### NOTICE TO ALL SOCIETIES

All societies must have their new executive lists on file with SMUSA before October 15th in order to receive the yearly start up grant. Any society who has not yet done so is reminded to pass in their new executive list to V.P. Student Affairs, 5th Floor Student Centre.

Any society who did not receive a Clubs and Societies Handbook is reminded that they can be obtained from the SMUSA offices.

### TYPING SERVICE

This month, the Students' Association will be starting a centralized typing service. The service will operate out of the Information Desk. All assignments to be typed, are to be dropped off, and picked up at the Information Desk.

The service is designed to provide the students with high quality typing at reasonable prices. Professional typists have been hired to work at the service. The Students' Association has decided to use a combination of outside help and students because of scheduling requirements.

Work will be handled on a first come, first serve basis and most submissions are expected to be completed within a day. Assignments should be booked, at least 1 day in advance so as to assist in the scheduling of typists and to help keep the cost to students as low as possible.

### MEDICAL INSURANCE INFO

CANADIAN STUDENTS are covered by or have access to basic hospital and medical coverage in their home province. It is the responsibility of all students to see that they have adequate medical coverage and are in good standing in their provincial insurance plans. If the province requires monthly payments, students must make certain that they are properly enrolled and maintain payments.



STUDENTS with LANDED IMMIGRANT STATUS previous to registration, or with DUAL CITIZENSHIP are eligible for M.S.I. Students on STUDENT VISAS may be eligible for M.S.I. after a certain length of time in the province.

FULL-TIME NON-CANADIAN STUDENTS who are not eligible for basic Canadian medical insurance or who are not enrolled in private medical plans MUST be insured by the comprehensive medical plan (Blue Cross) which has been arranged by the Student Representative Council. (Proof of eligibility in other plans must be shown at the time of registration). The premium is payable with the first instalment of fees. Family coverage is available. This insurance covers charges for hospitalization (standard ward bed) and doctor's hospital and office visits. It is necessary for students to pay their bills directly and then submit official receipts to Blue

Cross for reimbursement, initially, until personal cards arrive on campus.

A supplementary health benefits plan (Blue Cross), arranged by the Students Representative Council, is available for all FULL-TIME STUDENTS. The cost of the plan is included in the SRC fee that is paid with the tuition fees. Family coverage is available for an additional fee at the time of registration. Each student is issued a registration card from Blue Cross with a personal policy number on it. The number is needed for obtaining any benefits. The cards may be picked up AFTER notices are posted that the cards are available.

- Supplementary health benefits include:
- diagnostic and x-ray services
  - physiotherapist, chiropractor osteopath, chiroprapist, podiatrist
  - wheelchair rental
  - ambulance charges (\$50.00)
  - crutches, splints, braces
  - out-patient services
  - prescription drugs (\$2.00 co-pay)
  - accidental dental (\$1,000.00)

PART-TIME STUDENTS are not eligible for the comprehensive nor the supplementary health plan.

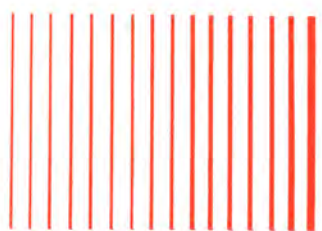

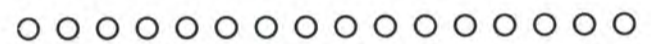

**TRAVEL BOARD**

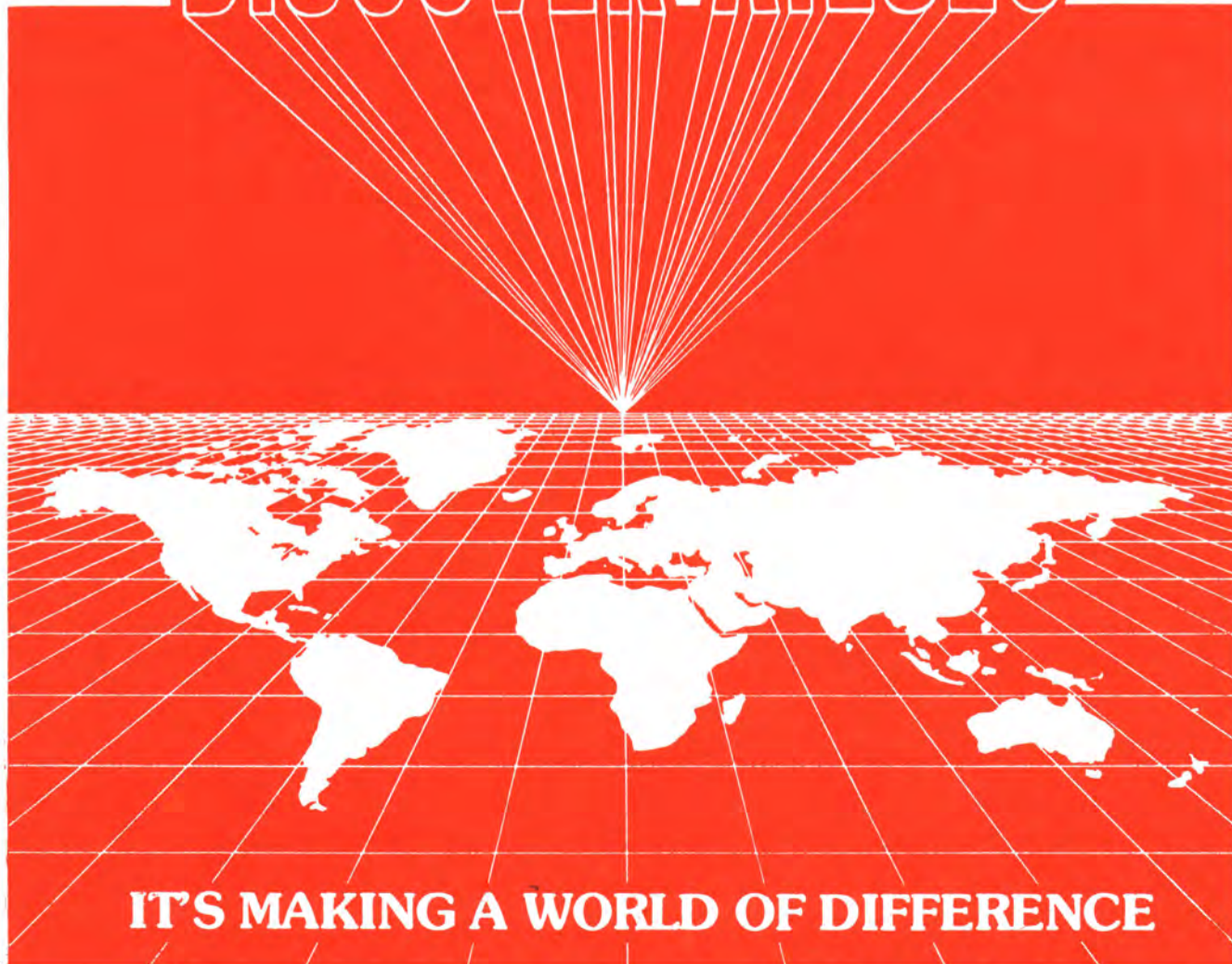
