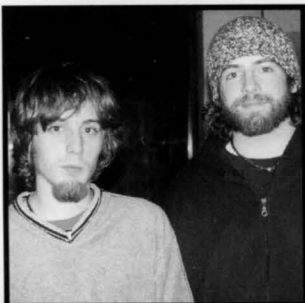
Selected Wednesday nights at the Gorsebrook lounge are an unbelievable show of Saint Mary's Talented Musicians

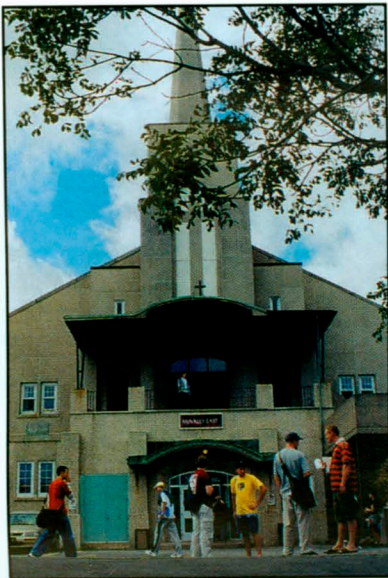

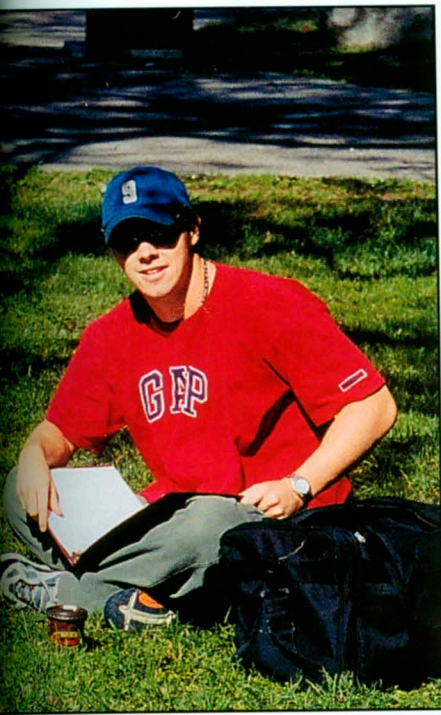

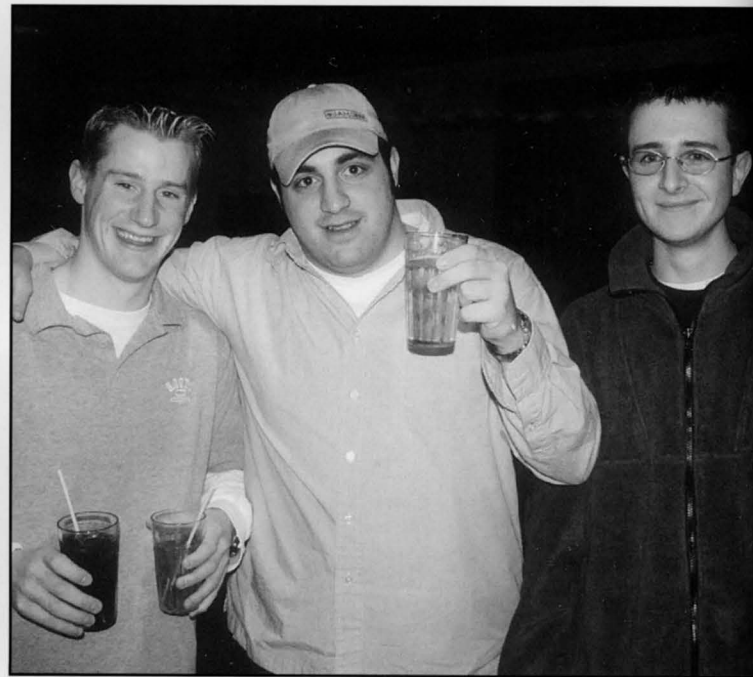


Pub Night:

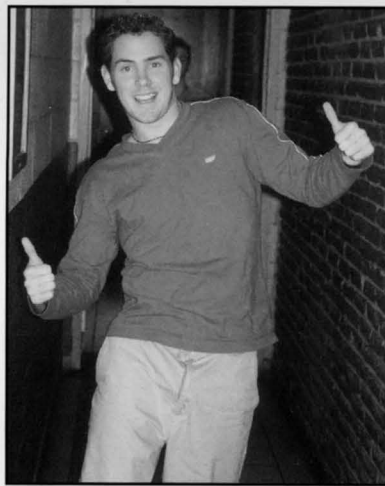
Every Thursday night, the pub is the most popular place on campus... Otherwise known as Amateur Night

Around eight o'clock the pub starts to fill up and by nine o'clock the pub is packed. Without fail the popularity of the pub extends all the way into the line up.

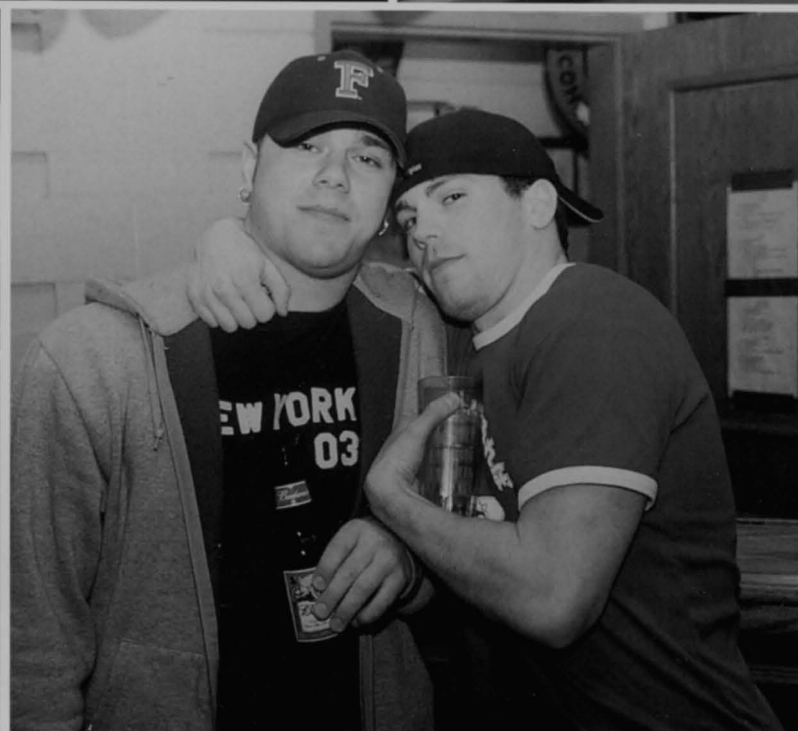
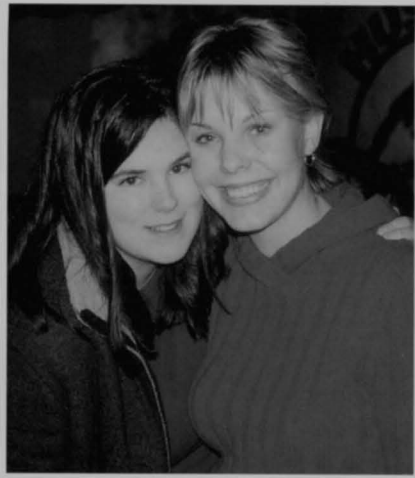

