FOOTBALL HUSKIES 1982

Head Football Coach Al Keith stood at the helm of his Huskies on September 18th with a young squad of 20 new and 20 returning players, eager for the opening kickoff to begin their 1982 league schedule on the year-old AstroTurf surface in Huskies Stadium.


Optimism and Confidence with a capital "O" and "C" were the words thought and heard most, and despite five consecutive losses, it wasn't until the final gun sounded to end their sixth game that a chance for a playoff berth dissolved.

The Huskies went on to finish in fourth place with a dismal 0-7 winless season; but it was a strong start for the 1983 season with several extremely talented football players already forming the base for a much improved club . . . one capable of challenging for the title with a few key revisions to the roster.

Wide receiver John Kowalski broke a conference record for most receptions in a single game with 13 completed passes on October 23rd at St. Francis Xavier University. Kowalski was joined by teammates Steve Molnar at linebacker, and Chris Tzaneteas at Kicker on the All-Conference squad, and Kowalski also received All-Canadian honours. Linebacker Jim Czenze was selected as the winner of the coveted Block and Tackle award as the Huskies' top lineman.

After nine years as Head Coach, in which he won four Atlantic and one Canadian championship and was named A.U.A.A. and C.I.A.U. Coach of the Year, Al Keith stepped down from his position at the season's conclusion to make way for a rising star on the coaching horizon, former C.F.L. all-star Larry Uteck. With Coach Uteck comes the dawning of a new age for the return of Huskies dominance on the gridiron.

SOCCER HUSKIES 1982


The Soccer Huskies embarked on their 1982 season the the conference title to defend. A strong lineup iced with All-Canadians Geoff Agostini at midfield, d forwards Jim Sidey and Ross Webb, lent credibility their claim for another banner year.


A ten game schedule became tougher as it proessed for the Huskies who recorded ties to rival Dalusie Tigers and the Mt. Allison Mounties, and a late ason 3-1 loss to the Tigers. The Huskies hung on to eir first place, finishing with a 7-1-2 record and the right host the A.U.A.A. Championships. A home crowd in your home stadium should spell success, but the Huskies continued the jinx which has never allowed them to take the championship in familiar territory. Once again, they failed to capture league laurels at home when a disappointing 2-1 loss to the U.P.E.I. Panthers in opening round action put them out of contention. The game was not decided until the completion of two overtime periods and a shootout.

Fullback Peter Wicha was selected the team's Most Valuable Player, and Captain Ross Webb was chosen the University's Athlete of the Year.



FIELD HOCKEY 1982


Head Coach Helen Castonguay took the reins for er first year and steered her field hockey squad toward demanding schedule.


The loss of McKellar, Longley, and several other players leaves a large gap in the lineup, but returning Head Coach Kathy Mullane is confident of a league contender in 1983.



1982-83 MEN'S BASKETBALL

After a highly successful 81-82 season, the 82-83 Huskies inherited an admirable reputation, minus the graduated stars of the previous year.

Head Coach Gary Heald stated from the outset that his 82-83 club would not repeat the previous year's performance, but would be a title contender when the playoffs arrived.

Key injuries at mid-season left the team without a bonafide guard, but capable fill-ins from the lineup handled those duties until the squad was healthy again. Haligonian guard David Smith was the only player who falled to return to active duty due to a back injury.


A see-saw struggle with league opponents throughout the schedule ended with the Huskies in second place on a 12-6 record. Post-season action elevated the underdog Santamarians to national prominence where their pursuit of excellence has so often led them. Conference playoffs placed the tough Dalhousie Tigers and St. Francis Xavier X-Men in the Huskies' path, but a thrilling one point victory over Dal and a convincing win over the X-Men gave Saint Mary's a hard-earned A.U.A.A. title.


The Eastern Canadian Regionals next faced the Atlantic Champion Huskies on the road to the Nationals, and wins over the Brock Badgers and York Yeomen for the Eastern Championship send the Huskies on to Waterloo for the four team finals.

Finally . . . Waterloo! Only four teams remained for the Canadian crown. The defending national champions, Victoria Vikings, once again stood in the way of ultimate success for the Huskies. The Vikings escaped opening round action with a narrow six point victory over the Maroon & White.







1982-83 WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Under the tutelage of Head Coach Helen Castonguay, the women's basketball team worked hard for a 7-7 league record and fourth place finish.


The S.M.R. Invitational was held in mid-November with both university and senior teams competing. The host Santamarians were the eventual champions.

Second year player Sandra Mumford was selected to the conference all-star team for her outstanding performances in rebounding and scoring statistics.


The graduation of captain Karen McKellar left a major gap in the lineup, but Coach Castonguay was optimistic about finding a very capable replacement.

1982-83 HOCKEY HUSKIES

The 1982-83 Hockey Huskies enjoyed moderate success with a young team. After upsetting hometown rival Dalhousie Tigers in the last conference game, the Huskies finished fourth and clinched the final league playoff spot on a 12-11-1 record.

A tight race for the playoff berths developed in the post-Christmas stretch, and while the Huskies had their share of disappointments they hung on for semi-final playoff action against the defending national champion Universite de Moncton Blue Eagles. The Blue Eagles eliminated the Huskies from further competition in two games.


Highlights included a 9-1 exhibition victory over the touring Chinese National Team amidst a packed house in a fog-shrouded home arena. The Chinese dubbed Huskies all-star goaltender Mark Locken with a nickname which translates to mean "Iron Gate".


The label was appropriate as Locken went on to complete his fifth year in Huskie colours as the M.V.P. in both the A.U.A.A. and C.I.A.U. He was selected for All-Conference status for the fifth consecutive year and voted to the All-Canadian squad for his fourth time.

Second year defenseman Mike Kelly joined Locken on the Atlantic and Canadian all-star teams; and both players were selected to Canada's Olympic training squad.

A multi-talented, but young, roster failed to return the A.U.A.A. championship to the Saint Mary's campus in 1982-83, but with experience and a key replacement for departed netminder Mark Locken, the Huskies await their chance to again capture the league silverware in the 83-84 season under Head Coach Brian O'Byrne.



Our world of high technology and rapid change forces many people to turn their attention to very specialized interests in the hope of keeping up with "the state of the art" in their field.






























































































EDITOR'S MESSAGE
