### ST. MARY'S GOES Co-Ed.

St. Mary's University will become coeducational, effective immediately, Most Reverend James M. Hayes, Archbishop of Halifax, chancellor of the university and chairman of the university's Board of Governors, announced Sept. 16th.

The decision of the Board of Governors was unanimous.

The Board authorized the administration of the university to proceed with the implementation of co-education of St. Mary's which the Board had, in effect, accepted in principle in December, 1967.

St. Mary's University, since its inception in 1841, has been traditionally all male.

The Board also stated that discussion will continue with Mount Saint Vincent University to investigate "ways and means" by which these two institutes could work together more closely.

## SUMMER SESSIONS

It is gratifying to be able to inform our Alumni that Saint Mary's this past summer held the most successful Summer School in its history. The Summer School, which was run in two sessions of six weeks each, had enrollments of 625 and 415 in the respective sessions.

In the first session all courses were scheduled from 4:30 p.m. on, thus allowing people in the business world and the teaching profession, as well as students, to take advantage of the subjects offered. The courses in the second session were all held in the morning as they were primarily directed to university or high school students, about to enter university, and the teaching profession.

With the completion of the new residential facilities this fall and winter, we expect to further increase our enrollments in the 1969 sessions. Our Alumni and their friends who have students in university are asked to keep Saint Mary's in mind if they have sons and daughters who require or wish to take a credit course during the Summer Sessions. The first session will run from approximately May 15 to June 30, and the second session from approximately July 2 to August 15. Information on offerings should be available early in February 1969.

The Director, Evening Division and Summer Sessions, will welcome inquiries from prospective students as well as suggestions from Alumni members which might help to make our Summer Sessions more effective.

### FR. BURKE-GAFFNEY LECTURES IN PARIS

Father M. W. Burke-Gaffney, S.J., Saint Mary's University, Halifax, was in Paris August 24th - September 1st. He attended the 12th International Congress of the History of Sciences and read a paper, "On the Visual Observations of the Iron Lines in the Spectrum of Comet 1882 II". While there he attended the Triennial Assembly of the International Academy of the History of Sciences of which he has been an elected member since 1950. He also met with members of Commission 41 of the International Astronomical Union to which he is a consultant.

Born in Ireland, Father Burke-Gaffney graduated from the National University of Ireland in 1917 with degree B.E. in Civil Engineering; he received Ph. D. in Astronomy from Georgetown University, Washington, in 1935, and Doctor of Engineering (Honoris Causa) from the Nova Scotia Technical College in 1955.

Father Burke-Gaffney has been at Saint Mary's University since 1940, and at present is Professor Emeritus, Astronomy.

He is a member of the American Astronomical Society; life member of the Royal Astronomical Society of Canada; honorary life member of the Association of Professional Engineers of Nova Scotia; an associate fellow of the Canadian Aeronautical and Space Institute.

### FATHER CROWE PUBLISHES BOOK

In the preface of his new book, A Time of Change — Guidelines for the Preplexed Catholic, (Bruce Publishing Co., Milwaukee), Father Crowe says:

The title already suggests the type of reader for whom this book is written, but I should like to spell this out with greater clarity. I have had in mind neither the sophisticated world of the theologian nor the simple world of the unquestioning believer, but that in-between world of those who take an intelligent interest in their faith and culture without having the opportunity or leisure to) study theology in the manner of professionals ... In particular, I have written for the generation growing into middle age; they were schooled in the old mentality and are faced now with the problem, not only of living out the best part of their lives in a new world, but also of communicating with their adolescent children who hold views that seem poles apart from those their parents were taught. The parents are an inquiring, intelligent, interested but somewhat bewildered generation; they are also, I think, a somewhat neglected generation . . . It is to help them, to give a certain theological basis to their thinking, to show them how they may face the problems of the times without undue fear and confusion, that I venture to put my ideas into a book . . .

### Dr. ROJO GOING TO ARGENTINA

Dr. Alfonso Rojo of the Biology Department of Saint Mary's University has accepted a two-year appointment with the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations, and will be leaving shortly for Mar del Plata, Argentina, where he will spend the next two years. Dr. Rojo, who is an expert in the field of Fisheries, will be acting as an advisor to biologists in Argentina on a project which is now being carried on on the Atlantic Coast covering exploratory and experimental fishing programmes as well as analysis of the biological and statistical data from research and commercial vessels.