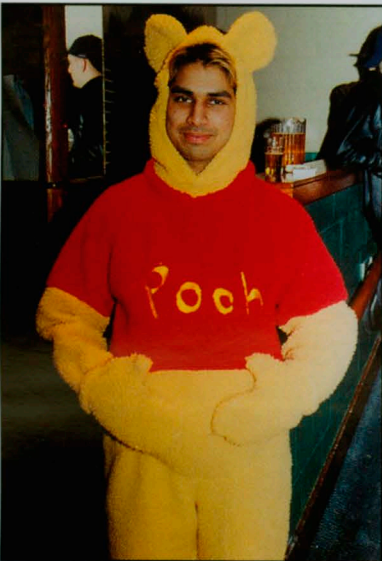


Halloween at the Pub

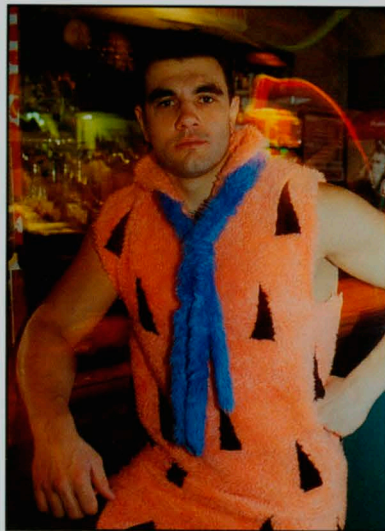

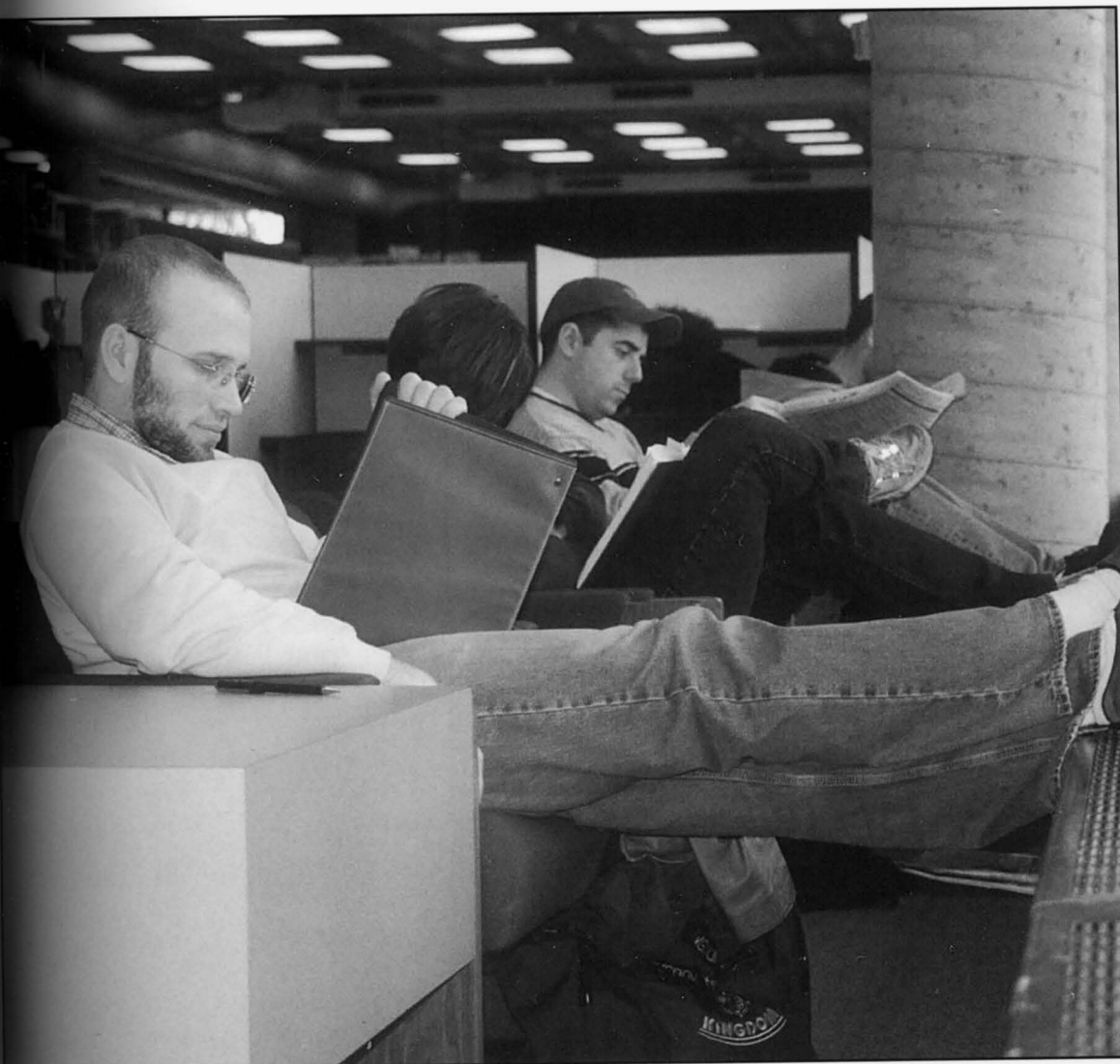

The Student Day of Action was a chance for students to speak out against tuition increases

On Wednesday, February 6, students at Saint Mary's University gathered at 1:00 p.m. at Saint Mary's University Student Centre in support of the Student Day of Action campaign. The Saint Mary's students joined forces with all other students in the province at Victoria Park at 2:15p.m. and then ventured to the steps of the Legislature for 3:00p.m.

Students organized for massive demonstrations on Wednesday, February 6, to manifest strong opposition to crippling government under-funding and skyrocketing tuition fees and debt loads. The demonstrators are timed to be part of the Canadian Federation of Students National Day of Action; however, all Student Unions, regardless of their Federal and Provincial Lobby Organizations, are participating through the Nova Scotia Student Advocacy Coalition.

The unprecedented co-operation between all of the Student Unions is directly related to the deplorable state of post-secondary education in Nova Scotia. Students here face the highest tuition fees and debt loads in Canada. Furthermore, Nova Scotia is the only province to have a complete absence of Provincial Grants and debt relief.



