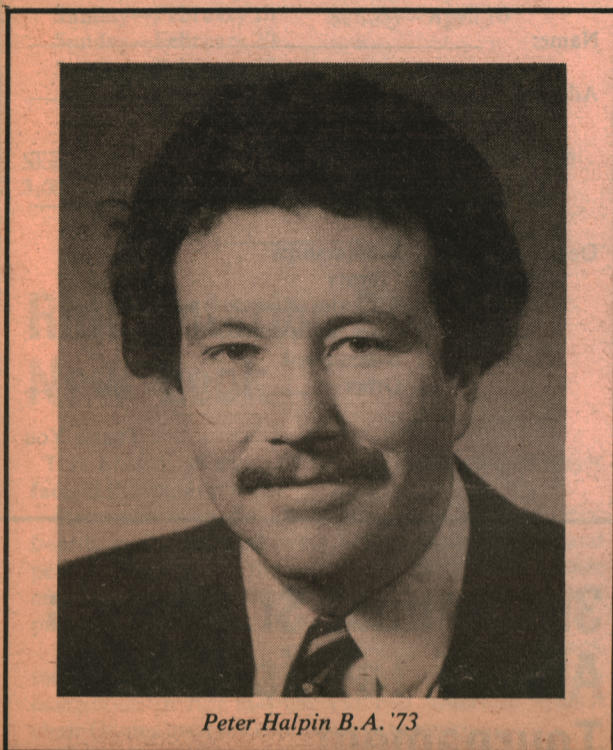

Funeral for J.J. Hennessey



Funeral mass for Father J.J. Hennessey, S.J., was held at Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Toronto, Saturday, August 14. Celebrant of the mass was Very Reverend William Ryan, S.J., Jesuit Provincial. Father Patrick Malone, S.J., concelebrated. Among the many Jesuits in the sanctuary were Fathers Bill Addley and Bob McDougall.

Father Stewart, S.J., of Saint Mary's was homilist. He read a letter of tribute from John Buchanan, Premier of Nova Scotia.

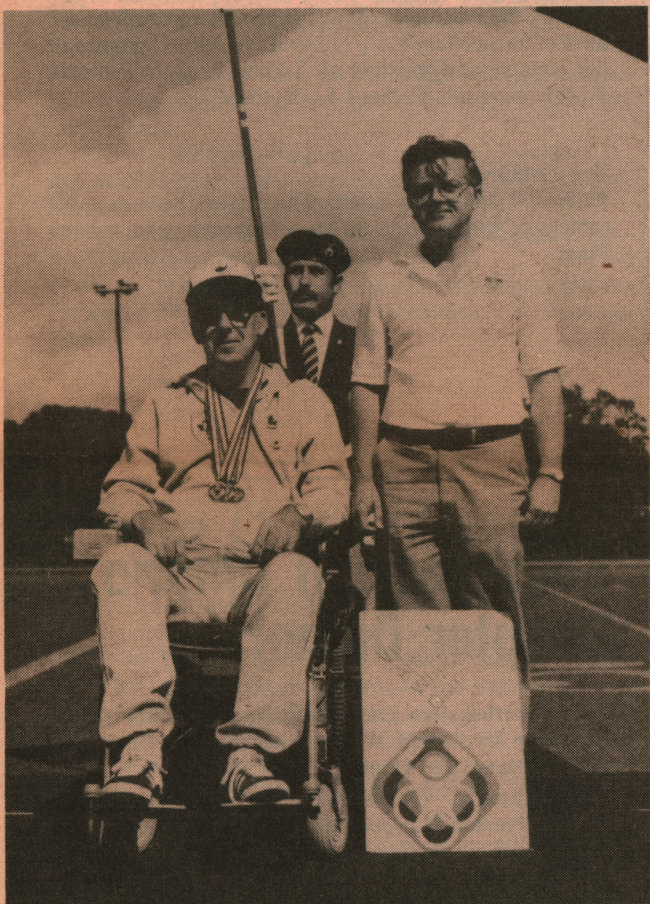

Alumni Pan Am Activity

Alumni as individuals participated in almost every facet of planning and administration of the 1982 Pan American Wheelchair Games, but the specific commitment of the Association was to plan and organize the medals presentations.

Chairman Don Reardon together with Jim Crane, Karen Henderson, Ed Fitzpatrick and Dave Zareski, Protocol Chairman for the Games planned for five months to make quality presentations. As time went on, they were given responsibility for marshalling the athletes for both Opening and Closing ceremonies, liaison with announcers, preparation of medal containers, gathering and display of national flags, the playing of national anthems at each presentation as well as the actual presentation ceremonies. The committee also arranged, with the cooperation of the staff and residents of the Sackville Correctional Centre, for the building of the loading ramps for the wheelchair buses.

Each day or evening the workers, over 100 in all, gathered at the Stadium or the Centennial Pool. In the week they arranged for the presentation of over 350 medals, accompanied by the playing of national anthems over 100 times. Of great assistance in the presentations were the men from Vimy and Scotia Branches of the Royal Canadian Legion who were flagbearers.

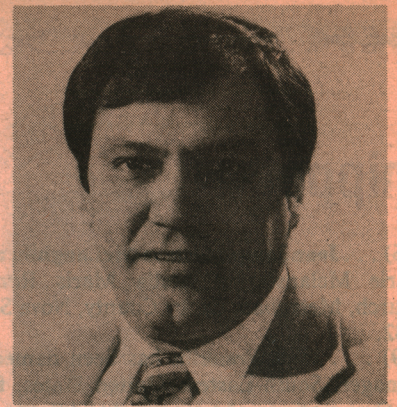

About Our Crest . . .

The present University crest was designed in the 1940's by Daniel Fogarty, S.J. Each symbol within the crest has a significance relevant to the various phases and history of the University.

On the outer portion of the crest the name and location of the University are inscribed in Latin and the founding date (1841) in Roman Numerals. This part is added for the official seal.

The book shown above the shield represents learning and knowledge. The inscription on the page of the book is in Latin—"Age Quod Agis". This is the motto of the University which exhorts all those connected with the University to strive to do their best in everything that they do. This quotation was borrowed from the Irish Christian Brothers and represents their contribution to the development of the University.

The upper part of the shield has the official seal of the Jesuits with I.H.S. being the Latin initials for Christ's name. Below these initials are the three nails which represent the Crucifixion and surrounding these is the Crown of Thorns.

The two crowns represent a dual loyalty—to the then Dominion of Canada and to the British Commonwealth. Below these crowns is the thistle, which stands for Nova Scotia's Scottish origin.

The Governor General's Medal was won by Herve LePierres, Halifax, son of Professor LePierres of the Department of Modern Foreign Languages.

The Alumni Association medal for the highest standing in Science was presented to Cynthia Ann Jollymore of Lunenburg County, N.S.

Honorary degrees were presented to John MacLennan Buchanan, Premier of Nova Scotia;
