The appointment of James B. Ternan, P.Eng., to the senior administrative staff of Saint Mary's University, as Assistant, President's Office, has been announced by Very Reverend C. J. Fischer, S.J., President of the University.

Mr. Ternan will direct the increasing Alumni activities of the University and will be involved in a broad range of administrative duties in association with Mr. Edmund Morris, Assistant to the President.

He brings to his new position many years of experience in university work. For the past 26 years he has been with the Nova Scotia Technical College, for many years as Registrar and latterly as Head, Department of Extension, as well as Public Relations Officer, Placement Officer and Secretary-Treasurer of the Alumni Association.

Born in Bedford, Nova Scotia, the son of Gerald B. Ternan, LL.B. and the late Mrs. Ternan, he was educated in the Halifax public schools, Saint Mary's College and the Nova Scotia Technical College, receiving his Bachelor of Engineering Degree in Electrical Engineering from the latter intitution in 1939.

Appointment of Laurie W. Smith, B.A., B.Ed., M.S., as first full-time director of admissions and scholarships at Saint Mary's University has been announced.

Mr. Smith, a 1943 graduate of Saint Mary's, was director of guidance for the Halifax City schools. Prior to that appointment he was vice-principal of Saint Patrick's High School, having previously taught at Saint Patrick's High and Junior High Schools and lectured at Saint Mary's and Mount Saint Vincent Universities summer sessions. He took up his duties at Saint Mary's on July 1.

Following his graduation from Saint Mary's, Mr. Smith received his bachelor of education degree from Dalhousie and his master of science degree in educational psychology and guidance from Fordham University, New York.

# PREVIEW OF FOOTBALL 1966

It's too soon to say right now but don't be surprised if the Saints go marching in again this year.

Referring of course to the varsity football Huskies who became the first team to have their name inscribed on the trophy which is emblematic of supremacy in the new Bluenose College Conference last season. The maroon and white marched through the schedule of the seven team circuit without a defeat.

The BFC, which operated for the first time last season, was a result of the college teams breaking away from the Atlantic Football Conference which they had played in since 1960.

Turnout for this year's edition of the Huskies was the largest (approximately 40 bodies) in the nine years that Bob Hayes has been at the head coaching helm. The prospects, including 20 returnees, started the training grind September 1 under the watchful eyes of coach Hayes and his staff consisting of Les Goodwin, Charlie Dolan and Jim Bayer.

"The fact that there aren't as many freshmen on the squad this year as last season means that we should get off to a better start," said Hayes. "Whether we'll be as good at the end of the season as we were last year is hard to say," he added.

"Our big need for this year is experienced linemen," Hayes said, "however, our backfield will be strong and our linebackers and defensive halfbacks appear to be as good if not better than we've ever had".

Huskies have a 10 game schedule facing them this season including four nonconference games. The non-conference games include a home and home series with Shearwater Navy of the Atlantic Football Conference, away games with Maine Maritime Academy in Castine, Me., and McGill Redmen of the Senior Intercollegiate Football League in Montreal. What will probably be their toughest game in the BFC is their last home appearance of the season against arch-rivals St. Francis Xavier X men Nov. 12.

Co-captains Paul Puma and Gerry Redmond head the list of returnees. Both are entering their fourth seasons in Maroon and white colors. The only other four year veteran is Frank Archambault.

Back for their third campaigns are Joe Hebert, Steve Armitage, John Murphy, Peter Grant, Frank Garner and Don Murphy. Two-year veterans include Blair Lopes, Eric Beddis, Jim Stewart, John Dudley, Ernie Turek, Graeme Fraser, Terry
