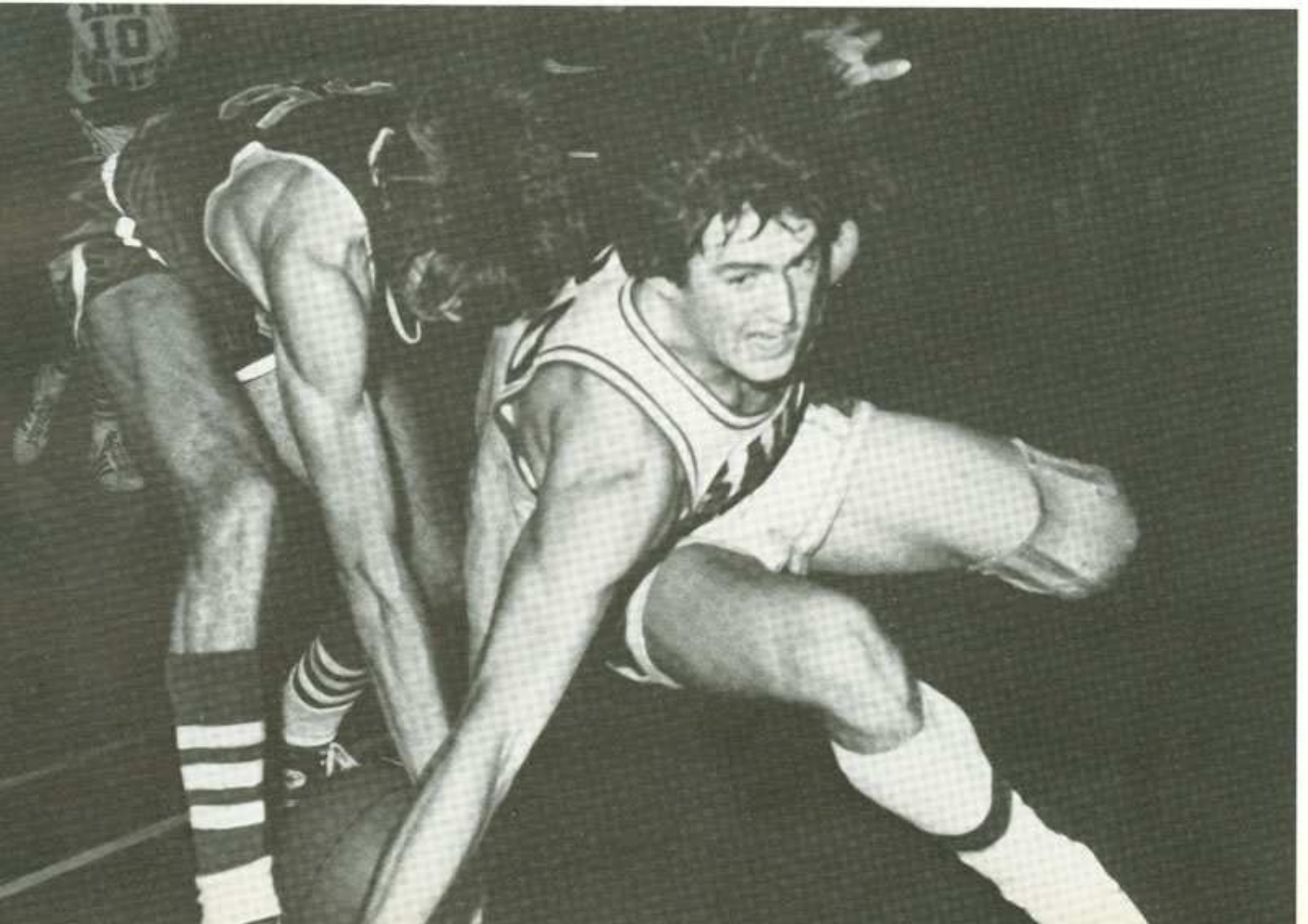


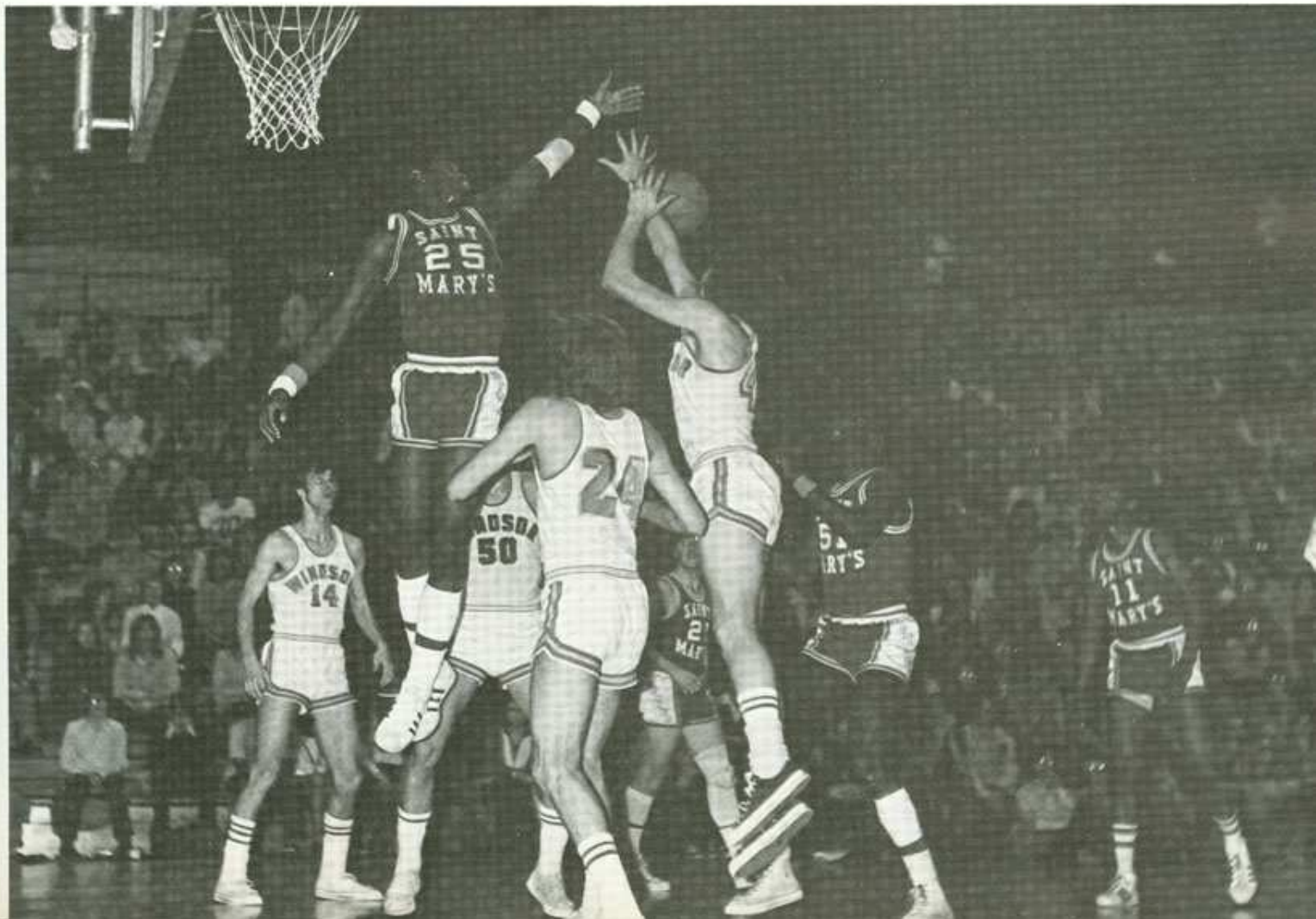
