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## Exams to proceed as planned

By the time this issue reaches you, you most likely have heard the news; that the part-time faculty strike that was threatening to occur at Saint Mary's University did not in fact happen. The situation was down to the wire on Thursday evening (March 29<sup>th</sup>) when CUPE local 3912 (the union) met with Saint Mary's (the university) one last time before a strike went into effect. To the relief of everyone involved, the university made the union a decent offer and the feared strike was completely averted.

Barbara Moore, the President of the union said in a brief telephone interview on Monday afternoon said that she is "Pleased with the tentative agreement we reached with the university on Thursday evening" and that the results would hopefully make many people "very happy."

The university, if they had made such an offer sooner (an offer they had originally said they could not afford), would have been able to prevent the unease and the gossip that

erupted on campus in the week before the agreement (tentative agreement) was reached. That did not happen, but at least the strike was averted. That is the important thing to concentrate on.

All students can now be evaluated traditionally (very few exam dates have been changed) and the academic year can end peacefully. What follows is a summary of the agreement and of the negotiations between the university and the union:

Posted: March 30, 2001—

The settlement includes the following:

1. 3 year term - September 1, 2000 to August 31, 2003.
2. Improved contract language on Labour/Management Committee, grievance procedure, and arbitration process.

3. Improved ability for the union local to acquire information on behalf of their members relevant to matters under the collective agreement, including copies of individual members contracts each semester.

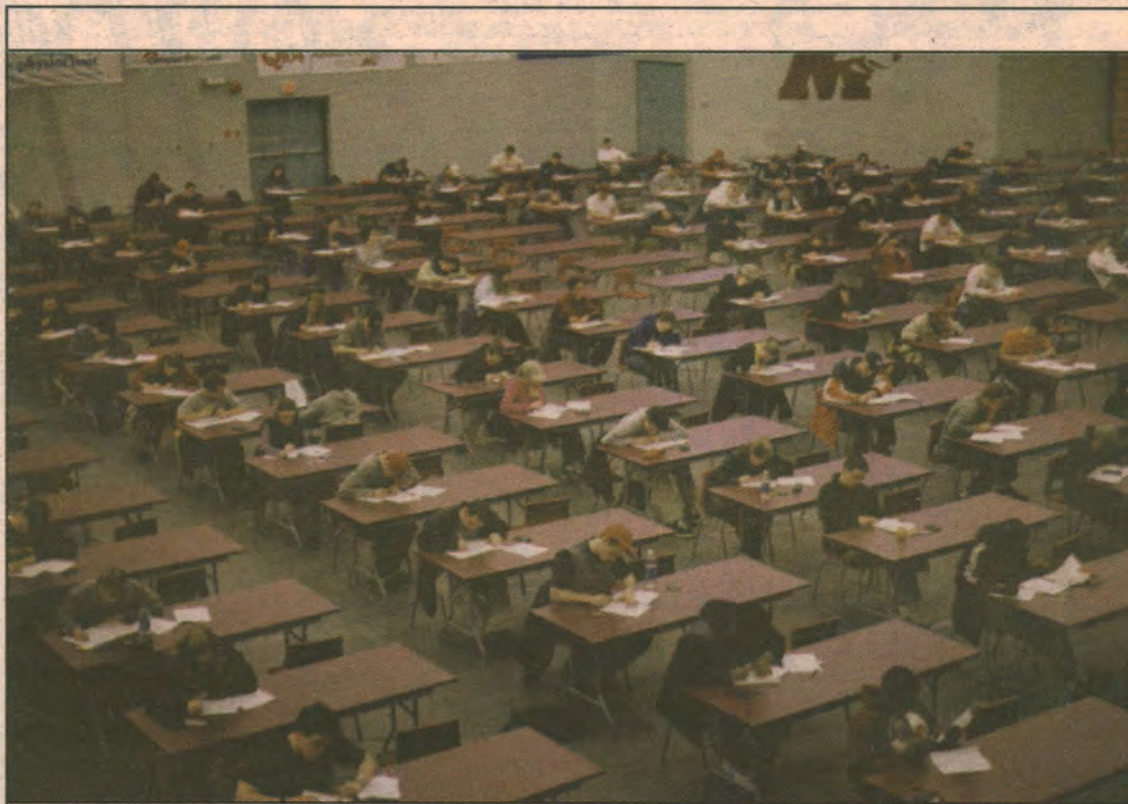
guests.

