- Lynn is a National Vice-President in her union, Canada Employment and Immigration Union, a component of the PSAC.
- Lynn played a major role in the founding of a human rights committee in her union and was its first chair.
- Lynn represents her union on the Equal Opportunities Committee of the PSAC.
- Lynn has played an active role in organizing Human Rights and Women's conferences at the regional and national level.
- Lynn was elected to one of two affirmative action positions on the CLC National Executive at the 1992 Convention.

 National Executive to take a public "NO" position during the referendum even

- Sister Lynn Jones has spoken out about the devastating impact of the recent federal budget, the changes to the UI and Immigration Acts on all Canadians and their more severe consequences for racial minorities.
- Sister Lynn Jones is committed to achieving fully-funded positions on the CLC Executive Council to more fully represent her constituents.
