Awards to Faculty

(a) President's Award for Excellence in Research

Established in 1989, this annual award honours outstanding research conducted by a full-time faculty member who has been employed at the University for at least three years. A detailed nomination procedure has been delineated whereby each Dean of Faculty may select one member of his faculty who has been nominated by the 15th October, and whose candidacy he is prepared to support. Other sponsors must be researchers, at least two of whom must be from outside Saint Mary's University. The Award is adjudicated by the Senate Research Committee, which has the authority to decide which nominee, if any, is deserving of the Award. The selection criteria consists of two component parts, namely productivity, whereby the nominee must have a record of continued exceptional contribution to research/scholarship, and secondly, recognition. The nominee must have attained national or international recognition as an authority in a major field of knowledge. Winners of this prestigious award are:

- 1989 - Dr. George Mitchell (Astronomy)
- 1990 - Dr. John Chadwick-Jones (Psychology)
- 1991 - Dr. John Reid (History/Atlantic Canada Studies)
- 1992 - Dr. Jaroslav Dostal (Geology)

The recipient of the President's Award for excellence in Research for this year is **Dr. Jaroslav Dostal (Geology)**.

Dr. Dostal received a Diploma in Geology from Charles University, Prague, Czechoslovakia in 1964 and lectured in Economic Geology at that institution from 1964 to 1968. He came to Canada to study at McMaster University in 1968 and received his Ph.D. in 1973. From 1973 to 1975, he held a National Research Council post-doctorate fellowship at Dalhousie University and in 1975, joined Saint Mary's University as an assistant professor. He was promoted to associate professor in 1980 and full professor in 1987. Dr. Dostal was instrumental in establishing the X-ray Fluorescence Centre for geochemical analysis at Saint Mary's and served on the advisory board of the McMaster University nuclear reactor from 1986 to 1989. Since 1976, his geological research has been generously supported by the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council and between 1982 and 1984, he received an installation grant of over \$250,000. Dr. Dostal's nomination for the research award was supported by his colleagues and peers and it was said of him, "There is little doubt ... that Dr. Dostal has an international reputation among the geology community", and "his contributions to the areas of volcanology, petrology and geochemistry are better than excellent, they are outstanding".

(b) William Stewart, S.J. Award for Excellence in Teaching

This was established by the Alumni Association and the Faculty Union in 1983. The selection Committee, comprised of representatives from those organizations, chooses the winner from nominations received from the faculty, students, and administration. There is a medal, which is presented at Convocation, and a cheque for \$1000. Previous winners of this prestigious award are as follows:

This year's winner is **Dr. Frank Phillips**.

Dr. Phillips obtained his teacher's licence in Fredericton in 1947, then taught for 12 years, eight of them at Minto Memorial High School, Minto, New Brunswick. He studied in London, England in 1960-61 on a Beaverbrook Overseas Teacher's Scholarship and obtained a B.A. from the University of New Brunswick in 1962. He then returned to England and obtained his M.A. from the University of London in 1965. He received his Ph.D. from the University of London in 1979. He joined Saint Mary's Faculty of Education in 1965 and has specialized in the history of education, comparative education and innovations in education until his retirement in May, 1992. Dr. Phillips served as Acting Dean of Education in 1980-81 and 1986-87. He is the author of two books, "Bishop Beck and English Education, 1949-1959" and "Creating an Education System for England and Wales". In his citation for the teaching medal, one of his students says, "Frank not only exemplifies excellent teaching, he demands teaching excellence. All of us who have had Frank as a teacher ... are better teachers as a result."

Honorary Degrees to be Conferred

At Fall Convocation, the University will grant four honorary degrees.