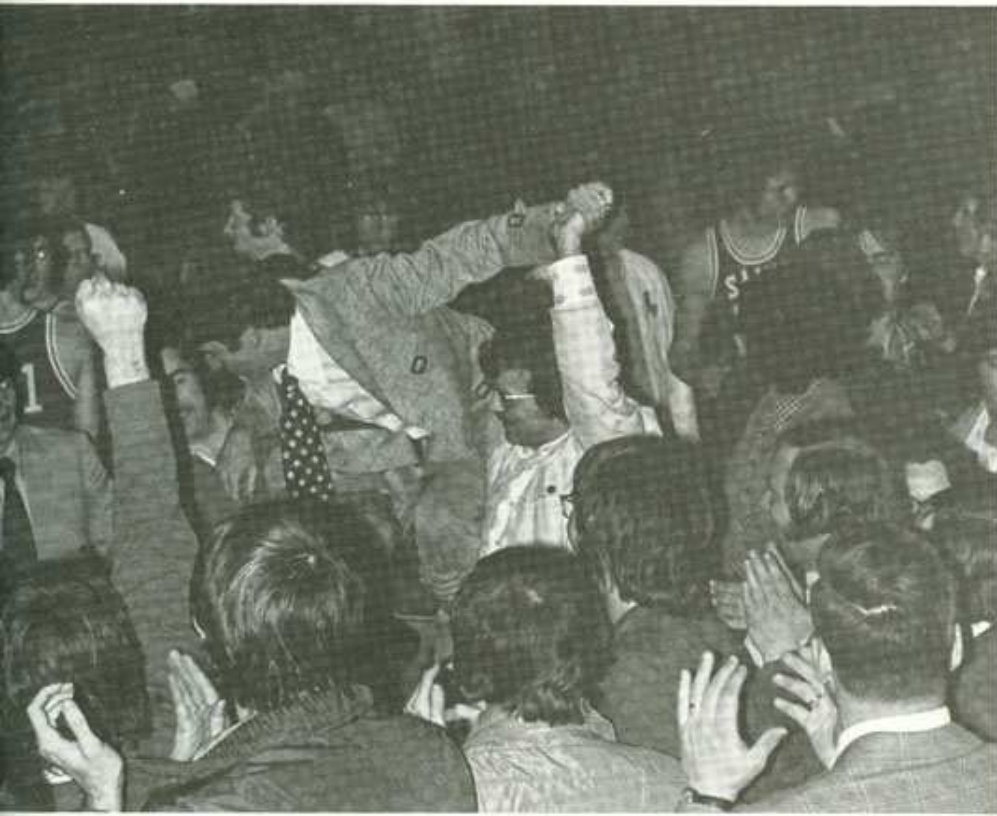




