## 10021 PRESIDENTS REPORT

#### **Key Discussion Points:**

- Dodds advised that the situation surrounding the O'Neill report remains unchanged. Stakeholder meetings are being held in regard to the issue of student assistance.
- There will be 'significant' cutbacks in funding but to what extent those cuts will impact the universities and specifically SMU is still unknown. There is no indication what a 'significant' cut means. There will be a meeting on this soon.
- The MOU process has been delayed as a result of consideration of the O'Neill report. The letter from the minister stated that the process will start early in the New Year.
- The VPs were asked for their input/suggestions on proposed strategies to address the items raised within the O'Neill report.
- Our Knowledge Infrastructure Program (KIP) projects are pushing for a completion date of March 31.

#### 10022 QUESTION PERIOD

# **Key Discussion Points:**

Question: Do the President's have any theories in regard to why there is little update on the O'Neill report and no movement in relation to the negotiations for a new MOU. Answer: They got off to a late start. There are many active initiatives taking up their time.

- Whatever our cutback is, they will insist that we meet our costs. The challenge is that right now the base is zero because we were prepaid last year.
- Question: Does this impact filling vacancies? Answer: There is no hiring freeze at the moment.
- The University is also facing utility increases and will have to take that into consideration.
- Question: Are the Presidents working together to present a common front in regard to their response to the recommendation coming out of the O'Neill report? Answer: An attempt is being made but there are challenges. The government sent a copy of the report to the chair of the Board of Governors as well as to the VPAR, so they are including the governance boards of the universities in the process.
- Question: What impact will this report have on our Budget process? Answer: We know that it is unlikely a university budget will be ready or even possible by the March Senate meeting.
- Question: How are things going for the open house tomorrow? Answer: There are 240 students plus parents signed up to attend. The last open house was very well attended. The Saturday date was implemented so that parents could drive in for the event.
- Question: How will we be able to establish the tuition rates if we don't know what the budget is by March? Answer: We will need a motion at the Board of Governors level to give the university spending authority.
- Students registering now for 2011 courses, will not know what the tuition will be for those courses. That will be true for the whole province, however students are not obligated to pay fees until the end of the drop/add period.
