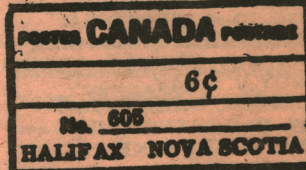
So come back to Saint Mary's this summer. Relax. Enjoy yourself. And what better way to do that than among old friends and familiar places.

SMU wins its First National Championship

Our Basketball team was the first team to win a national championship for the university. That was done on March 3 at Waterloo, Ont. in a game against Lakehead University by a score of 79-67. Much credit was given to Coach Brian Heaney. Three of the team were named to Canadian All-stars, Fox, Thomas and Gallinaugh.

STATE HONORS FR. HENNESSEY

Rev. J. J. Hennessey, S. J., of Saint Mary's University was recently honored by the State of Massachusetts. At a meeting of the New England Branch of Saint Mary's University Alumni Association, held in Boston early in December, Senator Joseph B. Walsh of the Massachusetts

Senate presented a citation to Father Hennessey in recognition of "His Many Years of Dedication and Service to God and His Fellow Man".

Father Hennessey was born in Boston, Mass., in 1902 and received his early education there. He graduated from Boston

College in 1922 and was recently honored by the College on the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of his graduation.

He entered the Canadian Province of the Society of Jesus in Guelph, Ontario, in 1924, and was ordained to the priesthood at Milltown Park, Dublin, Ireland, in 1936.

Returning to Canada in 1938, Father Hennessey spent the next 18 years preaching and giving missions throughout the whole of Canada and the United States. He later spent two years as Spiritual Father at Regis College in Willowdale, Ontario, and in 1961 he came to Saint Mary's.

Since then he has been Minister to Saint Mary's University Jesuit community, and is now Counsellor in Residence.

Very popular and highly respected by the students at Saint Mary's, they honored him in 1970 for his great concern for students by the institution of the Father J. J. Hennessey Medallion which is presented each year to an outstanding Saint Mary's student.
