Annual Meeting

A Welcome to the Graduating Class

The Annual Meeting of the Alumni Association was held on Monday, April 26, 1976 at 7:45 p.m. in the Student Union Building of the University.

The attendance at the meeting was very good and the discussion of the Agenda items, while not as lively as at some other annual get-togethers, was extensive and thorough.

The reports of the various Committees and the Auditor's report were accepted. A motion to change the Constitution so that a voluntary contribution system would replace the present dues system was defeated. As a result, the compulsory ten dollars (\$10) dues remains in effect for at least another year.

Article 5, sub-section 5.1 of the Constitution was amended so as to include all six Alumni members of the Board of Governors on the Executive of the Association.

Article 6 — Election of Officers and Executive — sub-section 6.2 was amended so that nominations for elections would have to be submitted to the Executive at least eight weeks prior to the Annual Meeting.

Rev. D. W. Rourke, S.J.

Rev. Daniel W. Rourke, S.J., former chairman of the Department of Sociology at Saint Mary's University, passed away Wednesday, May 26, in St. Catherine's, Ontario.

A respected Canadian criminologist and penologist, Father Rourke came to Saint Mary's University — then Saint Mary's College — in 1945 to teach English and sociology. For 25 years, until his retirement in 1971, he was chairman of SMU's Department of Sociology. He also served as dean of extension and director of athletics. He inaugurated here Junior Canadian Football and the Senior Canadian Football League, for which he acted as chairman, referee and sports broadcaster.

Born in 1901 in Saint John, New Brunswick, Father Rourke was educated at Normal School in Truro and St. Francis Xavier University. He entered the Society of Jesus in 1921, completed his classical studies at Ignatius College in Guelph, Ontario, studied philosophy and earned an M.A. in sociology at Spokane's Gonzaga University, and studied theology in both Ireland and Wales.

A math, physics and English teacher at Campion College in Regina before coming to Halifax, he coached various athletic teams in city leagues in the Saskatchewan capital. During World War II, he organized air cadets in Regina, served as Air Force chaplain and Commanding Officer of a squadron.

Father Rourke is survived by a brother, Ned, and sister, Mrs. Ronald Gillis, Hamilton, Ontario.

Funeral service was held Friday evening at 8 o'clock in Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Toronto.

A Memorial Mass, concelebrated by priests of the Jesuit community and the archdiocese of Halifax-Dartmouth, was offered in Canadian Martyrs Church, Monday, May 31. Chief celebrant of the Mass was Most Reverend James M. Hayes, Archbishop of Halifax, assisted by Rev. James W. Dyer, S.J., Superior of the Jesuits in Halifax, and Rev. Clarence P. Hinphy, Parist Priest of Canadian Martyrs. Readings were by Dr. D. O. Carrigan, President of Saint Mary's University, and Mr. John Chaisson, a nephew of Father Rourke. The choir was directed by Rev. Joseph Pottie, with organist Mr. John Martin. Mr. Frank Baldwin was lector.
