NEW ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS

Mr. Leo R. MacDonald, Director of Admissions of Saint Mary's University, has announced that this year's enrollment is the largest in the history of the university, with a total of 1573 students enrolled, which is an increase of 356 over last year's enrollment. In its first year as a co-educational institution there are 78 female students attending fulltime classes. Indications are that next year's enrollment figure will also show a further significant increase in the number of students, both male and female.

This projection is based in part on the change in registration requirements recently made known by the University. Mr. MacDonald has stated that principals of all Nova Scotia High Schools had been informed, in mid-October, of the new entrance requirements for admission to Saint Mary's.

Applicants will now be required to offer a Nova Scotia Grade XI High School Certificate, (Provincial examinations will not be required), with a pass in English, Mathematics and three other subjects from the following: History, Economics, Physics, Chemistry, French, German, Latin, Spanish, Biology or Geology. Emphasis for admission, however, is being placed on the recommendation of the school principal based on the student's high school transcript.

Nova Scotia Grade XII, or equivalent, Provincial Certificate, however, will still be required for the granting of advanced standing.

Saint Mary's University does not require SACU test scores as one of the criteria for admission.

ADDITION TO STUDENTS' CENTRE

Contract for a \$1,500,000 four-storey addition to the Students' Center Building at Saint Mary's University has been announced by Dr. Henry J. Labelle, S.J., President of the University.

Construction will be done by Fraser-Brace Maritimes Ltd., and part of the building addition will be completed by September 15th this year, and the remainder by November 1st.

Supported by financial assistance from the Nova Scotia University Grants Committee, the new addition will include student government offices, cafeteria facilities, a full-time Canada Manpower Center, and administration offices for the Director of Student Affairs, Dean of Men, Dean of Women, Director of Athletics, chaplains and counsellors.

The building, when completed, will also include a liturgical center, university book store, post office, games room, social and small theatrical center, television and music-listening rooms, and lounge spaces.

Concerning other construction now taking place on the Saint Mary's campus, Dr. Labelle announced that the 17-storey residence now under construction on the north-

west corner of Tower Road and Gorsebrook Avenue will be completed within the next 90 days. A \$1,000,000 addition to the Chemistry-Biology Building was completed last October.

SMU PROFESSOR AWARDED FELLOWSHIP

Award of a \$7,000 Canada Council fellowship to Dr. John R. MacCormack, chairman of the department of history at Saint Mary's University, was announced.

The "leave fellowship" will enable Dr. MacCormack to spend a year in England, where he will conduct research on the Puritan revolution.

He has just completed a book on the long parliament in that period—"Parliament in Revolution"—and his further research will provide material for a second book on the politics of the new model army.

Dr. MacCormack plans to leave for England next summer.

A graduate of Saint Mary's High School and the Halifax Academy, Dr. MacCormack graduated from Dalhousie and received his doctorate in philosophy from the University of Toronto.

Construction of one of the major facilities for the 1969 Summer Games in Halifax—the 9,580 seat stadium at Saint Mary's Field—is on schedule.

The huge mound of earth on which the stadium will stand has been completed and footings and pillars for the overhead canopy have been poured.

The earth mound will lie idle until August of next year when the actual stands will be started. Completion is slated for July.

The stands will include 3,480 concrete seats, which along with 3,600 new wooden bleachers and 2,500 wooden seats owned by the university will boost total capacity to 9,580 seats.

Almost any sport can be played on the new field.

Other facilities will include a VIP box and a top deck press section.