Student Day of Action began at 12:30 with the music of Trip Complete, after the band a fire-show kept students warm while showing their support. Samantha Anderson, President of SMUSA had the opening remarks followed by Ian Appleton the VP of External Affairs then Ian Affleck from NSAC on the importance of student support.

Barbara Moore the President for CUPE3912 of the part time faculty Union for SMU, Dal, and MSVU. Dr. Terry Murphy spoke as well as the Saint Mary's Student Max Haiven was the master of ceremonies.



Student Day of Action continued on a march down to Victoria Park to meet with Dalhousie, Mount Saint Vincent, Acadia and Saint Francis Xavier Universities to voice their concern for change.

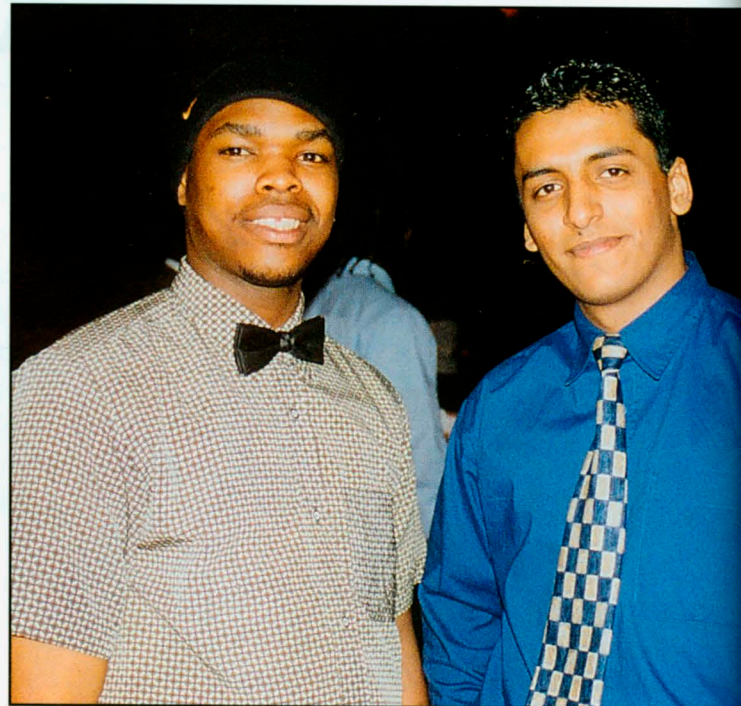

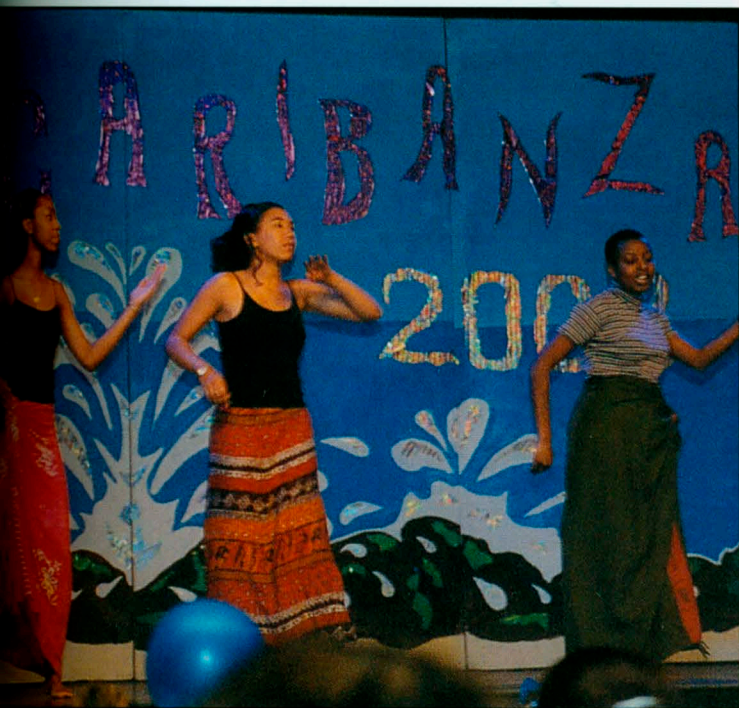

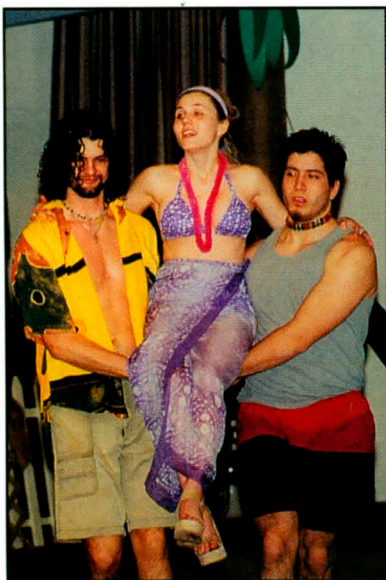

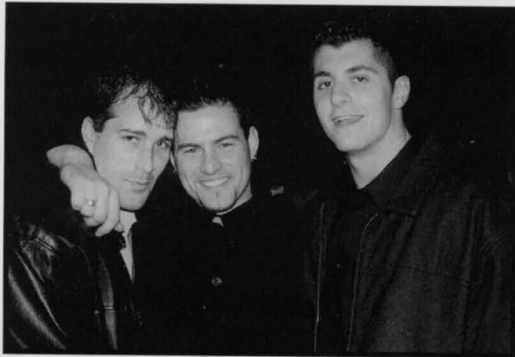


Charter Day

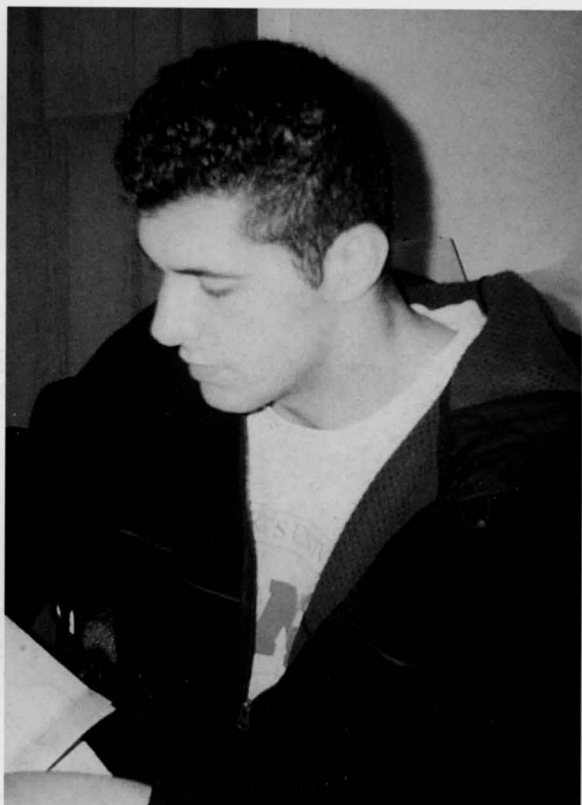

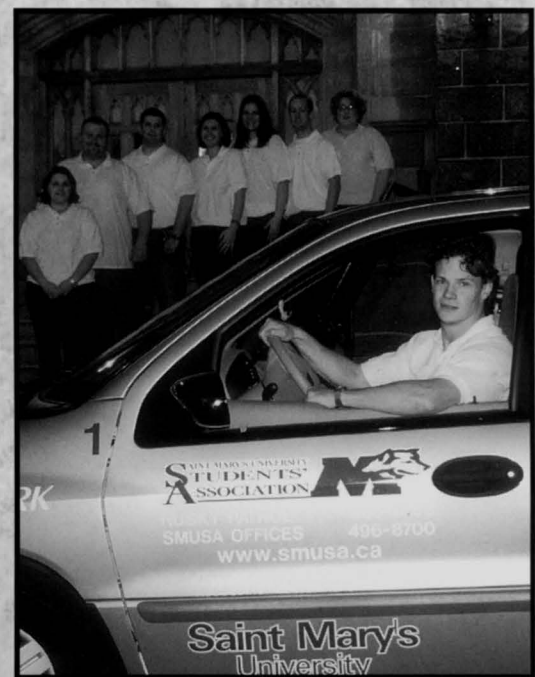
Husky Patrol

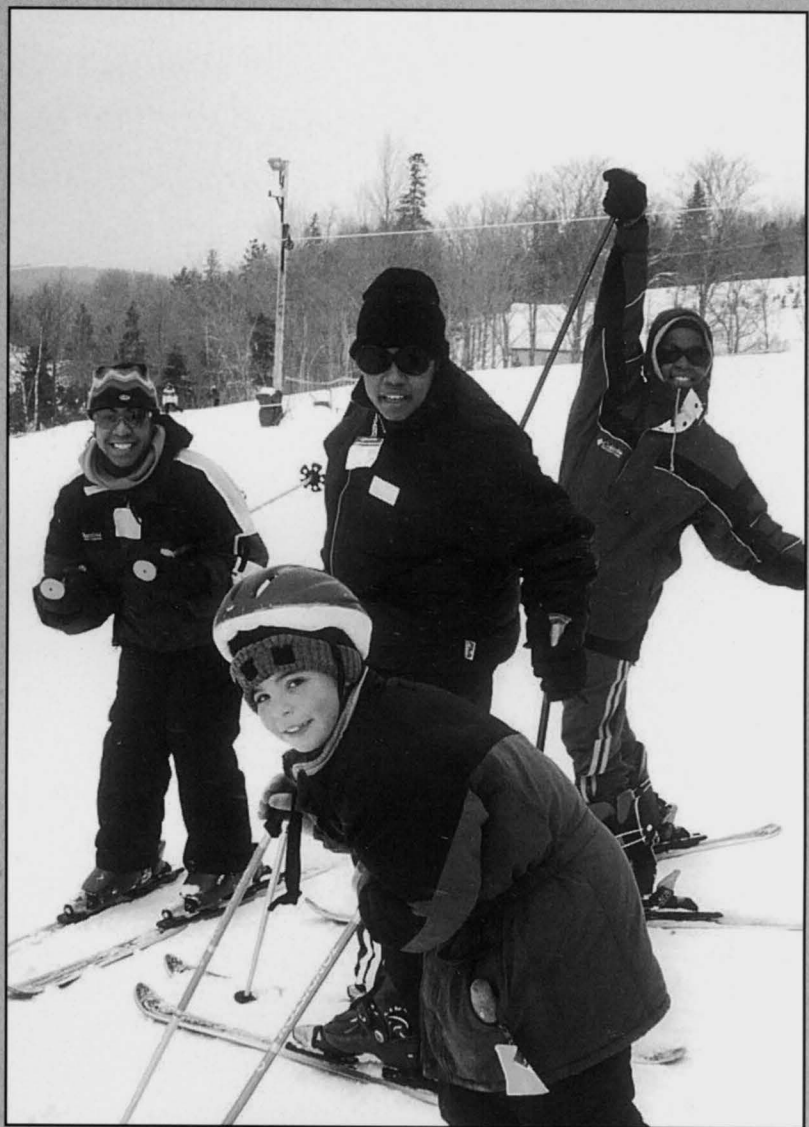


Bermuda Triangle Society

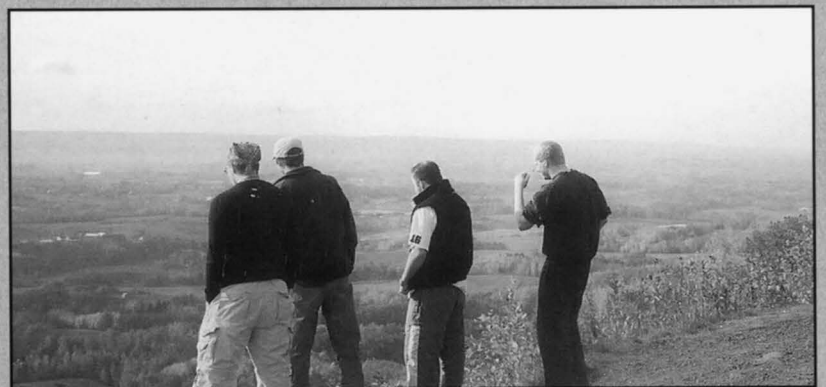
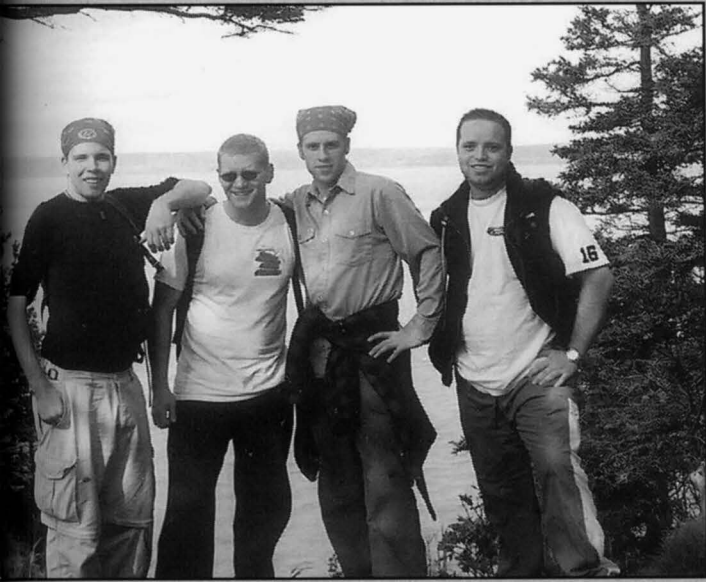
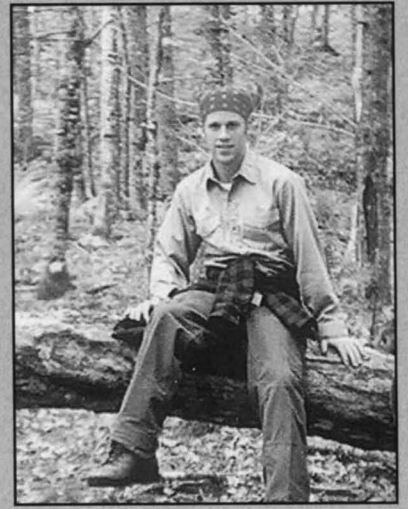




