## Soccer coach Clements honored

Saint Mary's head soccer coach, Roy Clements was honored by the university last Sunday, before a home soccer game at Huskies Stadium.

The game, scheduled for 1 p.m. was preceded by a luncheon and presentation honoring Clements for his 19 years as an outstanding coach of the soccer Huskies.

Clements has quite an impressive record with the Huskies. He came to SMU as head soccer coach in 1964 and in 1965-66 helped produce Maritime champs.

Since 1978 the squad has once again become a moving force in the world of collegiate soccer.

In 1978 Clements brought the Huskies out of obscurity once again. The team dominated AUAA play. His team were confident of winning the AUAA title but were defeated in an upset loss

in the playoffs.

1979 saw the Huskies make it all the way to CIAU final play where they were defeated only by the University of Alberta Golden Bears.

In 1980 the squad made it to AUAA final action and in 1981 the team became AUAA champs and went on the CIAU semi final play.

Clements came to Nova Scotia from his home in Manchester, England in 1951 and since then has become a major figure in the development and growth of soccer in the province. Aside from his many years at SMU, he has many other achievements in the soccer world under his belt.

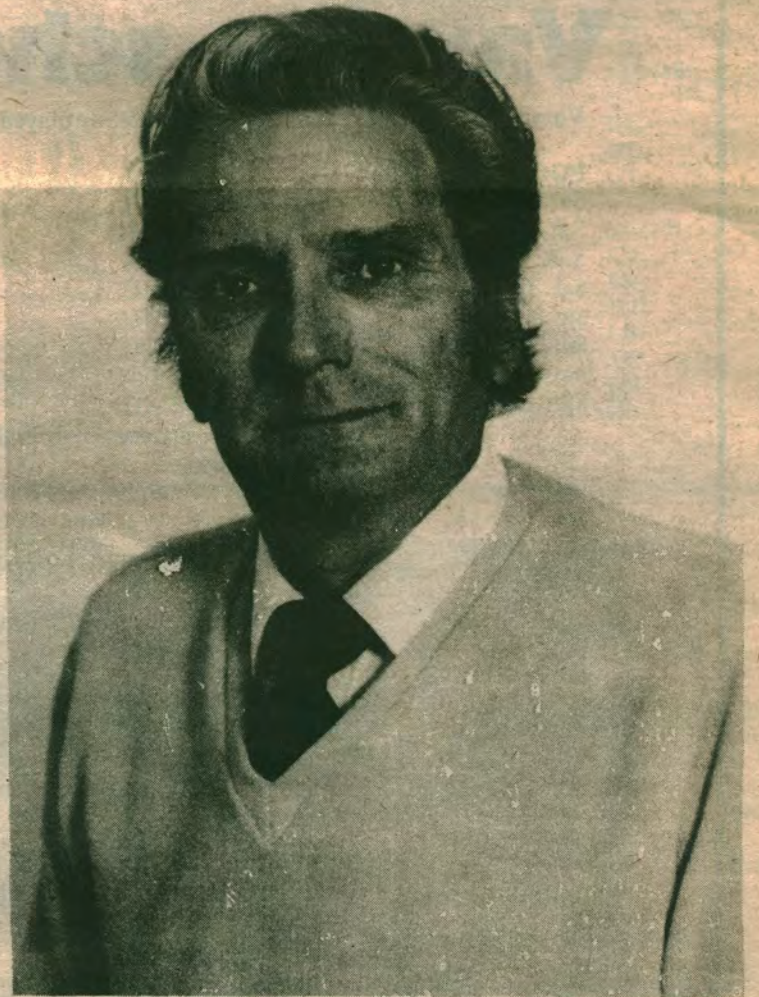
Clements has been involved with many other league, regional and provincial winners in his soccer coaching career, and continues to

be instrumental in the development of the sport in Nova Scotia.

In 1969 he was the president of the Nova Scotia Soccer Association and was Nova Scotia's delegate to the Canadian Soccer Association. He served as commissioner of the Halifax and District Soccer Association in 1967-68.

In May 1979, Clements coordinated the first Junior Olympics Soccer Clinic held at Saint Mary's University and has since held two more in 1980 and 1981. All three attracted over a hundred metro youngsters.

Clements is married to the former Florence Allen of Liverpool, England. They reside in Halifax with their two sons, Brett and Gary.

