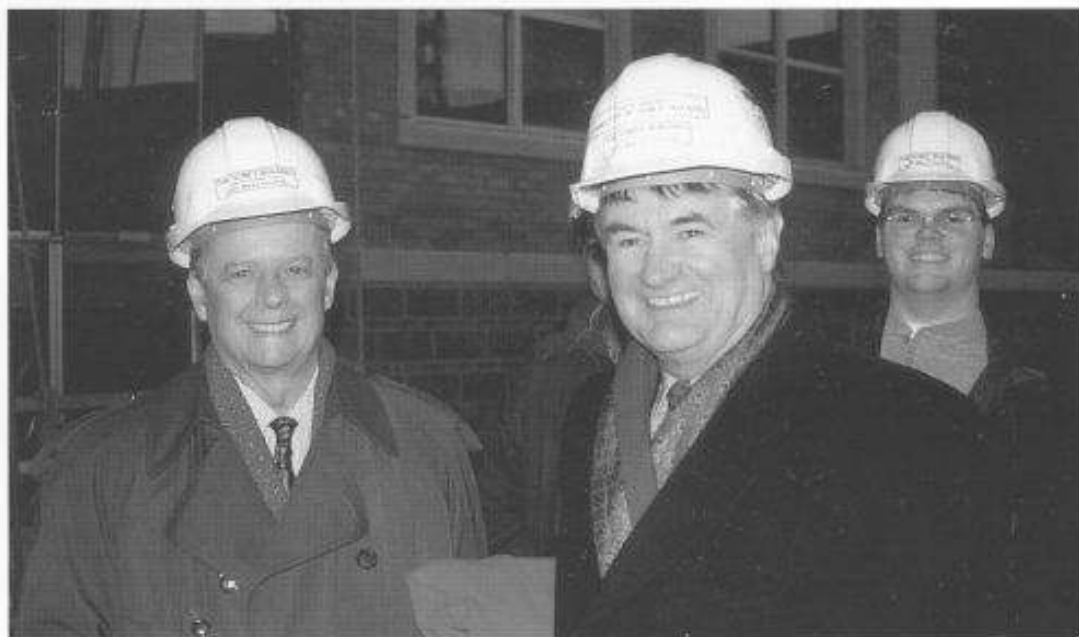
The stories and photos in this Santamarian yearbook are just some of the memories which you have of Saint Mary's. Cherish them. Enjoy them. Remember your University!

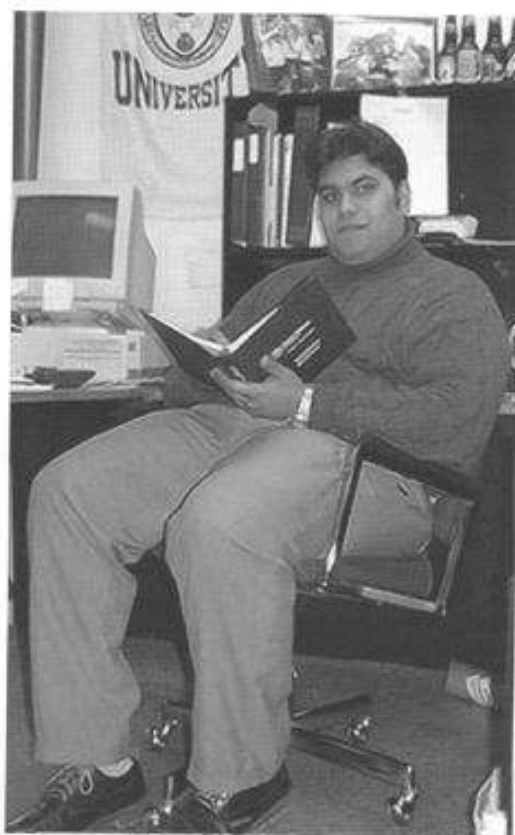
To those of you graduating I encourage you to never let the Santamarian in you die. Your times and experiences at Saint Mary's distinguish you from everyone else, never be afraid to share.