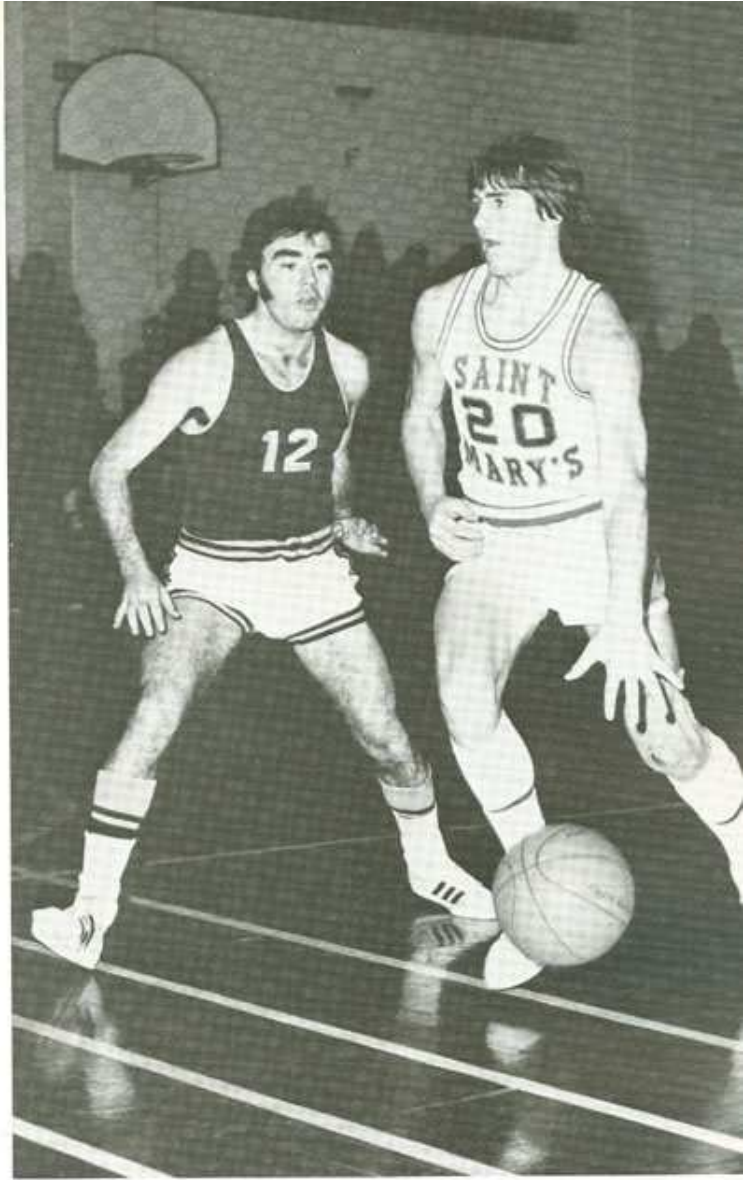


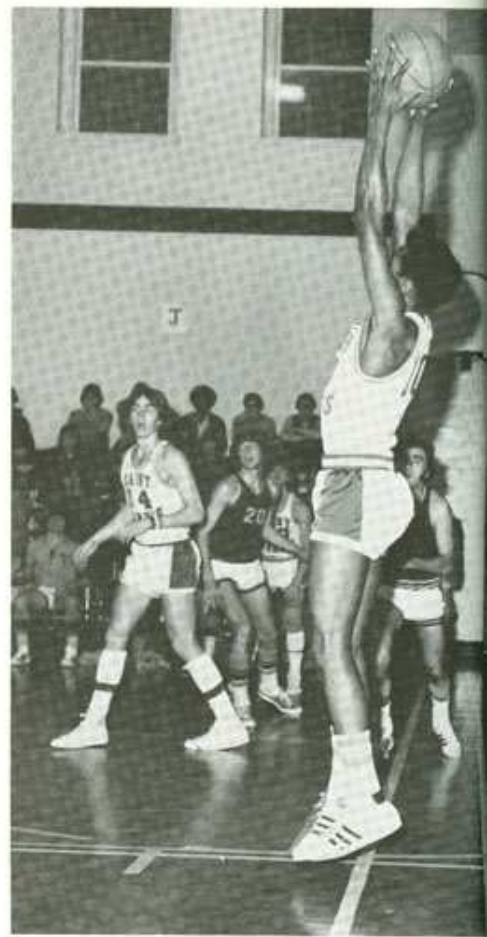


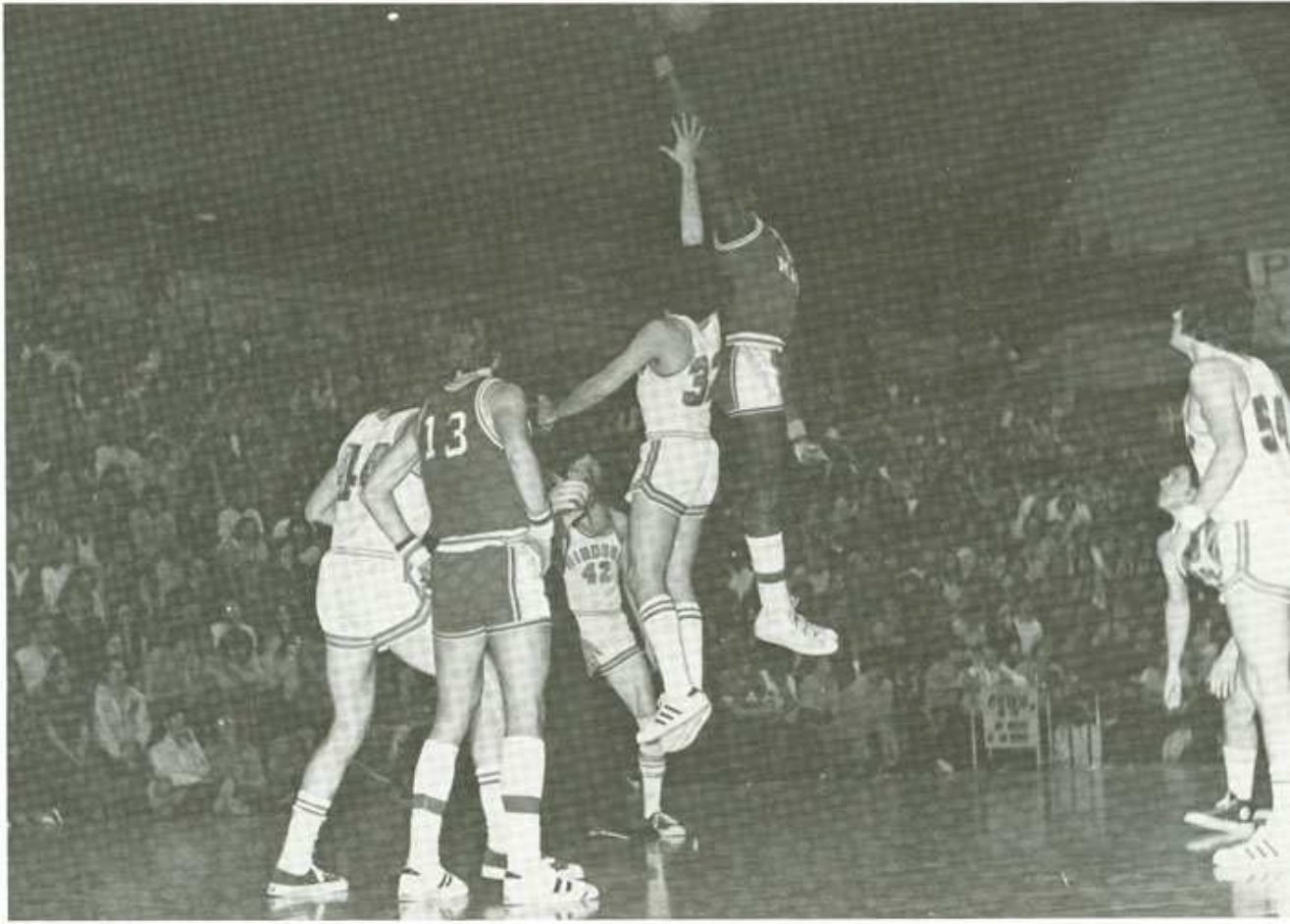
















S.M.U. Basketball
1972-'73 National Champions



At the beginning of the 1972-'73 season St. Mary's was rated highly, due to the impressive victories by the team, but that was changed as Acadia Axeman gave us our first defeat of the season. It seemed that Acadia was going to win the A.I.A.A. conference again with the only competition being St. Mary's. This reasoning seemed to be correct as Acadia won three of four season games against St. Mary's, with one game being won by Acadia on the last second basket making the final score 59-58.

Coach Brian Heaney, however, got his team to play outstandingly in the A.I.A.A. play-offs, where we easily defeated U.N.B. This put us against Acadia and the odds seemed to be in their favour. However, Acadia was knocked off balance by the rebounding of Lee Thomas and Otha Johnson, and the accurate shooting of Mickey Fox. In the second half, with reliable bench strength such as Greig Redding, St. Mary's dominated play, and won the A.I.A.A. conference by 64-55.

At this stage St. Mary's seemed to be constantly underrated as they went to the national finals. They were underdogs going against the University of Windsor, who were slated to take the championship. In that opening game the lead bounced back and forth until John Gallinaugh sunk a basket with one second left to put the game into overtime. St. Mary's eventually won 91-84 in the first overtime period.

This put us against the Lakehead University Nor'Westers. Many thought that due to the pressure of the game, the fairly inexperienced team of St. Mary's consisting mostly of freshmen and sophomores, would be outplayed by Lakehead. This seemed the case as at half time we were trailing by 39-34. However, with the generalship of John



Gallinaugh, the rebounding of Lee Thomas, the shooting by Mickey Fox, and an overall great defensive game by the whole team, they came back in the second half to win by a commanding score of 79-67.

