### Mini-Courses To Be Offered

In the continuing effort to expand services for students the Students' Association has launched yet another service.

Starting in January a series of mini-courses will be held. The courses will range from first-aid to bartending. Students will be able to gain skills and experience in a number of interest areas.

The first course being offered will be a St. John Ambulance First Aid Course. The session called "The Lifesaver" will be held on Monday January 27th at 7:00 p.m. Interested students and others may register for the 2½ hour course at the SMUSA Information Desk in the Student Centre Lobby.

Posters and advertising will announce up-coming mini-courses for February and March. All courses offered will have attendance certificates issued.



### Employment Centre on Campus

The SMU campus employment centre is currently under the threat of being phased out due to government cut backs. The Students' Association has been working to prevent the closing of the centre since early in the fall of '85. A brief on the importance of the centre was sent to Ottawa to the Minister of Employment, Minister of Finance and local Nova Scotia M.P.'s

Early indications are that the centre will be closed for a four month period every year, due to cut backs, SMUSA is concerned about the serious side effects such as closing will have and the possibility of a total shutdown next year.

The Student's Association will continue to lobby on this matter to ensure the quality of the campus employment service does not deteriorate.



### Meal Plan Questionnaire

The Students' Association Student Affairs Committee has launched a survey looking into the current food plan in place at Saint Mary's

The survey was directed at residence students to find out their feelings about the food plan they are required to buy.

The survey polled about 20% of the residence students from High Rise II and Vanier. The survey is looking to answer questions such as:

- does the plan meet a students nutritional needs
- are students displeased with the plan
- how does the plan rate with others they are aware of plus a host of other information.

Results of the survey are now being tabulated and a final report is expected by the end of January.

An act to incorporate the Saint Mary's University Student's Association was first introduced into the Nova Scotia Legislature as Bill No. 36 during the 1966 session of the legislature. The act received its initial reading on February 21st and its second reading on March 3rd. Bill 36 finally passed when royal assent was granted on April 6th, 1966.

During the coming months SMUSA will celebrate its anniversary. The festivities will wind up with a giant birthday and Charter Day combination celebration on April 4th, 1986.

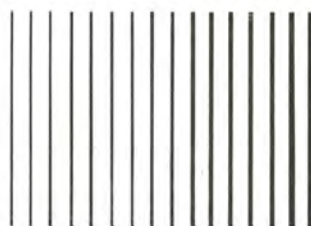

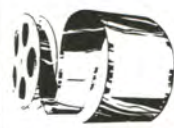

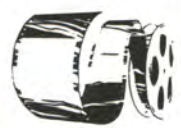