Saint Mary's University Extension Program in The Gambia

Did you know that Saint Mary's has over 200 full-time students who live, work, and study in The Gambia? This year the Yearbook is proud to feature the accomplishments and contributions of these members of the University community.

Jida Geesay Kejera, 30, leaves her home in Banjul, The Gambia, at 8:30 each weekday morning to start her day as a student of Saint Mary's University. She returns home to her husband and three children at 7:00 or 8:00 each night. Possible? Yes. But only because Mrs. Kejera doesn't have to travel to Halifax for classes. She is part of Saint Mary's Extension Program in The Gambia, her country's bold experiment in offering university education to Gambians at home.

The Saint Mary's University Extension Program in The Gambia (SMUEP) is well into its third academic year with more than 250 full time students, including 16 from other West African countries, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Ghana and Togo, and two from the United States. The purpose of the program is to make university education accessible to Gambians in their own country for the first time and to contribute to the planned development of a university of The Gambia. Thus far the SMUEP has been a resounding academic success, with the students taking full advantage of the opportunity provided by this unique program.

The Gambia does have teacher-training, vocational, and nursing schools but there is currently no university there. In the past, hundreds of Gambian students were sent abroad to study. This practice became increasingly expensive in the early 1990s, and opportunities for spaces abroad became more limited. The Gambian Ministry of Education, through the Nova Scotia-Gambia Association, therefore asked for assistance from Saint Mary's University to provide an interim solution in its efforts to make university education accessible to Gambians in their own country.

As a result, since late in 1995, qualified Gambian students have been admitted as Saint Mary's University students and, with support from the Gambian government and other sponsors, register for Saint Mary's courses which are delivered in The Gambia in facilities provided by the government there. Instructors travel from Canada for periods of about two months each, and teach courses in six-week blocks. By the spring of

1998, forty different instructors had taught in the program. More importantly – by that time a good number of students had accumulated ten of the fifteen credits required for a Bachelor of Arts degree, and were looking forward to graduation in the spring of 1999.

The Republic of The Gambia is located in Western Africa, bordering the North Atlantic Ocean and almost completely surrounded by Senegal, with a total area of 11,300 km². The Gambia can boast a tropical climate, and as an (almost) enclave of Senegal, it is the smallest country on the continent of Africa. Approximately 93% of the people in the Gambia are Muslim, 4% are Christian, and only 1% belong to other indigenous religions. English is the official language, while the principal African languages are Wolof and Mandinka.

The strengths of the program include the following.

- the strong support of the Secretary of State for Education, in The Gambia
- the availability and enthusiasm of well-qualified, experienced, and conscientious professors
- opportunities for Gambian academics to become involved in the program as instructors and as teaching assistants
- hard working and highly motivated students
- the helpfulness of administrative personnel at Saint Mary's, especially in the Admissions Office, Registrar's Office, and the Bookstore.

Students of Saint Mary's University Extension Program in The Gambia were saddened by the untimely death of two professors and two students, whose participation and contributions to the program are fondly remembered: they are students Landing J. M. Geesay and Sherriff Jobarteh and Political Science Professor Alan O'Brien, a former mayor of Halifax, and Dr. Kenneth Dunn, of the Mathematics Faculty of Dalhousie University.

Moanahile, on the main campus, a highlight of the Second Semester was the collection of books donated to form the nucleus of a library for students of the program and for a future University of The Gambia. Over a six-week period more than 11,000 volumes were contributed by students, faculty, and staff. The texts, manuals, software, and other learning materials were sorted and packed by a team of volunteers, and sent in a large container, by ship, arriving in The Gambia in mid-June.

Saint Mary's Community Involvement in The Gambia Extension Program

"I had not taught in West Africa for almost twenty years since my graduate days in Nigeria and much had changed since then. However, some things had not changed, namely the complete commitment, intense motivation and relentless curiosity of the West African student — more specifically the forty-five men and women in my history course. With a mixture of lectures, quizzes and discussion papers, we traced Global History from the advanced civilizations of India, China and the various Islamic empires of a millennium ago to the debris of the Berlin wall less than a decade ago. Without question, these Gambian students were plugged in and already tuned in to the world around them."