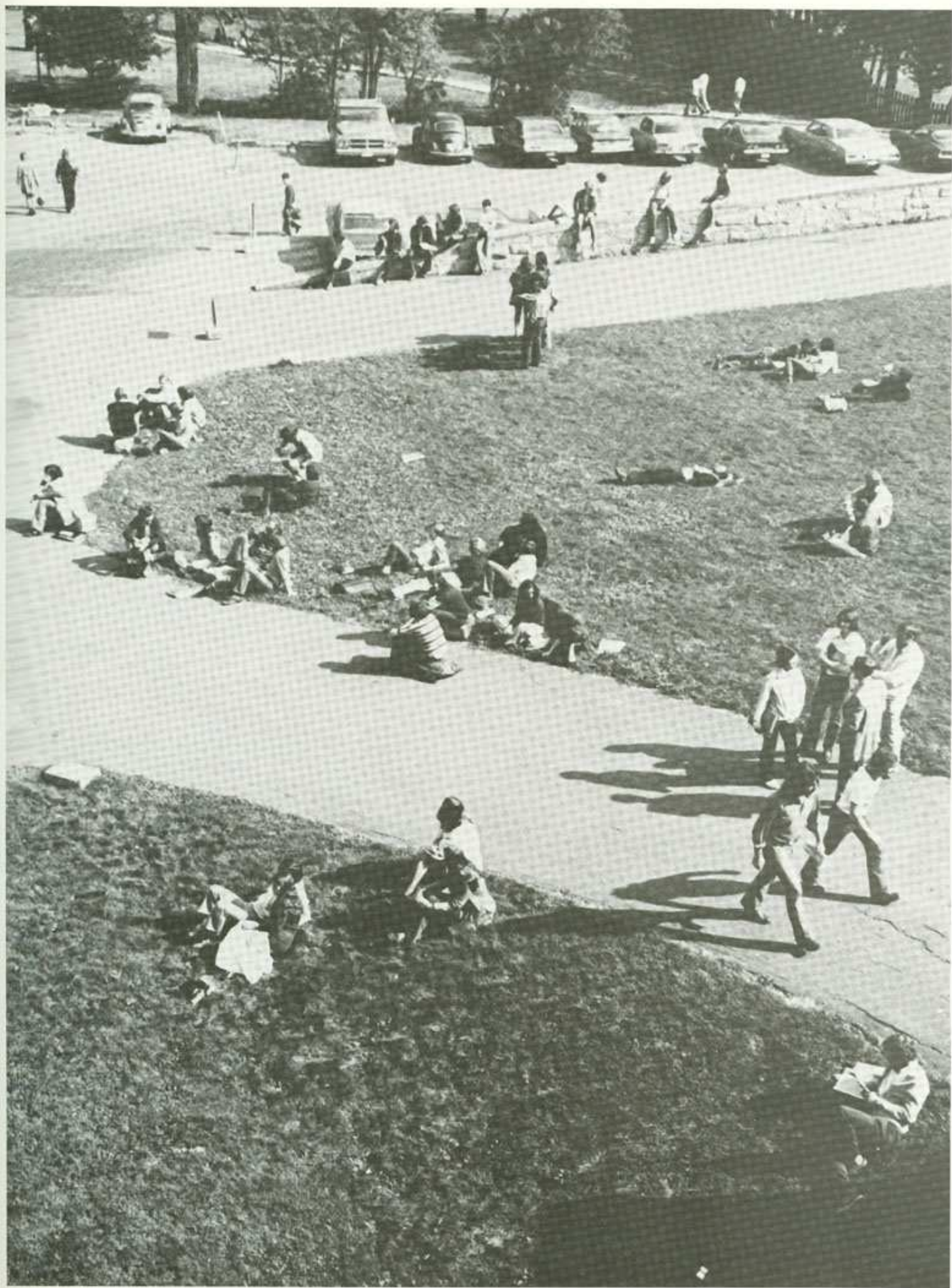
With a young team such as ours, and with new talent always coming up, coach Brian Heaney is confident that St. Mary's can be national champions again next year. With outstanding rookies such as Lee Thomas, Fred Perry, and Otha Johnson, and second year men like John Gallinaugh and Mickey Fox, it seems very likely that St. Mary's will again prove to be the best in the land.







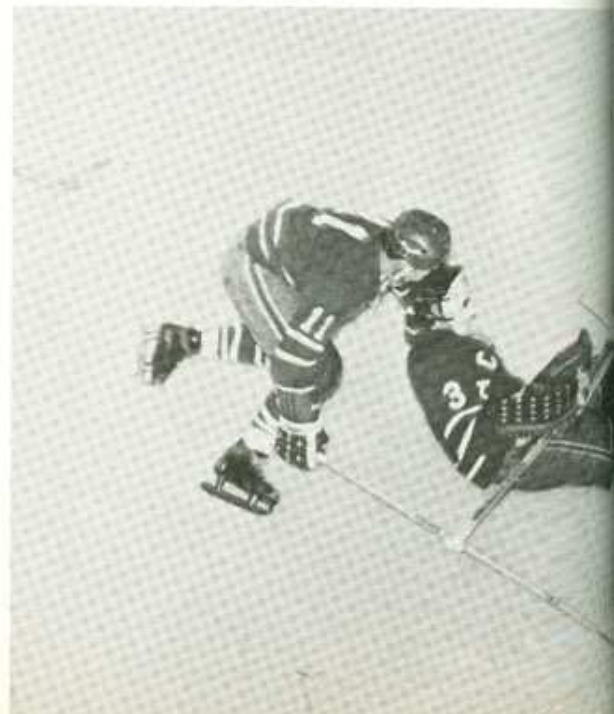
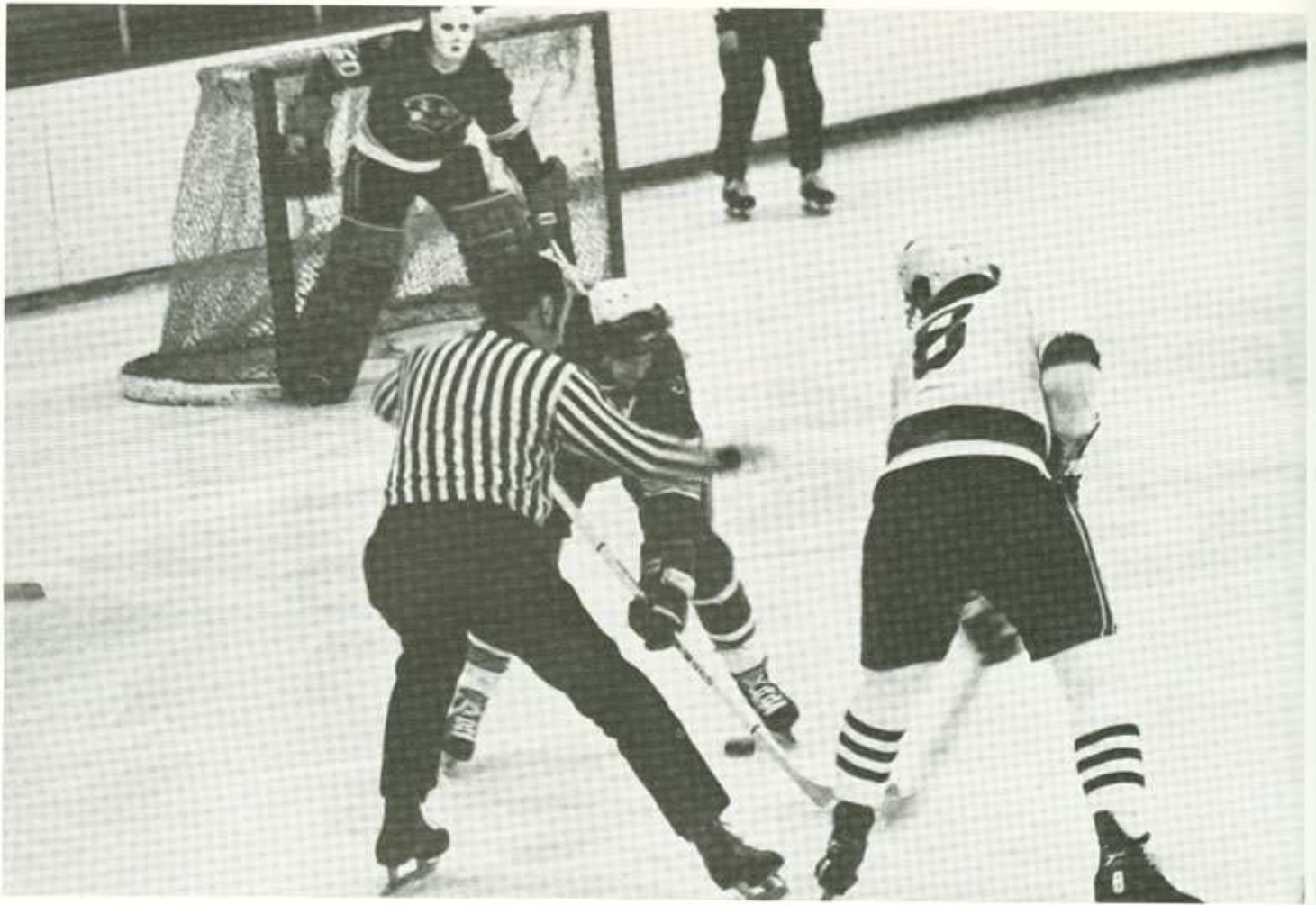