Biology Society

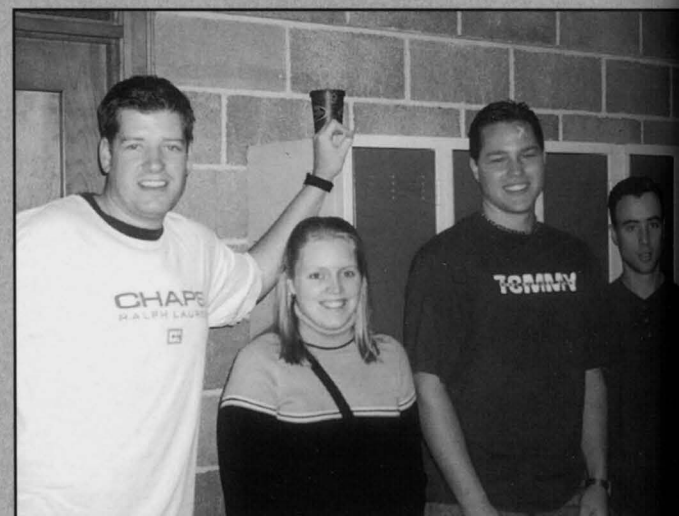


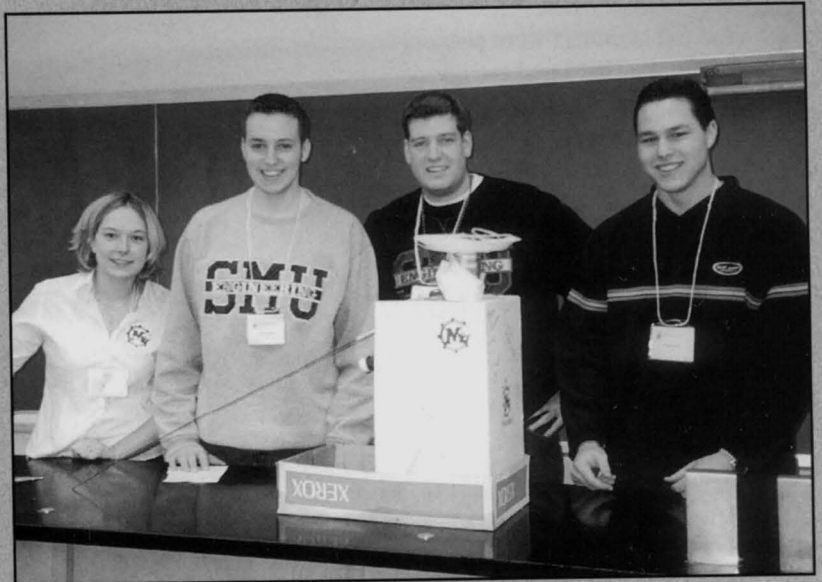
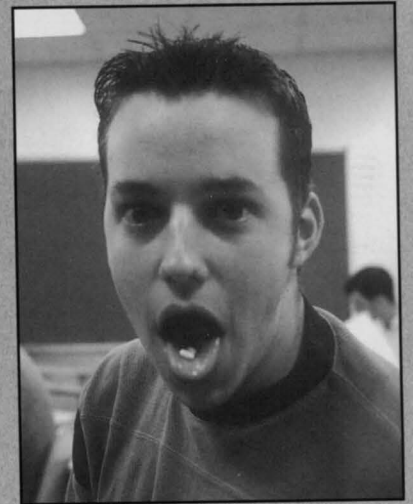