Dr. Phillip Alfred Buckner

Honorary Doctor of Letters

Dr. Phillip Buckner received his B.A. from the University of Toronto in 1965 and his Ph.D. from the University of London in 1969. His thesis dealt with British policy towards the British North American colonies in the first half of the 19th century. He joined the University of New Brunswick in 1968 and was appointed a full professor in 1980. He is currently on leave from U.N.B. and is a visiting professor at Birkbeck College, University of London. Dr. Buckner is a scholar of distinction and one who has also invested great efforts in furthering the scholarship of others. In 1971, "Acadiensis: Journal of the History of the Atlantic Region" and, with one break, he served as its editor until 1990. In 1980, Dr. Buckner founded the Acadiensis Press, which publishes scholarly books about the history of Atlantic Canada and now has 29 titles on its list, including two published in collaboration with the Gorsebrook Research Institute for Atlantic Canada Studies at Saint Mary's University. Dr. Buckner has been for a number of years an active member of the Board of Directors of the Gorsebrook Institute. Among his many scholarly achievements is the contribution of numerous biographies and general articles to the Dictionary of Canadian Biography, and he has written a number of important scholarly books and articles, pre-eminent among which is "The Transition to Responsible Government: British Policy in British North America". In May 1992, Dr. Buckner became President of the Canadian Historical Association.

Chief Ovide W. Mercredi

Honorary Doctor of Civil Law

Chief Mercredi was first offered an honorary Doctor of Laws Degree by Saint Mary's at Convocation in May of this year. He was a key player in the negotiations that preceded the Charlottetown Accord and his constitutional responsibilities prevented him from accepting the degree at that time. Ovide Mercredi, National Chief of the Assembly of First Nations (AFN) is a Cree Indian brought up in Grand Rapids, Manitoba. After working for Ontario Hydro for a number of years, Mercredi entered the University of Manitoba as a mature student and graduated with a law degree in 1977. During his time as a student, he started a political association for native students and persuaded the University to start an Indian Studies Department which now offers 26 courses. He was called to the Manitoba Bar in 1979 and practised criminal law until 1983. Mercredi then became involved in constitutional law and aboriginal constitutional reform, occupying many positions within the AFN. He provided leadership and legal advice in the AFN's opposition to the Meech Lake Accord and was an advisor to Elijah Harper during that period. Mercredi has served as Commissioner for the Manitoba Human Rights Commission, and was a member of the Senate Committee on Native Studies and a member of the Manitoba Alcoholism Foundation.

Eric P. Milledge

Honorary Doctor of Commerce

Eric Milledge graduated from Saint Mary's with a B.Comm. in 1972 and joined Ortho Pharmaceuticals (Canada) Ltd. as a sales representative the following year. He rose rapidly through the ranks of the company and by 1986 was Director of Marketing. In 1986, he was appointed National Sales Manager for Ortho Pharmaceuticals (U.S.) Limited, in 1988, he became Vice-President, Corporate Development, and in 1989, Vice-President, Sales and Marketing. In 1991, he became President of Ortho Pharmaceuticals (U.S.) Ltd. He is a director of Ortho Pharmaceutical Corporation. Eric Milledge was the guest speaker at the 1991 Commerce Dinner hosted by the Saint Mary's University Commerce Society. An article about him appeared in the Spring 1992 issue of the "Maroon and White" and the October 1992 issue of "The Times".

Jeannine Guillevin Wood

Honorary Doctor of Commerce

Mme. Guillevin Wood's life was that of a wife and homemaker until the death of her first husband in 1965. At that time, she took over control of the family firm, F.X. Guillevin et Fils, an electrical product distributor founded in 1906. Following numerous acquisitions, the company now has sales of \$450 million per year and operates under the name of Guillevin International Inc.

In 1969, Mme. Guillevin Wood founded Copel Inc., a national marketing and buying group comprising 15 independent distributors, most of which are situated in strategic centres across Canada. She was its president from 1969 to 1982. She is a member of several boards of directors, including the Royal Insurance Company of Canada, Hydro-Quebec and the Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada.