The extension program is being coordinated in The Gambia by Saint Mary's alumnus Burris Devanney (Arts, '59), who, as Executive Director of the Nova Scotia - Gambia Association (NSGA), has provided leadership to more than 20 development projects in The Gambia since 1986.

Some Saint Mary's University Graduates have decided to be involved with the Gambia Program. The Graduates are hired as Teaching Assistants and travel to the Gambia for usually twelve month intervals. They are the constant in the Gambia program because of their long term arrangements. Professors of the the program from Saint Mary's and her sister Universities travel to the Gambia for each teaching session last approximately six weeks. To the students and the traveling professors these graduate Teaching Assistants provide the means to communicate and understand what is expected of both the students and the faculty.

These books are used as class sets of textbooks and donated to the library as reference materials. With the help of regular Saint Mary's students the library at MCI is growing in size.

Komodou Sallah (pictured on the right hand side of this page), a third-year student in the Saint Mary's University Extension Program in The Gambia (UCP) was elected as President of the SMUCP Students' Union (SMUCP) on April 14, 1998. There were three contenders for the presidency: Ebou Jallow, Esia Jallow, and Komodou Sallah, the eventual winner, who received 60% of the votes.

The elections were conducted in collaboration with the national Independent Electoral Commission (IEC). Speaking at a ceremony which took place at the conference hall of the Management Development Institute, the IEC secretary and administrator Mr. Veessay expressed IEC's pleasure to have the opportunity to conduct elections other than national elections as part of its voter education. He said that such opportunities will help the IEC access the masses more frequently.

Mr. Durris Desannay, the Coordinator of Saint Mary's UCP, disclosed that the UCP student government will have a role to play in the development of the University of The Gambia. "A hard-working student government is a key to the success of a university", he said.

The outgoing president of SMUCP, Mr. Francis Morisy, advised his successors to work diligently in the best interest of the student body.

In his inaugural speech, Mr. Komodou Sallah, prayed to Allah to endow him and his team with strength and wisdom to execute their responsibility efficiently. He went on to say "We will not only defend the interest of the students but also the life of the UCP." He urged students not to limit their efforts to selfish interests but rather exert their mental energies towards national development.

The President of The Gambia Students Union (TAGSU), Komodou Sallah, expressing his satisfaction at the level of maturity shown by students during the campaign, underscored the importance of democracy, describing it as "the highest stage of human civilization."

Loyola Takes Residence Title

Team Loyola defied the oddsmakers as they defeated a heavily favored Rice squad by a score of 6-4. In taking their fifth straight residence hockey championship, Loyola relied on strong performances from old warriors Doug Ferguson, Brian Morris and the McCarthy boys. The two teams would then exchange goals to make the score 5-3 at the second intermission.

The festivities were short lived though as Hass received a five minute high sticking major on the ensuing face-off.

With the score 5-4 just under a minute left, Rice pulled their goalie for the extra attacker. Unfortunately for Rice, a weak penalty call meant that their extra attacker would spend the remainder of the game in the penalty box.

Loyola would later score an empty netter to ice the game, 6-4.

