FATHER LABELLE NEW PRESIDENT

The most Reverend James Hayes, Chancellor of Saint Mary's University and the University's Board of Governors announced the appointment of the Rev. Henry J. Labelle, S.J., as President of the University as of July 1st. Father Labelle succeeds Reverend C. J. Fischer, S.J., President since 1959.

Associated with Saint Mary's since 1946, Father Labelle received his Master's Degree in Philosophy from St. Louis University in 1952. He received his Doctorate in Philosophy from the Gregorian University in Rome in 1960. He is known in the academic community for his advanced courses in contemporary philosophy. Among the alumni he will be remembered by many who followed his dynamic courses. His appointment will be heartily endorsed by those who studied under him.



FATHER FOGARTY ACADEMIC VICE-PRESIDENT

The Most Reverend James Hayes, Chancellor of Saint Mary's University, and the Board of Governors announced the appointment of the Reverend Daniel Fogarty, S.J. as Academic Vice-President as of July 1.

Father Fogarty received his Master's and Doctorate in English from Columbia University. He was Dean of Saint Mary's school of education for eight years. He returns to Saint Mary's and his new position after a sabbatical leave.

Fr. Fogarty has long been associated with Saint Mary's. From 1927-30 he was a student in the High School. He taught in the High School from 1940-42. After an absence of four years he returned and taught English. At that time he reorganized the Alumni Association. From 1950-55 he taught Freshman English and Journalism. From 1957-65 he directed the School of Education.