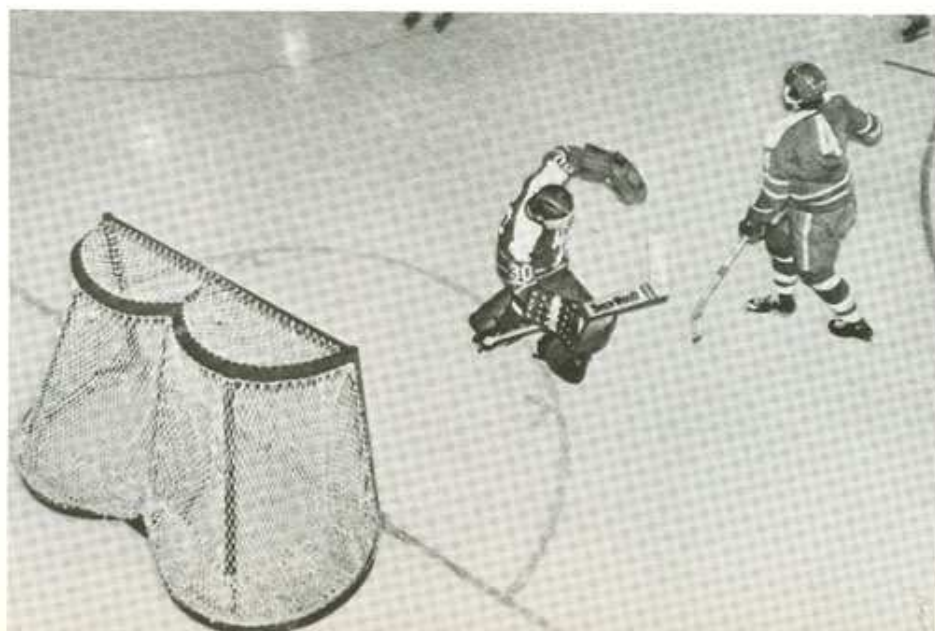
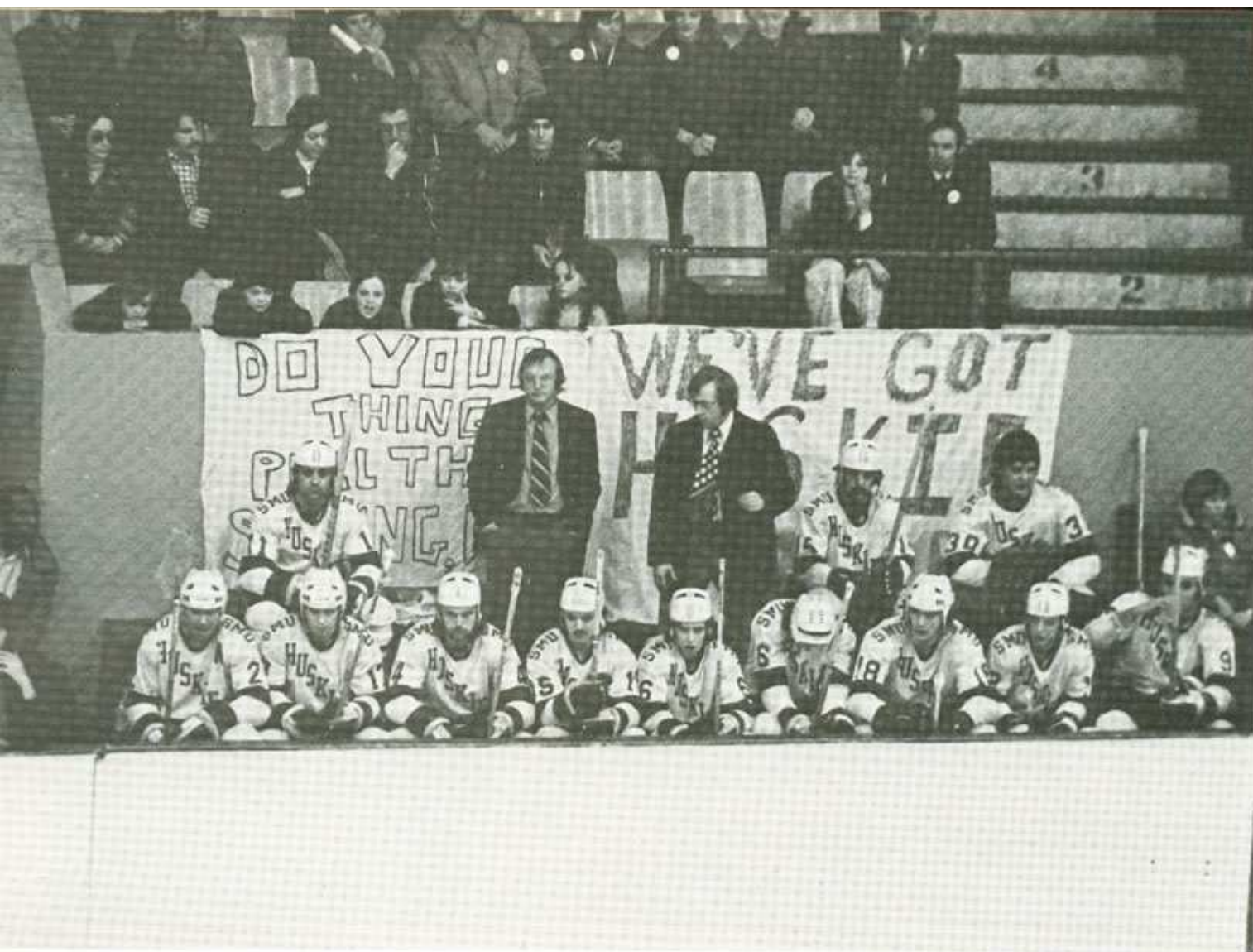




