#### NEW SERVICES OFFERED!

SMUSA has established a host of new services in the Student Centre for 1986/87.

- 1) **Postage stamps:** they are now readily and easily available from the SMUSA Information Desk in the Student Centre. The stamps are available seven days a week and there are no empty machines to deal with.
- 2) **Photocopying:** available in the lobby of the Student Centre next to the Info Desk. A high quality machine has been installed to provide crisp, clear copies for ten cents each. The machine also has the added feature of being able to enlarge or reduce your original and copy transparencies. No need to fuss with change either, just walk up and get the key to the machine from the SMUSA Desk Attendant and pay when your finished. Its easy and there is no maddening line up.
- 3) **Typing Service:** Starting in mid-October you will no longer have to search for someone to type your term papers, resumes, etc. Drop your work off at the SMUSA Info Desk and a qualified typist will type your paper in record time and then return it to you. Check the rates, they are very reasonable also.

The service is designed to provide students with high quality typing at reasonable prices. Professional typists have been hired to work at the service. The Students' Association decided to use outside help rather than students because of scheduling requirements.

Work will be handled on a first come, first serve basis and most submissions are expected to be completed within a day. Assignments should be booked, at least 1 day in advance so as to assist in the scheduling of typists and to help keep the cost to students as low as possible.

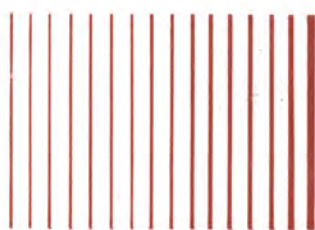

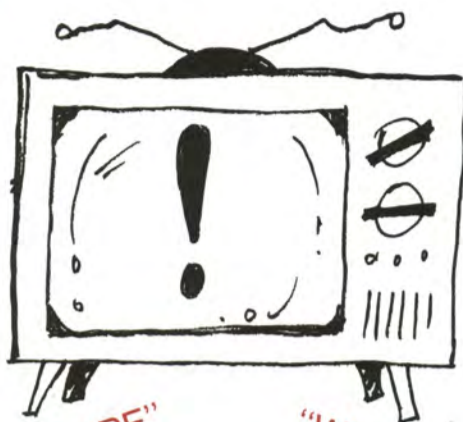
