IMPROVEMENTS WELL RECEIVED

The improvements undertaken by SMUSA over the summer months are proving to be very successful. Spot checks on usage of the SMUSA Games Room and Gorsebrook Lounge have shown a dramatic increase in usage by students.

With better facilities and better access to those facilities a major goal has been achieved.

The information desk which has been established in the lobby of the Student Centre has also proved to increase the efficiency of information distribution and ticket sales.

The Student Conference Centre established on the third floor of the Student Centre has also proved to be a badly needed facility. Bookings for the facility are numerous. Any group wishing to hold an activity in the Conference Centre should book as far in advance as possible.

With the increasing enrolment over the past half decade the facilities available to students here at Saint Mary's University have become strained. The facilities in use now were built for a student population of 2,000. There are now 3,300 full-time and another 1,400 part-time students at Saint Mary's.

Ensuring that the facilities in place are kept in top notch shape and are readily available to all students is a priority, of the Students' Association; as is continued attention to improving, and renovating so all students can have good facilities available to them.

Attendance at the SMUSA Film Fest has also been overwhelming with full houses for each event. The noon time entertainment held in the Student Centre Cafeteria in early September also brought rave reviews and calls for more.

The Students' Association urges everyone to take advantage of SMUSA services.

Campus Liquor Policy

The enforcement of Nova Scotia Liquor regulations is a critical part of hosting a campus function.

The following rules apply when you attend a Student Association function at SMU. You must possess a SMU I.D. to gain admittance and in order to purchase liquor at that function you must possess a N.S. Liquor I.D., or Passport or federally issued I.D. proving you are 19 or over.

Non-SMU students must be signed into the function by a SMU student and possess one of the above mentioned I.D.'s to obtain liquor.

When attending the Gorsebrook Lounge you must be 19 or over, a SMU student or be signed in by a SMU student.

All liquor laws apply and must be followed. To save yourself time and aggravation make sure you possess the proper I.D.

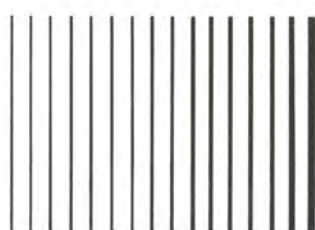

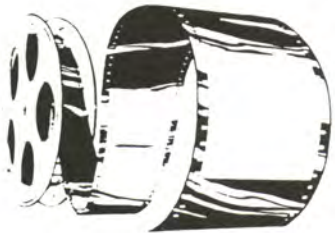

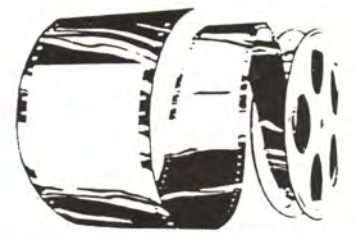