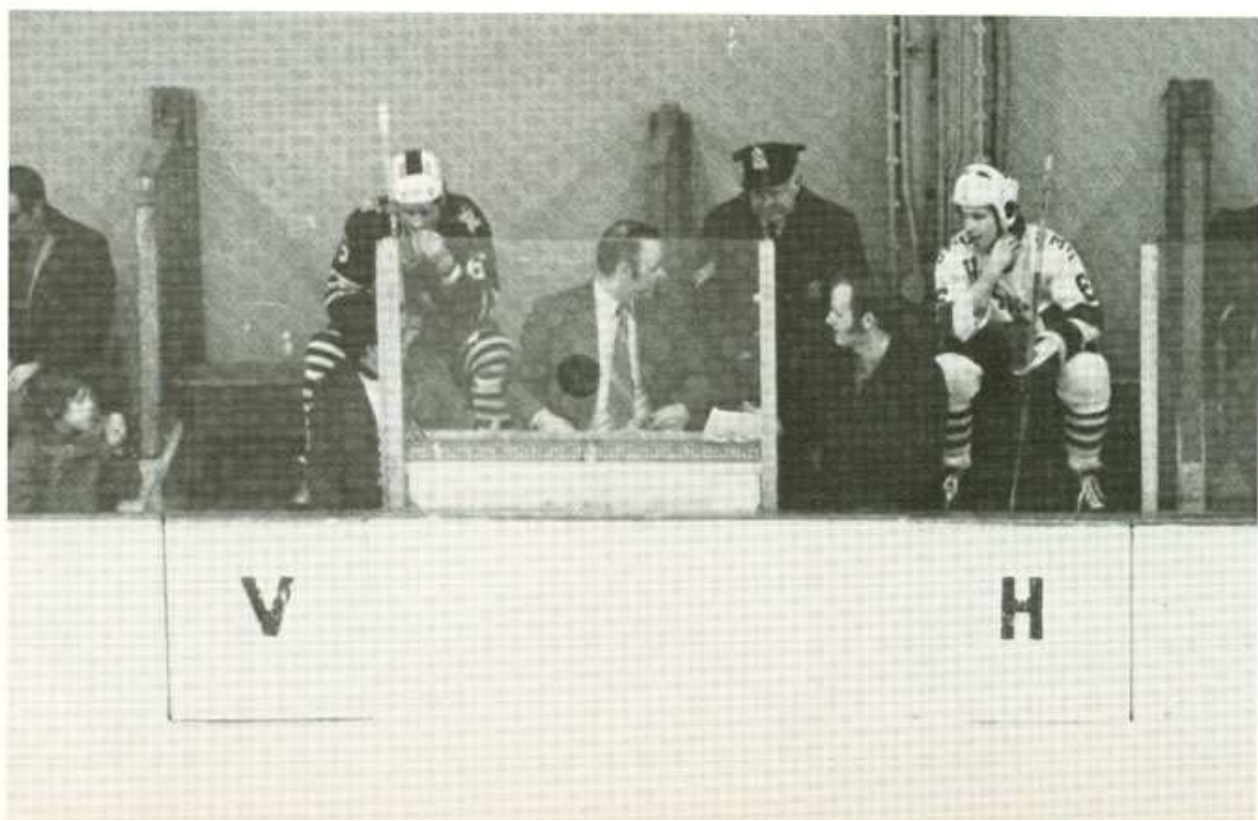

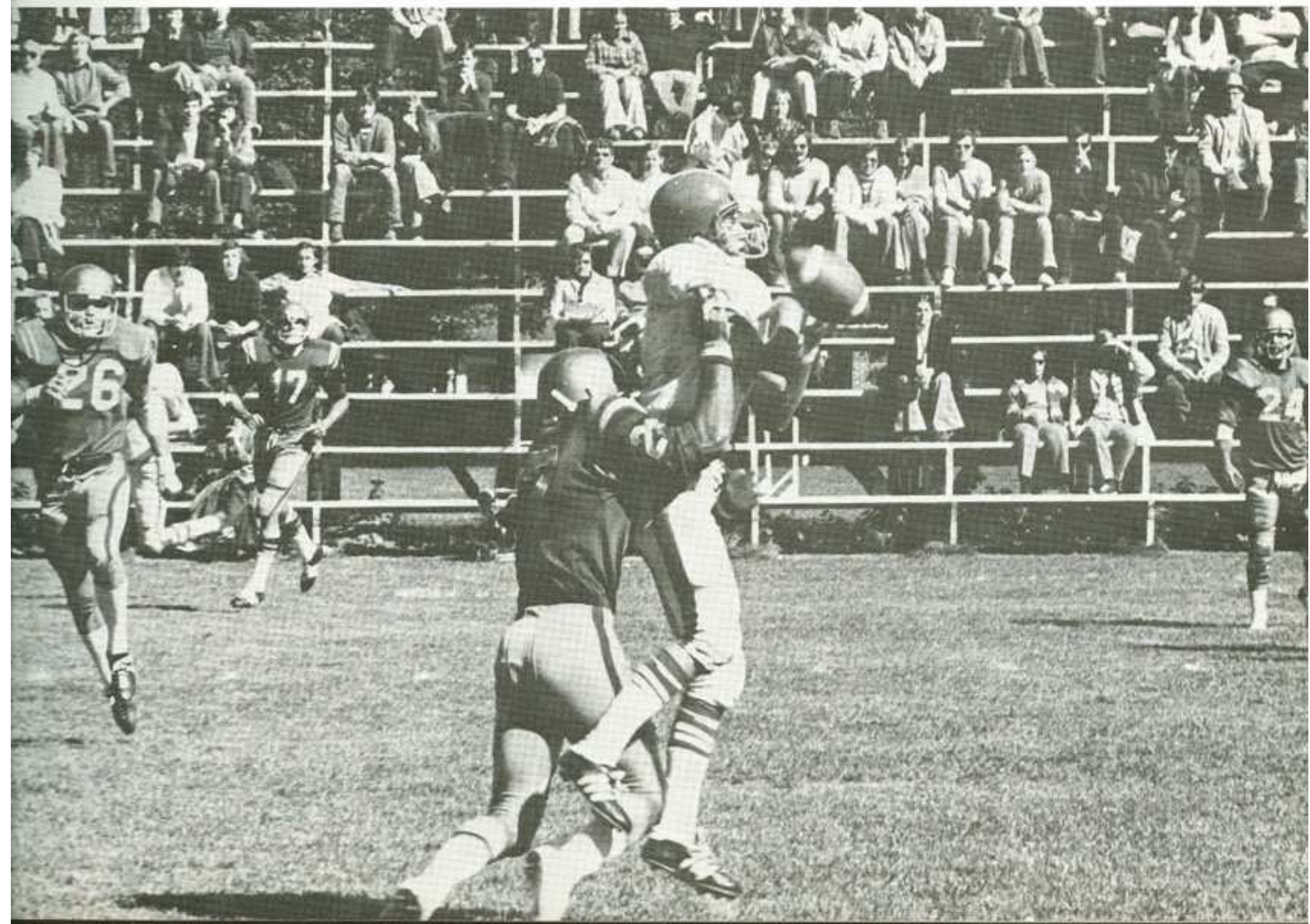














Varsity Football

In the 1972-'73 Inter-Collegiate Football season, coach Al Keith and the St. Mary's Huskies went on to show that we still had the best football team in the A.I.A.A. As in the 1971-'72 season, the Huskies were undefeated in regular season play. The season was unlike last year's as many games were uphill battles all the way.

