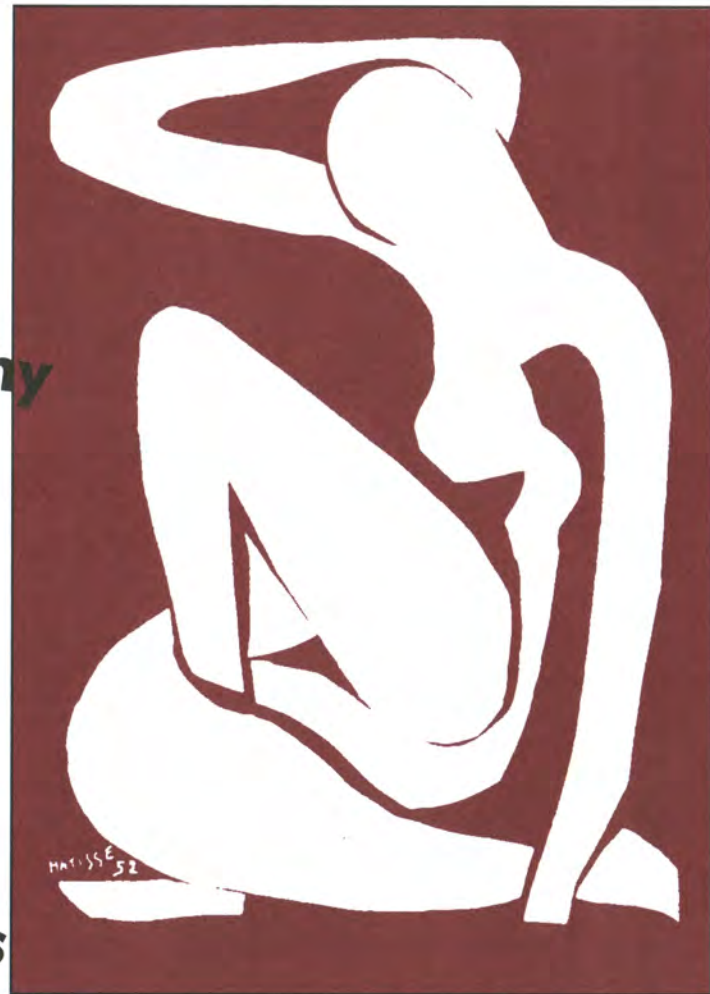


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CFSM Goes Bust

Saint Mary's campus radio station, CFSM, has dated back to 1973. It has been a volunteer organization run by the students of Saint Mary's University. The student executive passed the motion to shut down the station in early October, after volunteers complained to the VP Administration, Liam Arbuckle about problems. Up until that point the executive had no idea what was going on behind the doors of CFSM. When the problems were investigated a surprising shock was revealed. The administration found the expensive equipment disassembled and the station was a disaster area. CFSM's major problems can be rooted



to their high turnover rate. This in turn created the lack of leadership and managerial skills needed within an organization. These problems have been escalating for a number of years. Locking the doors was a hard decision but one the SRC council had to

face. Kevin Smith who was the manager of CFSM last year felt SMUSA "acted too quickly" in making a decision. At this point he is torn between letting go or holding on to the station. To get the station back up and running and able to be heard by the students, SMUSA would have to

invest large sums of money that they don't have. The station would need a manager with strong technical and managerial skills. The Student Executive interviewed candidates for the job but they have not found one that has all the qualifications needed. As it stands right now the shut down of CFSM is indefinite.

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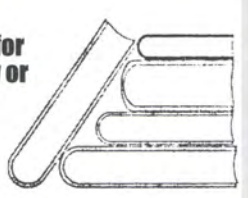

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Getting Stressed out about Exams?

Here are a few study hints:

- Study your hardest subjects at your best time of day. If you are not a morning person, do not try to be.
- Be realistic about what you can do in an hour. Set specific goals for each study session.
- Plan short breaks. Research has shown that 50 minutes of studying with a 10 minute break usually produces the most effective studying.
- Plan leisure time. If you do not, you may feel cheated and then really go off your schedule - feeling there are no rewards for your hard work.
- Reward yourself for staying on schedule or for finishing a difficult assignment.
- Make a daily To-Do list. Prioritize what must get done and what can wait until later.
- When writing a multiple choice exam, read the question, cover up the alternatives, and then predict what the answer is. Then go to the alternatives to find your predicted answer.
- Write essay exams as if they were essays. Essay questions should have an introductory paragraph stating the thesis and the outline of your answer. The essay then moves to the body, made up of several topics and finally ends with the conclusion.
- Remember to budget your time according to the value of each question.
