



HIPPODROME ALLEY








BOOZE CRUISE


During 1990-91, your Students' Association worked diligently to achieve its objective: providing you, the students, with better services and enhanced representation. This was the year that SMUSA turned its biggest loss in history into its biggest surplus in history - in just one fiscal year. Students ratified a referendum that would annually adjust student fees according to the rate of inflation - a first for Student Unions in Canada. We marched against cuts to post secondary education, boycotted Marriott Food Services for its inadequacies, and, on April 6, celebrated our 25th year as an incorporated student body.

This was also the year that the Students' Association achieved computerization, the Off-Campus Housing Office was opened, and the University committed to having a student on the next food services tender selection committee, in 1995. SMU was saddened with the passing of three of its students: Frank Bowes, Jeffrey Bedford, and Jill Bradley.

I wish to thank Dave, Terry, Sutej, Norm, Darcy, Rosemary, Gail, and all of the SMUSA team for their patience, assistance, guidance, and confidence. It is my sincere hope that through our efforts, your year has been enriched.

As I conclude three terms on the Executive of SMUSA, I can cite the students at Saint Mary's as exciting and energetic. As you move on in your chosen paths, reflect upon the pages of this yearbook as golden. Best of luck in your pursuits and endeavors.