Season play has started for all teams and the schedule will be a tight one with so many teams competing. There will only be a month of season play for softball and six

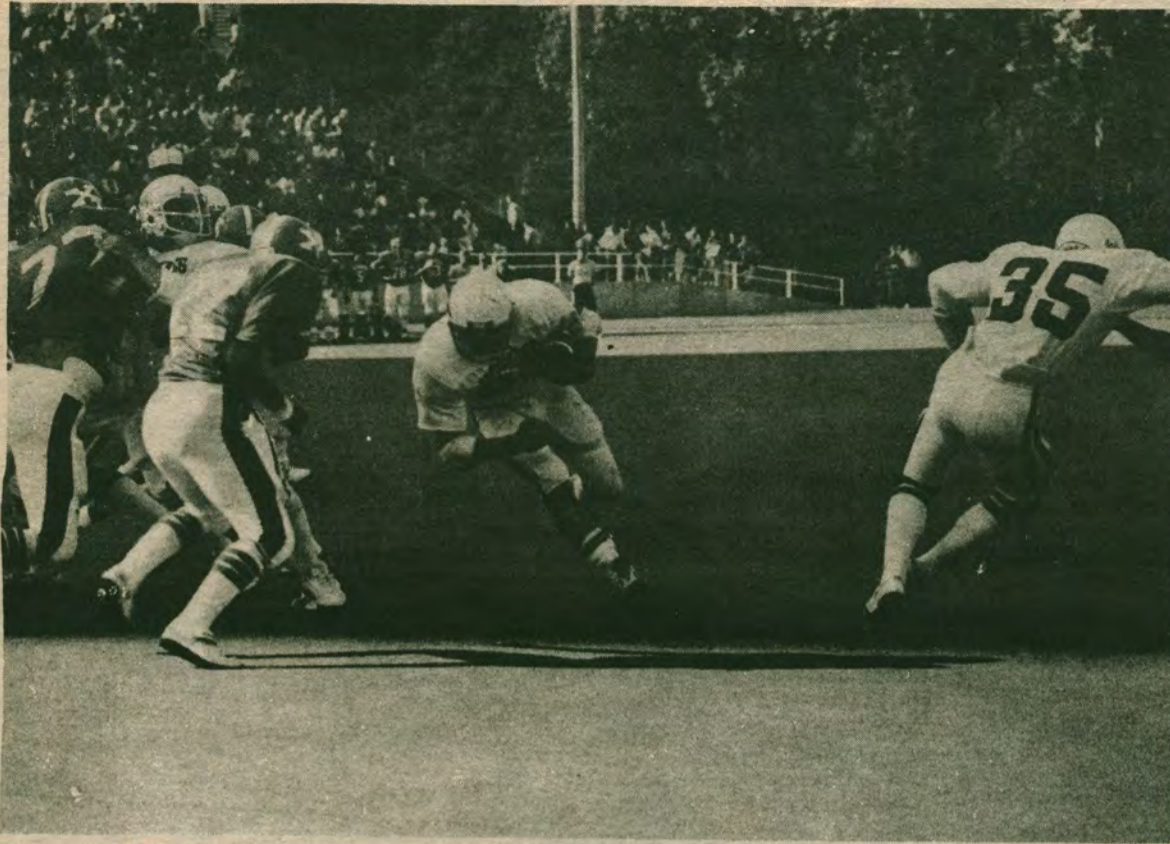
weeks for football and soccer before play-offs begin.

# CAMPUS FACILITIES



## The Campus and our Facilities

The Saint Mary's University campus houses the only artificial track and field surface in the Atlantic Provinces. The Pan American Wheelchair Games left the track and field legacy to Huskies Stadium after the federal government awarded a grant for the construction of the new surfaces specifically for the Games in August 1982. The community-oriented facility boasts a Chevron 440 track and Astro Turf field, both used 7:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. seven days a week from April through December.

Alumni Winter Arena, built in 1966, underwent internal surgery last spring and came out with a much improved interior. Renovations to the floor, installation of new boards and glass, and construction of new player and penalty benches on the south side of the arena certainly enhances the physical appearance and will promote a more efficient operation of the building.

The residence swimming pool is open year-round for recreational swimming by students, staff, faculty, and alumni.

Three modern tennis courts are located behind the Edmund Rice building and are open to students, staff, faculty, alumni, and their guests.

A weight room is located in the McNally Building basement across from the gym with Universal Gym equipment. Again, all Saint Mary's personnel are welcome to use this facility.

The Gymnasium, located under the old chapel in the McNally Building, receives heavy traffic year-round. It accommodates all team practices and virtually all home games, student, staff, and faculty structured and non-structured recreational time, and intramural activity.

The practice field, adjacent to the east side of Huskies Stadium, is used as a recreational field as well as for organized team practices.