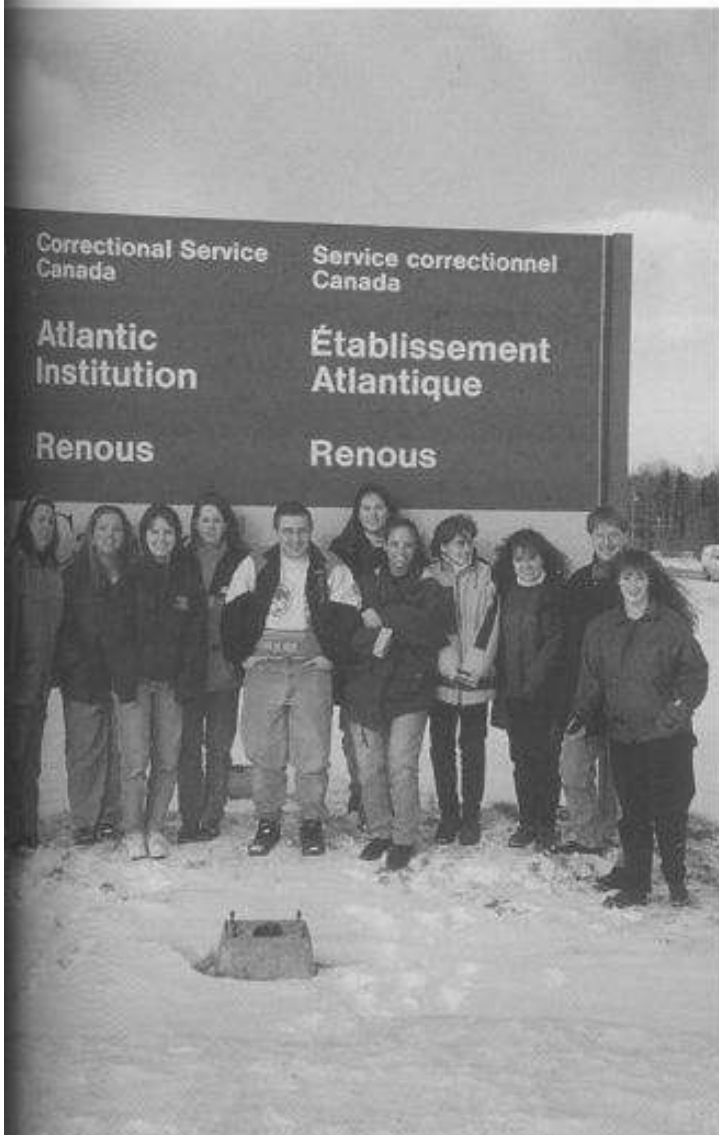


Criminology Societies 1998

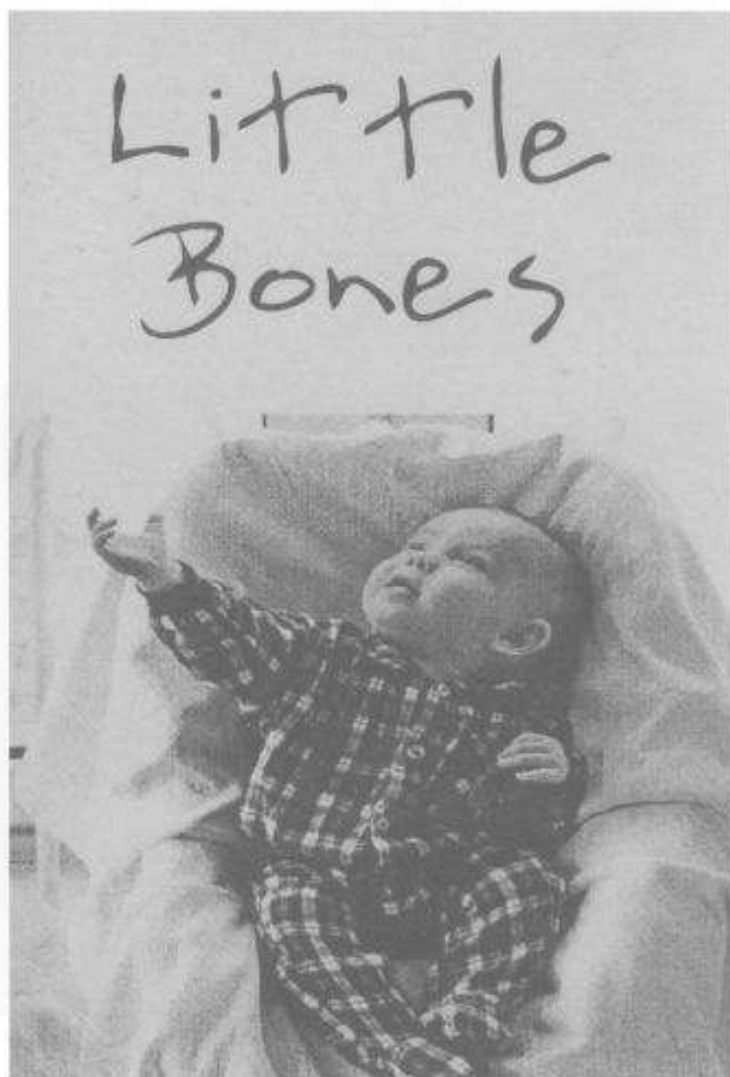


English Societies 1998

