The initial response to the replacing of annual dues by annual giving has been excellent. The total dollar response is already greater than the total collected all last year in dues. The numbers, however, are down.

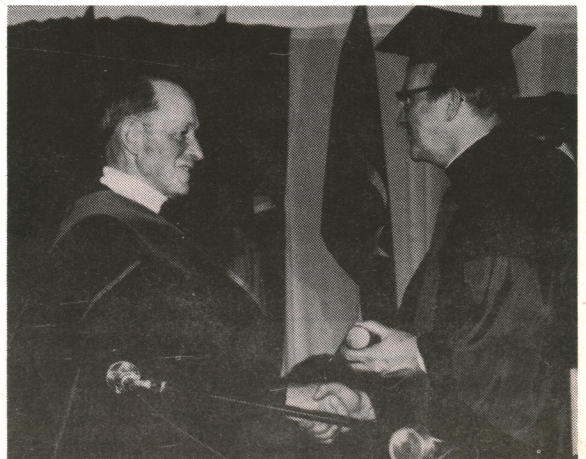

Alumni Scholarships

At the executive meeting in June, approval was given for the transfer of \$3100 in accumulated interest from the 175th anniversary alumni fund to provide for additional scholarships for the coming academic year. \$1500 has been transferred from the Christian Brothers Scholarship Fund; \$1000 from the Alumni Fund; and \$600 from the Father Burke-Gaffney Memorial Fund.

The Scholarship Committee of the university has been directed to award these funds to students presently enrolled.