Engineering Society

Environmental Society

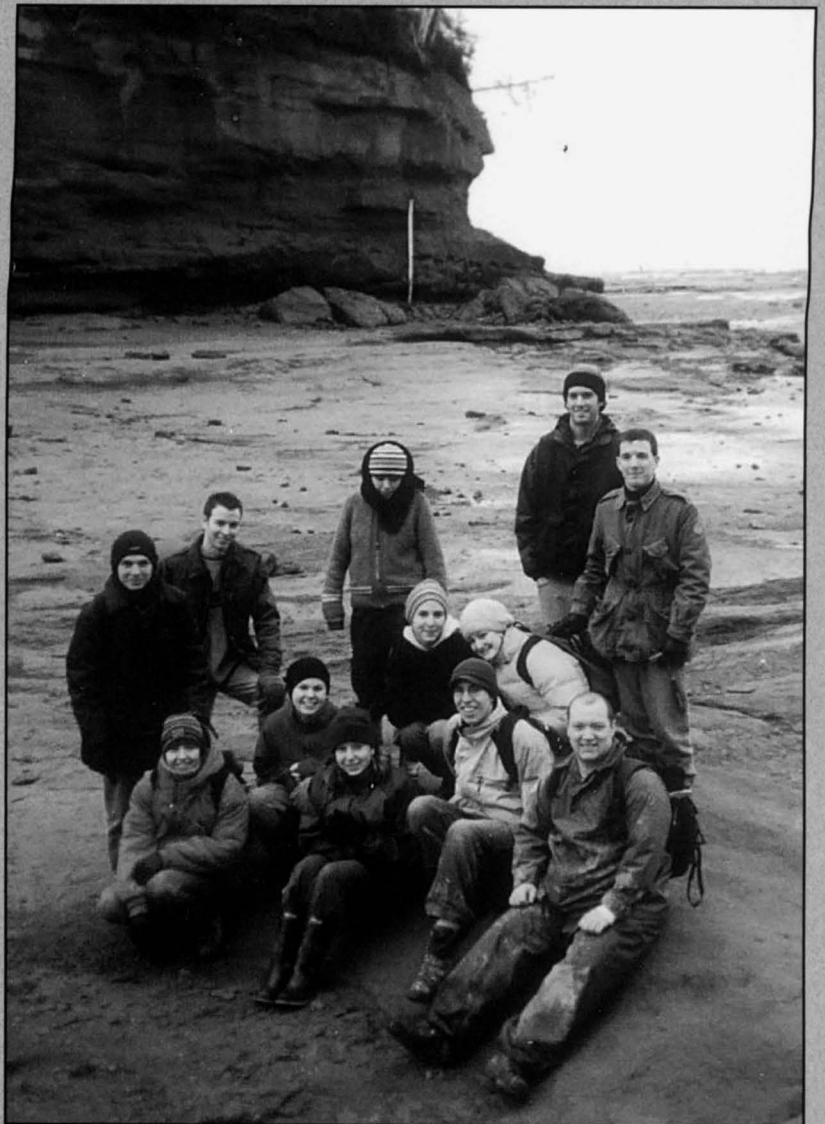

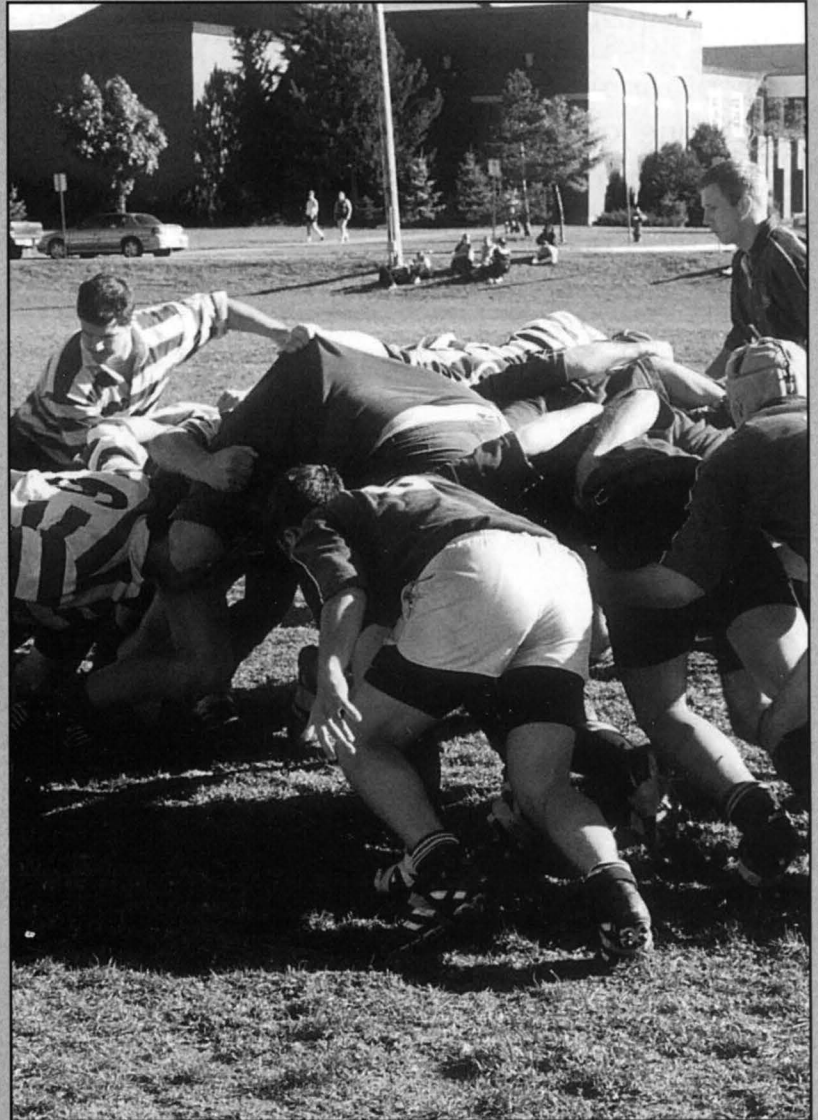
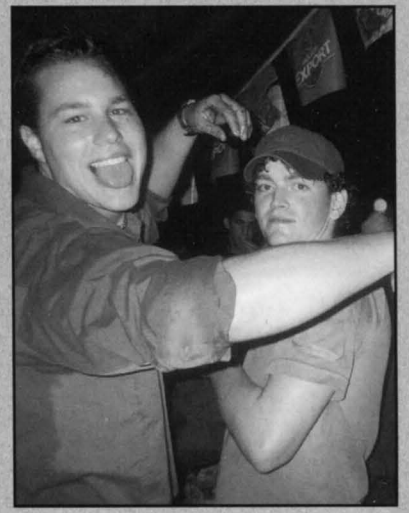




Rugby Society

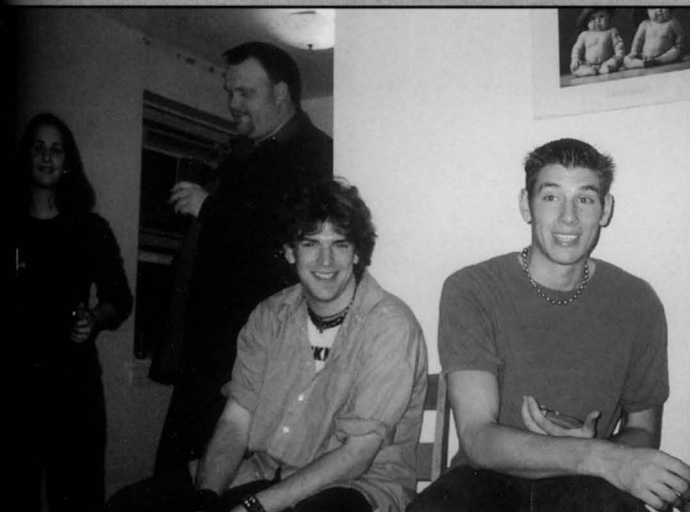

Outreach

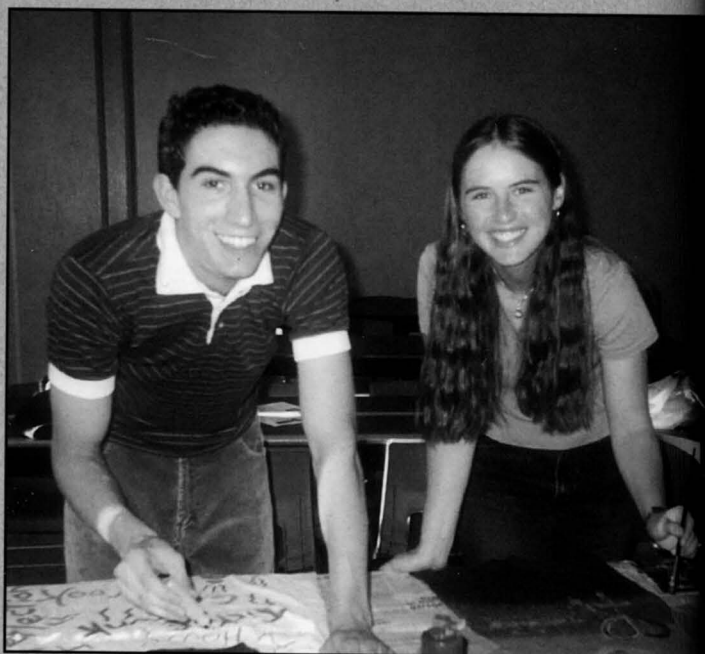

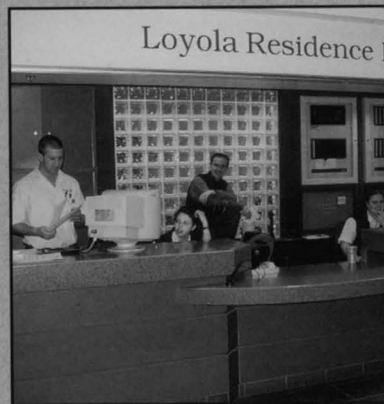
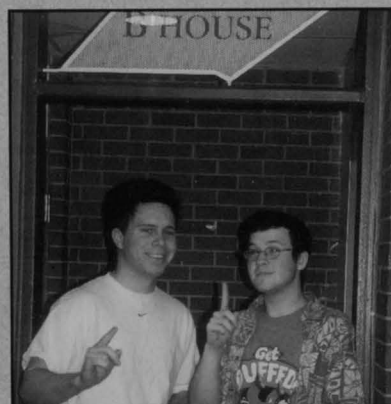
SMU AMBASSADORS