Exciting Huskies Basketball Season

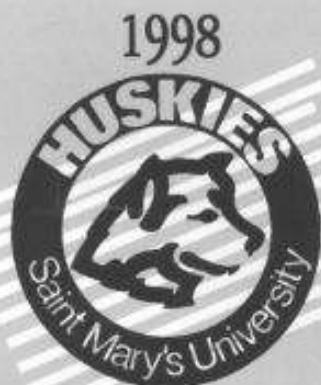

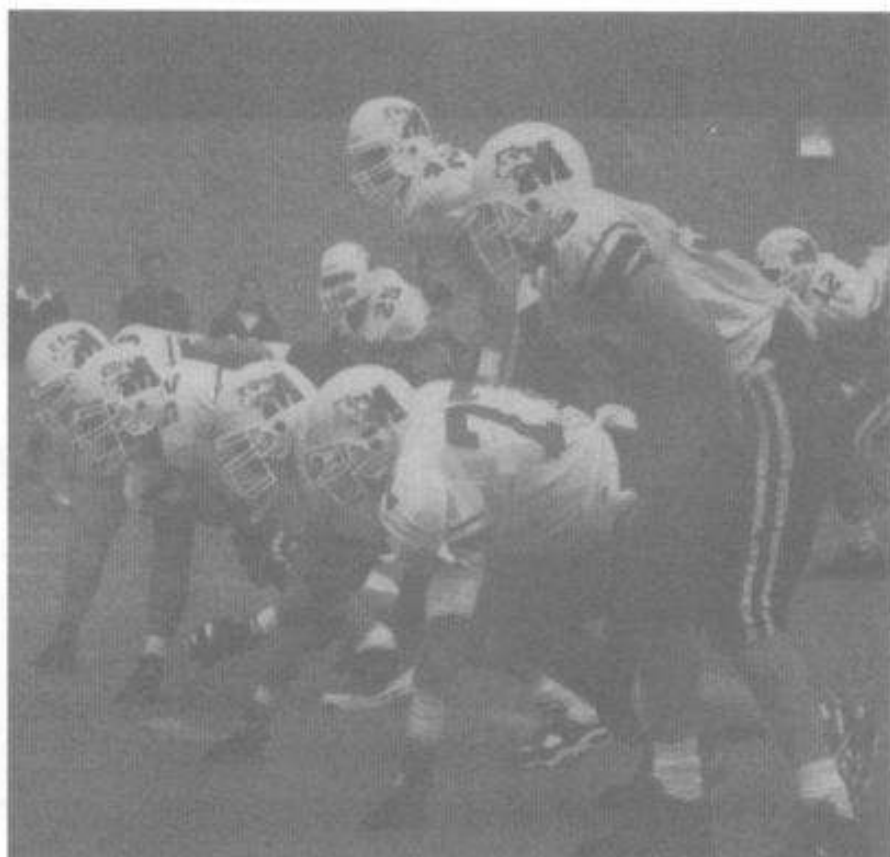
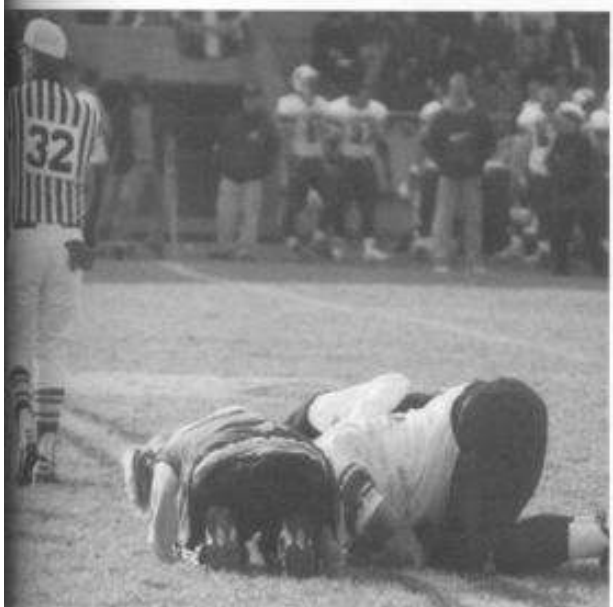


