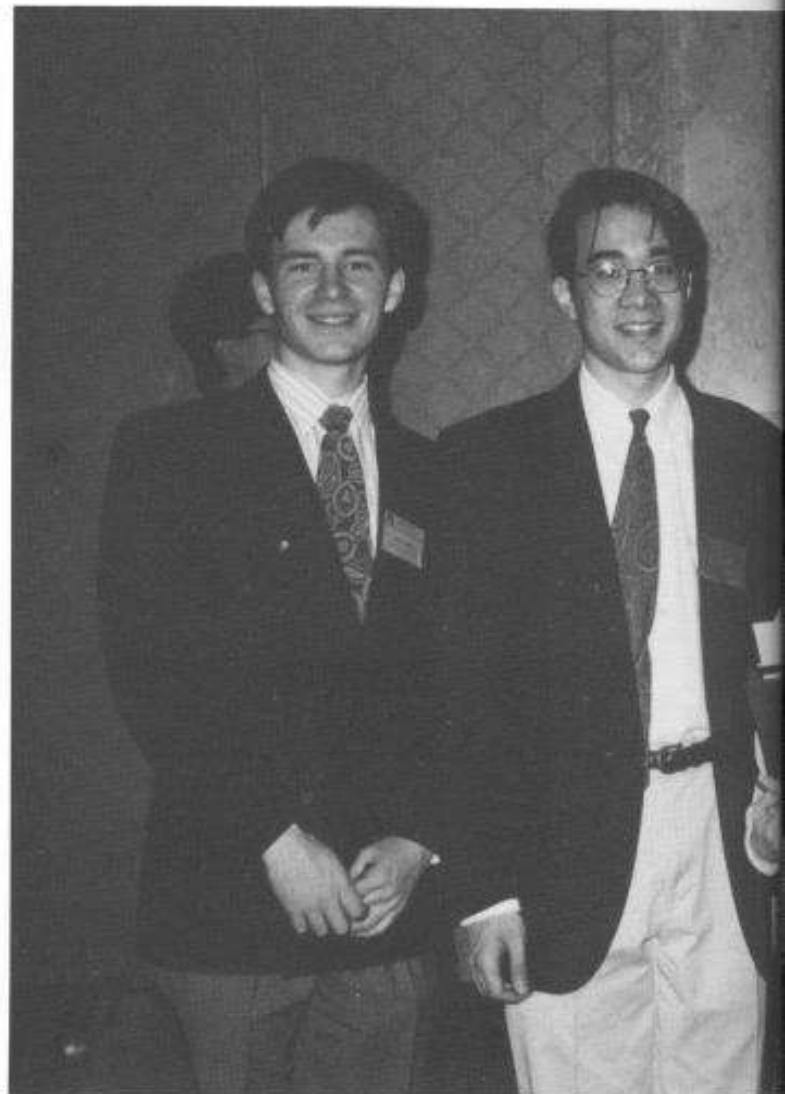


SMM Students at Harvard