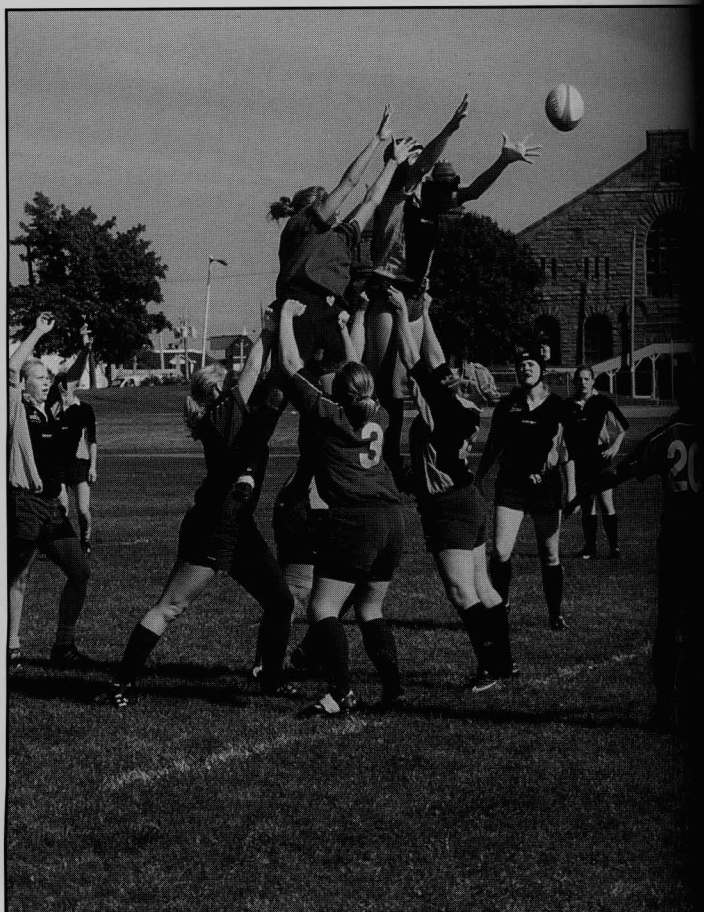
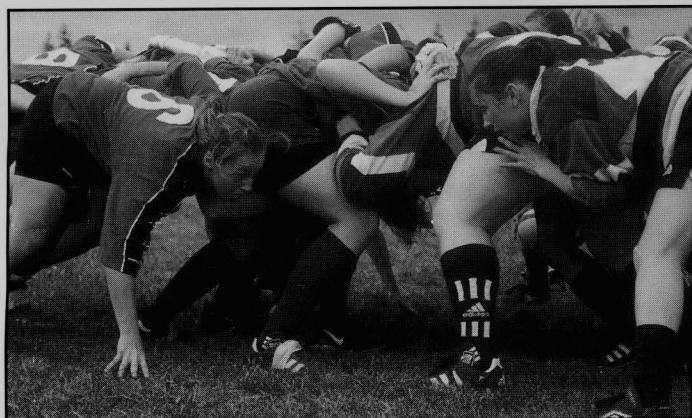
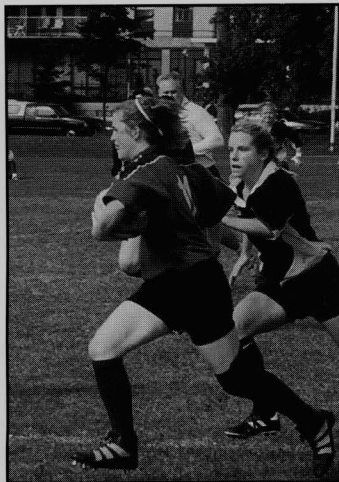
What a season for Womens Rugby

Three time Vermont State champion forward **Jamie Walker**, who was named the Saint Mary's Female Rookie of the Year, had an immediate impact on the league in her first season and will be a key player for the Huskies' future. Rounding out the newcomers was rookie post and former PEI Canada Games player **Laura MacPherson**, who also had a very solid rookie season.

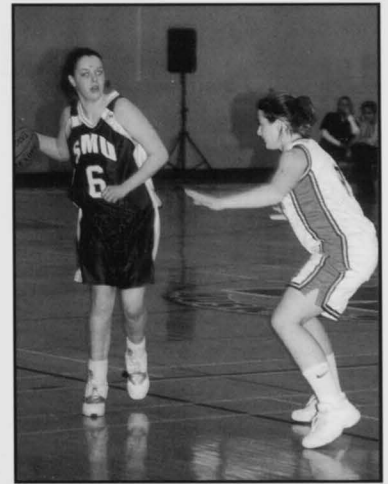

Men's Hockey won their first Atlantic University Sport championship in 25 years

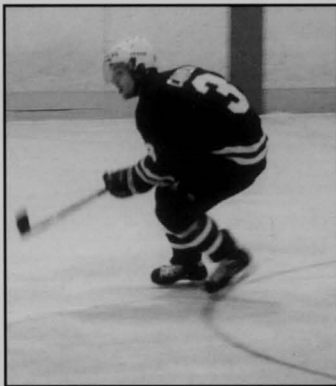
Saint Mary's Varsity Hockey 2001 – 2002

The best way to describe the Men's Hockey season is ground breaking. The team won their first AUS (Atlantic University Sport) in 25 years by defeating their cross town rival Dalhousie Tigers 3 games to 2 in a hard fought series. Saint Mary's would now proudly represent the AUS at the CIS (Canadian Interuniversity Sport) national tournament hosted by Kitchener – Waterloo March 21 – March 24, 2002. The Huskies defeated the University of Saskatchewan Huskies 3-1, but fell short 5-3 against the UQTR Patriotes. At the All Canada banquet, Huskies Defenceman Steve Gallace was awarded the TSN/Dr. Ross Gregg Award for combining academics, athletics, and community involvement as well as being named first team all Canadian. Freshman Jason Maleyko was named to the all rookie squad.