## Milosevic Arrested

Early Sunday morning the former President of Yugoslavia, Slobodan Milosevic was arrested after a twenty six-hour standoff at his Mansion. In addition to being arrested on suspicion of abuse of power and corruption, which carries a maximum of five years in prison upon conviction, Police are charging Milosevic with enticing his bodyguards to shoot at officers. If the charges prove to be warranted, Milosevic will face the possibility of another fifteen years in prison (the maximum sentence for enticing his bodyguards to fire at Police).

These two separate charges are serious and could eventually result in Milosevic spending twenty years in jail. However, some more serious charges are being considered which may include but are not limited to the former president planning several political assassinations.

Police Lt. Gen. Sreten Lukic, who was involved in the armed arrest of Milosevic on Sunday morning, said that Milosevic's bodyguards wounded four policemen early on Saturday, one of them very seriously. Three of the bodyguards involved are now in custody.

Milosevic maintained his

complete and total innocence of any of the charges, saying he was "not guilty of a single count on the charge sheet." Apparently officials do not believe Milosevic is sincere—he is being held for at least thirty days while the police continue to investigate into allegations of criminal conspiracy and diverting of millions of dollars in state funds.

After Milosevic was whisked away to Belgrade's Central Prison, police entered his compound in the tree-lined Dedinje district and said they found a major arsenal, including two armed personal carriers, thirty automatic weapons, three heavy machine guns, an anti-tank grenade launcher, 23 pistols of varying caliber's, 30 rifle grenades, two cases of hand grenades and other ammunition.

Milosevic had vowed not to be taken alive, and brandished a pistol during negotiations that led to his surrender. His daughter Marija fired two pistol shots after her father agreed to give up. For firing those two pistol shots, Marija may also be prosecuted.

The whole ordeal was a very strange end to the political history of Milosevic—he was a leader who presided over the dismemberment of Yugoslavia, triggering and

losing four Balkan wars that left his country in political, economic and spiritual ruin.

Milosevic surrendered only after he was assured by the negotiators that he would not be handed over immediately to the U.N. war crimes tribunal (known for strict punishment policy) that indicted him in 1999 for atrocities his forces allegedly committed against ethnic Albanians in Kosovo. Milosevic's crackdown in Kosovo triggered a 78-day NATO bombing campaign and the province's takeover by the United Nations and NATO.

Yugoslav authorities face intense international pressure to extradite Milosevic to the tribunal in The Hague, Netherlands. The Bush administration is expected to declare Monday whether steps taken to co-operate with the court so far are enough to avoid a cut-off of \$50 million in aid to Yugoslavia. In Washington, President Bush said Milosevic's arrest was an important step toward ending "the tragic era of his brutal dictatorship." He said the United States considers the arrest an initial move toward a trial at the war crimes tribunal.

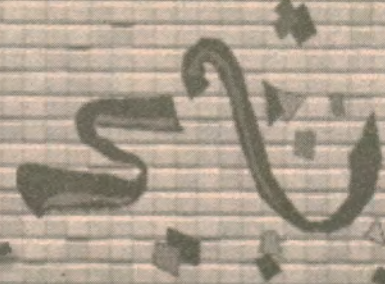

4. Improved job posting and appointment process: the university is now required to upload postings to the union's website.
5. No retirees will have priority to our work.
6. 6 Ph.D. students in the Doctoral Program in Management only will receive appointments, and they will be included in the bargaining unit.
7. Clarification obtained on precedence calculation.
8. Cancellation stipend.
9. Access to official files.
10. Part-time faculty representation in departmental meetings.
11. Provision of appropriate office space and equipment.
12. Emergency replacement stipend.
13. Disability pay for balance of contract if disabled - 75%.
14. Improved language in term of agreement provision.
15. New intellectual property provision.
16. Compensation improvement from current basic

stipend at \$6,400 to \$7,200 by September 1, 2002 for a full-credit course.