Mme. Guillevin Wood was elected Canadian Business Woman of the Year in 1984 and in 1989, received the Management Achievement Award from McGill University and was chosen one of the 12 Business Personalities of the Decade by “Le Journal de Montreal”. She is a member of the board of directors of the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts and La Fondation de l’Hopital du Sacre Coeur de Montreal and is also the only woman member of the Business Council on National Issues.

Distinctions on Degrees and Diplomas

At Saint Mary’s University in the general undergraduate degree and diploma programme, academic distinctions are awarded to successful candidates on the basis of the following quality point averages calculated on the highest grades attained in twelve courses taken at Saint Mary’s, including the last ten in the student’s programme in the case of the pass degree and, in the case of honours, seventeen courses (or equivalent) including the last fifteen courses in a student’s degree programme. In the case of the Diploma in Engineering, the best ten courses are selected. There are no distinctions awarded in the Bachelor of Education programme, nor in graduate and certificate programmes.

History of Saint Mary’s University

Saint Mary’s University was founded in 1802 to provide opportunities for higher learning to young Catholic men. Its founder, the Reverend Edmund Burke, had meagre resources to work with but, on later being named Bishop with responsibility for Nova Scotia, he continued to support the college as essential to the development of the Catholic community. In 1841, the Nova Scotia House of Assembly gave formal recognition of its academic role. Its legal status was confirmed in perpetuity by enactment in 1852.

In 1913, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, a teaching order, were invited by the Archdiocese of Halifax to direct the college and its academic program. During the ensuing years, Saint Mary’s University became more widely known for the quality of its undergraduate teaching and continued to develop new instructional programs most notably within its Faculty of Commerce. In 1940, the Upper Canada Province of The Society of Jesus was invited to succeed the Christian Brothers as administrators and teachers in the University, and for thirty years until the enactment in 1970 of the new act of incorporation, the college remained under Jesuit supervision. The long-standing emphasis on liberal arts and commerce was extended to include new programs in science, engineering, and teacher education. Extension courses became an important part of the University’s commitment to an active educational role in the community.

The Ceremonial Mace

The ceremonial mace, which is carried by the Marshal of Convocation at the head of the academic procession, was presented to Saint Mary's in April, 1980 and used for the first time at the 1980 Convocation. It symbolizes the University's authority to grant degrees. It was made and presented to the University by Maritime Command in recognition of Saint Mary's alumni killed in both world wars and also serving members of the Canadian Armed Forces who have been students at the University.

The mace is made of oak with a cast brass crown and brass plates carrying traditional ceremonial engravings. The plates represent the contribution to Saint Mary's by the Jesuit Fathers, the Christian Brothers of Ireland, the Archdiocese of Halifax, the LaSalle Christian Brothers, the Lay Teachers, and the Armed Forces.

Flags on the Stage

Each year Saint Mary's has a number of non-Canadians in its student body. The flags which you see displayed on the stage for Convocation are from some of the countries from which these students come, not necessarily graduating students, but those in any year of study. This international aspect of the Saint Mary's University community is a feature of justifiable pride which contributes markedly to the growth and understanding of both Canadian and non-Canadian students. Also included in the University's permanent collection of flags is one from the International Year of the Disabled signifying the University's commitment to disabled people.

Academic Regalia

The wearing of academic regalia by graduating students and faculty is a custom dating from the Middle Ages when students and teachers wore gowns at all times. Now it is customary for faculty and graduates to wear academic vestments only for convocations. Saint Mary's University graduates' hood is decorated with the colours of the institution, namely maroon and white. It is bordered with velvet in different colours representing the several faculties.

The doctoral hoods worn by faculty and administrators are larger and longer. Their doctoral gowns generally bear three velvet bars on the sleeves, while masters' gowns are plain, although they may have trailing arms with open sleeves. The rainbow of colours in the hoods of the faculty graphically demonstrate the range of academic disciplines and institutions from which faculty members have graduated.

A symbolic hooding ceremony has become a traditional feature of all Convocations at Saint Mary's University.