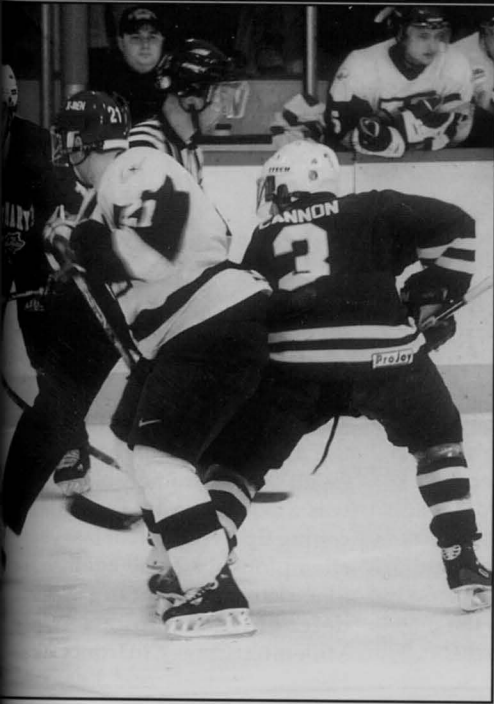
The regular season found the Huskies make some significant

accomplishments both as a team, and individually. In the twenty-eight game regular season, the Huskies finished second, two points behind Dalhousie, with a record of 14 – 6 – 6 – 2 and found themselves ranked nationally most of the season. The 6 regulation losses, and 129 goals were the best, in the league. Individually, the team was led by captain Jim Midgley and sophomore sniper Brett Gibson who each had thirty-six points, as well as three defencemen exceeding the twenty point mark: Steve Gallace (32 points), Brad Morgan (27 points), and rookie Jason Maleyko (21 points). In goal, the Huskies were led by AUS playoff MVP Brent Zelenewich who recorded a 3.21 GAA with one shut out. Travis Kennedy picked up AUS player of the week honours early in the season. Steve Gallace again represented Saint Mary's for the prestigious James Bayer Award, given to the athlete in the AUS who best combines academics, academics, and community service.

This season was the last for three of the members of this team: Alex Halat (5th year), Steve Gallace and Travis Kennedy (4th year). The Saint Mary's Mens Hockey team wishes them all the best in their future endeavors.

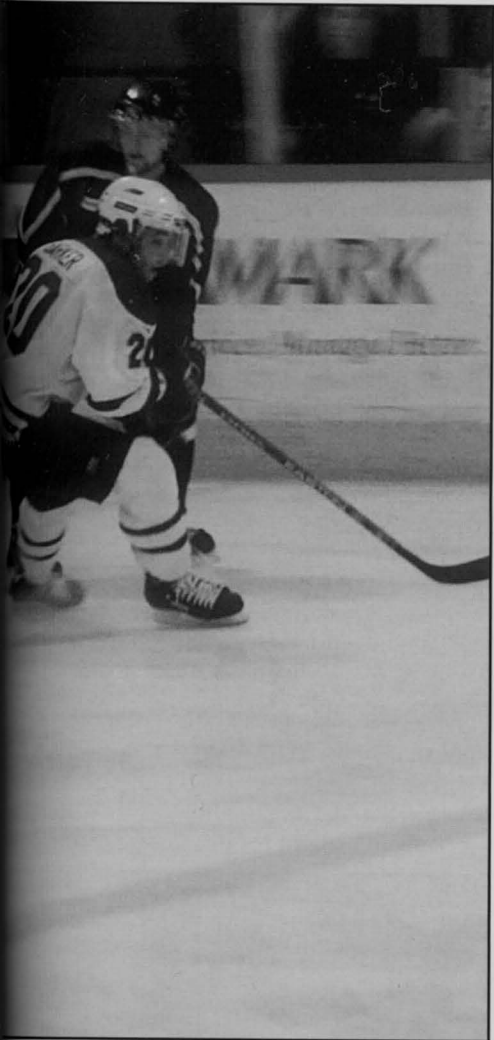

Saint Mary's Huskies travelled to Montreal to compete

After such a successful 2000-2001 season with so many young players, the Women's Hockey Huskies were expecting big things this year. Led by team captains Tasha Noble, Kerrie Boyle, Stacey Randell and Jill Seebold, the Huskies seemed to have all the pieces to the puzzle for a championship season. The first half of the year indicated that Saint Mary's would again be a strong contender for the AUS Championship. Their 2 match-ups against the 3-time AUS Champion SFX X-Women saw the Huskies earn a 2-2 tie and a tight 3-2 loss, proving Saint Mary's was capable of competing with the best in the league. Then a return visit to Montreal in November brought the team some perspective on how competitive they could be against some of the strongest teams in the country. Although the Huskies lost both games to McGill and Concordia during the trip, they were able to gain tremendous confidence from the experience. Building on the confidence from the Montreal trip, Saint Mary's rattled off 10 straight wins heading into the AUS championship weekend including a 5-2 win over the X-Women. This earned the Huskies the position of first overall in the regular season. With a convincing 16-0 win vs. St. Thomas in the quarter-finals, the Huskies would have to beat

UdeM in the semi final game if they were going to get a shot at the Championship banner. The result of an extremely close game was a 5-3 victory by the Huskies, setting up a rematch of last year's championship final against the SFX Women. Facing 3-time defending champions in the Millennium Center, in front of their home crowd of over 1300 fans, proved to be an insurmountable challenge for the Huskies as they were shut-out by the unbelievable goaltending of 3rd year SFX net-minder Amy Handrahan. (Handrahan was later named to the CIS Tournament All-Star team for 2002 as the top goaltender. Down by a score of 2-0 with just minutes to play, Saint Mary's were forced to pull their goalie for an extra attacker to try and get back into the game. However, it was the X-Women who put 2 goals into the empty net, giving them a 4-0 win and the right to a 4th consecutive AUS Championship. A very promising season ended in disappointment once again for the Huskies. With the graduation of Jill Seebold, a true leader of the Huskies defense, and career scoring leader Tasha Noble, the Huskies will have large holes to fill if they are going to continue their winning ways next season. However, considering 17 of the 23 players on the roster were in their 1st or second year on the team, the future looks extremely bright for this young team.

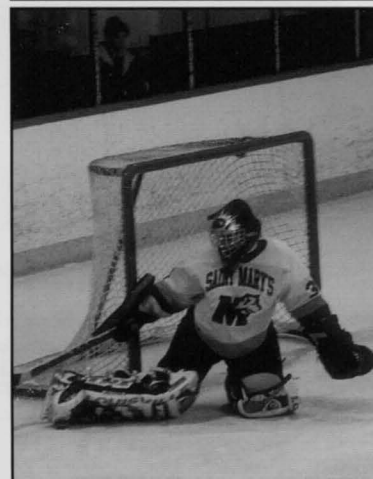