17. Compensation improvement for stipend - 5 years and 20 full course equivalents to \$8,100 by September 1, 2002.

This upper part of this table was first published following Saint Mary's March 8 offer. The lower part of this table shows the middle-ground, tentative deal reached the evening of March 29, which the union recommends accepting.

Step 1 — Basic: \$ 6,400  
Step 2 — With Precedence: \$ 6,575  
Step 3 — Precedence with 5 years: \$6,750

## Milosevic Arrested

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NATO also praised Milosevic's arrest and said it should lead to a trial at the war crimes court. Tribunal spokeswoman Florence Hartmann said the court expects Milosevic in The Hague by the end of the year. It will be interesting to see if Yugoslavia

is able to have its laws regarding extradition to foreign trials ratified before then. Currently the Yugoslav constitution bars the extradition of Yugoslavs to courts abroad. Until these decisions are made, Slobodan Milosevic will probably remain behind bars, in what is a fairly comfortable prison cell.

This is the first comprehensive rarity collection from the multi million selling alternative icons: the Pixies. They are Black Francis (a.k.a Frank Black), Kim Deal, Joey Santiago, and David Lovering. The Boston born band re-recorded some of the songs on this CD; others are live takes and exclusive tracks - none of these versions are available on any of their previous albums. This 19 track CD is also enhanced with the full length promo videos for 'Here Comes Your Man' and 'Allison'. The Pixies are widely regarded as one of the most influential alternative rock bands of all time, a fact acknowledged by various artists from Nirvana to David Bowie. Kurt Cobain referred to the band when he discussed the writing of *Smells like Teen Spirit* - "I was trying to write the ultimate pop song, I was basically trying to rip off the Pixies." The BBC is currently working on a documentary of the Pixies.

The tracks on this CD are all very entertaining and *Wave of Mutilation (UK Surf)* stood out to me because it first became famous due to its inclusion on the sound track for the movie *Pump Up the Volume*. This slow version became more popular than the more rockin' version on the original album. The track *Theme from NARC* is just that, the theme to the 80's video game *NARC*. The video game is about narcotics officers catching bad guys, and this is essentially what you heard when you blew em away - but filtered through the Black Francis Machine. Although Francis provides the majority of vocals for the group, Kim Deal does the lead vocals for *Into the White*. This song was a favorite for the band and crowd. The Pixies performed this song camouflaged under blazing white lights and tons of smoke. *Build High* is a light hearted song that the Pixies recorded early in their career and is described as "rollicking cow-punk jam." Something good can be said about every one of the songs on this CD. They each have a distinct flavor that teases your taste buds and makes your mouth water in anticipation of more. Black Francis provides short entertaining sleeve notes for each song on the album,

Kaico-Green got its start by opening up shows for the likes of The Sycamores, The Lampshades, and other Pavilion regulars. However, due to their continued success, the band has impressed club owners and have now found themselves playing high profile shows, sometimes headlining shows ahead of bands who they used to open up for. "It's kinda weird," says Luke, "I've seen them all play after me, and now the roles have reversed in some cases. Weird, but it's a good feeling."

The band has a mature outlook towards the future. Luke explained the band's methods as: "We could go and record and press a bunch of CDs, but if we're not smart about it, we'll fail miserably. You've got to take it slow, and think about what you're doing before you do it. [...] This band is an investment. From day one, we had a plan. Phase one ended

with the successful release of the EP. And I'd say that in the past 2 years, it's going better than expected."

The future for Kaico-Green looks promising - their immediate plans include a web site to be launched in the near future (<http://www.kaico-green.ca> or [.com](http://www.kaico-green.com)), and they intend to record a full length album to be released in the fall. Also, in the words of Luke, "We'd like to do some touring around the Maritimes in the summer. You know, to get a bit of exposure. We'd like to wrap it all up at Valleyallooza, then head into the studio."

The elder MacGillvray, the principle songwriter, gives credit where credit is due: "I couldn't write songs without the band. I just rip out an idea, and they help to mould it into a masterpiece." One of their newer tunes, "Colour," has already been receiving rave reviews from fans, and it is only one of nearly ten songs that the band has waiting in their vault, prepared for their next recording session. No

doubt that with the reaction that their newer songs are getting, the new album will be a smash.