Football Coach Steps Down

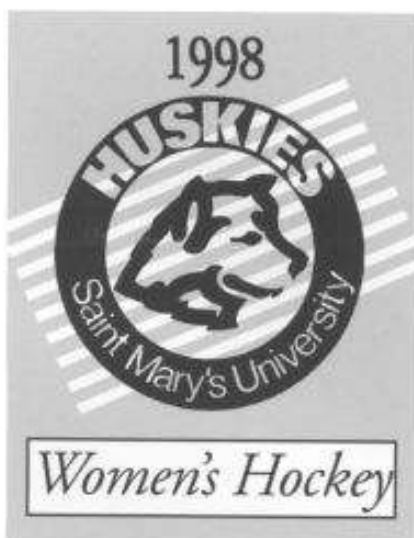

The team was upset in the semi-finals by the Dal Tigers. The loss was certainly disappointing to the Huskies, trying to capture their first league title, but without a question is overshadowed by the great success of the entire season.

Despite an 8-16-4 regular season record and a first round playoff loss to St. Francis Xavier, the predominantly young squad has an inspiring season to look back on.

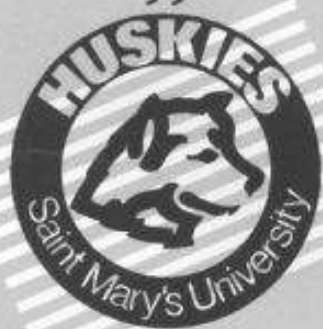

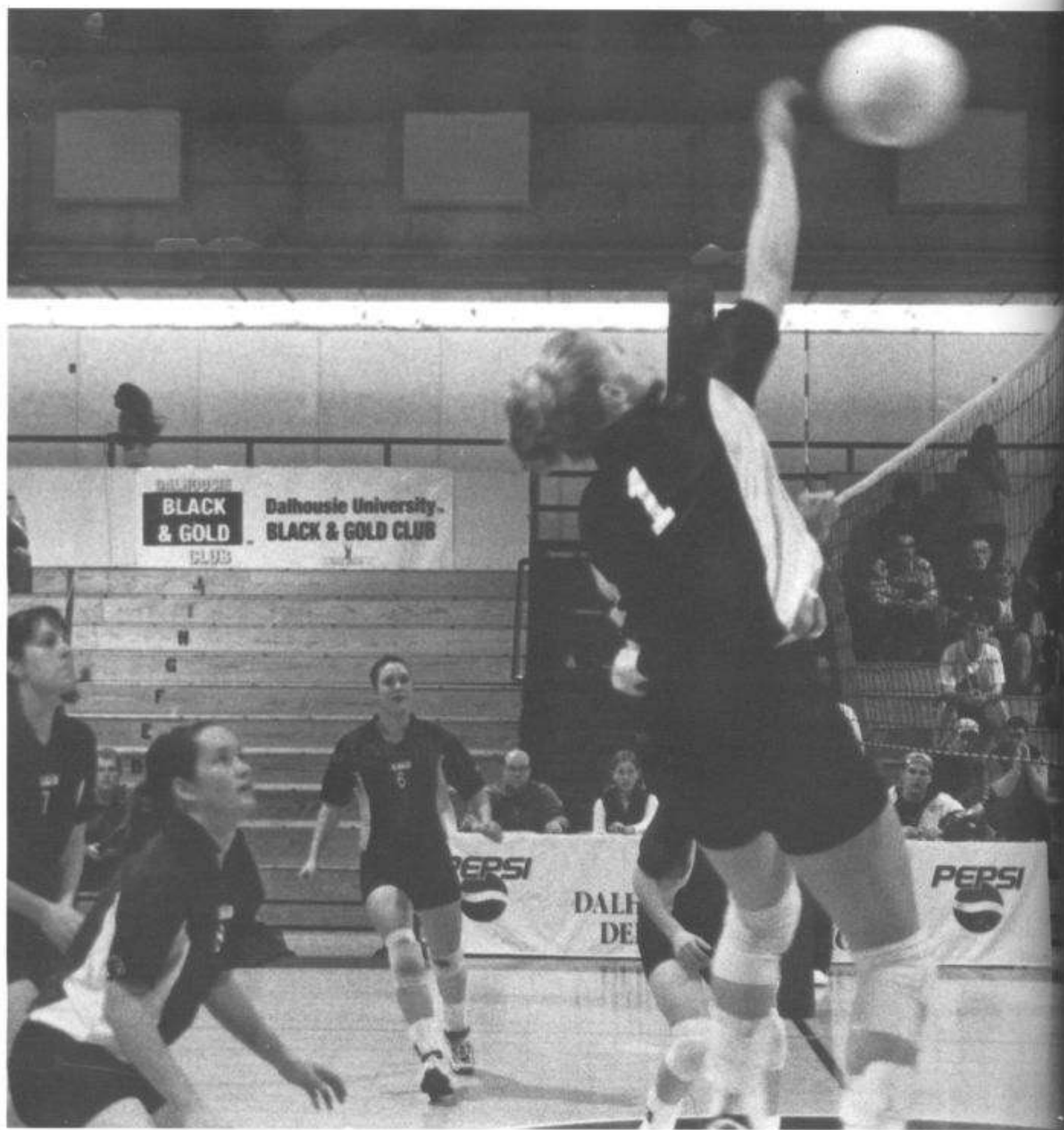

CREST AND LOGO

The University Crest was designed in the 1940's by the Reverend Daniel Fogarty, S.J. Each symbol in the crest represents a significant event in the phases and history of Saint Mary's.

In the outer portion of the crest, the name and location of the University are inscribed in Latin. In Roman numerals is the date 1841 - the year the University received a charter allowing it to grant degrees.

The book above the shield represents learning and knowledge. The inscription on the page of the book is Latin *Age Quod Agis*. This is the motto of the University which exhorts all those connected with Saint Mary's to do their best in everything they attempt. The quotation was borrowed from the Irish Christian Brothers and represents their contribution to the development of the University.

The upper part of the shield has the official seal of the Jesuits with I.H.S. (the Latin initials for Christ). Below these initials are three nails representing the crucifixion and surrounding these is the Crown of Thorns. The two crowns represent a dual loyalty - to the then Dominion of Canada and to the British Commonwealth. Below these crowns is the thistle - a living reminder of Nova Scotia's Scottish heritage.

In 1960 Saint Mary's University chose Huskies as the name for their sports teams. The Siberian Husky became the official mascot for qualities which paralleled the teams' motto, *In Pursuit of Excellence*.

Pound for pound, the Siberian Husky is the strongest draft dog in existence. A versatile and gentle dog, the Husky is the perfect example of tenacity, drive, and loyalty.

Like their namesake, the Saint Mary's Huskies strive for excellence. They are willing to work hard to get there and are always attempting to achieve their fullest potential.