The season began with two exhibition games, against Loyola, and Waterloo Lutheran. The Huskies were victorious over Loyola by a 37-15 drubbing, but had a tough fight against Waterloo Lutheran, defeating them 16-8.

The regular season then began with the first game against U.P.E.I. The Huskies won after some tough going, 24-14. Our first real scare was the following week when we played Acadia. At half time the Huskies were trailing 11-0. It was a different story in the second half though, as St. Mary's roared back to a 17-12 win.

The next game was an exhibition game against the '71-'72 College Bowl Champions, the University of Western Ontario Mustangs. This was a sort of grudge match due to the loss to Western last year in the Atlantic Bowl. The Huskies fought hard but came out on the short end of a 31-24 score. At this time a serious leg injury to Ang. Santucci threatened St. Mary's hopes of reaching the Atlantic Bowl. But Al Keith had ample depth on the team to counteract the loss of Santucci, and the following week St. Mary's defeated St. F.X. 13-11 in a last minute touchdown pass from Bill Robinson to Gord Fumerton. After that close victory the team really started rolling by defeating Dalhousie 55-1, Mt. Allison by 20-6 and U.N.B. 39-13. This set

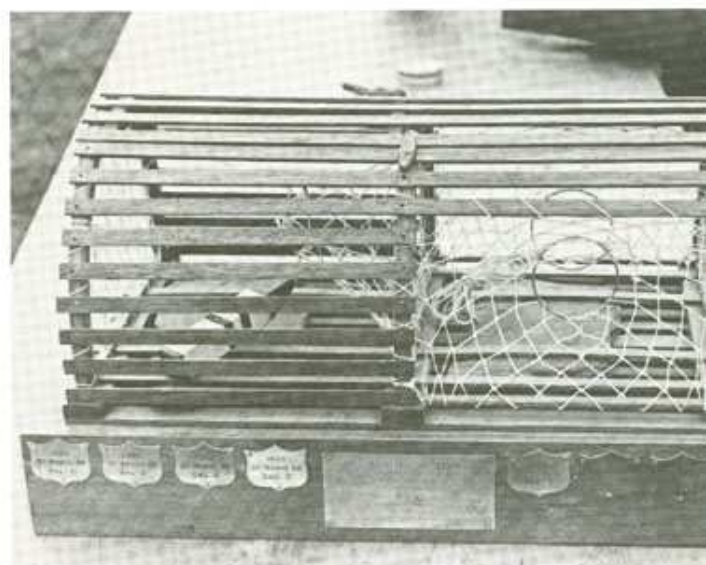
the stage for the Atlantic Bowl against the Ontario Champions, the Waterloo Lutheran Golden Hawks. As it turned out the Huskies were beaten by Waterloo devastating ground game, and routed 50-17.

Throughout the season the team received exceptional play from its rookies, in particular Fred Schmuck, Steve Telfer, Mike Kirkpatrick and Ray Romano. The returning regulars such as Gord Fumerton, Fraser MacDonald, Kevin and Mark Connolly, Mike Labrash, Ken Clark and Buzzy Theriault, combined to make St. Mary's a power on both Offense and Defense.

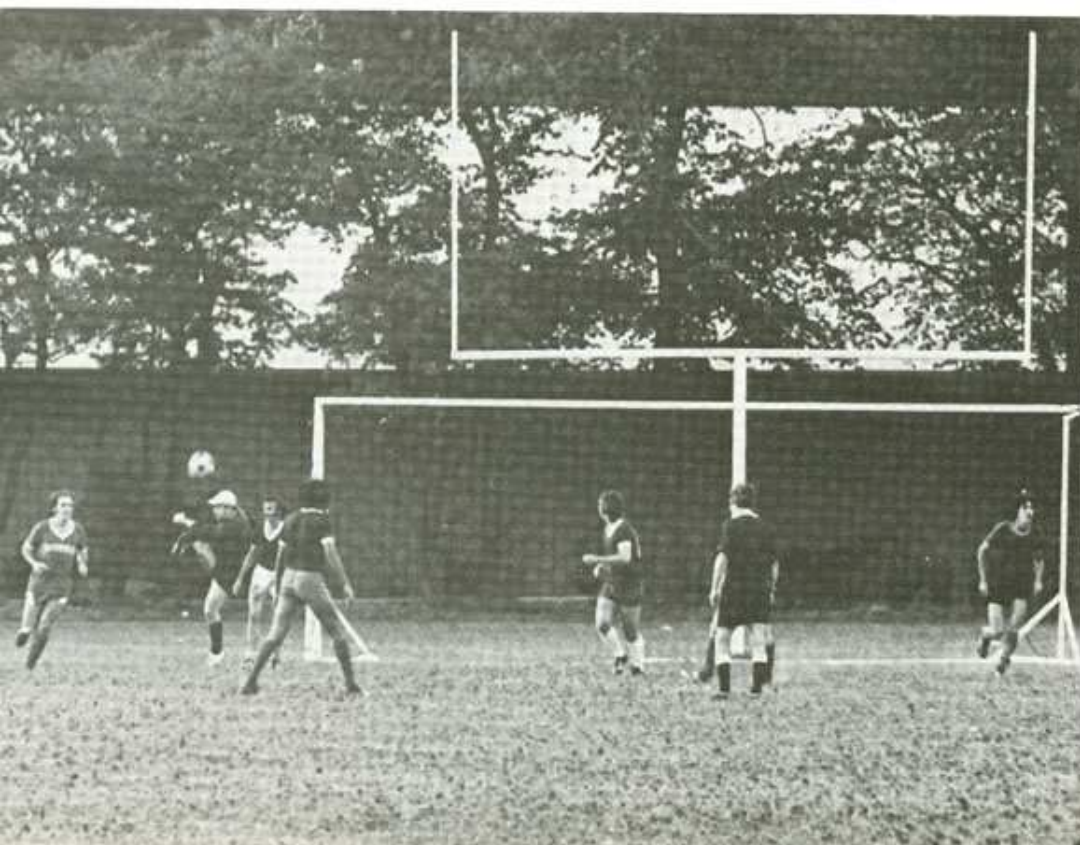
Next year, Al Keith should have a fairly balanced team and division contender again, even though many experienced veterans will be leaving, particularly on the offensive and defensive lines.

Whatever the outcome, St. Mary's fans will again, no doubt, be entertained by the Huskies, and next year could be the year St. Mary's wins the Vanier Cup.

