Al Keith ... who else? To be honest, I'm somewhat timid about writing this article since there's very little I can say with authority. You see, I never met Mr. Keith ... we simply talked briefly over the phone on a








number of occassions. So what can I say? Well, to begin with, I can note certain historic facts. Al Keith is a SMU grad (Arts, '65), as well as holding degrees in Physical Ed. and Education. He served as President of the Nova Scotia Amateur Football Association and the prestigious Canadian Football Coaches Association. His winning average was as near perfect as his commitment to football. He was enthusiastic about the development of minor level football, often lending the SMU facilities to high schools and having them work out with the team, as well as encouraging the coaches and helping them design their programmes. Most impressive is that in five seasons with SMU, Al Keith led us to four AIFC titles and, in 1973, our only national championship. The same year he was named Canadian Coach of the Year, and was twice ('72 and '74) so honoured by the AUAA.

The statistics are remarkable, but what about the man himself? Well, Alex Walling, columnist for the Fourth Estate, wrote: "You don't forget too many people who get you out of bed for a quote at 5:30 a.m. I've had to do that more than once in the radio business, and Al has always co-operated. In my ten years of reporting, Keith ranks as the easiest and most co-operative person that I've ever dealt with." And I've received nothing less than warmer comments from the guys on the team.

As for my own impressions, we have to go back to the phone conversations. In many years of student journalism, I've dealt with a number of coaches, directors and administrators. All of them proved remarkable, but too often intimidating and overpowering. Al IS remarkable, but nonetheless human. Our first conversation concerned arranging an interview. His reaction was "Interview me? Really!" with an "aw shucks" suggested by his voice. I couldn't keep our appointment and from then on we just kept missing each other. Al Keith is going on to new endeavours. We needn't wish him success because from all I've heard, his personality, talent and intelligence guarantees it. But we can wish him happiness, and I'm confident we all do.

Al Keith - one hell of a guy. I'm awfully sorry I missed him.








A Campus Cop's