Kaico-Green, while it maintains the majority of its fan base in Halifax, has earned a reputation in places as far away as Indiana, thanks to online exposure and word of mouth. They are already on the path to making it as big as local groups Shyne Factory and Arlibido, and in time, they might even become bigger than the Halifax 'supergroup,' Sloan. They have been 'handed the ball' by club owners and fans alike, and they continue to run with it, accomplishing bigger and better things. "We want to get Halifax rocking with something new. Something big," says Luke MacGillvray. I personally think that they will - there is no doubt in my mind that in time, we will see this band headlining shows at local venues and wowing audiences (and ladies) across the country.

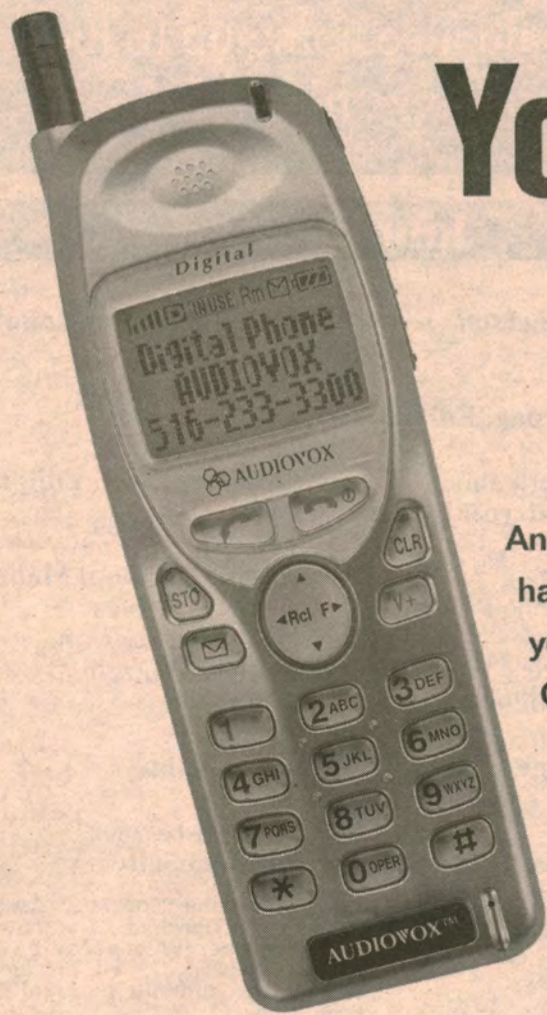
**Dave Matthews Band

What can be said about Dave Matthew's newest musical creation, *Everyday*? Well, it's very typical of him; difficult to define. The band is influenced by so many different genres of music that it is difficult to stick a plastic label on them. Maybe that's the reason that they are such a success. *Everyday* is a mix of reggae, pop, classical, Latin, rock, with a little jazz and blues thrown in for good measure. The style is similar to the two previous records; unpredictable. The band's rich sound comes from the five talented musicians who play multiple instruments on the album. You name it, they play it. The diverse instruments thrown in are trumpets, violins, basses, drums, guitars of all sorts, congas, bongos, clarinets, saxophones, flutes and vibraphones. The outcome is a rich and full sounding album. The songs are not very aggressive; the beauty in the songs is the subtlety of the instruments. The rich tones fronted by Dave Matthew's raspy vocals are a great mixture that will

impress anyone if given a chance. The first single "I Did It," probably the heaviest song on the album, is backed by a very strange and surreal video which makes little sense, though it does indicate that Dave has a sense of fun; his previous albums seemed rather gloomy compared to this one.

Dave experienced world-wide recognition with his single "Crash," but judging Dave Matthews by that song would be unjust. As great as that song is, it does not properly represent the band's sound. *Everyday* certainly strays from that sound. Upon hearing the album for the first time I was impressed by the musical diversity and the band's overall talent. The album is very pleasing to the ear but I couldn't pick out any songs that truly stuck out until about the third time listening to the disc. The songs do not possess the hooks that you could sing along to upon the first or second listen. That, in my opinion, is the only drawback to this album. Now, songs like "I Did It," "So Right," and "What You Are," are easy to get attached to and have great potential for hitting the top of the charts. If you are still unsure, try to download some songs off Napster if you still can, and then you might get a clearer picture of the quintet named The Dave Matthews Band.