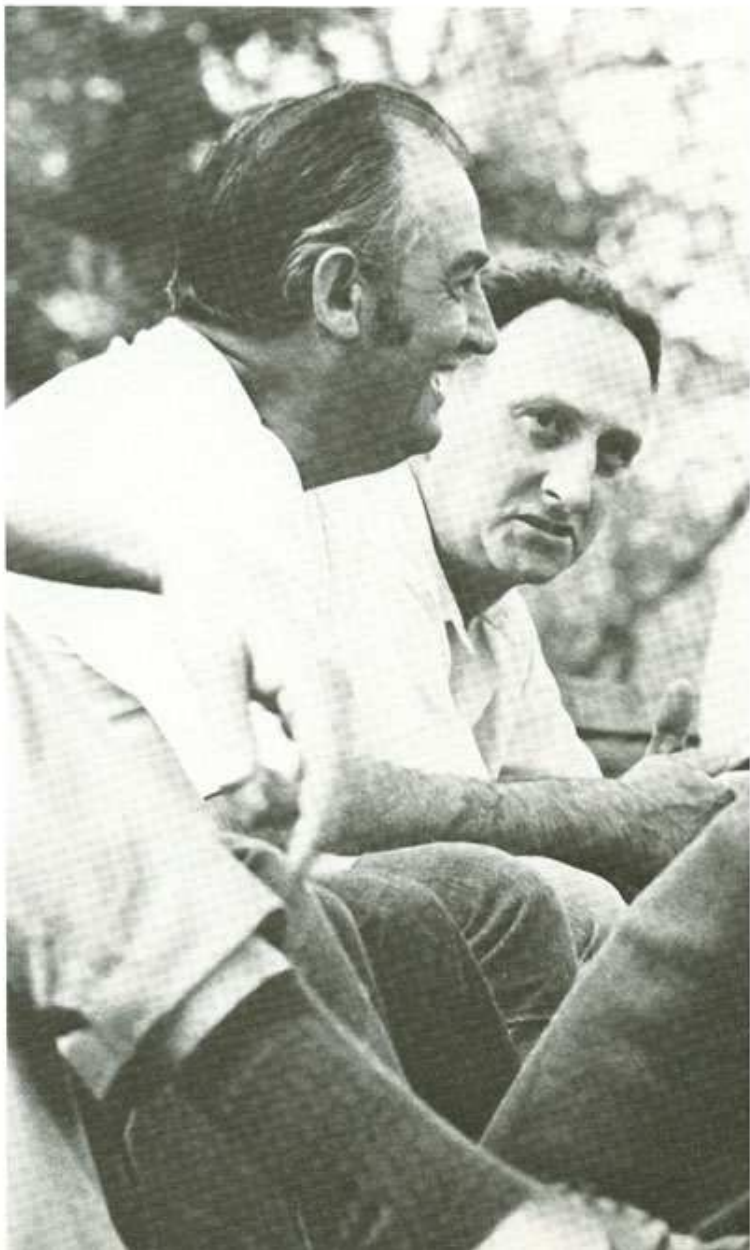
To the Graduating Class of 1973

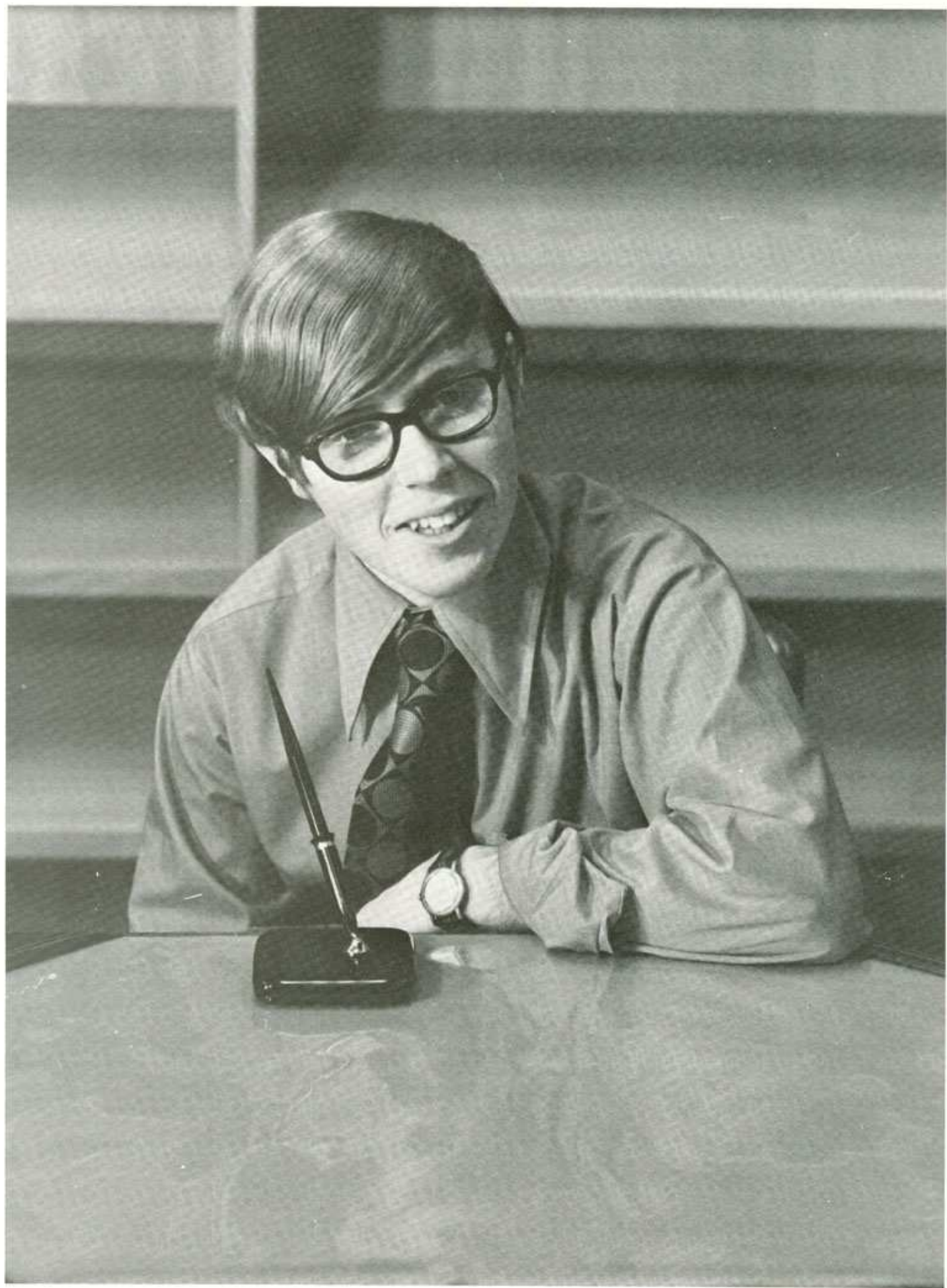












The academic year 1972- 73 is slowly drawing to a close as the 1973 Santamarian is nearing completion.
