THE COLLEYS' AND THE CARVERYS'

At this G-7 Summit what progress will be made on behalf of the Blacks who discovered the beautiful Province of Nova Scotia?

The people of Africville lived on the waterfront which was known as Spanish Shoal, in District 1. This is where the Summit is taking place.

In 1838 they were moved to Africville and the land was granted to them in 1867 by Queen Victoria.

Sir. John Wentworth, the first Royal Governor of Nova Scotia, has at least 2,000 decendents living in North America today. Most of them are the Colley family of Nova Scotia.

The Government of Nova Scotia only recognized Sir John as the First Governor in 1994.

We want this Province to know we as Black people are banning together to claim our rich history and have it known throughout the world.
