#### What is Referendum 87?

At the Students' Representative Council meeting of January 11th, the SRC voted to support a motion which will ask full time students to contribute \$25.00 to the University Capital Campaign and Students' Association.

The \$25.00 contribution would go to help finance scholarships, bursaries, special services for disabled students, the new Fitness & Recreation Centre, Library Equipment, Athletic teams and student organizations.

A campus wide vote will be taken on February 17th & 18th to ask students for their opinion on the proposal. If 2/3 of the voters support the proposal it will be accepted and ratified.

#### Referendum 1987

Referendum '87 is successful, will be the single biggest student financial contribution in Saint Mary's history.

On February 17th & 18th a referendum of the SMU student body will be held to ask their opinion on the proposed \$25.00 per student contribution to the Students' Association and SMU Capital Campaign. The \$25.00 contribution would be assessed to each student, each year.

For the next ten years, starting September of 1987, \$15.00 of the contribution would go towards supporting the SMU Capital Campaign (\$5.00 of the \$15.00 will be administered by students, to provide a trust fund, scholarship, bursaries and athletic funding at SMU).

The impact of the referendum will be immediate and long term as students enjoy the benefits of increased scholarship and research, increased services from their Students' Association, new facilities including a new fitness and recreation centre, computer equipment, scientific equipment, services for disabled students, new chairs of study, bursaries and funding for athletics.

The \$25.00 contribution will supplement the \$13 million dollar Capital Campaign currently being conducted by the university to maintain the high level of excellence and fine facilities SMU has held traditionally.

This referendum is a first for Saint Mary's but students at other campuses including Dalhousie, Acadia and Mount Saint Vincent have endorsed similar proposals at their campuses.

Students at Queens University in Ontario raised over \$1.1 million or \$30/student over 3 years to contribute to their schools financial campaign.

The SMU Campaign will contribute about \$500,000 dollars over a ten year period.

The timing of this contribution is very important to the success of the universities overall Capital Campaign. Support from students will demonstrate convincing leadership with the University and demonstrate to external contributors our commitment to a better Saint Mary's.

If supported by students on February 17th & 18th in a campus wide referendum the \$25.00 contribution will come into effect as of September 1987 and will be paid along with tuition payments.

#### SRC Treasurer

Do you enjoy controlling money? Do you enjoy meetings and boards and like to have a say in what goes on? Then you may be interested in the position of SRC Treasurer for 1987-88. If you are a registered Saint Mary's student and will continue to be in 1987-88 you are eligible to apply for this position.

Applications close February 6, 1987, so apply fast. To obtain applications, check at the Employment Centre, 4th floor in the Student Centre, or with the present Treasurer, Mark Ring, 5th floor. A weekly summer honorarium of \$210.00 per week plus a per term honorarium of \$950.00 goes with this position.

The 1987-88 Treasurer assumes his/her duties on the first Monday in May 1987.

#### Alcohol and Drug Symposium

Through the years, the issues of alcohol and drug misuse and the problems that arise as the result of it, have been thoroughly discussed and debated.

On February 5th & 6th a special symposium on the topic of alcohol and drug misuse and its impact and relation to university life will be held at Saint Mary's. The two day session is being sponsored by the Atlantic Association of College and University Student Services and Saint Mary's University Student Services. The two day symposium will attract students, student union employees, university administrators and student service professionals.

Sessions at the symposium will range from Alcohol Related Deaths on Campus to the Breweries: Their Impact on Campus.

#### The Father William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Teaching

You are invited to nominate a candidate. Each nomination must be supported by the name of at least ten persons from among alumni, faculty, and students. The nomination must also be accompanied by a brief statement in support of the nomination.

Established in 1983 by the Saint Mary's University Alumni Association, the Father William A. Stewart, S.J., Medal for Teaching is awarded annually to a faculty member who has made an extraordinary contribution to the education. The Award is open to faculty members who have completed at least five years of teaching at the University.

In making its recommendation to the Alumni Executive, the selection committee will have regard for the following factors in making its decision, as well as to any other factors considered pertinent:

- 1) Teaching ability and classroom performance.
- 2) Interaction with students.
- 3) Extra curricular contributions to the life of the university community.

The award will be presented at Spring Convocation, Monday, May 11, 1987.

The award will consist of an appropriate medal and a monetary award.

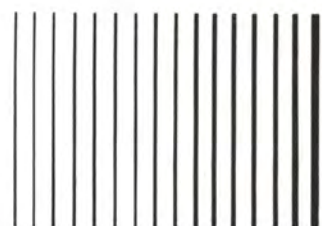

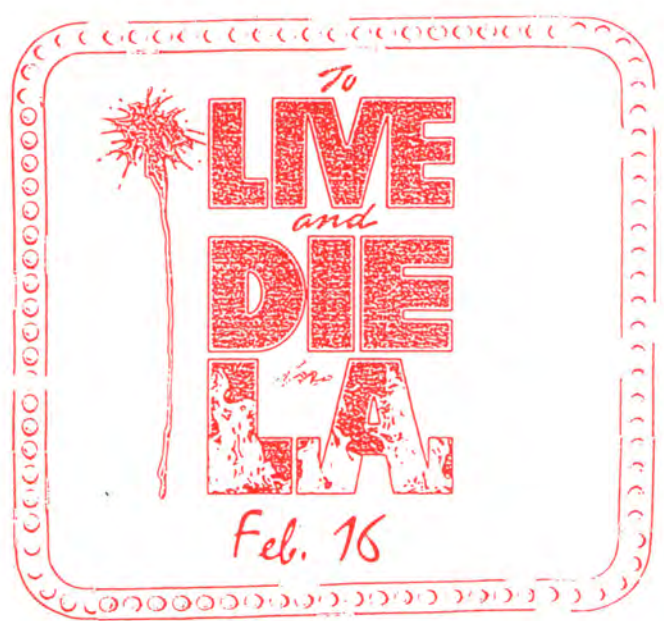
